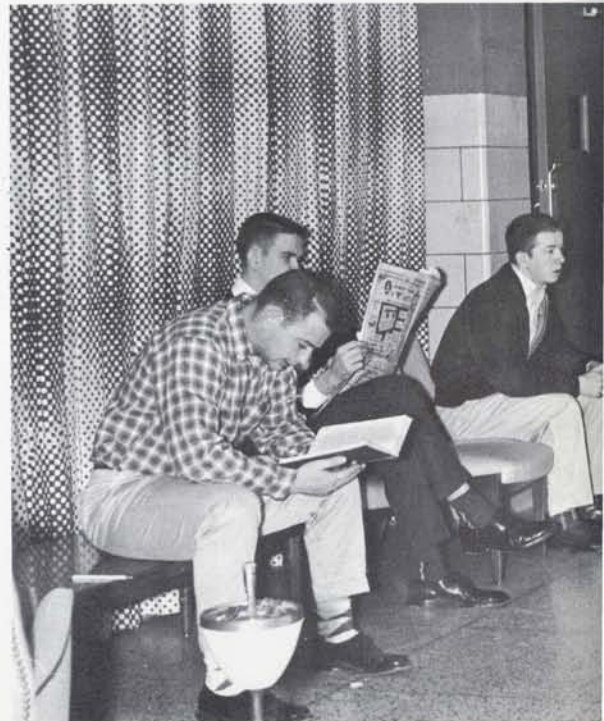

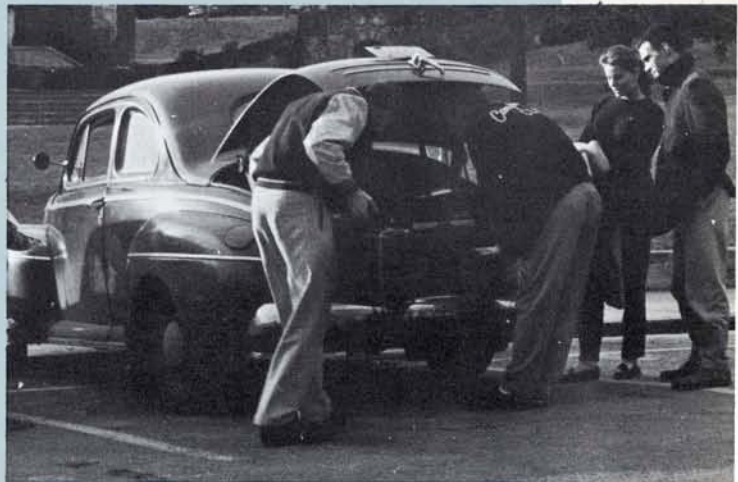

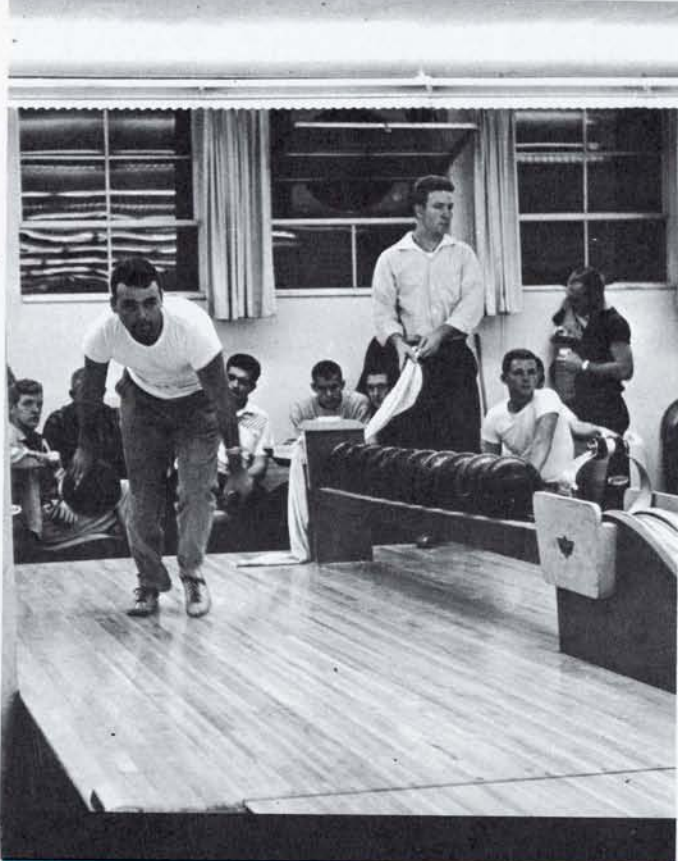

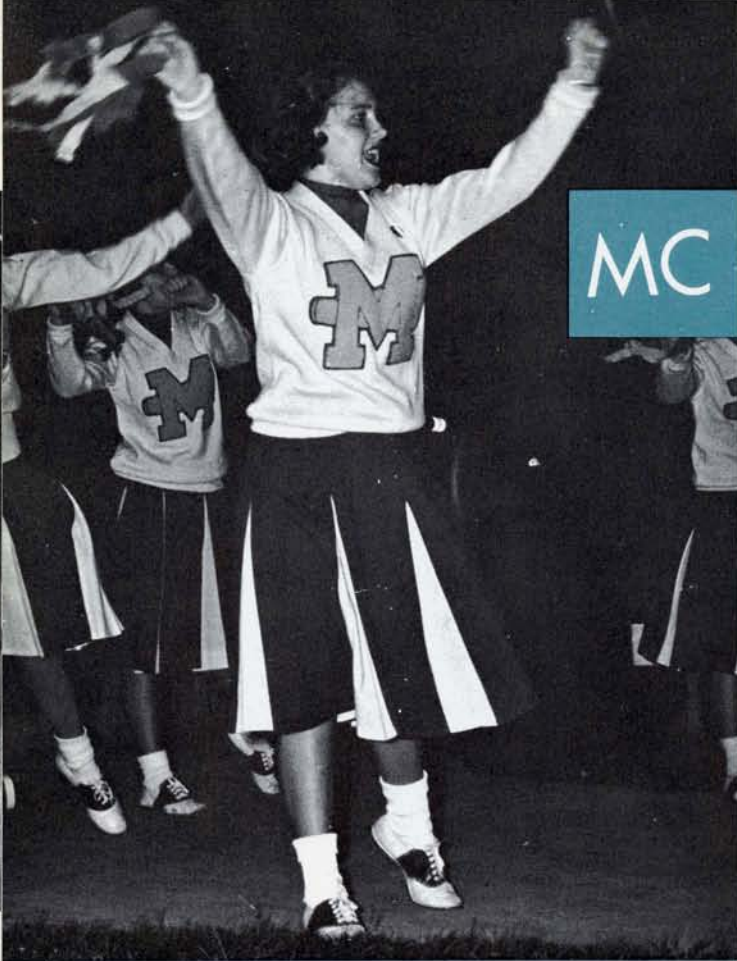

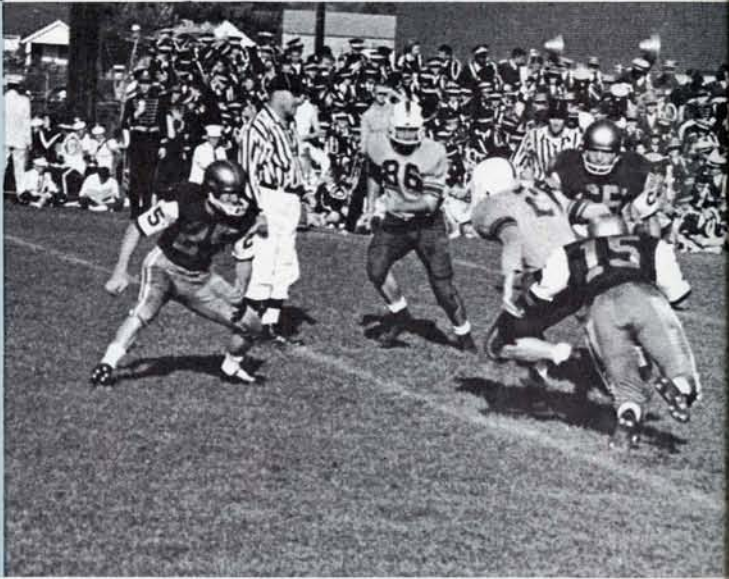

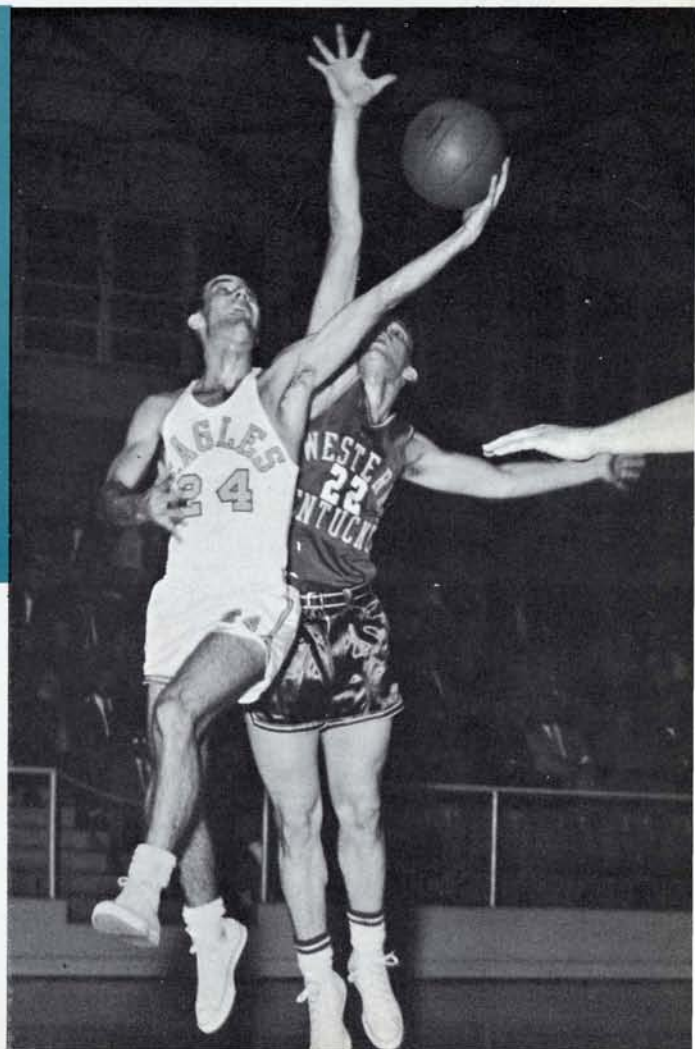

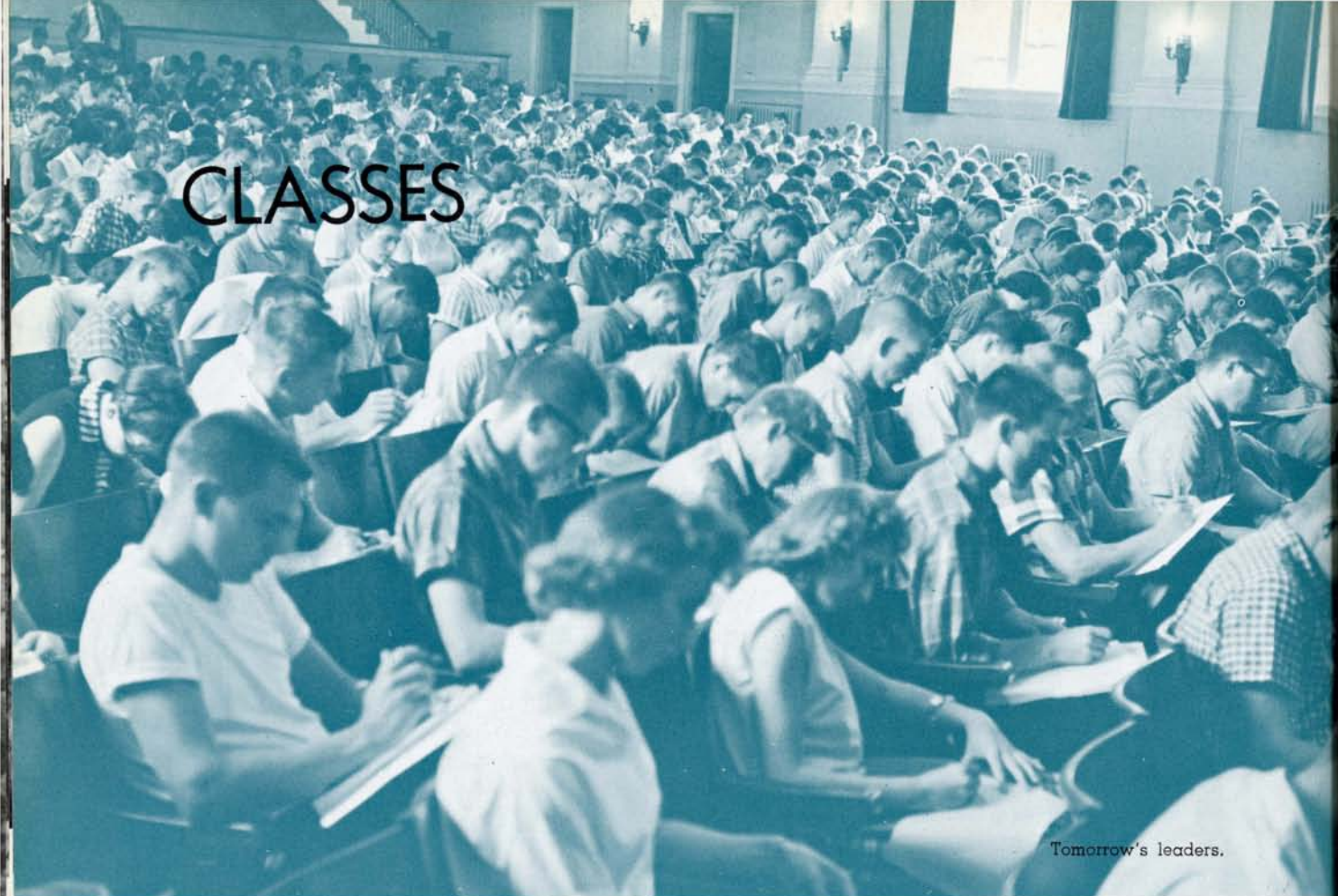

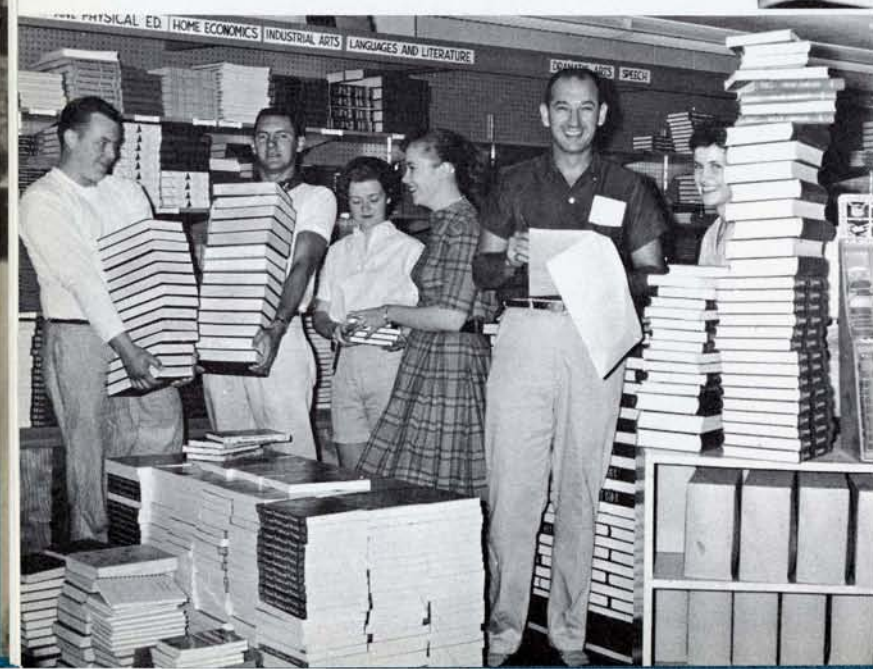

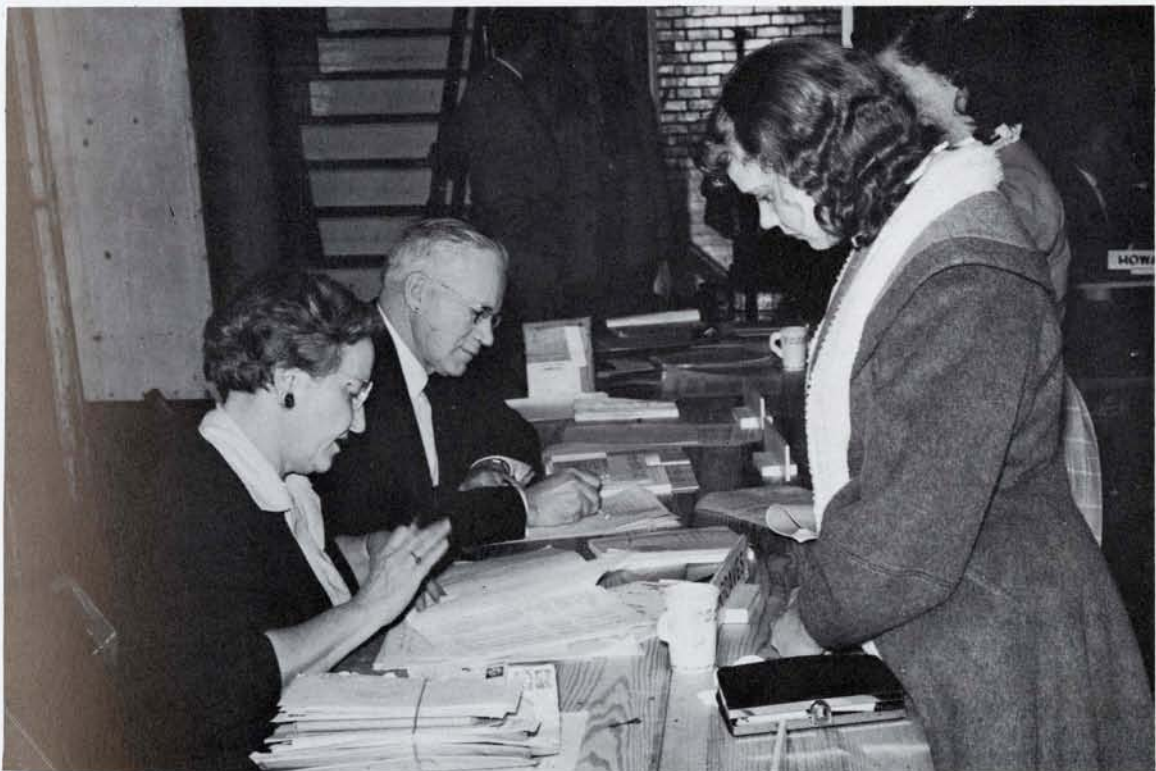
Board of Regents

Beta Chi Gamma

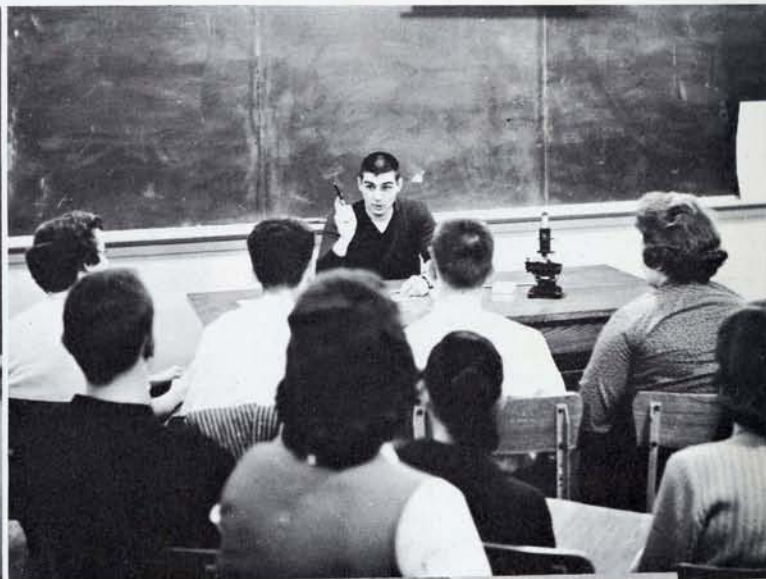

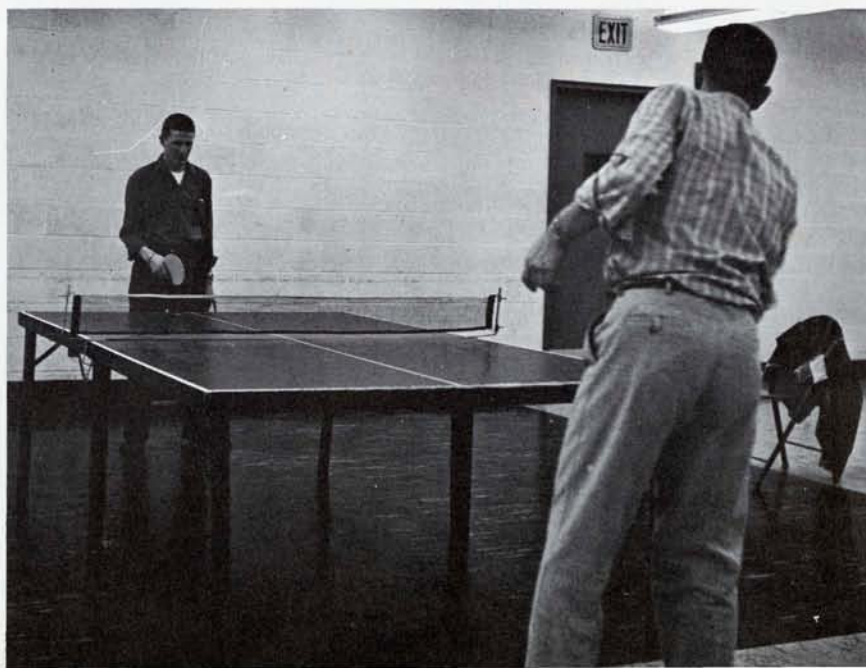

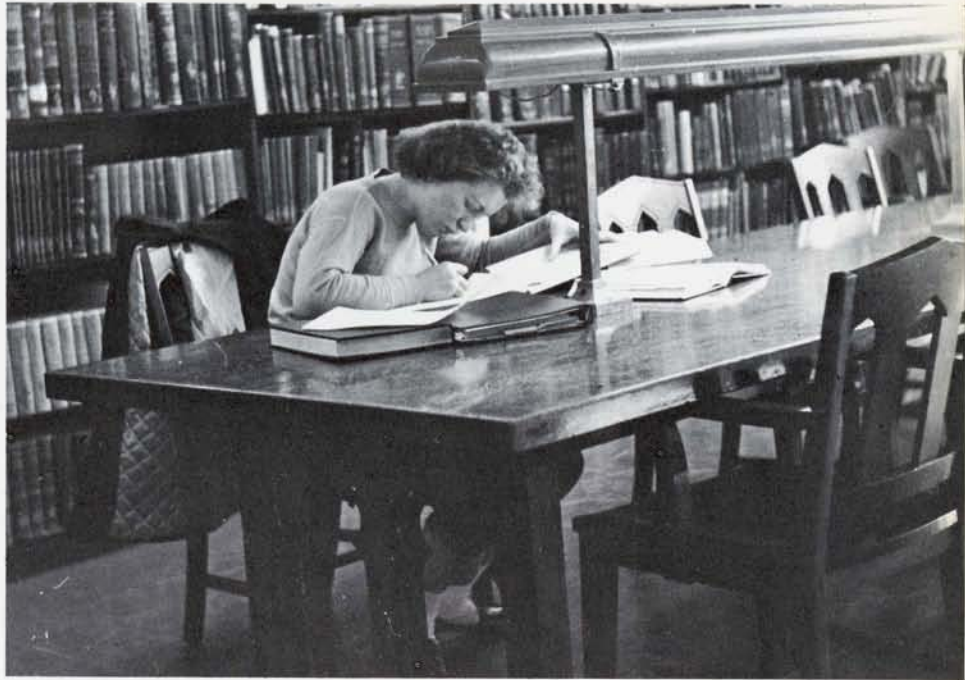
Student National Educational Association

This club is interested in improving not

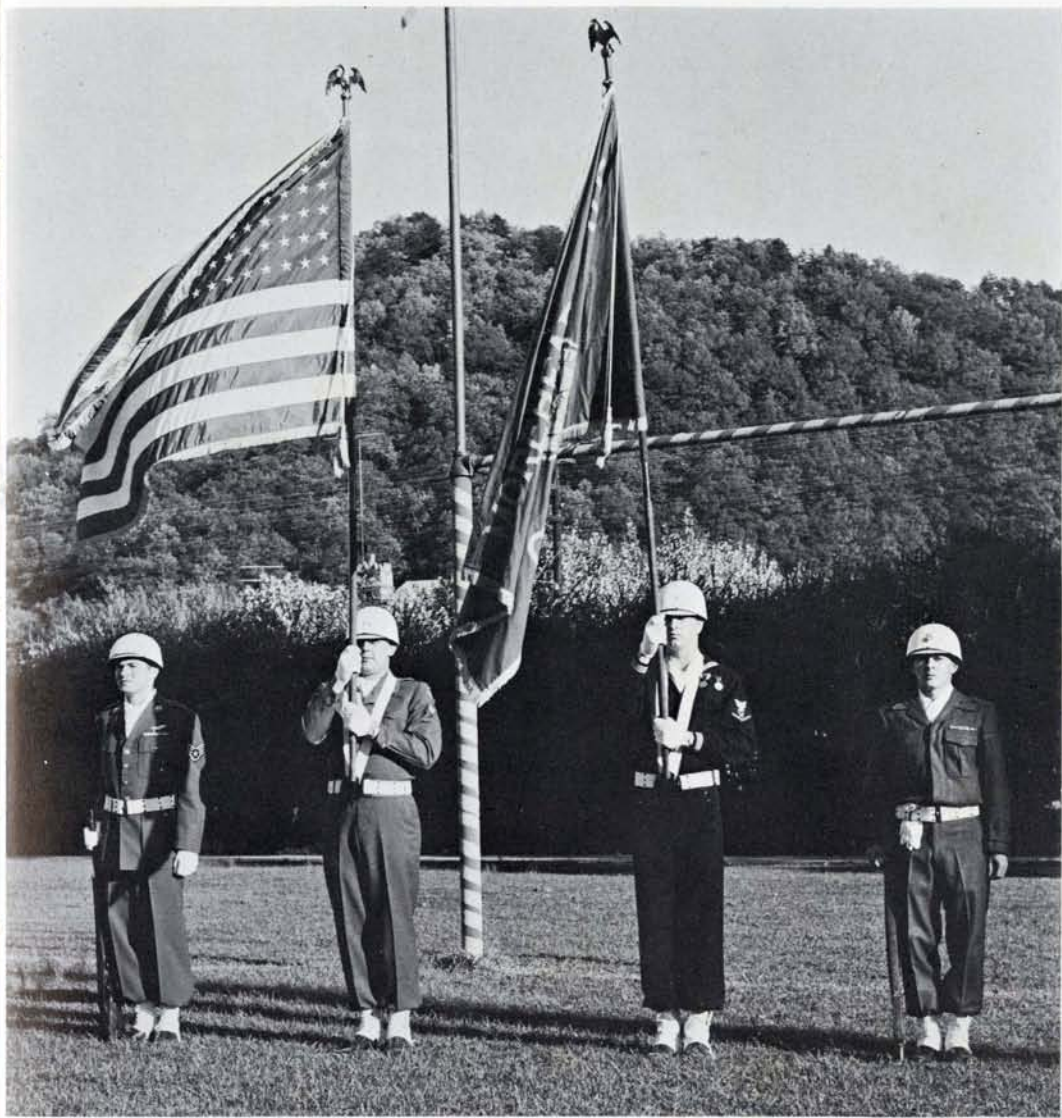
only its own organization and functions, but also in working toward the betterment of the campus as a whole.

The Morehead Players is a member of the Southeastern Theatre Conference and the American Educational Theatre Conference.

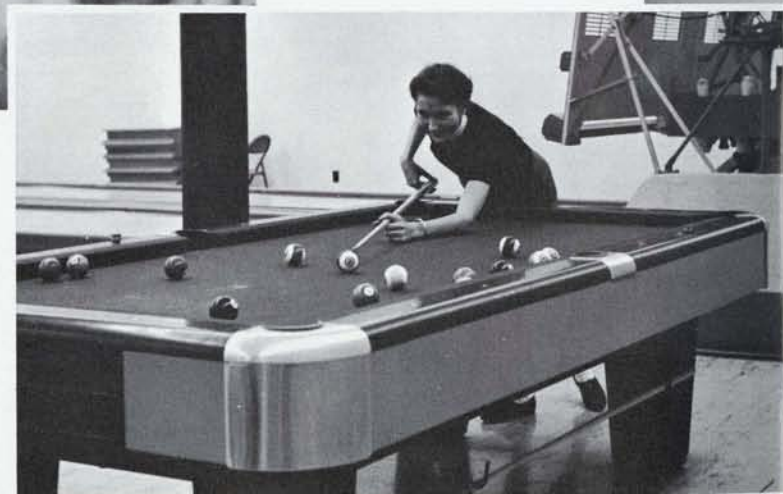

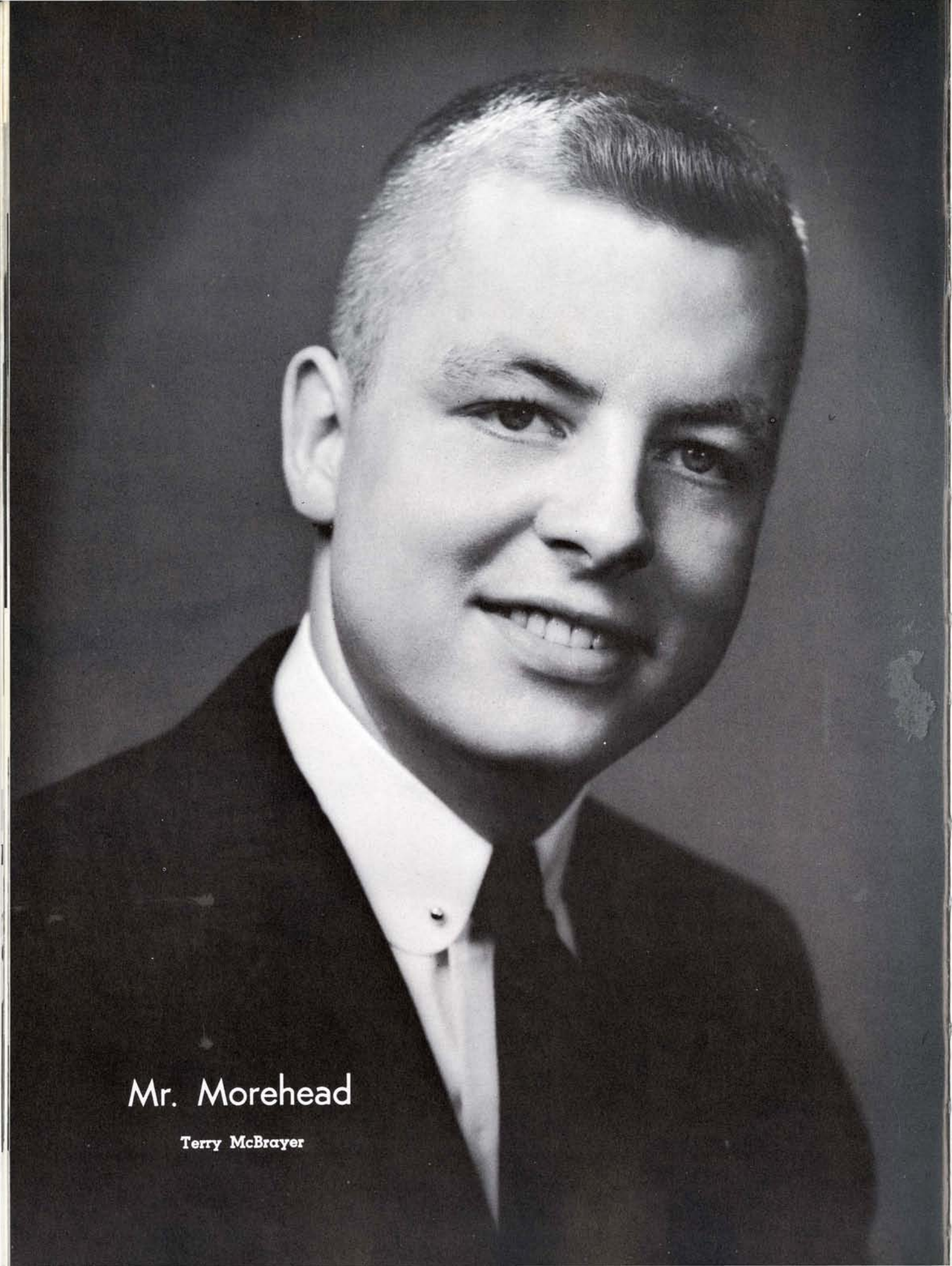

Morehead enjoyed another good season in basketball bringing to the fans the kind of game which has become the password among the Monday morning coaches, namely, "the fast break."

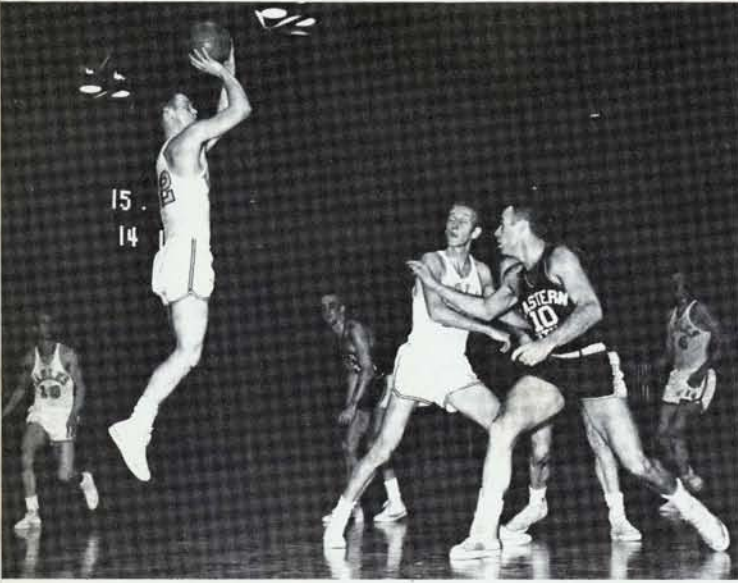
Injuries to key players at strategic times during the season caused the high-flying eagles to suffer defeats which would otherwise be on the credit side of the ledger.

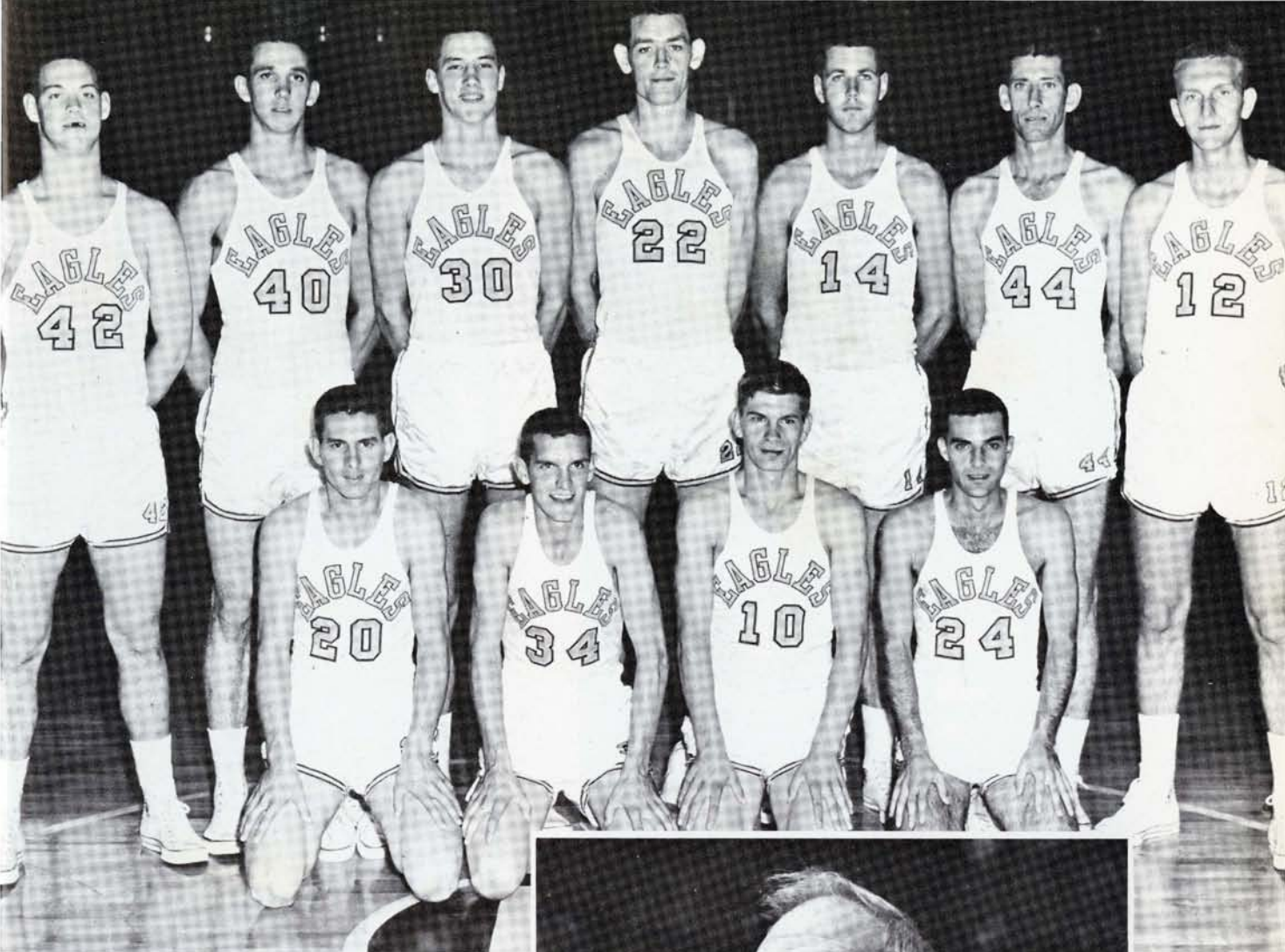
Senior forward Thornton Hill and junior guard Herbie Triplett led the sophomore-laden squad to a season which made the pre-season forecasters eat their words.

Although we lose three of our boys, the future looks bright for the Eagles as the freshman team shows some good talent and great promise.

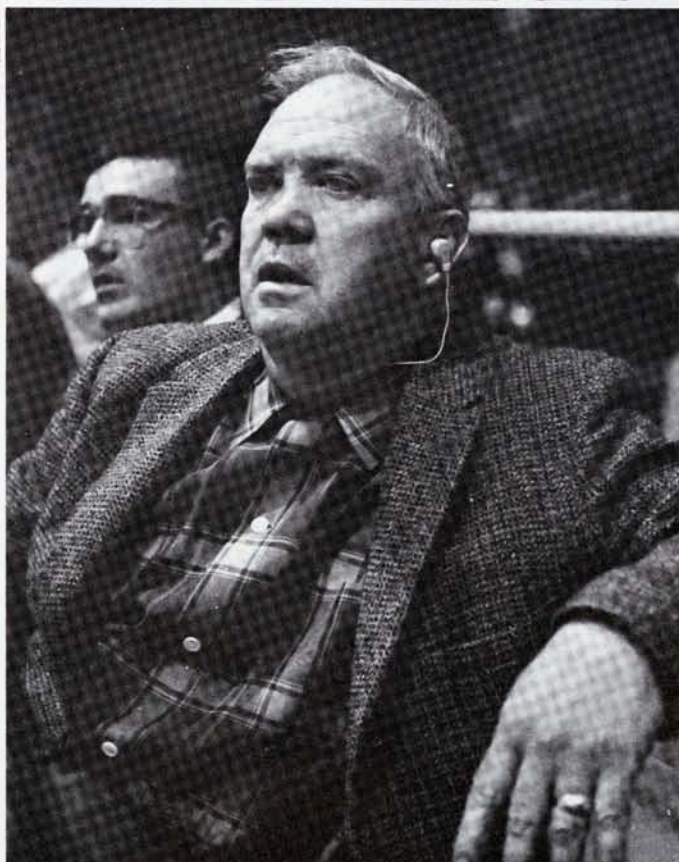
