

#### Administration

More than forty years ago in the picturesque and scenic footbills of the Cumberlands in Rowan County at Morehead a germ was planted which created the nucleus of one of Kentucky's most progressive and without doubt Kentucky's most democratic educational institution. Fostered in its infancy by Mrs. Phoebe Button and son, F. C. Button, it served as a home of Christian education and a source of training for those teachers who devoted their lives to the molding of youthful character in Eastern Kentucky.


In the year 1923 the institution came under the control of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, administered unto by The Board of Regents and Dr. F. C. Button, who for six years continued as president of the institution known as Morehead Normal School and Teachers College. Under his quiet and conscientious guidance, by means of increased financial support, provided by the Kentucky Legislature, the school was better able to serve the purpose for which it was created. From its beginning in 1923 it has shown phenomenal growth.

In 1929 Superintendent John Howard Payne, one of the state's best known educators, was chosen president of the new institution. A more capable man for the particular position could not have been chosen. He is the epitome of energy. With the spirit of friendliness and democracy which pervades his being, he appeals to the democratic type of students who hail from Eastern Kentucky.

The story of Morehead's progress during the past few years is almost as unbelievable as the story of Aladdin and the Wonderful Lamp. Over night, a few frame buildings, housing half a hundred students, have faded into a magnificient plant, caring for more than a thousand students. In the plant are three modern dormitories, an auditorium and gymnasium unsurpassed, a library of Tudor-Gothic design beautiful to behold, a convenient and ample administration building, and the center of all instruction the best training school plant in the South. Experienced engineerig has cooperated with nature to give this plant a setting which is not only beautiful but aesthetic. Durng the past year Morehead has gained admittance to the Southern Association of Colleges and the American Association of Teachers Colleges.

Throughout the entire scheme probably the most appealing factor to many students is the spirit of democracy which exists among students and between student body and faculty. Morehead's alumni and especially the Class of 1931 look with pride upon Morehead's short history and with hopefulness and golden dreams to her future.



Who visits each new daughter or son, And compliments highly every one, Yet knows he lies, but it has to be done— Who but a Country Teacher?


Who wears the 1920 styles, Takes off his silks to put on lisles, And rides horseback to church ten miles— Who but a Country Teacher?


Not spectacular but quiet and steady, keeping all his troubles to himself. Oliver never failed to turn in a good game whether the Eagles won or lost.

Captain of the team and one of the best floor men in college basketball in this section. He is a deceptive passer and the harder the contest the harder he plays. His team spirit makes him a leader.


