

At a meeting of the Board of Regents of the Morehead State Normal School and Teachers College held at the Administration Building, Morehead, Kentucky, on April 2, 1929, pursuant to adjournment at the recent meeting at Lexington, Kentucky, Hon. W. C. Bell, chairman, Mrs. S. M. Bradley, Judge Allie W. Young, Mr. Glenn E. Perry and Secretary E. W. Senff were present and the following business was transacted, to-wit:

Copies of the minutes of the meeting held January 22d, 1929, having been furnished members of the Board, the reading of same was on motion duly carried dispensed with and said minuted approved.

On motion of Judge Young, seconded by Secretary Senff the course of study recommended by the Executive Council was approved. Same follows:

MINUTES
JOINT MEETING OF EXECUTIVE COUNCILS
OF TEACHERS COLLEGES

The members of the Executive Councils of the State Teachers Colleges met in Frankfort, March 27, 1929, at 1:30 P. M., Supt. W. C. Bell presiding.

Purpose of the Meeting:

Consideration of two-year curricula recommended by Committee on Unification for training of Early Elementary, Upper Elementary, and Rural Teachers.

1. The first part of the conference was taken up with informal discussions and criticisms representing the reaction of the faculties of the different institutions as regards the proposed curricula.

2. President Wells read statements from the heads of his departments of Mathematics and Physics in which was pointed out the impossibility of students majoring in Mathematics and Physics under the proposed plan.

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3. Moved by President Wells, seconded by President Button, That for the core curriculum under consideration the maximum number of hours in Mathematics be sixteen and the maximum number in Science be twenty, instead of seven hours and ten hours, respectively, as recommended by the Committee. Carried.

4. Moved by Doctor Cooper, seconded by President Wells, That a bona fide registrant for Smith-Hughes Home Economics be permitted to substitute Home Economics for Agriculture in meeting the requirements for the Standard Certificate. Carried.

5. Moved by President Wells, seconded by President Button, That the core curriculum as recommended by the committee, and amended by the Council in "3" above, for training of Lower Grade, Upper Grade, and Rural School teachers be adopted. Carried.

6. Moved by Doctor Cooper, seconded by President Wells, That the matter of substituting Home Economics for Agriculture be reconsidered. Carried. (The original motion authorizing this substitution was lost.)

7. Moved by Doctor Cooper, seconded by President Wells, That the adoption of the core curriculum forming the basis of the curricula for the training of Early Elementary, Upper Elementary, and Rural School teachers shall not be retroactive in case of students enrolled before September, 1929, and completing work for Standard Certificate or degree before September, 1931.

8. Moved by Doctor Cooper, seconded by President Wells, That the new curricula adopted shall in no way affect degree requirements previously adopted by the Executive Council. These requirements are as follows: Education 18 hrs; (prescribed subjects and restricted electives). English, 12 hrs. Social Science, 12 hrs. Science, 12 hrs. Mathematics, 7 hrs. Carried.

9. Moved by President Wells, seconded by Doctor Cooper, That the educational requirements for the degree be eighteen hours, without specifying the subjects to be taken. Carried.

10. Moved by President Wells, seconded by President Button, That Doctor Cooper submit to the different schools, by mail, a proposed calendar for the school year 1929-30. Carried.
