It appearing that the appropriation of \$125,000.00 made by the Legislature of 1930, for the use and benefit of the Morehead State Normal School and Teachers College, and payable out of the General Expenditure fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1930, is now needed and necessary in the construction, heating and equipping of a training school and library building and the extension of the water, light, and sewerage systems, and other capital investments and improvements at said institution, on motion of Mr. Glenn E. Perry, seconded by Mrs. S. M. Bradley, the Treasurer, G. B. Senff is ordered and directed to make requisition upon the Auditor of Public Accounts on July 1, 1930, for the payment of said appropriation. On a roll call all members of theboard of regents present voted aye, and said motion was declared unanimously adopted.

It appearing that the appropriation of \$30,000.00 provided by section 4535b-5 Kentucky Statutes for maintenance and operation of the Morehead State Normal School and Teachers College, nos now needed and necessary, on motion of Mr. Glenn E.
