June 3, 1932

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At a meeting of the Board of Regents of the Morehead State Teachers College held at the Administration Building in Morehead, Kentucky, on June 3, 1932, pursuant to call, at which meeting Professor J. H. Richmond, chairman, Dr. J. M. Rose, Judge Allie W. Young and Secretary Earl W. Senff were present, the following business was transacted, viz:

The newly appointed members of the Board of Regents, Messrs. Allie W. Young and Earl W. Senff presented commissions from the Governor of Kentucky showing their appointment as such for a term of four years from April 1, 1932, and they were duly sworn as required by law by Miss Anna B. Carter, Notary Public of Rowan County, Kentucky.

On motion of Dr. Rose, seconded by Judge Young, the minutes of the last meeting were approved.

On motion of Judge Young, seconded by Dr. Rose and all members of the Board present voting Aye, Messrs. Rose and Senff were appointed a committee to confer with Judge Dysard, attorney for the bonding company and ascertain its attitude relative to the deposit now in the Citizens Bank of Morehead, that is, whether it will be available from the company, upon demand, when needed by the college and to report at the next meeting of the Board.

Judge Young then moved that Judge Ed. C. O'Rear, attorney, be instructed to collect from S. M. Bradley, former treasurer, the balance due from him by way of interest on the funds formerly in his hands, and Dr. Rose suggested that the bonding company or companies be included, if liable, which suggestion was accepted by Judge Young, and the motion as **amended** was then seconded by Dr. Rose and all members of the Board present voting Aye, is declared adopted.

On motion of Judge Young, seconded by Secretary Senff, and all members of the Board present voting Aye, the Board went on record as favoring no summer school for 1933, as a measure of economy and necessity.

On motion of Judge Young, seconded by Secretary Senff, and all members of the Board present voting Aye, the incidental

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and health fees are fixed at \$10.00 per semester, instead of \$5.00 as heretofore, beginning with the semester in September as a further measure of economy and necessity.

On motion of Judge Young, seconded by Dr. Rose and all members of the Board present voting Aye, the salaries of all employes of the college, beginning with the semester in September, who receive more than \$100.00 per month, be and the same are now cut and reduced ten per centum of such yearly salaries, respectively.

Dr. Rose then offered the following resolutions with reference to the untimely death of the late Professor D. M. Holbrook, which resolutions were seconded by Judge Young and unanimously adopted by the Board. Said resolutions are as follows:

WHEREAS, the tragic and untimely death of the late and lamented Professor D. M. Holbrook has brought profound regret and lasting sorrow to his many relatives, friends and associates in Eastern Kentucky. And

WHEREAS, the passing of one so honored, trusted and beloved brings to the faculty and student body of the Morehead State Teachers College the loss of a member whose sterling qualities and distinguished service commanded the high regards and respect of all. And

WHEREAS, the members of the Board of Regents of the Morehead State Teachers College recognize the loss of an able teacher whose christian life and fine character portrayed the lofty ideals of this institution.

THEREFORE, be it further resolved by the Board of Regents of the Morehead State Teachers College, that we recognize in the life of the late Professor D. M. Holbrook the fine qualities and training that marked him a scholar and a gentleman; we recognize the value of his honesty, his sincerity, his lofty ideals, his devotion to duty, his love and sactifices for this institution, his model christian life and his passing brings to us only sorrow mingled with deep regret.

Be it Further Resolved that the Morehead State Teachers College has lost a loyal friend, an able instructor and the community a man whose life typified mercy, kindness and equal justice.

Be It Further Resolved that a copy of these resolutions be spread upon the minutes, a copy given members of the family and a copy to the press for publication. 186

President Payne then recommended that the college boulevards and grounds be closed to motor traffic from 8 o'clock P. M. to 6 o'clock A. M. except upon special occasions and on motion of ^Judge Young, seconded by Dr. Rose and all members of the Board present voting Aye, the President is authorized and directed to have this done by the erection of chains or other appropriate barriers. On motion of Dr. Rose, seconded by Judge Young, and all members of the Board present, voting aye, the contract submitted for electric power to be furnished by the Kentucky Power Company is approved, and the president authorized and directed to execute same for and on behalf of the college.

On motion of Dr. Rose, seconded by Judge Young and all members of the Board present voting Aye, upon roll call, the balance due of \$407.00 on stokers and \$75.00 balance due Consulting Engineer O'Bannon are ordered paid.

Judge Young moved that the chair appoint a committæ to investigate the condition of the steam line running from the Allie Young Hall to the East corner of the Administration Building, which motion was seconded by Dr. Rose and all members of the Board voting Aye, said motion was declared adopted and the chair designated on said committee Messrs. Young and Senff.

On motion of Judge Young, seconded by Dr. Rose and all members of the Board present voting Aye, upon roll call, the sum of \$750.00 is ordered paid, to the architects, Messrs. Joseph & Joseph, on account.

On motion of Secretary Senff, seconded by Dr. Rose, and all members of the Board present voting Aye, Mr. Harlan Blair, Business Agent of the college, is authorized and directed to purchase a gas driven grass mowing machine and an electric scrubbing machine.

Dr. Graves and President Payne then explained to the Board the need of certain changes and equipment to accommodate the growing science department, and Secretary Senff moved that the President be authorized to have such changes made and to purchase such needed equipment, subject to the approval of the State Purchasing Agent, such changes and equipment not to cost in the aggregate more than \$3000.00, which motion was seconded by Dr. Rose, and on a roll call all members of the Board present voted Aye, except Judge Young, who did not vote and said motion was declared adopted.

President Payne then recommended the employment of the following list of faculty members and other employees which recommendation, subject to the 10% reduction heretofore provided for, Judge Young moved that the Board approve. Motion was seconded by Secretary Senff and upon a roll all members of the Board present **voting** Aye, except Dr. Rose not voting, and said motion was declared duly adopted:
