Minutes of May 13, 1955 continued -

4. Foods Laboratory. Final plans have been drawn and bids let in the expenditure of \$25,000 allotted by the State Property and Buildings Commission for the construction of 4 kitchen units in the Training School, 4 kitchen units in the College Home Economics Department, and 1 kitchen unit in the Home Management House. This project will be completed by September 15, 1955.

5. Repair Work. The State Property and Buildings Commission has allotted \$13,500 to the College for the purpose of re-roofing the Gymnasium-Auditorium building and re-roofing the Library Building and to re-wire the Library Building. These jobs will be by contract.

6. Student Union Building. The application of the Board of Regents to the State Property and Buildings Commission for an allotment to construct a Student Union Building has been approved. An allotment of \$250,000 has been made and the Board of Regents has been asked to authorize the sale of revenue bonds in an amount of not less than \$350,000 to finance the construction of a \$600,000 Student Union Building.

7. Gymnasium. The plans for the gymnasium are still in the hands of the architect, Mr. Henry Spaulding. We hope that he will deliver the final drawings to the Director of the State Property and Buildings Commission in a very few days. The Commission plans to proceed with the advertising and letting of contracts and our Fiscal Agent will then be in position to advertise for the sale of our bonds.

8. Financial Report. I am submitting a financial budget showing the additional income anticipated and the distributiob of this income for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1955 and ending June 30, 1956.

9. Personnel Roster. I am submitting te personnel roster for the next school year, with recommended positions and salaries.

The recommendation for acceptance of Personnel Changes contained in Paragraph 1 of the report was approved on motion of Dr. Gearhart, seconded by Dr. Esham. On roll call, the vote was: Mr. Butler, aye; Dr. Esham aye; and Dr. Gearhart aye.

The president reported an enrollment of 998 students for the second semester, which compared to an enrollment of 766 for the same period last year.

The Board unanimously approved the list of candidates for degrees to be awarded at the next commencement June 1, 1955.

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Minutes of May 13, 1955, continued -

A Student Union Building for the College was discussed at length. Dr. Doran reported that the State Property and Buildings Commission had approved an allotment of \$250,000 for the erection of a Student Union Building at Morehead, with the suggestion that the Board of Regents authorize the sale of revenue bonds in an amount of not less than \$350,000 to finance the construction of a \$600,000 Student Union Building. Motion by Mr. Butler that the \$250,000 be accepted, and that the president be empowered to negotiate with the Executive Director of the Buildings Commission in developing plans for the Student Union Building. Motion was seconded by Dr. Gearhart. Voted on this motion was: Mr. Butler aye; Dr. Esham aye, and Dr. Gearhart aye.

President Doran submitted a financial statement for the third quarter ending March 31, 1955, a preliminary budget estimate for the year 1955-56, and a personnel roster for the year. Motion by Mr. Butler that these be accepted as submitted by the president, and made a part of these minutes. The vote on this motion was: Mr. Butler aye; Dr. Esham aye, and Dr. Gearhart aye.
