At a meeting of the Board of Regents of Morehead State College held in the Conference Room of the Administration Building on March 19, 1956, the following members were present:

There being a full quorum, the following business was transacted:

The minutes of the meeting held December 12, 1955 were read and on motion of Mr. Eblen, seconded by Dr. Esham unanimously approved.

President Doran read his report to the Board, whereupon the Board acted upon each item as read:

1. Enrollment: The enrollment for the second semester, 1955-56 shows 1078 students, as compared to 927 for the second semester of last year, and 1060 for the first semester of this year. The report shows that 53 counties in Kentucky were represented, with 13 other states, and one foreign country.

Gentlemen:

I am submitting herewith a report on the operation of the college for the period December 12, 1955 to March 19, 1956, and certain recommendations for Board Action:

2. Acceptance of Keeneland Scholarship:

KEENELAND SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

As It Relates to Morehead State College

A. Name of Scholarship

1. Keeneland Educational Scholarship

Keeneland Scholarship continued -

B. Donor:

- 1. Keeneland Foundation, a charitable and educational trust, with its income derived from Thoroughbred sales and racing.
- C. Type of Scholarship:
 - 1. For undergraduate candidates for a degree in education.

D. Number, Amount, and Date of Scholarship:

- 1. One four-year scholarship, effective fall term, 1956.
- 2. Three hundred dollars yearly.

E. Criteria of Selection of Recipients:

- 1. Character, scholarship promise and leadership, with some priority on need.
- F. <u>Restrictions:</u>
 - 1. Priority will be given applicants who express a real intent to teach in the schools of Kentucky.
 - 2. Recipient must be both a resident of the state of Kentucky and a graduate of a Kentucky high school.

G. Selection of Recipient:

1. To be made by College.

H. Administration of Scholarship:

1. To be handled by college.

I. Discontinuation and Reapplication of Scholarship:

- 1. If recipient fails to meet scholarship standards or if recipient discontinues his education, for any reason, the scholarship will cease. (Any exception to this will be mutually agreed upon by College and Keeneland).
- 2. In the event the scholarship is terminated, it is Keeneland's desire that the college apply the remainder of the scholarship to another desiring student, who would be expected to earn a degree in education in the time remaining on the scholarship.

J. Payment of Funds:

- 1. Keeneland will pay the college (\$1,200 representing total amount of one four-year scholarship, prior to the beginning of the fall term 1956.
- 2. Payment of funds to recipients will be made by the College.

Keeneland Scholarship continued -

K. Publicity:

- 1. Keeneland desires to make formal announcement of the scholarship program (which embraces six other state colleges and universities) in January, 1956.
- 2. Keeneland desires to make formal announcement of names of recipients by June 15, 1956, and to make a public **p**resentation of certificate of award in each recipient's home town.

L. Follow-up:

- 1. Keeneland hasmore than an initial interest in the scholarship program, hoping to be able to continue awarding a four-year scholarship each year.
- 2. Keeneland desires a personal information report on the recipient, when selected, and desires semester reports on the progress of the student.

I recommend that the \$1200 be accepted from the Keeneland Foundation to establish a four-year scholarship for an undergraduate for a degree in education.

Dear Dr. Doran:

The fund balance as of July 1, 1955 were \$161,723.34 and as of December 31, 1955 these same balances were \$175,751.13 or we operated the institution for the first six months on funds made available during the period.

For the first six months of the school year we allotted \$453,940.42 and we spent or obligated the college for \$451,158.60 leaving a balance of \$2,781.82 for the first six months. Fifty-three percent of the estimated revenue of the college has been realized in the first six months of operation. All auxiliary enterprises operated at a small profit.
