Dr. Adron Doran, President Morehead State College Morehead, Kentucky

Dear Dr. Doran:

These are the statements of the college as of June 30, 1956 for the fiscal year 1955-56 with the accounts payable to be liquidated in the period from July 1 to September 30, 1956. Complete statements for the year will be finished after all encumbrances have been liquidated.

The Fund Balance Statement shows an increase during the year of \$73, 455. 84 of which an increase of \$67, 993. 88 is in the Revolving Fund (Student Fees) and \$5, 461. 96 in the Sinking Funds (Bond and Interest Payments). We are obligated for an expenditure of approximately \$25, 000.00 for the construction of the 20 dwellings from the Student Fee Fund. There was a bond and interest payment of \$14, 013. 72 due January 1, 1956 on the Waterworks Improvement Fund which is not reflected in the statement. This correction will be made before September 30, 1956.

The Receipts and Disbursements Statements show that we realized an income of \$934,243.10 and we have spent or have accounts payable in the amount of \$867,555.48 or receipts over disbursements of \$66,687.62. All auxiliary enterprises such as the bookstore, cafeteria, dormitories and apartments have operated at a small profit.

The audit being conducted by Kelley and Galloway, CPA, covering this year and the three preceding years is near completion and we should have copies soon after September 30.
