THE DOGS OF WAR. The Rowan County Trouble Breaks Out Afresh. Special to the Courier-Journal.] MOREHEAD, June 28 .- The war broke out afresh here to day. One man has been killed, another mortally wounded, another disabled T and a revival of hostilities is exe pected at any moment. e At 9 o'clock this morning Town 1-Marshal Craig Toliver started out 8 to arrest Sheriff Cook Hum-0 phreys. He had a warrant chargting Humphreys with conspiring to E take the lives of Toliver and his e friends. The Sheriff was at the residence of Ben Martin, who lives one mile out of town, and £ Toliver went there with a posse of four friends. They went in and demanded Humphrey's surrender, 1but were told that he was not in 8 the house. They did not believe 3. this, however, and the Marshal t started up stars. He had scarce-ly put foot upon the steps before 1he was fired upon by the fugitive, e who was watching him from 0 above. The wapon he used was . a double-bar, shot-gun loaded only a few fort distance, it failed to kill Tolier. Five shots went n N) S r into his lef hand, one in the right 8 breast, onein the cheek and two f grazed hi face. n The wounded man though tae ken at : disadvantage, did not . give up rithout a struggle, he ree treated, out emptied several shots out of he pistol at Humphreys. None tok effect, however, and he . y was correyed by his friends to Morehed, where his wounds were 8 dressed He is now lying at the e Cottage Hotel, in this place, but t his injuries are not dangerous and . he will toon be up. . The stooting caused the greatest exctement in the town, and this afernoon another attempt was male to capture Humphreys. A poss was organized, as it was 8 learned that be refused to give himseliup, and at about 4 o'clock in the afternoon Martin's house was rached. They started to surround it, but the fugitive and his friends saw them. They slip-Æ 1 ped out of the back way and made a break for the woods, but they . were aminute too late, the posse 0 seeingthem in time to open fire. One of the men, whose name is 7 Rayburn, was killed outright, and 1 Humpireys was mortally wounded. The remains were taken back to the house, the firing instantly ) ceasing as soon as the deadly result was ascertained. It is feared by many that the worst is yet to come, and that the long struggle of last winter and 1 spring will be renewed. It will be remembered that there have been two parties to this fend all the time. It began at the last August election over a quarrel 1 which resulted in the killing of Floyd Toliver. Since then several other deaths have followed. County Attorney Yaung was shot arm amoust, Depart Swellin Stu-art Bumgardner was waylaid and killed, one of the Martins was killed while a prisoner, and several pitched battles took place. Craig Telliver and Jeff Bowling took the leadership of one party, while Logan Carey, Sheriff Humphrey and several others were at the head of their opponents. The difference was finally adjusted after two or three visits from Adjutant General Castleman, and both parties agreed to quit and be friends. Mutual distrust has prevailed, however, and a revival of the fight has been constantly anticipated. Charges have been made that Cook Humphreys had hired a desperado named Ed Pearce to kill his enemies, and to this Pearce made confession not long ago.
