A meeting of the Board of Regents of Morehead State College was held in the Conference Room of the Administration Building, on the College Campus, August 6, 1959. The following members were present:

In the absence of Chairman, Dr. Robert Martin, Vice Chairman W. H. Cartmell, presided. The meeting was called to order by the vice chairman, and the following business was transacted:

Reading of the minutes of the meeting held May 15, 1959, was dispensed with, since copies were mailed to each member of the Board. On motion of Mr. Gilley, seconded by Mr. Reed and unanimously carried, the minutes were approved.

Dr. Doran presented his report to the Board, as follows:

On motion of Mr. Reed, seconded by Mr. Gilley, and unanimously carried, the staff changes as set forth in the president's report were approved.

Minutes of August 6, 1959 meeting continued -

On motion of Mr. Gilley, seconded by Mr. Reed and unanimously carried, the following resolution relating to combining the two Federal Loan Agreements - Ky. CH-15-31 (D) and Ky. CH-15-28 (D), into one bond agreement was adopted, and is as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Regents of Morehead State College that President Adron Doran be authorized to sign an agreement with the United States of America through the Housing and Home Finance Agency to combine Projects Ky. 15-CH-31 (D), and Ky. 15-CH-28(D) into one bond issue in the amount of \$1,950,000.

Dr. Doran called attention to certain renovations needed on the College campus. He stated that the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Finance, had set aside an amount of \$34,000 to be used for the renovation of the Swimming Pool, Street Lights, Gas Line, Reroofing Allie Young Hall Annex, and repair to the Dam Spillway.

The Board unanimously approved the president's plan for the erection of four faculty duplexes, the same to be occupied by the faculty and staff of the college.

On motion of Mrs. Shannon, seconded by Mr. Chamberlain, and unanimously carried, the following resolution relating to the purchase of a lot adjoining the Morehead State College Campus was adopted:

Resolution pertaining to a lot owned by Mr. Parney Martindale:

WHEREAS, THE Commissioner of Finance has authorized the employment of an architect to draft preliminary plans for a maintenance-industrial arts building at Morehead State College, and

WHEREAS, Mr. James Clark, Lexington, has completed Phase A of the architect's contract, and

WHEREAS, THE Commonwealth of Kentucky does not own sufficient land on which the maintenance-industrial arts building can be erected, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Parney Martindale owns a lot on the southeast corner of the college which is an adequate site for the maintenance-industrial arts building, and Minutes of August 6, 1959 meeting continued -

WHEREAS, THE Commissioner of Finance has allocated \$30,000 from the Capital Construction Fund for the purchase of a building site, and

WHEREAS, ALL efforts of the college officials and Directors of the Morehead Chamber of Commerce have failed to persuade the owner to sell the lot to the State,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Regents request the Commissioner of Finance to confer with Mr. Martindale and offer him a fair price for the lot, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the event Mr. Martindale continues to refuse to sell the lot to the State, the Board of Regents requests the Commissioner of Finance to instigate condemnation proceedings to require the court to decide the matter.

The president explained in detail the PRIORITY NEEDS of the College. A committee of the faculty was selected to make a study of these needs. The committee reported that the college had outgrown the quarters used for Maintenance, Industrial Arts Building, and a Classroom Building. It was further stated that the Commonwealth of Kentucky had allocated the sum of \$1,000 to cover the cost of Phase A in planning this Maintenance-Industrial Arts Building, and Mr. James Clark, of Lexington, had been designated as the architect to proceed with plans; and that \$2,000 had been allocated for Phase A in planning for the Classroom Building, and Mr. George Lusk, of Ashland, had been designated as the architect to proceed with the planning of this building. Dr. Doran stated that he would present these plans in justifying our requests for appropriations for capital construction by the 1960 Legislature.

The problem of the movement of traffic on the college campus was presented to the Board. In this connection, the president called attention to the necessity of widening the street behind the college campus. The Board concurred with the president in this matter, and requested that he proceed to request the Department of Highways to widen Fifth Street, at the rear of the campus.

Mrs. Shannon called the attention of the Board to the fact that the President did not request an increase in salary when the budget was adopted, and the personnel roster was approved at the meeting on May 15, 1959, and the Board did not discuss the matter of raising the president's salary, even though all other faculty and staff members were given substantial raises for the 1959-60 fiscal year. This matter was discussed rather thoroughly by the Board. President Doran explained that he had

never recommended a raise for himself and did not desire to do so now. He further stated that he thought it would not be propitious for the Board to raise salary at this time, in view of the recent ruling of the Court of Appeals on the constitutional limit of salaries. The Board decided to go on record in favor of raising the president's salary for the 1959-60 fiscal year at such time as to be determined by a final ruling by the Court of Appeals on the constitutional limit on salaries of State employees, and the amount of the raise to be determined by the Board to be retroactive to July 1, 1959, and on motion of Mrs. Shannon, seconded by Mr. Reed, with all members voting aye, the abovesetup was unanimously approved regarding the salary of President Doran.

On motion of Mr. Reed, seconded by Mr. Gilley, and unanimously carried, President Doran was authorized to use food from the college cafeteria for entertaining visitors and guests of the college.

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried, the meeting was adjourned, subject to call of the chairman.
