Morehead, Kentucky April 3, 1963

The Board of Regents of Morehead State College, Morehead, Kentucky, convened in an adjourned session of its regular quarterly meeting of January 10, 1963, in the office of the President of the College, at Morehead, Kentucky, on April 3, 1963, at 11:00 A. M., Eastern Standard Time. The Honorable Wendell P. Butler, Chairman was in the Chair presiding and upon call of the roll it was ascertained that the following members of the Board were present:

Also present were Dr. Adron Doran, the President of the College, and Miss Anna B. Carter, Secretary of the Board, and Messrs. C. W. Grafton and Spencer E. Harper, Jr., of Grafton, Ferguson & Fleischer, Bond Counsel.

It having been determined that a quorum was present for transaction of business, the Chairman called the meeting to order.

The invocation was given by Mr. G. C. Banks.

On motion of Mr. Gilley, seconded by Mr. Chamberlain, and unanimously carried, the minutes of the meeting held January 10, 1963, were not read, but were approved since copies had been mailed to all Board members.

President Doran reminded the Board of Regents that one of the principal items of business to be transacted was receiving, considering, and taking action upon such bids as might be received for the purchasing of \$215,000.00 "Housing System Revenue Bonds of 1961, Series E," and \$725,000.00 "Housing System Revenue Bonds of 1961, Series F," and bids therefor had been received in the President's office and were ready for consideration.

The President was then called upon by the Chairman to present for opening and consideration by the Board all purchase bids received in his office at or prior to 11:00 A. M., Eastern Standard Time, on the day of the meeting. President Doran stated that before doing so, he felt he should tender to the Board proof of proper advertising of the Bond sale according to the requirements of KRS Chapter 424, and in that connection presented an Affidavit of an employee of The Courier-Journal and Louisville Times, Louisville, Kentucky, and an Affidavit from an employee of The Bond Buyer, New York, New York, each showing publication of the authorized "Notice of Sale of Bonds" on March 19, 1963.

President Doran then handed to the Chairman the sealed bids so received in his office, and said bids were publicly opened and read.

It was noted that in conformity with the College's Loan Agreements two bids were received from Housing and Home Finance Agency of the United States Government, one offering to purchase all of said Housing Sytem Revenue Bonds, Series E, or such lesser amount of the Bonds as might be awarded to it if equal or better bids should be received in conformity with the prescribed terms and conditions, such bid being at a price of par or face value, plus accrued interest upon condition that the Bonds awarded to said Housing and Home Finance Agency be caused to bear a single uniform interest rate of three and three-eighths per centum (3-3/8%) per annum; and one offering to purchase all of said Housing System Revenue Bonds, Series F, or such lesser amount of the Bonds as might be awarded to it if equal or better bids should be received in conformity with the prescribed terms and conditions, such bid being at a price of par or face value, plus accrued interest upon condition that the Bonds awarded to said Housing and Home Finance Agency be caused to bear a single uniform interest rate of three and three-eighths per centum (3-3/8%) per annum.

All bids were examined for compliance with the prescribed terms and conditions, and compared in the manner set forth in the "Statement of Terms and Conditions of Bond Sale."

Thereupon, Board Member Gilley introduced, caused to be read in full by the Secretary, and moved immediate adoption of a Resolution, as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF MOREHEAD STATE COLLEGE ACCEPTING THE BEST BIDS RECEIVED FOR PURCHASING \$215,000 "MOREHEAD STATE COLLEGE HOUSING SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF 1961, SERIES E," AND \$725,000 "MOREHEAD STATE COLLEGE HOUSING SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF 1961, SERIES F," AS AUTHORIZED BY A RESOLUTION ADOPTED ON JANUARY 10, 1963, AND ESTABLISHING THE INTEREST COUPON RATES TO BE MADE APPLICABLE THERETO.

# THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF MOREHEAD STATE COLLEGE, MOREHEAD, KENTUCKY, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined and declared that the best bids received in the office of the President of the College, in Morehead Kentucky, prior to 11:00 A. M., Eastern Standard Time, on April 3, 1963, for the purchase of \$215,000 "Morehead State College Housing System Revenue Bonds of 1961, Series E," and \$725,000 "Morehead State College Housing System Revenue Bonds of 1961, Series F," dated November 1, 1961, are the following:

Section 2. Said Bonds shall bear interest from their date until paid at coupon rates set forth in Section 1 hereof, and the printer may be instructed to proceed with the preparation of the Bonds in accordance therewith.
