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Chair's Report:

• The need still exists for a Faculty Assessment Coordinator on the General Education Council

A member asked what the duties of the Faculty Assessment Coordinator are and if there is a need for a fulltime person and an Assessment Office. The members discussed the Faculty Assessment Coordinator position at length and the meaning of "Faculty". Provost Hughes asked for clarification of the relationship between the Faculty Assessment Coordinator and the office in Academic Affairs that oversees Assessment and Professional Development in order to maintain continuity in the area of assessment. Chair Berglee suggested the Gen Ed Council review this issue.

- Terry Irons volunteered to serve on the task force to review the University Smoking Policy.
- Senator Chatham provided the Senators with a copy and explained Part 1 Order of Precedence of Motions and Part 2 Six Basic Facts about Each Motion from *Roberts Rules of Order*. The Senators discussed how motions are handled during the meetings.

Senate Actions:

Governance:

Item #3, Teacher Education Committee (description update), has been moved by Chair Berglee to review by the Governance Committee prior being returned to the full Senate.

The Governance Committee recommended Ed Reeves fill the vacant position on the Faculty Promotion Committee and Carol Wymer fill the vacant position on the General Education Council. The members approved the recommendations.

Academic Policies:

At the last meeting, the Academic Policies Committee was charged "to evaluate the effect on the original document and report to the full Senate in two weeks" regarding the "stipulations" document attached to Senate Motion 14.17 - General Education Curriculum and Courses Distribution Proposal. The Provost provided the Academic Policies Committee and the Senate members with a "Clarification of Provost Comments on General Education Framework" (a condensed version of the "stipulations document"). Senator Irons stated "the intent was not to modify substantively any of the structure of the framework; the intent was to provide guidance to the General Education Council as they move through the process of implementation of the framework". Senator Iron's opinion is that "her comments do not in any way substantively modify what the Senate forwarded to the Administration in the spring". Senator Irons explained the five points in the clarification document. Senator Irons asked for questions. Senator Irons stated that there are items in the Gen Ed Faculty Senate Minutes October 15, 2009 Page 3

Framework that need to be reviewed. Senator Irons recommended the Senate approve the President's concurrence with the "stipulations". The members discussed at length specifically what the motion under consideration was. Regent Morrison moved to take off the table the motion from the October 1st meeting. Discussion followed. Regent Morrison withdrew his motion. A Senator was concerned about how the "stipulations" document will be perceived by the general faculty. The Provost stated that "General Education review and redesign was a result of the President's directive to do that, and as his Chief Academic Officer, I then took responsibility for it and it is a high priority, because it is an integral part of providing the kind of academic foundation that our students not only should have but deserve to have" and "we will try our very best to do that which is necessary to make this General Education Program a 21st century program."

Chair Berglee clarified that the motion, from a previous meeting, on the floor now is to reject the "stipulations" document. He stated that the motion went to the Academic Policies Committee and they have presented their findings to the full Senate. Senator Irons offered a friendly amendment to the motion to approve the President's concurrence with "stipulations". Senator Katz and Senator Hennen accepted the friendly amendment. Senator Irons moved to end debate and call the question. The motion to accept the "stipulations" as clarified by the Provost's documentation was approved.
