STUDENT HOUSING FEES

The President appointed a committee to study the matter of housing fees charged composed of:

Russell McClure, Vice President for Fiscal Affairs
Roger Wilson, Vice President for Student Affairs
Gene Scholes, Assistant to the President
John Graham, Controller
Larry Stephenson, Director of Housing

The committee met and reviewed all fees charged to students living in University-owned housing.

At the present time the university is charging \$10.00 per semester to all female students living in self-regulated residence halls. The revenues from this source have been used to defray the costs of additional residence hall night clerks and additional security.

The committee reviewed this fee and considers it to be in violation of the spirit of P.L. 92-318, Title IX, Sec. 901(a).

On the basis of the committee study I am requesting this Board to approve the following changes:

1. Eliminate the fee of \$10.00 for women living in self-regulated halls.
2. Increase room rates \$12.00 per semester for all residence halls. (men and women)
3. Place a night clerk in all residence halls for men and women to increase security at night which is badly needed.
4. Maintain the present system of regulated halls and self-regulated halls for women and continue to require parental permission for assignment.

5. Continue to maintain the same closing hours for all women's residence halls as presently used. (12:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 2:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday)
6. Night Clerks on duty in all residence halls will enable the women students to live in the residence hall of their choice according to classification (freshmen and upperclass) as both regulated and self-regulated hours can be administered in each hall.
7. The recommended increases in room rent will be sufficient to cover the cost of operation for 1974-75 fiscal year.

Use of Motorcycles on Campus

On March 29, 1974, the Student Government Association presented to the Student Life Committee a proposal having to do with the registration and operation of motorcycles on the campus of Morehead State University.

On Monday, April 29, the Student Life Committee discussed the proposal and approved the following to become effective at the beginning of the fall semester in August, 1974:

Students enrolled at Morehead State University be permitted to register and operate motorcycles in certain areas of the campus of Morehead State University as follows:

- A. Motorcycles be restricted from the following areas:
 - 1. On University Boulevard from Elizabeth Avenue to Battson Avenue
 - 2. On Battson Avenue from Second Street to Ward Oates Drive
 - 3. On Ward Oates Drive from Battson Avenue to Earle Clements Lane.
- B. A student is not permitted to register both an automobile and a motorcycle for the same period of time at Morehead State University.
- C. The same registration procedure that applies to automobiles would also apply to motorcycles.
- D. The parking of motorcycles shall be limited to those areas designated by the Bureau of Student Affairs. Fines for traffic violations on motorcycles will be the same as automobiles.

Justifications and Implications of the Proposed
Environmental Studies Major with Options (Ecology;
Geology; Chemistry and Physics; Social Studies and Economics)

1. The entire program is based upon existing courses. It does not require the introduction of new courses; rather, it is a realignment.
2. All options within the major require the same group of core courses. Option differences are between the required courses for the emphasis, required complementary courses, and suggested courses for satisfying general education requirements.
3. Additional options can be added. One other option has been mentioned as a distinct future possibility (Health).
4. Flexibility is built into all options. The grand total of hours for each option leaves several elective hours for the student. In some cases, even within required course categories, there are options. For example, item B-6 under the emphasis in ecology option permits the student to choose one course from five specific ones.
5. Certain general education requirements have been chosen because they are complementary to the major emphasis. This is preferable to open-ended course selection by the student. Each general education requirement chosen has relevance to the particular option.
6. Depending upon the option chosen, the major will have from 53 to 57 hours. The judicious choice of a minor would enable the student to be better prepared than ever before in most of the areas.
7. The options can lead to a Bachelor of Arts degree or a Bachelor of Science degree depending upon which option is chosen.
8. The options permit the student to obtain a teaching certificate in those subjects approved for certification. This is particularly important in designing environmental studies major programs because the state of Kentucky and other states do not issue a certificate in environmental studies. Therefore, if a teaching certificate would be useful to a student opting for the ecology emphasis, for example, he can be certified in biology since he will have met the requirements for certification.
9. Very few schools in the nation have similar programs and their graduates are being hired. Our graduates can be placed in an industrial or governmental job market and, therefore, open doors for future graduates. This program will be the only program of its kind in this state (Eastern does have a natural resources major, but it is a narrower program).

Proposed Environmental Studies Major

10. The entire program is designed for easy student understanding. Each option is outlined in specific terms and categorized.
11. There are presently 62 Environmental Science Minors. The Environmental Science Minor started in the spring of 1973 and will be kept as a viable student choice. Student enrollment in the minor is expected to decrease next year if the Environmental Studies Major is approved because many of the minors have been waiting for this program and will switch from the minor to the major. However, if the trend in the past year is any indication, this minor will recover and remain viable as an awareness type of course of study.
12. It is requested that the present Environmental Science Minor be changed to the Environmental Studies Minor and that the Environmental Science Committee be changed to the Environmental Studies Committee.

THE EFFECT OF VITA FERM ON
THE FEED EFFICIENCY OF GROWING AND FATTENING STEERS

INTRODUCTION

A number of growth stimulus have been used in the commercial production of beef. The most notable of these is DIETHYLSTILBESROL (DES) which is given both orally or by subcutaneous implantation. Since DES is questionable in its use and has been pulled from the available growth stimulants, it is proposed that an experiment be designed with Vita-Ferm to determine its effect on the growth and feeding of steers.

EXPERIMENTAL PROCEDURE

Forty (40) steers will be purchased between the weights of 400-450 pounds with an attempt made to obtain steers that have been under similar genetic backgrounds and under similar feeding practices. Twenty of the steers will be implanted with the growth stimulant (DES) upon arrival of the calves at Morehead State University. All steers will be weighed, wormed and vaccinated as deemed necessary. Of the forty (40) steers, there will be random selection of four (4) groups of ten (10) steers each. The groups will be as follows:

- Pen 1 - DES plus Vita-Ferm
- Pen 2 - DES
- Pen 3 - Vita-Ferm
- Pen 4 - Control

The feed will consist of roughage and concentrates. The steers will receive 1-2% of their body weight as concentrates and all the hay or other roughage they want to eat. Any concentrate or roughage not consumed will be weighed back each day. The amount of Vita-Ferm used will be according to recommendations set

forth by the manufacturer. Vita charge will be fed at the rate of 25 pounds per ton the first two weeks of the feeding period after which Vita-Ferm beef will be used. Steers will be weighed at the beginning of the tests and at 28-day intervals for a total feeding period of 180 days, or depending on the time required to finish the animals.

A local abattoir will slaughter the steers and record the needed carcass information. The following live and carcass information will be determined:

- Feed conversion ratio
- Average daily gain
- Feed consumed
- Slaughter weight
- Hot carcass weight
- Chilled carcass weight
- Rib-eye area (12th rib)
- Fat thickness (12th rib)
- USDA carcass grade
- Per-cent of Kidney fat
- Per-centage yield of retail cuts (yield grade)

The Biozyme Enterprises will furnish the steers, feed, and the cost of veterinarian services and student labor. Morehead State University will furnish the professional assistance, facilities, and compile and analyze the experimental data. It is also suggested that this be the beginning of several experiments conducted on the Vita-Ferm at Morehead State University.
