The Board of Regents of Morehead State University met for its third regular quarterly meeting on Friday, August 23, 1985, at 6:00 p.m. in the Riggle Room of the Adron Doran University Center.

**I. CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Robert M. Duncan called the meeting to order.

**II. INVOCATION**

Regent John R. Duncan delivered the invocation.

**III. ROLL CALL**

**IV. ACTION ON MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD JUNE 15, 1985**

Motion by Mr. LaViers, seconded by Dr. Skaggs, that the minutes of the meeting held June 15, 1985, be approved as distributed. Motion unanimously carried.

**V. OATH ADMINISTERED**

The oath of office was administered by Notary Public Carol Johnson to Ms. Margaret Holt, newly elected

student representative on the Board of Regents for the 1985-86 fiscal year ending June 30, 1986, pursuant to KRS 164.320, Subsection 5.

Without objection, Chairman Duncan indicated that item VI. **CONSIDERATION OF PRESIDENT'S CONTRACT** would be deferred until all members were present. Hearing no objection, the Chair recognized Dr. Reinhard for item VII. **REPORT OF PRESIDENT.**

President Reinhard presented a written report (Exhibit VII-A) which constituted a compilation of the significant items achieved during the past 1984-85 year by the students, faculty, staff and administration of the university. Dr. Reinhard further stated that under law the university was required to print and distribute an Annual President's Report which would be distributed on or about September 3, 1985.

Secondly, Dr. Reinhard distributed a printed copy (Exhibit VII-B) of the University Standing Committees and their memberships for the 1985-86 year.

Thirdly, Dr. Reinhard distributed a copy of a letter (Exhibit VII-C) dated August 20, 1985, written by Mr. Porter Dailey, Treasurer of the Board of Regents, to Mr. Ed Mabry, Route 3, Morehead, Kentucky. At the meeting on April 26, 1985, the Board of Regents approved the sale of university-owned trailers at the Criqueside Trailer Park on the basis that housing was available on campus, that the trailers were costing the university approximately \$125,000 per year for maintenance due to their age and that the cost of leasing the land was \$59,040 per year. The sale of some of the trailers was scheduled during September but was postponed because the university had been contacted by an attorney representing Mr. Mabry indicating that Mr. Mabry owned the trailers.

Dr. Reinhard assured the Board that all of the purchase orders along with the cancelled checks were on file, but until it was determined who in fact owned the trailers, Dr. Reinhard felt that it was in the best interest of the university not to attempt the sale of any trailer.

Following the conclusion of the President's Report, the Chair opened the floor for a motion to go into executive session for item VI. **CONSIDERATION OF PRESIDENT'S CONTRACT.**

Motion by Dr. Skaggs, seconded by Mr. Cassity, that the Board go into executive session for the purpose of consideration of an extension of the President's contract. The Chair recognized Mr. Joe Lamb of The Morehead News who objected to the Board going into executive session. Mr. Lamb felt that consideration of an extension of the President's contract was not exempt under the Open Meetings Law. The Chair recognized Mr. F. C. Bryan, Legal Counsel for the Board of Regents. Mr. Bryan advised the Board that in his opinion, under exemption six of the Open Meetings Law, the Board could go into closed session for consideration of an extension of the President's contract. Chairman Duncan declared the motion to go into executive session passed with a vote of six to two.

Chairman Duncan announced that, without objection, due to the fire and safety hazards that existed with the overcrowded condition that the meeting would reconvene in another location following the closed session.

Judge Richardson came in at this point.

The closed session of the Board of Regents lasted for approximately two hours. Chairman Duncan, upon the conclusion of the closed session, reconvened the meeting in the auditorium of Breckinridge Hall at 8:50 p.m.

No action taken.

#### VIII. REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE AND FISCAL SERVICES

##### A. Sale of Surplus Property

Motion by Mr. LaViers, seconded by Dr. Skaggs, that the Board ratify the sale of surplus property in Exhibit VIII-A. Motion unanimously carried.

**B. Personnel Actions**

Motion by Dr. Duncan, seconded by Mr. Cassity, that the Board approve the personnel actions in Exhibit VIII-B. Motion unanimously carried.

**C. 1986-88 Capital Construction Requests**

Motion by Mr. LaViers, seconded by Dr. Skaggs, that the Board approve the 1986-88 Capital Construction and Equipment Request in Exhibit VIII-C. Motion unanimously carried.

**D. Budget Status Report**

President Reinhard provided a Budget Status Report (Exhibit VIII-D) and recommended that the Board establish a "Fund for Excellence" and that the proceeds from the sale of the three residential properties become the first deposit of funds to the account for the purpose of enhancing the academic programs of the institution. Motion by Mr. LaViers, seconded by Mr. Cassity, that the Board approve the President's recommendation. Motion unanimously carried.

**IX. REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON ACADEMIC AFFAIRS**

**A. 1985 Summer Graduates**

Motion by Mrs. Burchett, seconded by Dr. Skaggs, that the Board ratify the awarding of degrees to all candidates (Exhibit IX-A) who have successfully completed all degree requirements as approved by the faculty of the university at the 1985 Summer Commencement on August 3. Motion unanimously carried.

**B. Renaming of Office of Continuing Education to Office of Extended Campus Programs**

**C. Separation of Department of Psychology and Sociology**

Following extensive discussion, Dr. Skaggs moved, seconded by Mr. Cassity, to ratify renaming of the existing Office of Continuing Education the Office of Extended Campus Programs and, further, that Mr. George Eyster, the current **director** of Continuing Education, continue as the Director of the Extended Campus Programs.

Further, that the Board ratify the separation of the Department of Psychology and Sociology into two departments--Department of Psychology and Department of Sociology, Social Work and Corrections.

Motion carried on items B and C with Mrs. Burchett voting nay.

**X. Admission Index for 1986-87 through 1990-91**

President Reinhard reported (Exhibit X-A) that after careful deliberations by the President, Vice Presidents, Academic Deans and others and after review by representatives of the Faculty Senate and their concurrence, it was the intent of the administration to establish the following index scores as minimal admission requirements for Morehead State University:

6. Planned and executed successful observances of Community Day, Business and Industry Day and Legislative Day and organized the Town and Gown Committee for ongoing dialogue between campus and community.
7. Directed the most successful annual giving campaign in the University's history with a 25 percent increase in yearly gifts (\$241,000 to \$300,000) and secured a commitment for our largest cash gift ever, \$100,000 for scholarship endowment, distributed over 10 years.
8. Conducted effective national searches for several major positions with committees composed of faculty, staff and students and institutionalized the practice of students serving on key search and screening committees.
9. Merged the campus and community performing arts and lecture planning groups into a unified organization with increased funding.
10. Chartered new alumni chapters in Ashland and Paintsville, completed preliminary work on chapter organization in Prestonsburg and Cincinnati, renovated the hospitality area of the Alumni Center and organized the student alumni ambassador program.
11. Revamped the operation of conference coordination to reduce costs and gain efficiency through computerized scheduling of facilities and services.
12. Initiated winter commencement and revived summer commencement which, combined with spring commencement, allow timely recognition of graduates for their personal convenience.
13. Appointed a long-range strategic planning committee and completed the first phase of a campus-wide study of word processing.
14. Eliminated more than 90 percent of the individual course laboratory and/or activity fees paid by students.

#### Division of Academic Affairs

15. Streamlined the administrative structure through the merger of six schools into three colleges and 24 academic departments into 17, resulting in substantial reductions in operating costs.
16. Consolidated all extended campus programs under one office.

17. Decentralized the management of budgets; routine academic processes and official publications to increase efficiency and to be more responsive to needs of the various units.
18. Initiated internal studies of three larger academic departments which resulted in the current recommendation to separate the programs of the Department of Psychology and Sociology.
19. Improved utilization of administrative computing while upgrading the security of student records and other data.
20. Revised the total curricula in English and art and made other improvements in the teacher education and educational administration programs.
21. Received continued accreditation or favorable review of programs in teacher education, radiologic technology, nursing and veterinary technology.
22. Acquired new instructional equipment valued at more than \$180,000, including computer-assisted drafting, word processing for technical writing, a computerized organ and various scientific instrumentation, completed new broadcast facilities in Breckinridge Hall and new art exhibition space in the alternative gallery, renovated the outdoor kiln in art, initiated the automation of the library and completed three major structures at the Martiki-Morehead State Mountaintop Agricultural Complex in Martin County.
23. Expanded the Small Business Development Center to serve the Pikeville and Ashland areas, established a Small Coal Mine Operators Assistance Center and hosted our first statewide coal conference.
24. Opened a folk art museum as the first element of the planned Kentucky Heritage Collection.
25. Strengthened faculty-staff development through allocation of restricted funds for sabbatical leaves, scholars-in-residence and increased funding for professional travel.
26. Conducted extensive national searches in the recruitment of minority faculty and staff.
27. Increased the yearly stipend for graduate assistants and reserved certain positions for minority students.

28. Developed and implemented a selective general admissions policy, including a summer enrichment program for applicants with academic deficiencies, and raised the requirements for admission to teacher education.
29. Revamped the institutional scholarship program to emphasize academic excellence and personal leadership by providing larger awards with four-year commitments, including fully-paid scholarships for six new students qualifying as finalists (3) or semi-finalists (3) in National Merit competition.
30. Initiated Academic Honors Week to promote academic achievement by recognizing students and faculty who excelled during the year.
31. Completed a comprehensive study of the academic advising system, including recommendations for improvements to be considered during 1985-86.
32. Received external funding in the amount of \$2,033,155 for various research and service projects and contracted with non-university agencies to furnish \$245,734 in various services.

#### Division of Student Development

33. Restructured the division to implement a new student development philosophy which emphasizes community building, student involvement and student self-responsibility.
34. Assisted the President in opening communication channels with various student groups, including residence halls, Greek-letter organizations, the Student Association and minority students.
35. Expanded the summer orientation program for new students and their parents to a two-day schedule with separate program tracks for students and parents.
36. Revised the student handbook, student conduct code and judicial procedures to reflect the new student development philosophy.
37. Improved the student housing environment by permitting students to personalize residence hall rooms, by curtailing weekly room inspections, by eliminating freshman residence halls and by providing the option of coeducational housing.

38. Created the Office of Residence Education to strengthen residence hall programming and to improve professional qualifications of students and permanent staff employed in residence halls.
39. Converted Eagle Lake from a little-used reservoir to a recreational facility for members of the University community.
40. Relocated the student activities staff to new facilities at the University Center for better access to students and for expanded student programming in other newly-renovated areas of the building.
41. Increased the institutional commitment to minority students by appointing a full-time director of minority student affairs and by requesting nearly three times as much in state-allocated desegregation funds for the next biennium.
42. Broadened the outreach of the Counseling Center to serve non-traditional, minority and international students.
43. Enlarged the scope of career planning and placement and employed an experienced director with a doctorate.
44. Improved operational procedures in student health services to insure full compliance with state law regarding prescription drugs and medical devices.

#### Division of Administrative and Fiscal Services

45. Completed the renovation of Breckinridge Hall and refurbished the Palmer Development House, Senff Natatorium, Allen Field grandstand and the University Center atrium.
46. Erected the first coordinated exterior signage system and upgraded the appearance of buildings and grounds through extensive repair and repainting and better landscaping.
47. Installed the first phase of a key control system for all campus buildings.
48. Initiated the first university-wide evaluation system for all non-teaching employees and sponsored a series of employee recognition programs for faculty and staff.

49. Supervised the development and implementation of a new personnel policy manual which replaced all or parts of three other documents.
50. Revised and expanded the previously-rejected Affirmative Action Plan to win approval of the U.S. Office of Civil Rights.
51. Expanded employee benefits, including increased life insurance, improved medical insurance, the first dental insurance coverage for employees and extension of faculty-staff tuition waivers to summer sessions.
52. Offered all employees the option of semi-monthly paydays and direct bank deposit of paychecks.
53. Extended direct access to computing facilities to academic departments and other administrative units, made the new Prime 9955 computer fully operational and instituted electronic mail for major offices.
54. Initiated a total inventory of fixed assets to correct a longstanding deficiency in audit procedures by identifying and locating all physical property.
55. Established direct dispatch of safety and security officers for improved response and to provide 24-hour communications capability for students, employees and visitors.
56. Decentralized the budgeting of telephone service, copying and duplicating and postage for more efficient management.

Dear Colleagues:



Dear Mr. Mabry:

On August 15, 1985, Mr. Truman L. Dehner, hand delivered a letter to me setting forth the position that according to documents in your possession, that you were the owner of the mobile homes located in the Criqueside Mobile Home Park, the park which Morehead State University currently leases from you for \$40 per pad per month. In preparing for the sale of these mobile homes, we have learned, as Mr. Dehner's letter points out, that the titles to the mobile homes were not transferred to Morehead State University at the time of their purchase. I will not at this point speculate as to why titles were never delivered to Morehead State University at the times the payments totalling \$440,538.50 were made.

According to Morehead State University and the Commonwealth of Kentucky, records indicate the bulk of the mobile homes located in the Criqueside Park were purchased in four separate transactions.

- Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Finance Purchase Contract, No. CT 4357, dated July 1, 1970, under Invitation to Bid #S-276-71, amended July 17, 1970, resulted in the delivery of thirty-seven (37) mobile homes to Morehead State University on August 15, 1970. Receipt of the mobile homes was certified by Robert W. Stokes. The total contract price and check payable to Ed's Auto and Trailer Sales was \$132,588.50, authorized by Commonwealth of Kentucky, Distribution Voucher #10474.


- Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Finance, Purchase Contract No. CT 11461, dated March 18, 1971, under Invitation to Bid No. S-1922-71, resulted in the delivery of twenty (20) mobile homes to Morehead State University on May 3, 1971. Receipt of the mobile homes was certified by Robert W. Stokes. The total contract price and check payable to Ed's Auto and Trailer Sales was \$74,000, authorized by the Commonwealth of Kentucky Distribution Voucher #E4304.
- Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Finance, Purchase Contract No. CT 24076, dated July 7, 1971, under the terms and conditions of Invitation to Bid S-1922-71, resulted in the delivery of fifteen (15) mobile homes to Morehead State University on August 20, 1971. Receipt of the mobile homes was certified by Russell M. McClure. The total contract price and check payable to Ed's Auto and Trailer Sales was \$55,500, authorized by the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Distribution Voucher #14696.
- Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Finance, Purchase Contract No. CT 29089, dated November 16, 1971, under Invitation to Bid S-1098-72, resulted in the delivery of fifty (50) mobile to Morehead State University on January 8, 1972. Receipt of the mobile homes was certified by William C. Ewers. The total contract price and check payable to Ed's Auto and Trailer Sales was \$178,450, authorized by Commonwealth of Kentucky Distribution Voucher # 83935.

In briefly discussing this matter with Mr. Dehner, reference was made to an "agreement" that would result in the trailers reverting to your ownership after a specified period of time. I would appreciate you providing me with a copy of any written "agreement" that might exist between you and any former officials of Morehead State University or the Commonwealth of Kentucky, or your understanding of any verbal agreement that might have been made at the time of purchase.

**Exhibit VIII-A****SALE OF SURPLUS PROPERTY****Background**

In accordance with regulations adopted by the Board of Regents October 27, 1982, the University may declare surplus and sell at public auction surplus personal property.

On July 27, 1985, the Office of Business Services, Division of Administrative and Fiscal Services, conducted a surplus property sale in Richardson Arena at the Derrickson Agricultural Complex. All items listed in the attachment were sold at public auction resulting in gross revenue of \$8,454.91. Expenses from labor, advertising, auctioneer commission and sales tax amounted to \$2,773.43. Net proceeds to the University were \$5,681.48.

In addition, surplus livestock has been sold in accordance with university policy resulting in gross revenue to the university farm livestock enterprises of \$24,634.56.

## 1986-88 CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION REQUESTS

Background

The Council on Higher Education 1986-88 Capital Construction and Equipment Budget Requests Guidelines required that institutional requests be submitted to Council Staff by July 15, 1985. In accordance with the guidelines, a capital construction and equipment request totalling \$18,703,500 was submitted, pending approval by the Board of Regents. All construction projects of \$200,000 or greater, and items of equipment the cost of which is \$50,000 or greater, must have the approval of the executive and legislative branch of government before construction or purchase can commence. The guidelines required the request to be identified by the following categories:

Of the total biennial request, state general fund support of \$15,793,500 is sought. The remainder of the projects or items of equipment will be funded with institutional funds.

Major projects for which state support is sought includes the renovation of Fields, Thompson, Mays and Lappin Halls. State funds are also sought for the replacement of eight major roof systems, and the repair or replacement of nine major air conditioning systems. Funds for fire safety improvements, power plant improvements, water treatment plant improvements, and energy management are also requested.

Major items of equipment to be replaced or purchased in 1986-88 would include items for industrial robotics, industrial technology, academic and administrative computing, word processing, and miscellaneous items for the Physical Plant.

Recommendation

That the Board of Regents approve the 1986-88 Capital Construction and Equipment Request.

**Budget Status Report**  
**July 1, 1985 - August 23, 1985**

On July 1, 1985, we began the operating year with an approved budget of \$39.2 million. The state general fund appropriation for 1985-86 represents sixty percent (60%) of the total operating budget. Though relatively early in the fiscal year, there is no indication that state general fund receipts will fail to meet estimates as projected by the state when the 1984-86 biennial budget was prepared.

Summer II revenue projections were met. Summer II student headcount enrollment was 1,392. Expenditures for faculty salaries for the Summer II term were within the budgetary allotments available.

The first week of fall registration resulted in a student headcount enrollment of 5,418. According to the Registrar's Office, we will continue to enroll until September 3, 1985. The fall 1985 enrollment estimate for budget preparation purposes was based on a decline of four percent (4%). The projected decline was consistent with previous year enrollment losses. At this point, there is no indication that enrollments will decline beyond this projection which was made last April.

Various capital construction projects have been completed or are currently underway since the start of this fiscal year. The second phase of the campus paving project was completed prior to the start of the fall semester. Some minor landscaping is planned in the area of the Academic-Athletic Center and Jayne Stadium. The renovation of ADUC grill is underway with the target completion date of August 27. Restroom shower facilities in Cartmell Hall have been completed and the second phase of the installation of the Medeco key system has begun. Bids have been received on the Button Auditorium stage rigging and are being evaluated by the State Division of Facilities Management, University theatre, and Physical Plant personnel. An award is expected to be made in the next few days with a projected completion date scheduled for mid November.

As I informed you earlier, we received approval from Mr. Gordon Duke, Secretary of the Department of Finance, of an allotment from the state's repair and maintenance funds for

repairs to the ADUC roof and Baird Music Hall roof. Each roof project is estimated to cost \$50,000. Plans are underway at this time to make the repairs on Baird this fall. Repairs to the Student Center roof will be delayed until spring.

As you will recall, last spring the Board declared surplus and approved the sale of three (3) residential houses owned by the university and used for faculty and staff rental housing. Information received yesterday from the state Division of Real Properties scheduled the public sale for early October. It is estimated from preliminary appraisals that income from the sales will be approximately \$110,000. In accordance with the provisions of KRS 164A.620, "The Board of Regents is authorized to establish a "fund for excellence" trust fund into which gifts, grants, and special appropriation by the general assembly intended for such purpose may be deposited. The Board may also deposit into this fund proceeds from the sale of surplus property. Investment income from moneys in this fund shall be used only to enhance academic programs of the institution."

It is my recommendation that the Board establish a "Fund for Excellence" and that the proceeds from the sale of the three residential properties become the first deposit of funds to the account for the purpose of enhancing the academic programs of the institution. 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**RENAMING OF OFFICE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION  
TO OFFICE OF EXTENDED CAMPUS PROGRAMS**

**Background**

The concept of an office responsible for coordinating and developing academic and other special programs that extend beyond the campus has been discussed by Dr. Roberta Anderson, Vice President for Academic Affairs, and the Deans. Many of the components of such a program are already in place and functioning under the direction of the Office of Continuing Education. The bulk of the responsibilities in Continuing Education was inherent to the office prior to the October 1, 1984, reorganization, but since then other responsibilities have been added in an effort to streamline and use personnel and other resources more effectively. With these added responsibilities and the diversification of services, it is apparent that the office needs a title that more clearly defines its scope and functions and that one individual should be given the responsibility for working with the Deans to monitor present activities and determine its future directions. The Director of the Office of Extended Campus Programs will report to the Dean for Graduate and Special Academic Programs as did the Director of Continuing Education.

The following components will be included in the Office of Extended Campus Programs:

1. Continuing Education--responsible for planning, establishing, expanding, improving and maintaining all continuing education nonformal, nonacademic activities of the University. The office is responsible for the systematic collection, maintenance and retrieval of records related to: (a) individual continuing education units and (b) institutional continuing education units in the following subcategories: Education Services (programs planned by external agencies); Personal Enrichment/Special Interest (Community Education); Continuing Recurrent Education; Preparatory and/or Adult Basic Education; and Community Service.

2. Correspondence Study--program offers credit courses to over 250 students. There are 24 faculty offering 37 courses. The scope of work includes the management of all present services, fee collection, faculty payment, materials production, advisement and maintenance of records.

3. Credit by TV--coordination and administration of credit courses offered in collaboration with the Kentucky Council on Higher Education and Kentucky Educational Television. The scope of work includes the preview and selection of TV courses to be offered through MSU; the local promotion of programs throughout

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eastern Kentucky; maintenance and retrieval of records and program evaluation.

4. Coordination of Regional Instruction--coordination and development of graduate and undergraduate offerings at the six (6) regional instructional centers.

5. Kentucky Educational Development Corporation--provides a linkage system to 39 school districts for all educational endeavors in our service area.

6. Inservice Education--MSU assists 31 districts in planning, delivery, and evaluating inservice programs. Our inservice coordinator, Dr. George Troutt, serves on a State Department of Education Committee which is designed to implement and evaluate the "cutting edge" programs in education. At the present time, we are involved in the following program efforts:

- (a) Beginning teaching internship
- (b) Education for economic security
- (c) Evaluation of all public school personnel
- (d) Implementing "Inservice Institutes" for credits toward Rank I and Rank II
- (e) Implementing "Teacher Training Academies"

7. Coordinating gifted students' program in 31 school districts--campus activity associated with the program is Project Challenge. This summer there were 20 students (paying their own tuition) enrolled in Calculus I and Composition.

8. Speakers Bureau

9. Area Health Education System (AHES)--Coordinates and prepares reports and evaluation for Allied Health program receiving budgeted funds. Currently, Radiologic Technology, Medical Technology and Environmental Sciences are receiving funds.

### Recommendation

That the Board ratify renaming of the existing Office of Continuing Education the Office of Extended Campus Programs and, further, that Mr. George Eyster, the current director of Continuing Education, continue as the Director of the Extended Campus Programs.

## SEPARATION OF DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY AND SOCIOLOGY

### Background

The rationale for separating the Department of Psychology and Sociology into two departments--Department of Sociology, Social Work and Corrections and Department of Psychology--has two primary parts. First, the emphasis of the programs in Sociology, Social Work and Corrections is applied in nature. Most of the degrees granted are in the two applied areas of Social Work and Corrections. Only about one fourth of the majors are in general Sociology.

Secondly, there is a strong feeling among the faculty that the applied programs in Social Work and Corrections need greater visibility. The best way to achieve that visibility is through having a separate Department of Sociology, Social Work and Corrections.

### Recommendation

That the Board ratify the separation of the Department of Psychology and Sociology into two departments--Department of Psychology and Department of Sociology, Social Work and Corrections.

**ADMISSION INDEX FOR 1986-87 THROUGH 1990-91**

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In October 1984 the President recommended minimal admission standards beginning for the Fall Semester 1985. Coupled with that recommendation was the establishment of a University Enrichment Program beginning in the summer of 1985. The recommendation for both admission standards and the University Enrichment Program were approved unanimously by the Board. It was indicated at the time of the recommendations that a 300 index score would be used for the 1985-86 academic year with the intent to increase that index minimally over the next five (5) years. For information the index is the applicant's ACT score x 10 and the applicant's high school grade point average x 100. For example, to meet the 300 index score for 1985-86 an applicant could have a 2.0 high school grade point average and 10 on the ACT.

After careful deliberations by the President, Vice Presidents, Academic Deans and others and after review by representatives of the Faculty Senate and their concurrence, it is the intent of the administration to establish the following index scores as minimal admission requirements for Morehead State University.

1986-87	320
1987-88	340
1988-89	360
1989-90	380
1990-91	400

It is significant to note that based on the pool of student applicants for the Fall Semester of 1985, an index score of 320 would have impacted approximately fifty (50) applicants. It is also significant to note that the 300 index score for 1985-86 resulted in approximately twelve (12) students not meeting the minimal admission standards. Of those twelve, six (6) entered the University Enrichment Program and five (5) of those six

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have successfully completed that program and will enroll as freshmen in the 1985 Fall Semester.

It should be noted that the maximum score of 400 in the 1990-91 academic year may be reached with the following examples:
