BOARD OF REGENTS MOREHEAD STATE UNIVERSITY

Minutes of Meeting of March 11, 1986

The Board of Regents of Morehead State University met in special session on Tuesday, March 11, 1986, at 9 a.m. in the Riggle Room of the Adron Doran University Center in Morehead, Kentucky. Temporary Chairman Louie B. Nunn presided.

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Nunn called the meeting to order at 9 a.m.

II. ROLL CALL

Chairman Nunn announced a quorum was present and proceeded with the orders of the day.

IV. & V. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

On the advice of Legal Counsel, Mr. F. C. Bryan, and in accordance with the Bylaws, Chairman Nunn indicated that the appropriate legal procedure would be to elect a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer, and Secretary to serve until such time as the officers can be chosen at the first regular quarterly meeting.

Chairman Nunn entertained a motion for the office of Chairman whereupon Governor Breathitt nominated Governor

Nunn. Mr. Wheeler seconded the motion. There being no further nominations, Governor Nunn was elected Chairman by unanimous consent.

Mr. Wheeler nominated Governor Breathitt to serve as Vice Chairman. Mr. Seaton seconded the motion. There being no further nominations, Governor Breathitt was elected Vice Chairman by unanimous consent.

Chairman Nunn said that in so far as he was concerned this was a new beginning for Morehead State University in that they expected the Board to be very active and very positive. The Board meetings would be open and public and they invited the participation of students at future meetings. If any student or student organization has anything to present to the Board he asked that they reduce it to writing and that it be brought and presented to the Board. He indicated it would be heard and discussed and he hoped they would make themselves available for questions. The same applies to the faculty. If there are matters of concern relating to the university, any suggestions that would improve this university or higher education in general, those comments would be welcome and should be submitted in writing. There would be a free and open discussion of them. As far as he was personally concerned, they were not here to engage in personalities, they were here to work with those who hold university positions and he hoped responsibly so and to see that they carry out the functions of those positions.

He said that the meetings were open and he was delighted to see the number of people present, but advised that the Board did not expect to put on an exhibition for the benefit of the press. The Board expects to be in charge, we expect to make everything public, and we expect to move forward as expeditiously as time will permit. This is the position we expect to take and we look to this as a new beginning in the furtherance and causes of a great institution and we will act in that manner.

Mr. Seaton nominated Mr. Porter Dailey, Vice President for Administrative and Fiscal Services, to serve as Treasurer. Dr. Lansing seconded the motion. There being no further nominations, Mr. Dailey was elected Treasurer by unanimous consent.

Mr. Seaton nominated Ms. Carol Johnson, Secretary to the President, to serve as Secretary at the current annual stipend of \$3,090. Ms. Curry seconded the motion. There being no further nominations, Ms. Johnson was elected Secretary by unanimous consent.

III. ACTION ON MINUTES OF MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 4,

Chairman Nunn deferred to Legal Counsel Bryan for advice on what action should and could be taken on the November 4, 1985, minutes. Mr. Bryan advised that the Board could consider the minutes, but the seven new members who did not participate in that meeting would have to abstain. The three other members could approve them, but they would not constitute a majority and the Board would have to take its chances on the actions being challenged. Chairman Nunn directed President Reinhard to place on the agenda of the next meeting those items which are essential to the operation of the university and the new Board would take action on those items.

Without objection from any member of the Board, Governor Nunn called on President Reinhard to make whatever remarks he might have concerning items on the agenda and to introduce the Vice Presidents and others who might be present.

President Reinhard introduced the members of the President's Executive Cabinet:

Dr. Roberta Anderson, Vice President for Academic Affairs;

Dr. Gary Grace, Vice President for Student Development;

Mr. Porter Dailey, Vice President for Administrative and Fiscal Services; and

Mr. Keith Kappes, Assistant to the President for University Relations and Director of Conferences.

Dr. Reinhard also introduced his wife, Nancy; the President of the MSU Alumni Association, Mr. David Bolt; and Mrs. Claudia Grace, wife of Dr. Gary Grace.

VI. ORGANIZATION OF BOARD COMMITTEES

President Reinhard said that the previous Board was organized into three committees which reflected the three divisions of the university—Academic Affairs, Administrative and Fiscal Services and Student Development. The purpose of organizing into committees was to somewhat streamline the work of the Board. The committees would meet when necessary with both the President and the appropriate Vice President to discuss any item in that division that would appear on the agenda of the next Board meeting with the intent of that committee to present those items at the Board meeting and recommend action to be taken.

Legal Counsel Bryan said that his Board of Regents Handbook did not reflect the new committee structure.

Chairman Nunn asked, without objection from the other Board members and the President, that Mr. Bryan review and revise all policy and procedures manuals.

Dr. Lansing suggested that the Board not divide itself into committees at this stage since it was a new Board and he felt all of the members had an interest in the total workings of the institution. To take a Board of such small numbers and divide it into three committees, when the Board does not know the problems or issues, would be premature. Ms. Curry and Chairman Nunn concurred.

Following discussion and to be in compliance with the Bylaws, Dr. Lansing moved that each member of the Board be appointed to all three of the standing committees of the Board. Motion was seconded by Mr. Seaton and unanimously approved.

Prior to moving to the next agenda item, Chairman Nunn said President Reinhard had made reference on two occasions during the meeting to a telephone discussion he and Dr. Reinhard had and he wanted to clarify that for the benefit of everyone. When the meeting was held in Frankfort after the brief session with the Governor, he was named Temporary Chairman. As Temporary Chairman he was charged with inviting the Governor of the Commonweal at some later time to come to Morehead State University to a public meeting in order that she might address the administration, faculty, staff, students and entire region. The sole purpose of her visit would be to advise everyone that the support of the Governor's office and the Commonwealth of Kentucky, to the extent she could control it, would be behind Morehead State University.

The second responsibility was to call Dr. Reinhard and advise him that the Board wanted a meeting today and to request that he plan the agenda.

Chairman Nunn declared a ten-minute recess at 9:45 a.m. At 9:55 a.m., Chairman Nunn declared the Board to be back in session.

Chairman Nunn indicated that what has transpired at Morehead State University is not anything different than may have transpired at other universities. This is not the first time this university has had problems. In years gone by there were serious problems that resulted in the disaccreditation of Morehead State University. At that time, there were those critics who said the university would not survive. It did survive

and has rendered a great contribution to the causes of higher education. Morehead State University will survive because it has the power and desire to survive and the people that it serves are strong people. He asked Mr. David Bolt, President of the Alumni Association, to encourage those who have attended the University and enjoyed the benefits it has offered to take positive action to participate in the academic and athletic activities of this school to continue to encourage its growth.

VII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS AND REPORT BY REGENT WILLIAM R. SEATON

Mr. Seaton asked Mr. Porter Dailey to make the presentation on the financial status of the university

President Reinhard indicated that there had been a lot of negative publicity given to the university's financial posture. It had been reported in the media that the university could have a 1.7 million dollar deficit for 1986-87, but The administration unfortunately that was reported out of context. has looked at all of the possible scenarios for 1986-87. university has experienced, with the exception of one year, a nine-year decline in its enrollment and the faculty/staff complement is based on a much larger enrollment than we currently The worst scenario we can depict for 1986-87, enrollment wise, would result, if no action was taken, in a 1.7 million dollar operating deficit. We also reported that at the end of this fiscal year the university would have about a one million dollar balance in the fund balance, not the operating balance. Unfortunately, that was not reported accurately by the press or state officials. The university will end this fiscal year with one million dollars in its fund balance which is nonrecurring. In other words, once it is spent, it is gone.

In responding to a question by Governor Breathitt on how long it would take, with the current faculty attrition rate and student enrollment, for the faculty/staff complement to reach the proper level for our number of students, President Reinhard indicated that the university has an overage of between 25-50 faculty based on current enrollment and that it could even be in the 40 to 50 range. At that rate, it would take five or more years.

President Reinhard further indicated that the Kentucky Legislature over the years had done a fine job of funding higher education and that Morehead State University had received funds near the top of the allocation formula. He stated that the problem was that many funds have been in places that have been non-productive and that we continue to allocate funds for programs

and projects that probably should be reduced or in fact eliminated. It means that our priorities need to be reviewed and rearranged. A number of academic disciplines have had considerable enrollment declines over the past six to seven years while other departments have had major enrollment increases. The declining departments have generally too many faculty while the increasing departments have the need to add faculty.

Dr. Duncan suggested that the Board consider an early retirement program. He said that many of the faculty were employed in the late 50's and 60's when there was a tremendous period of growth and such is not the case now. With a number of these people only two or three years away from retirement, the Board might look at initiating an early incentive retirement program to encourage people to leave. Many of these people are in disciplines where they are not needed. No discussion followed.

At the request of Chairman Nunn, Dr. Roberta Anderson, Vice President for Academic Affairs, presented an admissions status report which provided a comparison of applicant pools for January 1985 with January 1986. She reported that in-state students had declined from 547 in 1985 to 307 this year; however, out-of-state students had increased from 106 in 1985 to 312 this year. She said that new data would become available in a few days which could be significantly different. That data will compare mid-March information for 1985 and 1986. Dr. Anderson also noted that the attrition rate for freshman students had declined last semester. Normally, the university can expect to lose up to 50 percent of its freshman class through attrition, but that figure had declined to 20 percent. She indicated that this figure is slightly better than two of our sister institutions.

After discussing the need for a closer working relation-ship with the school superintendents, principals and other personnel, Chairman Nunn asked Regent Duncan to work with Dr. Anderson to furnish at their earliest convenience a plan and program for recruitment in the immediate and eastern Kentucky area and that a copy of the plan and program be forwarded as soon as it is put together to Governor Breathitt and himself.

President Reinhard indicated that he had appointed an Enrollment Management Task Force with the primary role to study and discuss all aspects of the declining enrollment, outline and specify the projected reasons for the declines and recommend measures to improve the overall enrollment and retention picture. Dean Robert Burns, Chairperson of the Task Force, offered brief comments on the work of that group. Chairman Nunn asked that Dean Burns and his Task Force provide a preliminary report to the Board by the end of March.

In meetings involving the recruitment of students and activities related to the alumni, Governor Nunn suggested that it might be beneficial to include Mr. Bolt, President of the MSU Alumni Association. Later Dr. Lansing suggested, with the concurrence of other members, that the Alumni Association President serve as an ex-officio member of the Board. If it would not be appropriate for Mr. Bolt to serve as an ex-officio member, the Chairman could invite him to attend the meetings as his guest.

President Reinhard advised that he assigned some eight or nine months ago President Emeritus Morris Norfleet the responsibility of surveying all of our living alumni on their perceptions of all aspects of the university. Chairman Nunn directed the President to provide to the Board a list of the programs directed to alumni specifying the project and the person responsible.

Following extensive discussion on the university's financial situation, Dr. Reinhard was asked to identify some of the areas he would consider for reducing the 1986-87 budget:

Dr. Reinhard stated as follows:

--Athletics

The university currently subsidizes its athletics program by 1.3 million dollars over and above all athletics income and the student activities fee. The subsidy comes from our regular operating budget, and at the expense of all academic programs.

--Faculty and Staff

The university currently has 25-50 too many faculty.

--Derrickson Agricultural Complex

The university currently subsidizes the agricultural program by \$239,000 annually. This amount also comes directly from the operating budget and at the expense of all academic programs.

Chairman Nunn also raised questions on the university's golf course which is subsidized by approximately \$25,000 per year. He emphasized that the Board was simply looking at all of the alternatives to better serve education, and it should not be construed to mean that they have decided to eliminate any programs.

At the request of Mr. Wheeler, Dr. Reinhard, Dr. Anderson and Dean Burns identified several programs where there have been decreases in enrollment and the reasons for those decreases.

Chairman Nunn and Mr. Aker asked about the Governor allocating \$500,000 additional funds for the university for 1986-87 and the university not being receptive to those funds. In response, Dr. Reinhard said that the Governor placed in the Executive Budget proposal \$500,000 to assist Morehead State University in offsetting the financial loss of a declining enrollment. The university did not request it, it was never put in our budget proposal, it was not approved by the Board of Regents and we have not lobbied for it.

Dr. Reinhard further said that philosophically he had some personal problems with it because he did not think the taxpayers should be taxed for the enrollment decline at Morehead State University because he felt the problem should be addressed on this campus in terms of what must be done to increase enrollment and retain students. He further stated that the university had not lobbied against the \$500,000 and has said loudly and clearly that if somebody wants to keep it in the legislative budget, we will take it and put it to good use. Chairman Nunn said that we should accept all of the financial assistance we can get.

After discussion, Chairman Nunn directed President Reinhard to present at the next meeting options for balancing the 1986-87 budget.

Without objection, Chairman Nunn indicated he would move to item IX on the agenda.

IX. ESTABLISHMENT OF QUARTERLY MEETING DATES

Motion by Governor Breathitt that the first quarterly meeting be scheduled for Monday, March 31, 1986, at 9 a.m. in the Riggle Room of the Adron Doran University Center. Motion was seconded by Mr. Wheeler and unanimously approved.

Chairman Nunn asked that the President and Legal Counsel prepare and have on the agenda a list of all matters legislatively required to be done at the first quarterly meeting.

X. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

A. Personnel Actions (October 5, 1985, thru March 5,

1986)

President Reinhard recommended that the Personnel Actions for the period October 5, 1985, thru March 5, 1986, be adopted and approved by the Board.

Motion by Mr. Seaton, seconded by Governor Breathitt, that the Personnel Actions for the period October 5, 1985, thru March 5, 1986, be approved. Motion carried with Dr. Duncan asking to be disqualified from voting due to a conflict of interest

because of references to Dr. Duncan in the Personnel Actions. (Additional background information is attached to these Minutes and marked Exhibit X-A)

B. Founders Day

President Reinhard indicated that the 64th Founders Day is scheduled for Thursday, April 3, 1986, and recommended that the Board invite Governor Martha Layne Collins to be the featured speaker at the 10:25 a.m. convocation. Governor Breathitt moved that a special letter be sent on behalf of the Board to all folks the university works with in the region (i.e., superintendents, principals, etc.) inviting them to the Founders Day program and providing special seating and recognition to each group. Motion was seconded by Mr. Seaton and unanimously carried.

Mr. Wheeler moved that the Chairman and President be authorized to extend an invitation to Governor Martha Layne Collins on behalf of the university to speak at the 10:25 a.m. convocation on Thursday, April 3, 1986. Motion was seconded by Mr. Seaton and unanimously approved.

VIII. REVIEW OF EXISTING CONTRACTS/LEASES (Non-Personnel)

Chairman Nunn indicated that he had asked Justice Aker to work in conjunction with Legal Counsel, Mr. F. C. Bryan and Mr. Robert Chenoweth, to review all contracts, leases and other obligations on the part of Morehead State University and to present their findings at this meeting. The major concern expressed by Justice Aker was in the area of general liability insurance both for the university and university personnel. Justice Aker recommended that in the future any liability insurance that is secured should be done with input by Board counsel. Mr. Chenoweth said that he also reviewed all of the contracts provided and he found nothing out of order.

Mr. Bryan pointed out that a few weeks ago the Supreme Court of Kentucky did relieve the university of some of its sovereign immunity to the extent that the institution is permitted by statute to have insurance. KRS 164.2871 states that the governing board of each state institution of higher education is authorized to purchase liability insurance for the protection of the individual members of the governing boards, faculty and staff from liability for acts and omissions committed in the course and scope of the individual's employment or service. Each institution may purchase the type and amount of liability coverage deemed to best serve the interest of such institution.

Chairman Nunn asked that an underwriter be secured to review all of the university's insurance policies.

XI. OTHER BUSINESS

Chairman Nunn invited President Reinhard to have his attorney present at the March 31, 1986, meeting to present any matters pertaining to his contract that he might desire to have discussed. He further invited anyone who desired to submit any information to the Board do so in writing and in advance of the meeting.

XII. ADJOURNMENT

Motion by Mr. Seaton, seconded by Ms. Holt, that the meeting adjourn at 12:35 p.m. Motion unanimously carried.
