# BOARD OF REGENTS MOREHEAD STATE UNIVERSITY August 28, 1987

The Board of Regents of Morehead State University met in regular session on Friday, August 28, 1987, at 10 a.m. in the Riggle Room of the Adron Doran University Center in Morehead, Kentucky. Chairman Louie B. Nunn presided.

ABOLISHMENT OF MISSION/LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE Chairman Nunn called the meeting to order and Regent Charles Wheeler gave the invocation.

On roll call, the following members were present: Chairman Nunn, Mr. Breathitt, Mr. Carr, Ms. Curry, Dr. Lansing, Mr. Seaton, Mr. Ramey, Mr. Wheeler and Dr. Wheeler. Mr. Aker was absent. Mr. Bryan, Legal Counsel, was present.

Chairman Nunn administered the oath of office to Mr. Gregory Ramey, Inez, Kentucky, who was elected by the student body to serve as the student representative during the 1987-88 year ending June 30.

Mr. Seaton moved, seconded by Ms. Curry, that the minutes of the meeting held June 19, 1987, be approved as distributed. Motion unanimously carried.

President Grote presented the following recommendation:

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board abolish the Mission/Long Range Planning Committee that was established by action of the Board on June 13, 1986.

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President Grote noted that the committee was charged with the development of a five-seven year plan specifying directions for the University; however, the committee was never organized. The University has a \$25,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Education to develop a long-range plan. In accordance with the guidelines of the grant, an ad hoc planning committee has been appointed with representation from the Board, Student Government Association, faculty, community, alumni, business and industry, and University administration. The committee is to complete its work in early 1988 and will report to the Board at that time.

Dr. Grote said that he felt uncomfortable with an action by the Board on the books directing the University to do something without it being done. Therefore, it would be better to start over and get it into proper sequence.

Following discussion, the Board asked that the secretary maintain a list of actions taken by the Board and advise the Board of any action not acted on by the administration.

MOTION: Mr. Seaton moved, seconded by Governor Breathitt, that the Board approve the President's recommendation.

VOTE: The motion unanimously carried.

# SUMMER CAMPS AND CONFERENCES

President Grote reported that the University had experienced a very busy summer. Camps and conferences, including the Appalachian Celebration, drew nearly 12,000 overnight visitors. Further, 16 high school football teams and their fans visited the campus for scrimmages, exhibition games and season opening games at Jacobs Field. Two nights of high school football attracted nearly 10,000 additional visitors.

All of the major organizations which utilized our campus facilities for summer activities—Boys State, Girls State, Universal Cheerleaders, Kentucky DeMolay, Kentucky Dance Institute—have indicated they will be returning in 1988.

#### SUMMER ORIENTATION AND REGISTRATION (SOAR) PROGRAMS

Dr. Grote said that 1,361 students participated in the four Summer Orientation and Registration (SOAR) programs which represents a 33 percent increase or 451 more students than participated the previous year. Ninety-three percent (93%) or 1,270 of those that came are enrolled this fall. A further breakdown of the figures show: 79 percent are in-state; 1,022 are new freshmen; 174 are transfers; and 74 are returning students. Of the 1,270 who enrolled, 1,070 are currently living in residence halls.

# RESIDENCE HALL OCCUPANCY

Dr. Grote reported that as a result of the increase in enrollment three residence halls (Thompson, Waterfield and Butler) have been reopened. Currently, 3,009 students are living in residence halls which represents a 22 percent increase over the previous year. The residence hall occupancy rate is approaching 90 percent.

# MARRIED HOUSING OCCUPANCY

In married student housing, the occupancy rate is 92 percent with 155 of the available 168 units being occupied.

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# ANNUAL GIVING STATUS REPORT

Dr. Grote noted that private giving to the University through the Office of Development and/or MSU Foundation, Inc. for the year ending June 30, 1987, totalled \$1,258,319.03. This is an increase of \$807,498.79 or 179 percent over the previous year. Most of the increase occurred in capital giving as a result of significant contributions from Terry and Susan Jacobs, the Ashland Oil Foundation and the estate of Dr. Norman Tant. In addition, annual giving totals reflect an increase of nearly 10 percent over the previous year.

Further, 44 percent of the first year goal for the Ashland Oil-Albright Challenge grant has been reached in 33 percent of the time during the first four months of the Challenge year.

#### MSU-ASHLAND CENTER

Dr. Grote reported that the University had entered into a lease agreement with the First American Bank in Ashland at an annual rental rate of \$1 for administrative office space. Dr. Grote said that an ad hoc committee had been appointed to assist Dr. Robert Goodpaster, Center Director, with the development of a long-range plan, and that the University would take time to assess the needs in that area before deciding on a permanent location for the MSU-Ashland Center.

#### MORGAN COUNTY PROJECT

Dr. Grote said that in addressing the educational needs of Morgan and surrounding counties, the University has established a Morgan County-MSU Educational Services Center in West Liberty.

MSU has entered into a lease agreement with Frederick and May Lumber Company for office and classroom space at an annual rate of \$26,635.

In addition to six undergraduate classes being offered during the fall semester at the Morgan

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County Center, the University will assist in providing adult education programs to improve the literacy rate, pre- and post-employment training programs and educational programs for prisoners. An external grant of \$27,043 has been received to support Center programming with additional grant monies anticipated during 1987-88.

In response to a question on the method of funding for this program, Dr. Steve Taylor, Acting Vice President for Academic Affairs, said that in addition to receiving funds through the state funding formula and through income generated by the classes, the University has made application through the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA), Appalachian Regional Commission and Kentucky Department of Education.

#### **ENROLLMENT REPORT**

Dr. Grote asked Dr. Taylor to present an enrollment report. Dr. Taylor reported that as of August 27 preliminary figures show 6,153 students as compared with a final enrollment figure last fall of 5,894. He pointed out that off-campus and part-time registration was still in process with the expectation that the final enrollment figures would be significantly higher.

# SALE OF MOBILE HOMES REPORT

It was reported that Morehead State University netted \$78,612 from the sale of the surplus mobile homes on July 18, and that another sale was scheduled for October 10 to sell the remaining 82 trailers.

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JOB CLASSIFICATION AND COMPENSATION PLAN STATUS REPORT A status report of the Job Classification and Compensation Plan was presented. A Wage and Salary Policy which provides equitable and appropriate compensation throughout the University is scheduled for submission to the Board of Regents for its approval before March 1, 1988.

#### ABOLISHMENT OF THE MISSION/LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

#### Background:

On June 13, 1986, the Board of Regents approved a recommendation presented by President Reinhard to establish a Mission/Long-Range Planning Committee. That committee was to be charged with the development of a five to seven year plan specifying direction(s) for the University. The committee was to present recommendations to the President by November 1, 1986, with a final draft scheduled for presentation to the Board by mid-February, 1987. The committee has not yet met nor have individuals been identified for membership. This is not to suggest that the University does not need to concern itself with long range planning. Indeed this University, as most institutions of higher education, must engage in strategic long range planning in preparation for the 21st Century. The question is a matter of timing.

#### Analysis:

Morehead State University has received a \$25,000 planning grant from the United States Department of Education for long-range planning. This particular planning grant has been implemented and will culminate with a report to the Board of Regents on the planning needs and concerns of the University. In keeping with the guidelines of the grant, an Ad Hoc Committee for the USDE Planning Grant has been appointed with representation from the Board of Regents, Student Government, faculty, community, alumni, business and industry, and university administration.

The Ad Hoc Planning Committee will conclude its work during the first quarter of 1988 and will report to the Board of Regents at that time. It is anticipated that the report from the Ad Hoc Committee for the USDE Planning Grant will contain recommendations for future structure and direction for institutional planning. It seems appropriate to await the report resulting from the planning grant before appointing a committee. At that time we can create or recreate a special planning committee, constituted according to any forthcoming recommendations.

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Regents abolish the Mission/Long Range Planning Committee that was established by action of the Board on June 13, 1986.

Appointment to full-time faculty, administrative, or staff (exempt or non-exempt) position. Standing I Employed through permanent budget funds with benefits fully covered. Regular status.\* No ending date.

Standing II Appointment to part-time administrative or staff (exempt or non-exempt) position. Employed through permanent budget funds with no benefits. Non-Regular status.\*\*\* No ending date.

Fixed Term I Appointment to full-time faculty or staff (exempt) position for more than six (6) months but less than one (1) year. May be employed through Soft Money\*\* with benefits fully covered. Regular status.\* Terminable after one year.

Appointment to full-time or part-time (up to (1) year) faculty position or special project for Fixed Term II less than six (6) months. May be employed through Soft Money\*\* or available permanent budget funds, with no benefits. Non-Regular status.\*\*\* Terminable after one (1) year, if part-time; after six (6) months, if full-time.

Additional contract obligation in supplement to original agreement (adds calendar time) for faculty Supplementary or staff (exempt or non-exempt) currently Standing I or II appointments. For example, Summer I & II appointments or 9-month appointment extended to 10, 11, or 12 month appointment. Regular status\* with benefits fully covered. OR Additional contract obligation in supplement to Standing I, II or Fixed Term I appointment (same contractual period). For example, administrators teaching night classes or on-the-road payment. Should not handle overtime. Regular status\* with benefits fully covered.

Faculty with "visiting" as part of title. Can be full or part-time. Limited to one year. Employed through Soft Money\*\* with no benefits. Non-Regular status. Appointment

Temporary assignment for staff (exempt or non-exempt) position or special project. Full-time Wage Payroll up to 6 months or part-time up to 1 year. Terminable after specified time. May be employed through Soft Money.\*\* Non-Regular status with no benefits. Specified ending date.

- \* Regular status is a faculty or staff member who is appointed to a full-time position that will exist for more than six consecutive calendar months with the exception of continuance.
- \*\* Soft Money is defined as nonrecurring funds from University or external funds.

Visitina

Non-Regular status is a faculty or staff member who works less than full-time or who works full-time but is not appointed to a position that will last more than six consecutive months.

#### CONTRACT STATEMENT

#### Background:

Prior to the issuance of administrative contracts for 1986-87, the Board of Regents approved the following language to be placed on the individual contracts:

This appointment is subject to the right and authority of the President and Board of Regents of Morehead State University to reassign or transfer the appointee, and/or change or modify duties, services, functions or title during the period of the contract.

In discussing proposed contracts with President Albright, Dr. Grote was informed that the same language would be placed on administrative contracts for 1987-88. It was equally appropriate to place that language on the individual contracts since a new president was assuming office on July 1, 1987. An identical statement as the one above was placed on the contracts issued to the Vice Presidents, Deans, Director of Athletics and the Director of University Relations for the 1987-88 year.

#### Analysis:

President Grote understood that such a statement would be placed on administrative contracts for 1987-88 and it apparently was the intent of the Board to continue this practice with the issuance of the 1987-88 contracts. It would seem appropriate for the Board of Regents to ratify the action taken by Dr. Albright in issuing the 1987-88 individual contracts.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board ratify the inclusion of the following language that was placed on administrative contracts for 1987-88 as follows:

This appointment is subject to the right and authority of the President and Board of Regents of Morehead State University to reassign or transfer the appointee, and/or change or modify duties, services, functions or title during the period of the contract.

#### AMENDED 1987-88 RESIDENCE HALL RENTAL FEE SCHEDULE

#### Background:

Housing applications and assignments for the fall semester 1987 have resulted in the re-opening and use of Butler Hall, Waterfield Hall, and Thompson Hall for the 1987-88 academic year. Last year, Thompson Hall was not needed nor utilized as a residence hall, and Waterfield and Butler Halls were used primarily for conference housing. In preparing the 1987-88 Fee Schedule, which was adopted by the Board on May 22, 1987, a semester rental fee for Waterfield and Thompson Halls was not anticipated. Although Butler Hall was included in the original fee schedule at the semester rate of \$460, an amendment to the Butler Hall rate is being recommended since it is being utilized for regular student housing this year.

#### Analysis:

Presently, the semester residence hall rental fee of \$460 includes air conditioning, individual room refrigerators and television cable service. In the past, a differential rate was assessed for Butler, Waterfield, and Thompson Halls because they are not air-conditioned. A larger differential is being proposed for Thompson Hall because the electrical service to this older facility will not allow for refrigerators and televisions to be placed in each room as they are in all other housing facilities. It seems appropriate to reduce the rate for Butler and Waterfield Halls by \$10 in recognition of the lack of air conditioning and to reduce the rate for Thompson Hall by \$20 since a room refrigerator and television cable are not furnished as they are in other halls.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board of Regents amend the 1987-88 Residence Hall Fee Schedule with the following semester rental rates for Butler, Waterfield, and Thompson Halls:

#### AMENDMENT TO 1988-90 CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION REQUEST

#### Background:

Due to the enrollment increase for the fall semester 1987-88 and the concomitant increase in residence hall population, the \$3.08 million Thompson Hall renovation budget request item and the \$3.08 million Fields Hall renovation request have been amended. The original request included the renovation of Thompson Hall for administrative offices. Fields Hall was to be renovated for classroom and office space. The amended request provides that Thompson Hall and Fields Hall be renovated for single student housing. After two years of non-use, Thompson Hall is being used this fall, again, as a residence hall. Although Fields Hall has not been used as a residence hall for four years, projected enrollment indicates the need to reestablish Fields as a residence Hall as early as fall 1988. The estimated cost of the renovation projects remain at \$3.08 million for each project.

Also, the Council on Higher Education staff, after an initial review of the institution's Capital Request for 1988-90, has recommended that the Utility Tunnel and the PCB Removal Projects be combined into a single project. The new project will be titled Utility and Electrical Distribution System Renovation. The estimated total cost of the projects remain unchanged at a combined amount of \$7,314,000.

#### Analysis:

The renovation of Thompson and Fields Halls for student housing will enable the institution to meet the long-term housing requirements associated with an increase in the campus residential population. Restoring Fields and Thompson Halls will add 312 beds to the housing system thus enabling the institution to offer quality housing for future residential growth. The renovation of Fields and Thompson Halls will result in a housing system capacity of 3,675.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board of Regents amend the 1988-90 Capital Construction Request to renovate Fields and Thompson Halls for single student housing; and consolidate the Utility Tunnel Renovation and PCB Project into a single project titled Utility and Electrical Distribution System Renovation.

# REVISION AND NAME CHANGE: BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN FOOD ADMINISTRATION TO BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN HOTEL, RESTAURANT AND INSTITUTIONAL MANAGEMENT

#### Background:

On April 23, 1987, the Department of Home Economics approved the proposal to revise and change the name of the Bachelor of Science Degree in Food Administration to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Hotel, Restaurant and Institutional Management. The proposed revision was subsequently approved by the College of Applied Sciences and Technology Curriculum Committee, the College Dean, the University Undergraduate Curriculum Committee and the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

#### Analysis:

The name change and minor curriculum revisions will allow Morehead State University to meet the current trends in the hospitality management field. An explosive rate of expansion is predicted, both state-wide and nationally, for hospitality enterprises as we prepare to enter the 21st century. These conditions generate a great demand for hospitality management graduates with education, motivation and experience. It is predicted that by increasing our comparative advantage more students will be attracted to the University who are interested in pursuing career paths in the hospitality industry throughout the region, state and nation. Through this program we can contribute to the economic development of the region.

#### Recommendation:

That the Board of Regents approve the proposed revision and name change from Bachelor of Science Degree in Food Administration to Bachelor of Science Degree in Hotel, Restaurant and Institutional Management.

#### 1986-87 ANNUAL REPORT OF GIVING

I am pleased to report on a record year of private giving to the University through the Office of Development and/or the MSU Foundation, Inc. for the period ending June 30, 1987. The table on the second page reflects a comparison of 1986-87 to the previous year and distinguishes between capital and annual gifts in each of the years.

The numbers shown show an increase in total giving to Morehead State University of \$807,498.79 or 179 percent over the previous year. Most of the increase occurred in capital giving as a result of significant gifts from Terry and Susan Jacobs, the Ashland Oil Foundation and the estate of Dr. Norman Tant. However, our annual giving totals also reflect a healthy increase of nearly 10 percent over the previous year.

In terms of the Ashland Oil-Albright Challenge, we have reached 44 percent of the first year goal in 33 percent of the time (4 months).

#### THE MSU-ASHLAND CENTER

In May of this year, the Board of Regents approved the establishment of an MSU-Ashland Center for the purpose of extending the services, applied research, and instructional functions of the University to the northeast area of Eastern Kentucky. On June 29, President Albright announced that Dr. Robert Goodpaster, former director of the Ashland Community College, would serve as the director of the MSU-Ashland Center. Dr. Goodpaster will closely coordinate the programs and activities of the Center with the main campus; conduct surveys to determine the need for courses and services in the Ashland area; and will assist students in admission, registration, and course selection. Dr. Goodpaster assumed this responsibility on July 1.

On July 23, 1987, an Ad Hoc Task Group was created by President Grote to assist Dr. Goodpaster with the development of a long-range plan (2 - 5 years) for the Center. Representatives from the School of Business and Economics, School of Education, Student Development and Business Services, as well as other academic officers, were assigned to the Task Group to identify the academic and economic development programs and services that could be provided by the University and assist in defining the administrative requirements of a consolidated service center.

As soon as the long-range plan is completed, we will be in position to better define our long-term space needs. While it may be possible to consolidate the various components of the Center, there may be the need to utilize several locations for both efficiency and economy. It also may be necessary to phase the Center in over a 2 - 5 year period to accommodate program development and budget constraints.

Since May, the University has been attempting to acquire space sufficient to house the instructional, applied research, and administrative functions for this program. However, due to the time constraints of the fall 1987 semester and the lack of a specific programmatic plan, a decision was made to delay, at least for the fall semester, the selection of a facility site. Earlier this month, by working with the State Office of Real Properties and the First American Bank in Ashland, temporary administrative offices were obtained for Dr. Goodpaster. On August 3, a lease between Morehead State University and the First American Bank was signed providing for the payment of an annual rental rate of \$1 for space located in the Ashland Arcade Building located at 1536 Winchester Avenue in downtown Ashland. On August 5, the executed lease agreeement was delivered to the state Office of Real Properties.

Morehead State University will continue to utilize the classroom space in the Paul Blazer High School for its instructional needs at the weekly rate of \$100 per course, plus \$100 each week for custodial services for the 17-week semester. It is anticipated that a total of 30 courses will be offered in the Ashland area this fall. Morehead State University is grateful to the administration of the Paul Blazer High School, the First American Bank and other local community leaders for the cooperation we have received in expanding our program to the area.

## EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES RELATED TO THE MORGAN COUNTY PRISON PROJECT

#### Background:

In July, 1988, a correctional facility will open in Morgan County. The facility will initially house 500 inmates with plans to expand almost immediately to 1,000 inmates. Initially, 225-250 persons will be employed at the correctional facility.

With the apparent absence of major businesses and industries in the region, the unemployment rates in Morgan and surrounding counties range from 9.4 percent to 22.1 percent. The unemployment rate in Morgan County is approximately 19.0 percent. The correctional facility will be a tremendous economic resource for the region. It is essential to prepare the population of Morgan and neighboring counties to compete for jobs created by the location of the correctional facility in West Liberty, Kentucky. In addition to the correctional jobs, numerous other employment opportunities will be created in the community of West Liberty and nearby counties.

#### Analysis:

In order to address the need to provide educational services for the adult population of Morgan and surrounding counties, Morehead State University has established a Morgan County - Morehead State University Educational Services Center in West Liberty, Kentucky.

The Center is being designed to assist in the preparation of the adult population of Morgan and surrounding counties to compete successfully for employment in the correctional facility and other community-based businesses which will expand to meet the increased demands for services and to meet the following objectives:

- 1. To identify educational resources currently available to the adult population,
- To develop and expand adult education programs to complement existing educational resources including GED preparation,
- To conduct community awareness/orientation training programs,
- 4. To conduct pre-employment training programs,
- 5. To expand the Employment Services available in Morgan County,

- 6. To offer associate, baccalaureate, and graduate courses to enhance employment marketability of the adult population,
- 7. To offer undergraduate and graduate courses and/or degree programs to meet the needs of the correctional facility staff and inmates.
- 8. To develop and coordinate refresher courses for persons re-entering the job market or needing to upgrade employment skills, and
- 9. To identify and assist with obtaining additional economic development in Morgan and surrounding counties.

#### Information:

Morehead State University has entered into a lease agreement with the Frederick and May Lumber Company for 4,553 square feet of office/classroom space on Highway 7, West Liberty, Kentucky. This lease is set at an annual rate of \$26,635.04.

Morehead State University has employed a Coordinator of the Educational Service Center at Morgan County for \$25,000. Six undergraduate courses have been scheduled for the fall semester of 1987-88.

Morehead State University has received external grant funds in the amount of \$27,043 to support Center programming. The University anticipates receiving an additional \$29,970 in grant money during 1987-88. Efforts are being made to continue seeking external grant support.

#### SALE OF MOBILE HOMES

Morehead State University sold 62 surplus mobile homes located at the Criqueside (Mabry) Trailer Park on July 18, 1987. The price per trailer ranged from \$1,050 to \$1,950. Twelve individuals paid an average price of \$1,335 for the 62 mobile homes. A total of \$82,750 was received from the sale. After auctioneer expenses were paid, the University netted \$78,612. There has not been a determination made at this time regarding the use of the proceeds.

The second phase of the sale will be held on October 10, 1987, and will involve the disposal of the remaining 60 trailers located at the Criqueside Trailer Park as well as an additional 22 University-owned trailers located at the Morehead State University Trailer Park on U.S. 60, approximately three miles east from campus. The 22 trailers located on the Morehead State University property have likewise been declared. Disposal of these mobile homes will leave the University with six mobile homes. Four of the remaining six are located at the University Farm and two have been moved to Martin County as part of the Martiki research project.

At this time, campus-based married housing is sufficient to accommodate married student applicants for housing for the fall and spring semesters of 1987-88. In anticipation of providing quality campus-based married housing in the future, the University has included as part of its 1988-90 Capital Construction Budget Request, a request to renovate Downing Hall for use as married housing. Should this request not be funded by the 1988 General Assembly, the University would be required to re-evaluate alternatives to its married student housing needs based on the usage of other campus-based housing facilities.

#### STATUS OF JOB CLASSIFICATION AND COMPENSATION PLAN

At the February 20 Board of Regents meeting, the Board directed the administration to develop a formal Job Classification and Compensation Plan.

With that direction, the University developed a six (6) phase plan to accomplish that task. Specifically, the six phases of the plan are:

- Phase I In cooperation with incumbents and supervisors, develop and complete job descriptions for the 270 exempt and nonexempt positions (excludes faculty and administrators) within the University by April 22, 1987.
- Phase II Office of Personnel Services to review, edit, and finalize the job descriptions to ensure standardization and sufficient content for evaluation purposes by May 15, 1987.
- Phases III Employ a professional consulting firm and IV to evaluate job descriptions, establish job grades encompassing the exempt and nonexempt positions, conduct a market analysis, and recommend specific wages and salaries for the job grades. Completion date is to be determined.
- Phase V Develop a Wage and Salary Policy, which provides equitable and appropriate compensation throughout the University, for submission to the Board of Regents for its approval before March 1, 1988.
- Phase VI Implement the Compensation Plan along with the Wage and Salary Policies effective July 1, 1988.

Phases I and II were completed on schedule. In late April, the University solicited proposals from consulting firms and, on June 17, awarded a contract for \$55,000 to Cresap, McCormick and Paget, a nationally prominent consulting firm located in Washington, D.C.

Since entering into the contract, Dr. Eugene Smoley, the Project Director has visited the campus twice. His team members, Dr. Peggy Siegel and Mr. George Bond, have visited once to collect data and conduct interviews with supervisors.

Dr. Smoley has met with President Grote; the Steering Committee which is composed of the Vice President for Administrative and Fiscal Services, the Vice President for Student Development, the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, and the Director of Personnel Services; administrative unit supervisors; and has held two "open" meetings with employees.

During the month of August, the Steering Committee to accept or modify the consulting meet will recommendations for selecting performance factors to be used for evaluating job descriptions, weighting of the performance factors, and identifying the benchmark positions to be used in the classification process. Once the Steering Committee and/or approved the consulting modified recommendations, the classifying process will begin with subsequent meetings between the University and consulting firm to occur as needed and as frequently as necessary. Presently, the consulting firm believes that Phases III and IV will be completed by late November or early December, 1987.
