



The forum is sponsored by the Office of the Provost, the Caudill College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences, and the Volgenau College of Education. The forum presents two guest speakers **Dr. Andrea Abrams**, Associate Professor of Anthropology and Vice President of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion at Centre College and **Dr. Gary Houchens**, Professor of Education Administration at Western Kentucky University. Also, **Dr. Benjamin Fitzpatrick** Assistant Professor of History at Morehead is serving as the moderator for the forum.

The participants will discuss the controversy surrounding the hot button issue of critical race theory and public education. The forum will examine what critical race theory is and isn't, whether the theory is actually being used in K-12 education in Kentucky, and the possible impact **House bill 487** and **Senate bill 138** may have on social studies curriculums in Kentucky.


