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GENERAL INFORMATION



Morehead State University ...In a Nutshell...

- Headcount enrollment in Fall 2005 was 9,062, down 231 (2.5%) from Fall 2004 (9,293).
- First-time freshman headcount was 1,300, a 1% increase from Fall 2004 freshman enrollment (1,284).
- Seventy-nine percent of undergraduates enrolled full-time (5,964 of 7,544) compared to 19% of graduate students (283 of 1,518), 81% of whom enrolled part-time.
- Women outnumbered men at the University, accounting for 62% of undergraduates, 69% of graduate enrollment, or 63% of enrollment overall.
- The average age of undergraduates was 24 years (minimum 15 years, maximum 86 years) compared to 34 years for graduate students (minimum 21 years, maximum 76 years).
- Eighty-five percent of enrollees were Kentuckians; 67% originated from MoSU's 22-county Service Region.
- Minorities (including international students) represented five percent of University enrollment overall.
- MoSU conferred 1,536 first degrees in 2004-05 -- 125 Associate, 1,038 Bachelor and 373 Master/Specialist. An additional 22 second degrees were conferred in 2004-05 -- 22 Bachelor.
- Camden-Carroll Library averaged about 5,200 visits per week during the Fall 2005 semester.
- Residence halls housed 2,583 students in Fall 2005.
- About 67% of MoSU's alumni reside in Kentucky.
- MoSU's 378 full-time and 156 part-time faculty taught 2,399 courses in Fall 2005.
- In addition to faculty, MoSU employed 750 full-time staff.
- The university's opening budget (2005-06) was \$103.7 million.

University Overview

Meeting the educational needs of East Kentucky while striving to constantly improve the quality of its public service, economic development and applied research programs are the primary objectives of Morehead State University.

Historically, the University traces its lineage to the Morehead Normal School, which opened its doors in 1887. The private school closed in the spring of 1922 when the Kentucky General Assembly established Morehead State Normal School. The state institution accepted its first students in the fall of 1923 and graduated its first class in 1927. Name changes occurred in 1926 when "and Teachers College" was added, again in 1930 when it was shortened to Morehead State Teachers College, again in 1948 when "Teachers" was dropped and, finally, to university status in 1966. Thirteen men, starting with Frank C. Button, have served as president. Dr. Wayne D. Andrews assumed office as the 13th president on Jan. 1, 2005.

Academically, the University offers 78 undergraduate degree programs, including 8 associate level degrees and 12 pre-professional programs in four colleges -- Business, Education, Humanities, and Science and Technology -- and 20 academic departments. There are 54 graduate degree programs plus 22 graduate level non-degree programs designed especially for professional educators. The education specialist in five specialty areas also is offered. A master's degree for physician assistants, social workers and a cooperative doctoral program, all with the University of Kentucky, are available on the MSU campus.

Classes are conducted in Ashland, Jackson, Maysville, Mt. Sterling, Pikeville, Prestonsburg, West Liberty and other locations. Regional campuses--located in Ashland, Jackson, Mt. Sterling, Prestonsburg and West Liberty--are staffed with full-time directors. Additionally, the University offers a number of distance learning courses throughout the region via the Internet and interactive compressed video. Sixty-five percent of MSU's 378 full-time faculty members hold doctoral degrees.

Physically, the University is located in the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest in Rowan County. The nearly 500-acre main campus within the city limits of Morehead includes more than 50 major structures with a total replacement value of more than \$144 million. Beyond the city, the University's real estate holdings include the 320-acre Derrickson Agricultural complex and a nine-hole public golf course. The instructional plant includes 120 classrooms and 112 laboratories. Housing facilities include space for approximately 2,900 students in a variety of housing styles including traditional residence halls, suites and apartments.

Fiscally, the University currently operates on an annual budget of \$103.7 million with about \$44.8 million provided by the state and \$40.2 million coming from tuition and fees.--Additionally, grants and contracts from external sources for research, service and academic/student support projects generate more than \$15 million each year. Annual private donations to the University, through the MSU Foundation, Inc., have exceeded \$3 million the past two years.

Statistically, the University has awarded more than 50,000 degrees and currently has more than 1,100 full-time employees. Enrollment for fall 2005 was 9,062, with the student body representing 104 Kentucky counties, 39 states and 27 foreign countries. The University attracts more than 50,000 visitors annually and its economic impact, directly and indirectly, on the Morehead area is estimated at more than \$80 million yearly.

Administratively, an 11-member Board of Regents governs the University with eight citizens appointed by the governor and three seats held by elected faculty, staff and student representatives. Management of the institution is vested primarily in six divisions--Academic Affairs, Administration and Fiscal Services, Development, Planning and Technology, Student Life, and University Relations--with each headed by a vice president.

Athletically, the University sponsors 18 intercollegiate sports for men and women in accordance with the regulations of the Ohio Valley Conference, the Pioneer Football League and Division I of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. MSU also supports an intramural program involving more than 25 team and individual sports.

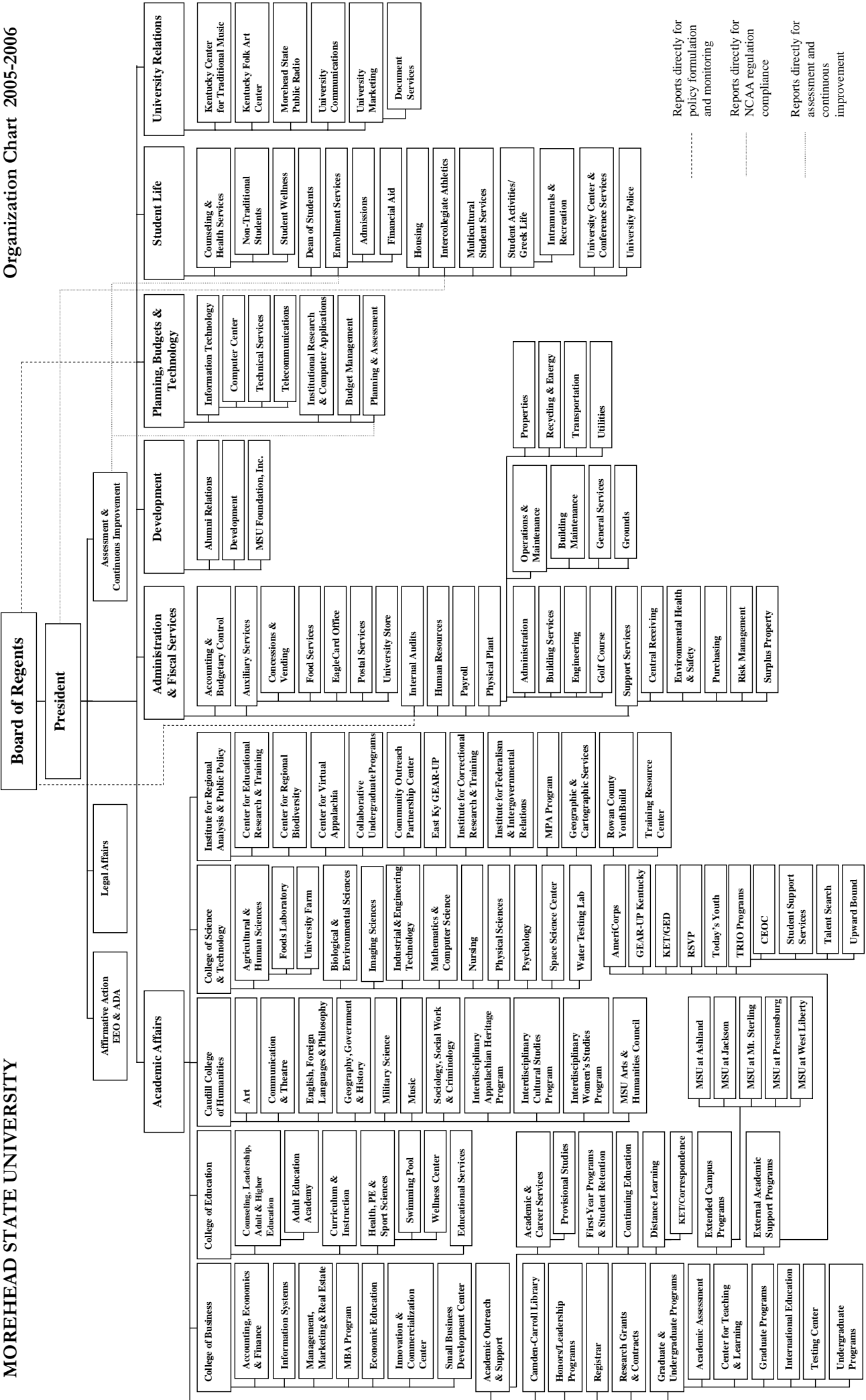

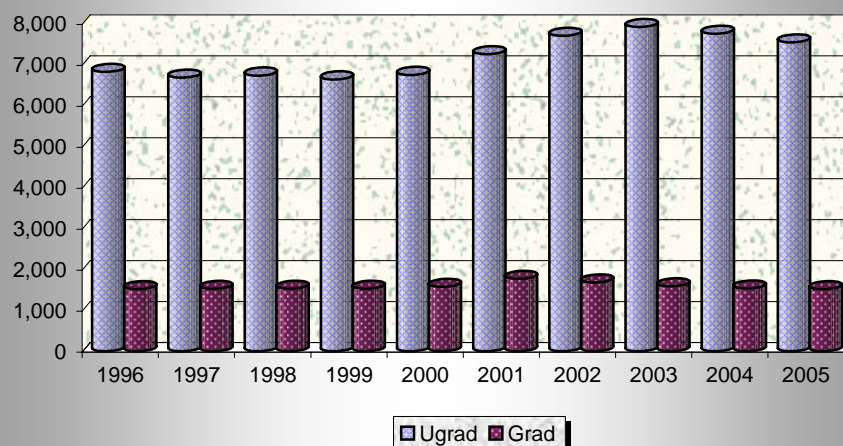

Headcount by Level

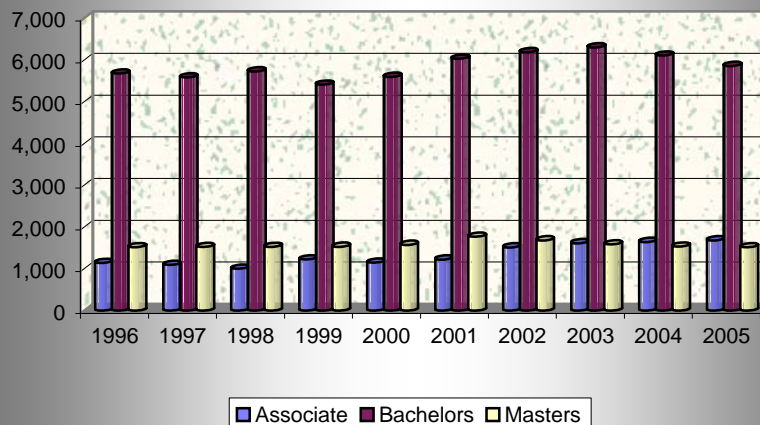
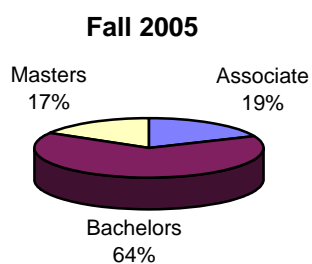

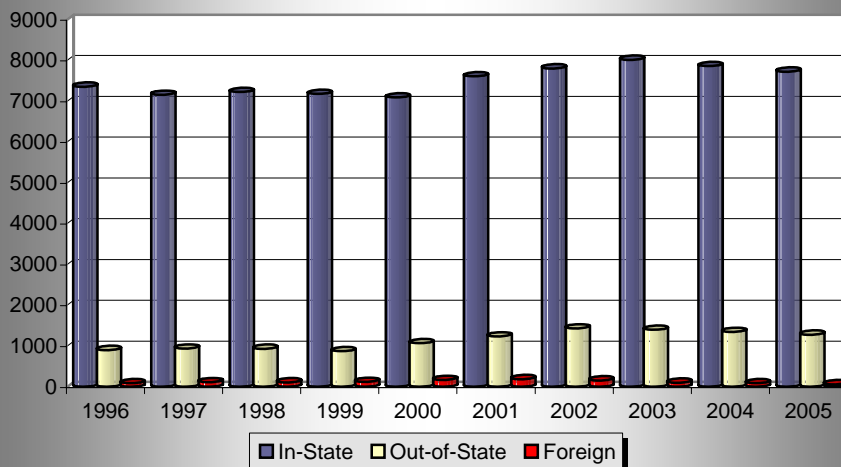

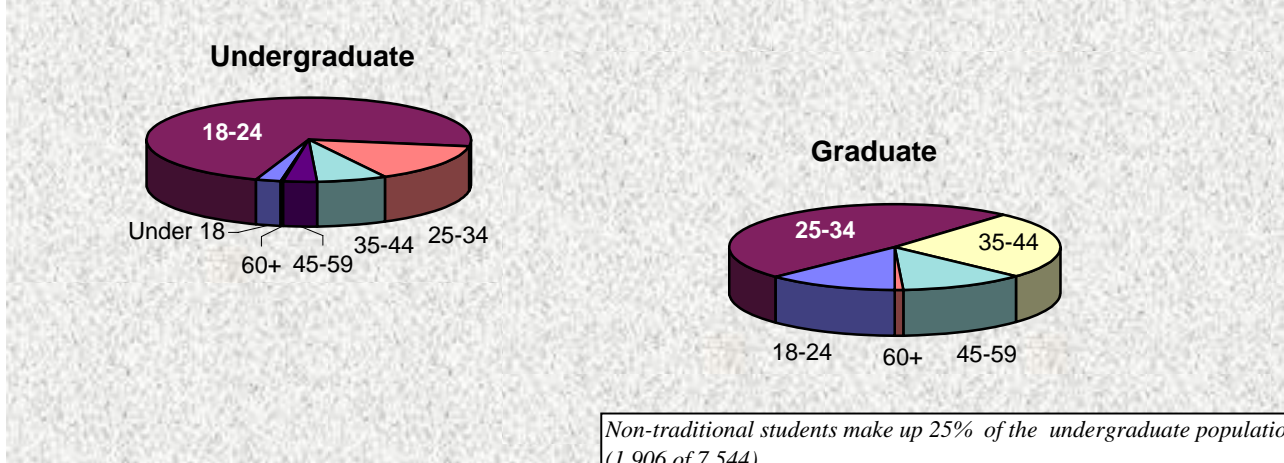

Enrollment by Age and Level



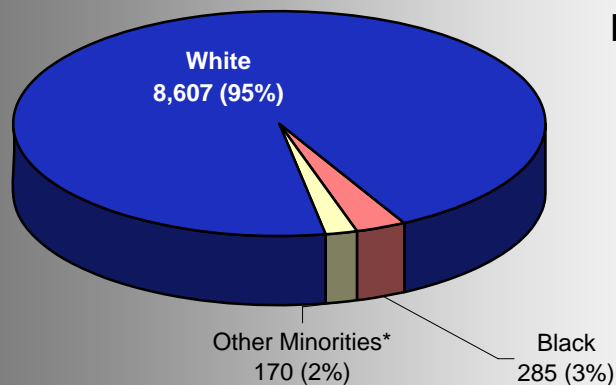

Enrollment by Ethnicity and Sex

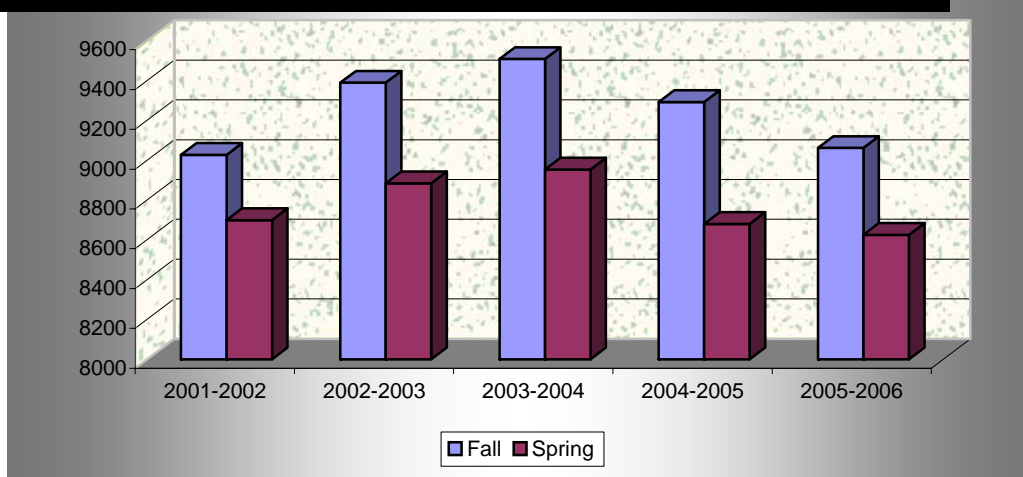

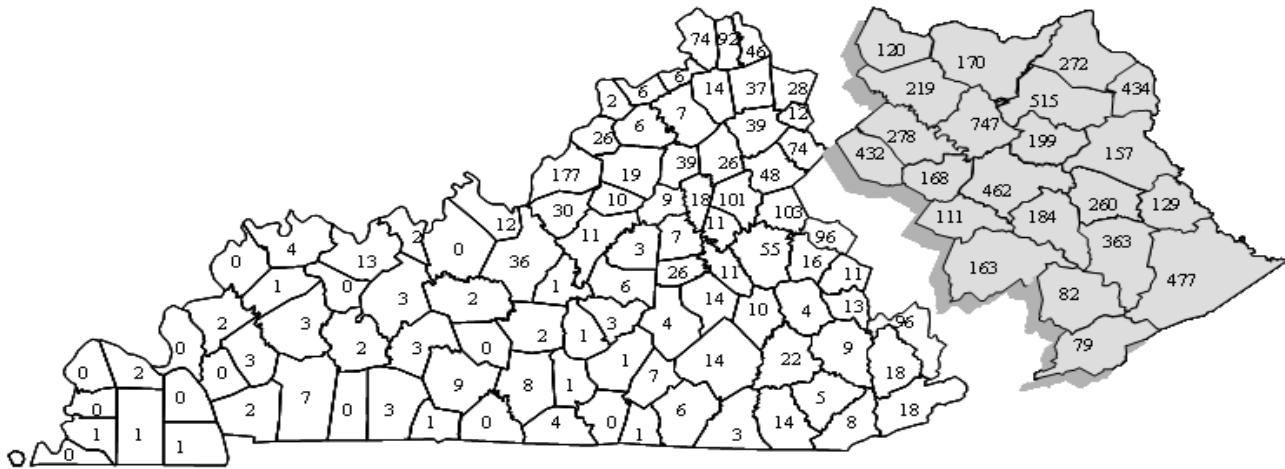

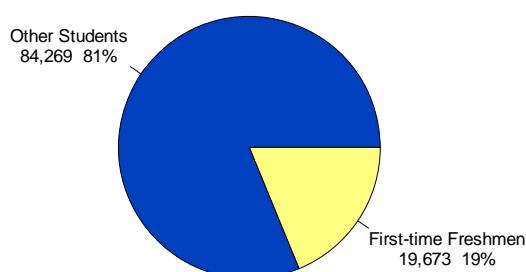
Highlights: First-time Freshmen

Ninety-eight percent (1,277 of 1,300) of fall 2005 first-time freshmen were full-time students. This group accounted for about 19% (19,673) of the University's total credit hour production (103,941). Headcount**

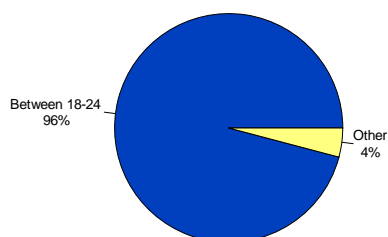


**Fall 2005
Credit Hours**

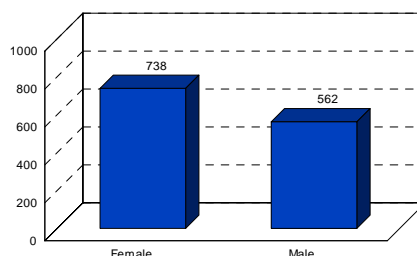


The majority (1,251 or 96%) of MSU fall 2005 first-time freshmen were of "traditional" age, that is, between 18 and 24 years of age, and more than half (56%) were female. About 92% (1,200) were white whereas blacks accounted for 80% (80 of 100) of the non-whites and about 6% of fall 2005 first-time freshman enrollment overall.

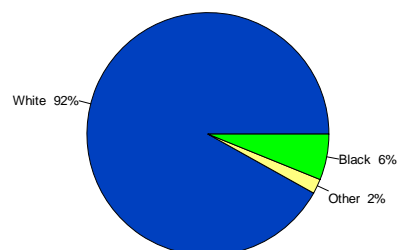
Age

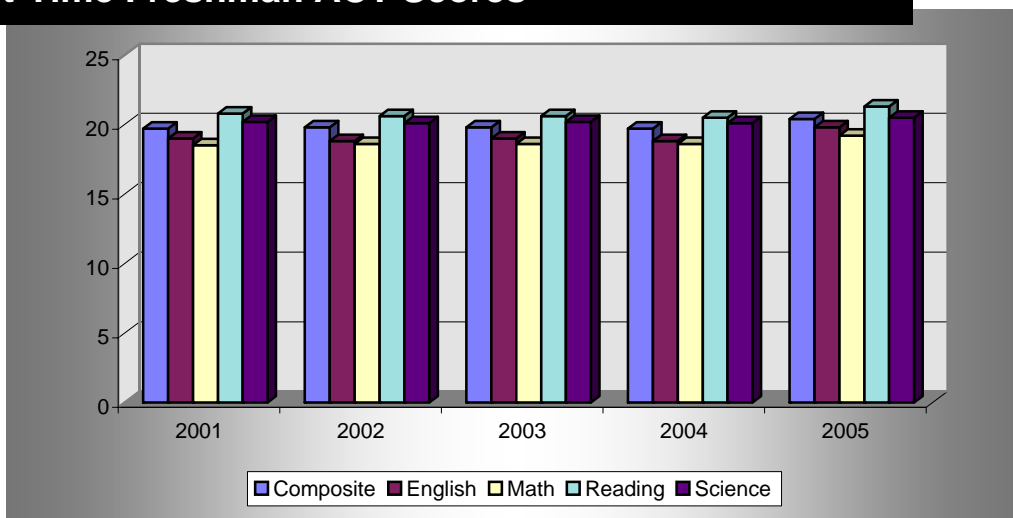

In fall 2005, 77% (1,006) of first-time freshmen were seeking a bachelor's degree and 294 (23%) were enrolled in associate level programs. 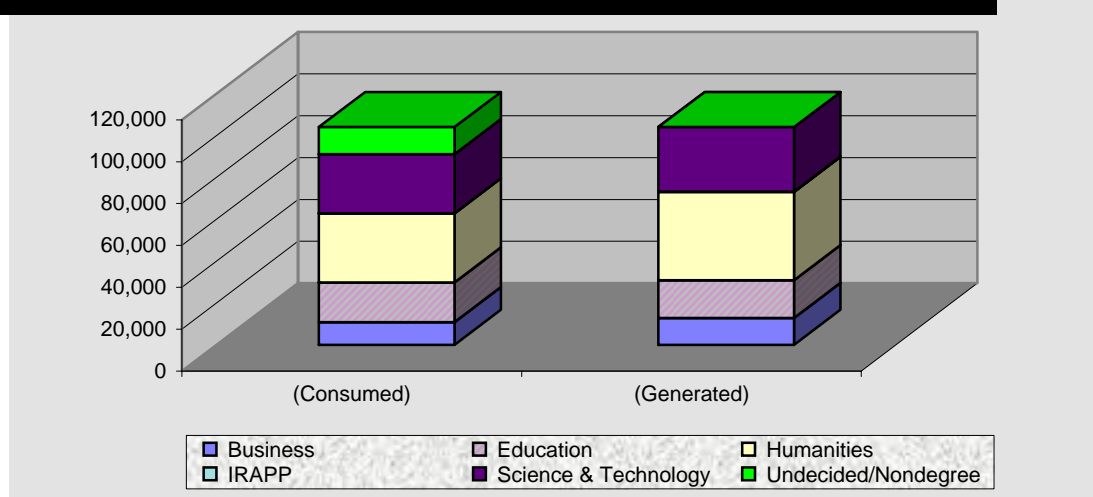

Credit Hours - "Consumed" and "Generated"

The difference between credit hours "consumed" by majors within a given college and credit hours "generated" by faculty teaching within a given college characterize that college's general academic service profile. For example, Education majors consumed 18,946 credit hours in Fall 2005 whereas Education faculty taught classes which generated 17,949 credit hours during the same semester. The number of credit hours consumed by Education majors in excess of credit hours generated by Education faculty characterizes the College of Education as an academic service "consumer" in Fall 2005. As expected, the College of Humanities generated the most course credit hours overall as well as the most credit hours in excess of majors' credit hours.

In order to obtain a general program area overview of enrollments, the Council on Postsecondary Education prepares trend tables displaying comparative fall enrollments by CIP (Classification of Instructional Programs) Area. That is, the 6-digit CIP codes for specific program majors are collapsed to 2-digit codes and enrollments in all majors beginning with the 2-digits are summed. For example, under CIP code 13 (Education), enrollments in 16 specific program major codes have been summed showing MoSU's fall 2005 enrollment in Education programs to be 1,732. The technique allows for quick overview of predominate areas of enrollment at MoSU (as in this table) and for other institutions across the Commonwealth.

Distance Learning Courses Fall 2005

The Council on Postsecondary Education classifies distance learning courses by Provider Category (Institutional, KYVU, KET, Other) and by Primary Learning Mode of Delivery ("B" Internet/World Wide Web, "C" Interactive Video, "D" Open Broadcast, "E" Print Based, Audiotaped, Videotaped, CD ROM, "F" KET Telecast.)

In Fall 2005, Morehead State University reported 237 distance learning courses. The following table shows that for those 237 courses, the Predominant Modes of Delivery were Interactive Video (128 courses) and Internet (106 courses). The remaining 3 courses were KET originated. Other sections of the table display total course enrollments and student credit hours generated by all distance learning courses in fall 2005. In summary, distance learning courses accounted for about 7% of course enrollments (2,668 of 39,584) and 7% of student credit hours generated (7,543 of 103,941) overall.

For comparative purposes, Morehead State University's ACT Composite cut-off score for unconditional freshman admission in fall 2005 was 14 with an Admissions Index (AI) of at least 400 (AI=high school GPA x 100), whereas the average ACT Composite score for MoSU's fall 2005 first-time freshmen was about 20. In terms of institutional admissions selectivity, an average ACT Composite score of 20 would place MoSU somewhere between "Open" (ACT 17-20) and Liberal (ACT 18-21) selectivity with retention rates between about 62.5% and 65.7%. MoSU's fall 2004 first-time freshman retention to fall 2005 was 61.0%, slightly below the average "Open" selectivity institutions offering Bachelors and Masters degrees.

MoSU's 3-year graduation rate for 1999-2000 associate-seekers was about 3% (10 of 361). However, an additional 45 associate-seekers obtained baccalaureate degrees within 5 years for an adjusted 5-year graduation rate of 15%. Likewise, for 1999-2000 baccalaureate-seekers, 5 students obtained degrees within 3 years whereas an additional 350 students obtained baccalaureate degrees within 5 years for an adjusted 5-year graduation rate of about 37%. The table on page 65 displays comparative 3, 4, 5 and 6-year graduation rates for 1999-2000 first-time, full-time freshmen by degree-seeking level.

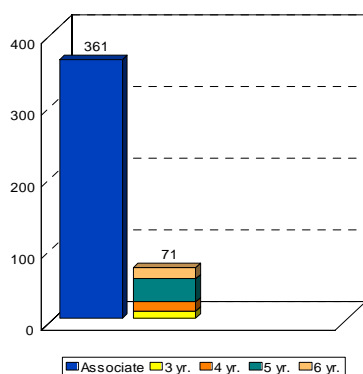

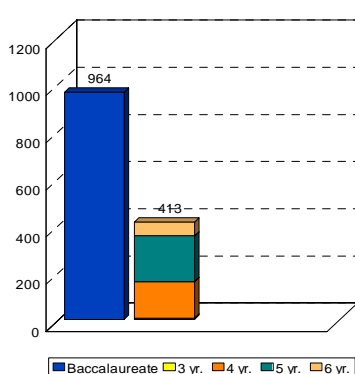

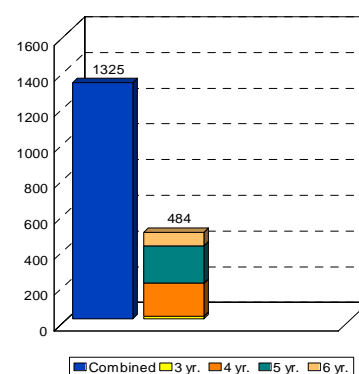

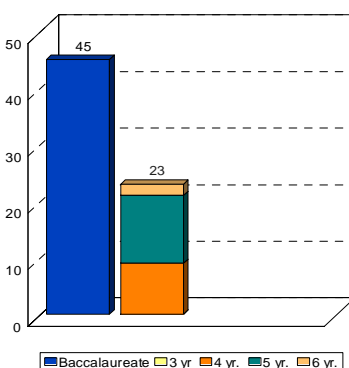

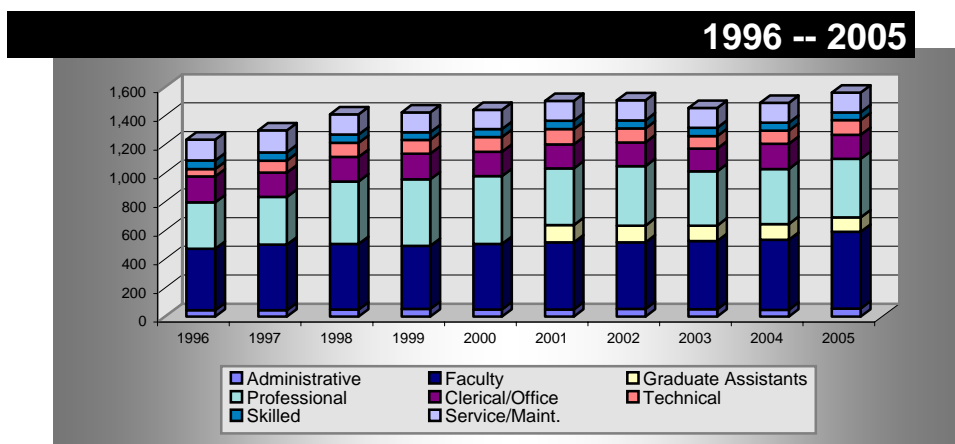

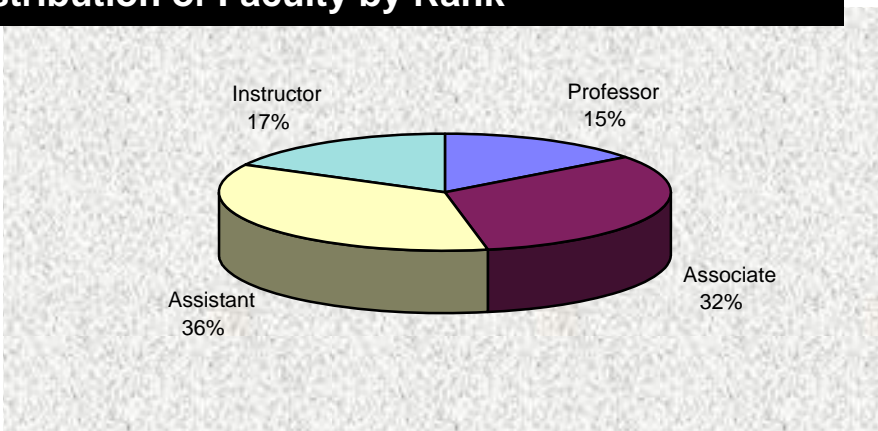

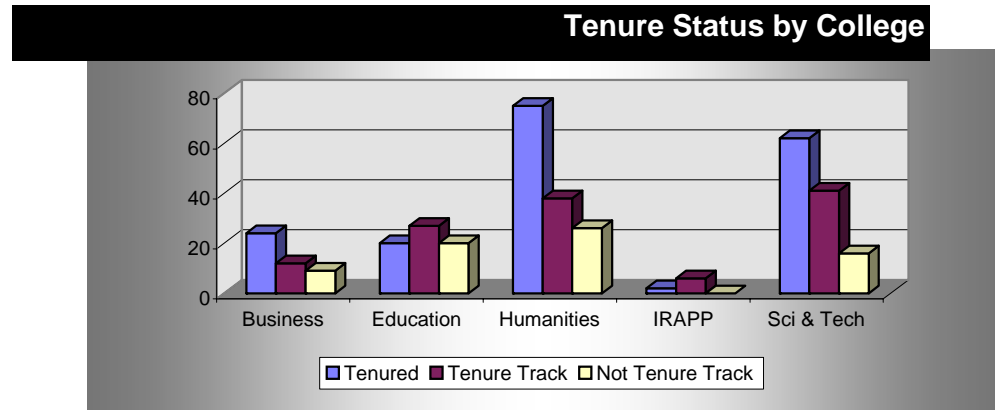

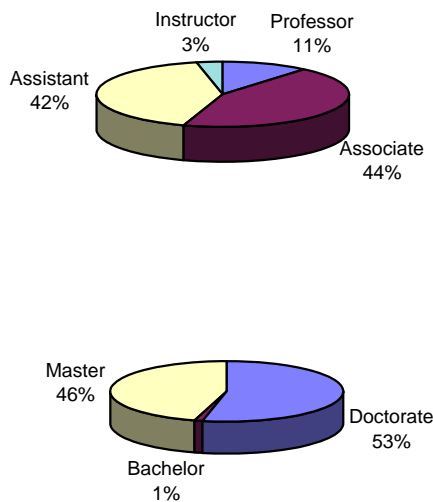

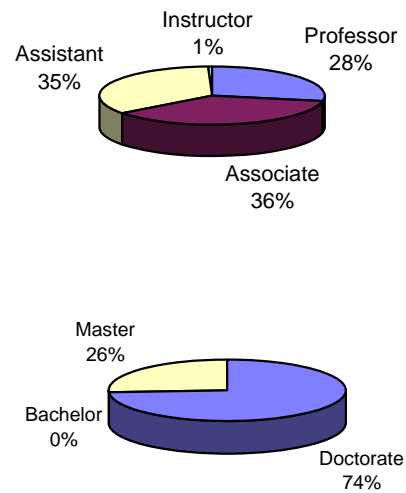

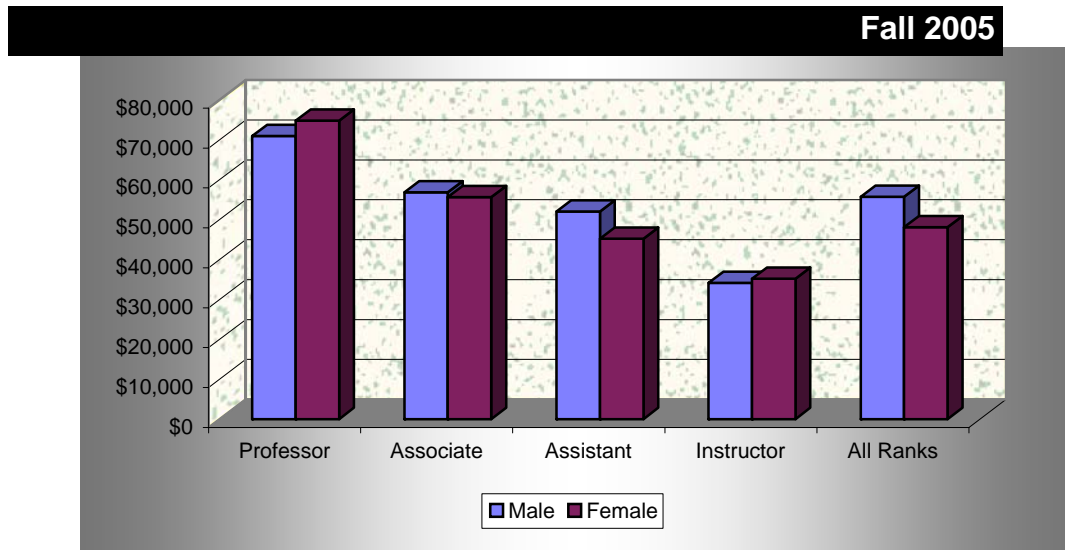

AAUP/IPEDS and Faculty Salary Comparisons

IPEDS (Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System) full-time faculty are by National Center for Education Statistics definition:

Those members of the Instruction/Research staff who are employed full-time (as defined by the institution) and whose major (more than 50%) regular assignment is instruction, including those with released time for research. Also included in this category are:

- * Full-time instructional faculty on sabbatical leave
- * Full-time replacements for instructional faculty on leave without pay
- * Chairs of departments (if they have no other administrative title and hold a full-time faculty rank.)

Both AAUP (American Association of University Professors) and IPEDS annually collect and report on average faculty salaries and compensation (salaries plus other benefits). As an option, institutions may forward their mandatory IPEDS faculty surveys to AAUP rather than prepare a separate AAUP-sponsored survey. AAUP publishes an "Annual Report on the Economic Status of the Profession" in the March-April issue of its bulletin, *Academe*. The next page shows a table displaying average faculty salaries by rank for MoSU's fall 2005 nineteen benchmark institutions. Faculty salary averages and respective numbers at each rank have been taken from the AAUP data reported in *Academe*, March/April 2006 when available.

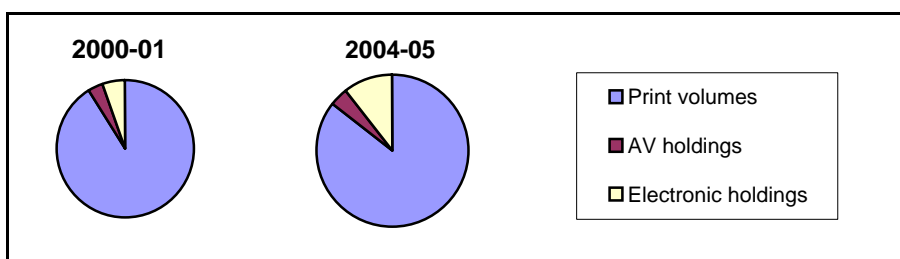

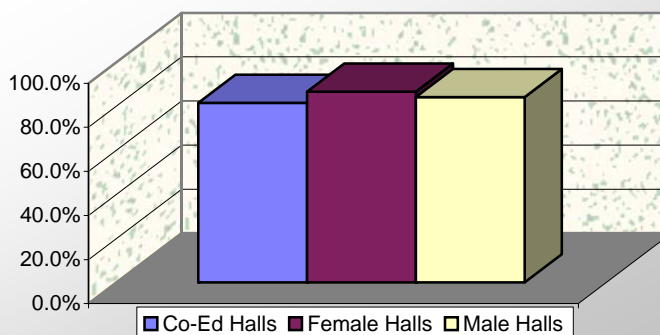
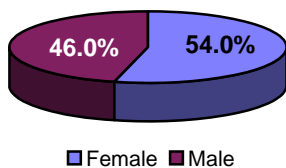

Residency Hall Occupancy Rates

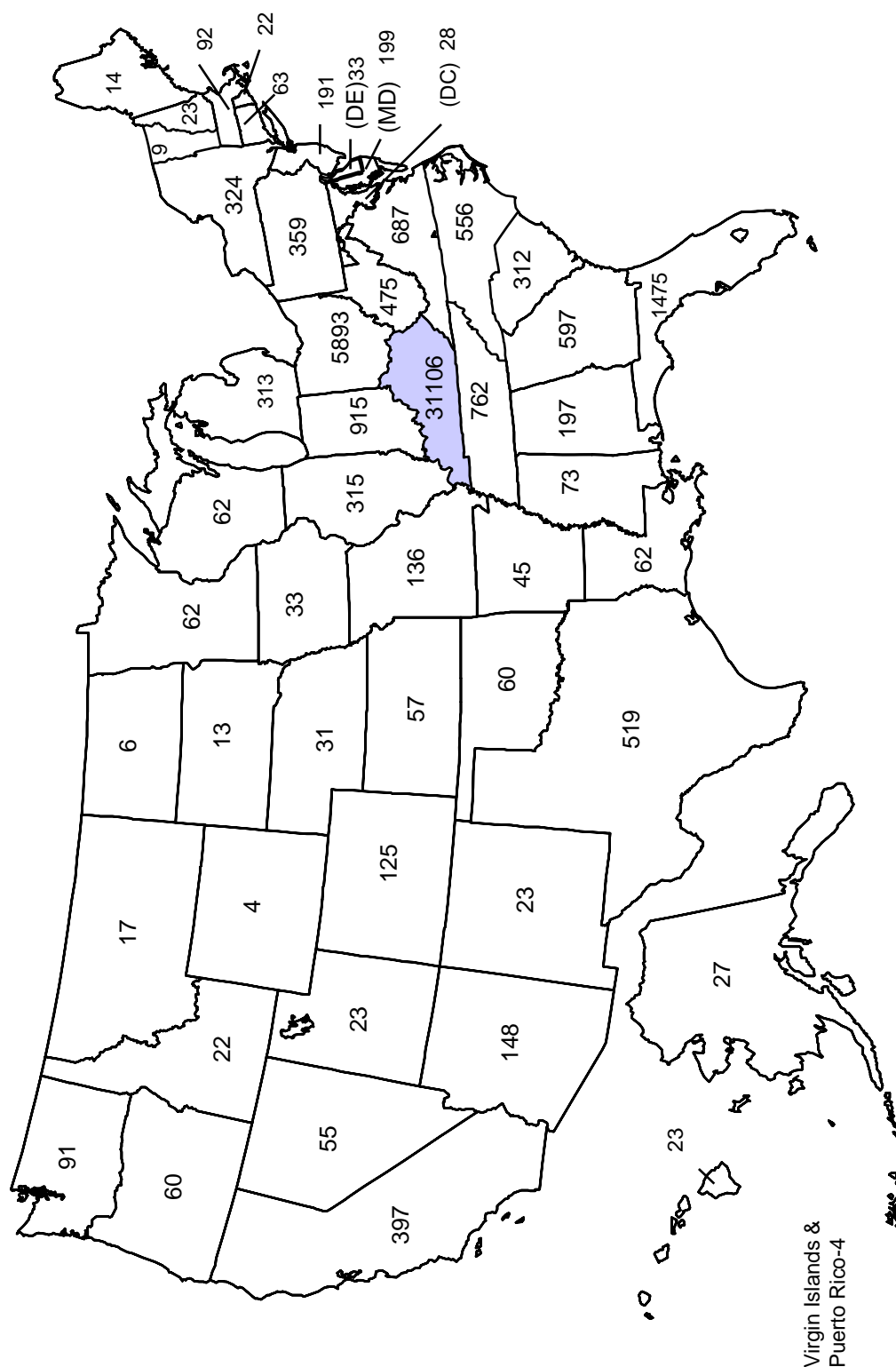
Hall Occupancy by Sex

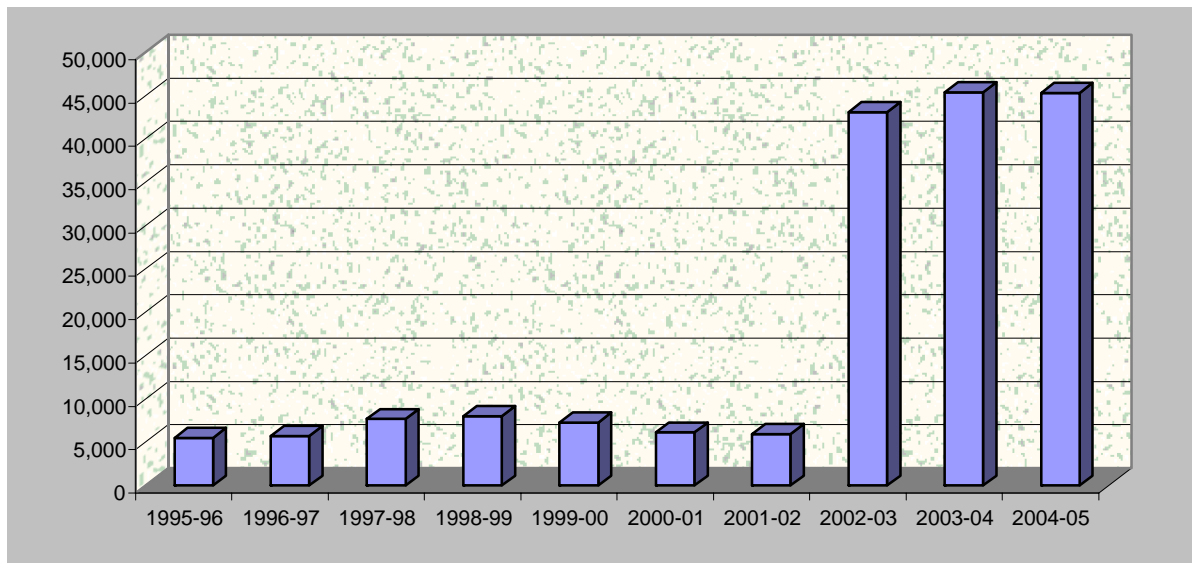


Morehead State University Alumni by State



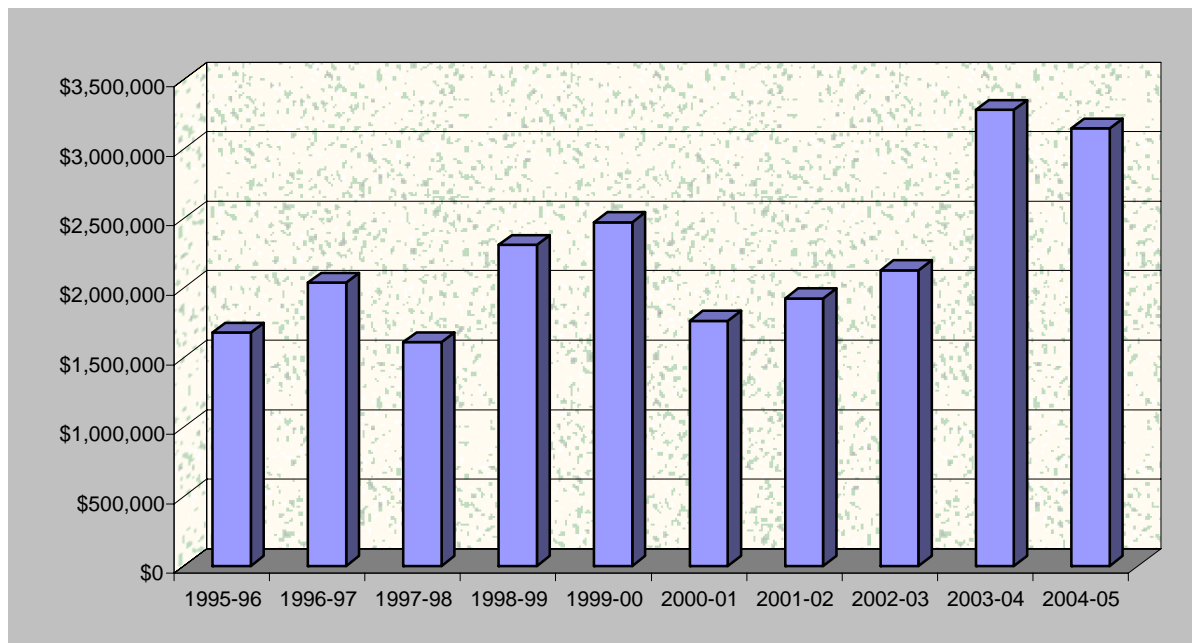

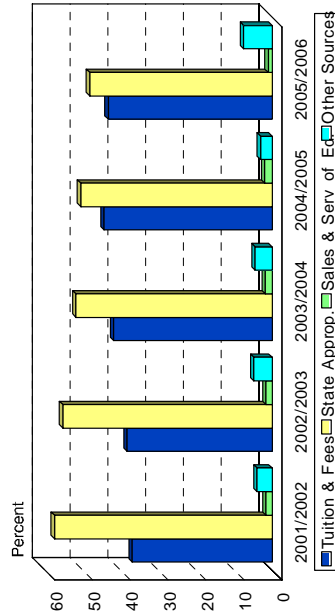

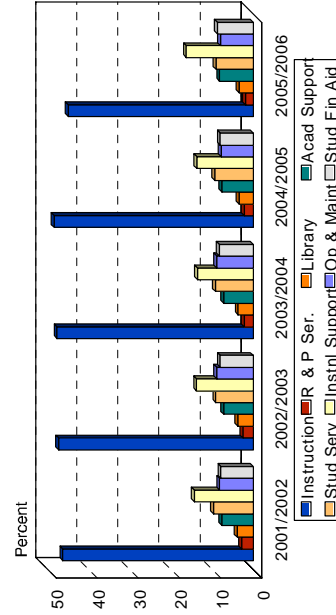

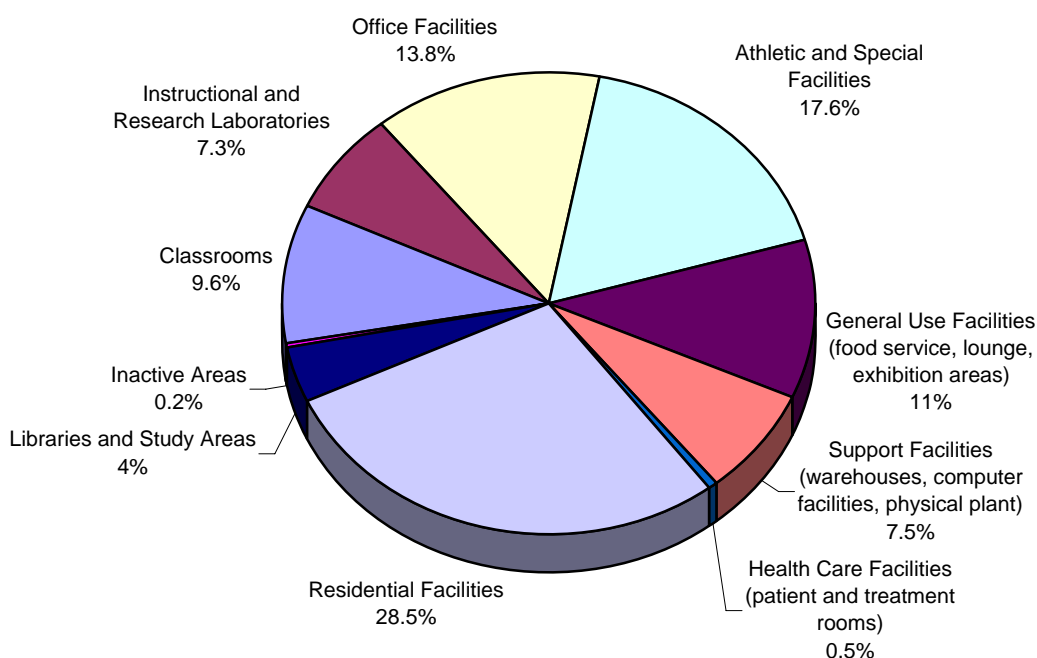
ACTUAL (AUDITED) EXPENDITURES BY FUNCTION
