An experience of upwards of twenty years, has clearly taught us, that of all persons is not a sufficient compensation for the cost of the article, and that the price of the article is not a reasonable rate, we thought it not far to advance on the price of carding, but the time has at length arrived when the Farmer has a living price for every kind of produce he may have to sell, and we hesitate not in saying we believe that the Farmers are willing to divide with the carders, and afford them a price that will enable them to live decently, if not independently. The carders in Fleming, and the adjacent counties, are invited to sell their cotton, and to establish the price of carding at a rate for white wool, and 10 for mixed.
