It was voted that the quarterly meetings will be continued on same dates as the past year, and that the executive meetings would be held in church parlor. Fellowship dinners are to continue as last year, and love gift boxes to be distributed.

Addie Radar made a motion that picnics be held in July and study programs begin in August. Motion seconded by Mable Reynolds, passed.
