The executive Board of the C W F met in the church parlor on April 2, 1956, with Mrs. Zell Walters, president in charge. Mrs. Walters read the scripture, and a very impressive devotional was given by Mabel Reynolds in the form of a question. The question was, Do we discuss with our friends and neighbors, often enough the Christian faith?"

Mrs. Oppenheimer, treasurer, made the following report. Local fund, \$131.74, miscellaneous, \$56.87, contingent, \$24.17, and that up to that time the Easter offering was \$75.78, and that more would probably come in from women who had not attended the Easter service.

s a letter to the treasurer. Please hand it to her. We are sending it through Guideposts to save mailing expense.

Often there are inquiries about certain offerings and how they are credited or why they are credited as they are. I regret that sometimes we make mistakes and are glad when you give us the chance to correct them. It is helpful for us all to clear up any problems of crediting early in the year. If, after reading the explanations that follow you have questions, please do write to us.

1. Each year the budget of The United Christian Missionary Society is set up on the basis of needs of all the work it supports. Within the budget is the regular maintenance, "the bread and butter support of our regular work," and possibly new items if it is possible to increase the budget to meet the ever present need for expansion. Then in faith that our churches and organizations will support the budget items, they are requested to set goals. All offerings sent in from Christian Women's Fellowships and other women's organizations to the UCMS for use in the regular work, apply toward the financial goal of these groups.

2. All offerings for specific pieces of work regularly supported by the budget of The United Christian Missionary Society are applied on the goal. (For example, an offering to support an evangelist who is a regular employee of the mission would apply on goal because his support must be cared for in the regular budget.)

3. Woman's Day offerings and Easter sacrificial offerings are regular offerings and may be credited over and above goal, but unless so stated are credited on goal.

offerings for items outside the regular budget of The United Christian Missionary Society are called designated specials. They do not count on goals but credit for them is given in the Year Book under the heading, Designated Offerings. This is not a special column for Women's organizations but is for the total church. Offerings given to an institution to purchase extra equipment or supplies or perhaps a special fund for a missionary to use in a special project, are designated specials. They are important offerings but because the item for which they are intended is not part of the regular budget of the Society they cannot count on goals. Please mark any such offerings plainly as "designated special for"

5. Offerings for the National Benevolent Association, local charities, local churches, or for any cause not handled through Unified Promotion, is listed in the Year Book under a suitable heading such as (a) National Benevolent Association and Homes, (b) Miscellaneous Missionary, Benevolent and Emergency Relief Offerings, etc.

6, Capital for Kingdom Building and Week of Compassion offerings. Capital for Kingdom Building offerings are for special pieces of work that are "over and above" the budget of the United Society therefore are credited as designated specials. Week of Compassion offerings are promoted primarily through the church and used for projects that are not within budget. These offerings cannot count on regular giving or goal.

7. LOVE GIFTS for the national project, are very personal and given in addition to one's regular offerings; are not to be applied on goals. They will not be counted in local groups but will be brought together as a State Love Gift, and then all states will be added together making one whole.
