"Economics for Prophets: The Gospel Critique"

An ecumenical workshop about justice in the marketplace is scheduled for March 9 and 10, 1990, at Eastern Kentucky University, Richmond, Kentucky. "Economics for Prophets: The Gospel Critique" features Walter L. Owensby, author and economist with the public Policy Office of the Presbyterian Church, USA, as the keynote speaker and special resource.

The workshop explores the myths of the American economic system and critiques them from the perspective of the gospel. Additionally, it encourages participants--with peer support--to design and educational experience to introduce Christian economic values in their own programs of religious education. The workshop is intended for pastors and lay people with little formal background in economics.

"Economics for Prophets" is sponsored jointly by Kentucky Appalachian Ministry, a program of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), and Human Economic Ministries, a program of the Catholic Church's Glenmary Society.

### ETHIOPIA

Many regions of Ethiopia are experiencing food shortages due to drought-induced crop failures. Two to five million people may need food assistance in 1990. The Christian Relief and Development Association is providing nutritional rehabilitation programs with special attention to needs of orphans, street children and displaced destitute people.

An emergency grant of \$2,000 has been sent and more will be forwarded to as it becomes available.

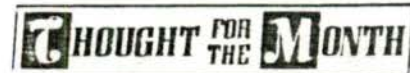

February 17th. Oberlin High School,  
still struggling to repair damage  
caused by Hurricane Gilbert, was  
seriously damaged by fire. The sec-  
ond story of the school, housing  
the home economics department a  
science facility, was destroyed.  
Damage estimate is Jamaican \$1  
million.. (\$147,000). Insurance will  
provide only half the funds needed  
for repair.

The space on the wall was only 14 by 30 feet, for thirteen more-than-life-sized figures. Andrea del Castagno, who faced a similar difficulty, conceived his background first, then crammed the figures in. Leonardo had a priority. He drew his figures first, and then added the background. (Time-Life Books)

That's a proper priority to fitting people into our lives. Don't try to cram them into our own background first, but learn to know them as they are, and then add the background.

MUCH OF OUR "FAITH JOURNEY" IS ROOTED IN THE EASTER EVENT. THE WRITER OF THE GOSPEL OF JOHN LOOKED BACK ON THAT EVENT FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF YEARS AND OBSERVED HOW, "GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD THAT HE GAVE HIS ONLY SON, THAT WHOEVER BELIEVES IN HIM SHOULD NOT PERISH BUT HAVE ETERNAL LIFE." (JOHN 3:16)

BECAUSE OUR "FAITH JOURNEY" IS ROOTED IN THE EASTER EVENT, WE CELEBRATE THAT EVENT AS A PART OF THE PASSING OF EACH YEAR. THOUGH IT IS THE SAME CELEBRATION EACH YEAR, IT STILL HAS SIGNIFICANCE FOR THE WOULD-BE-CHRISTIAN. "PALM SUNDAY", THE FIRST DAY OF EASTER WEEK, RECALLS, HOW JESUS ENTERED THE HOLY CITY FOR "PASSOVER CELEBRATION" AND HOW HIS FRIENDS AND DISCIPLES SHOUTED "HOSANNA TO THE KING!" ON MONDAY HE DEMONSTRATED HIS DIVINE AUTHORITY BY CLEARING OUT OF THE SACRED TEMPLE THOSE WHO HAD DEFILED IT BY TRYING TO MAKE IT A BUSINESS INSTITUTION AND MARKET, AND RESTORED IT TO ITS RIGHTFUL PLACE OF WORSHIP, DECLARING, "MY HOUSE SHALL BE CALLED A HOUSE OF PRAYER FOR ALL THE NATIONS." (MARK 11:17)

ON TUESDAY HE SPOKE TO THE PUBLIC FOR THE LAST TIME. IT WAS A DAY FILLED WITH TEACHING, HIS FINAL WORDS TO HIS NATION AND TO ALL PEOPLE.

ON WEDNESDAY HE RETIRED INTO SOLITUDE AT THE BETHANY HOME OF LAZARUS, MARTHA AND MARY, SPENDING THE DAY, NO DOUBT IN PRAYER AND SPIRITUAL PREPARATION FOR THE END WHICH HE SENSED WAS NEAR. IT WAS ON WEDNESDAY NIGHT THAT JUDAS MADE THE BARGAIN WITH THE JEWISH AUTHORITIES TO BETRAY CHRIST FOR THIRTY PIECES OF SILVER.

ON THURSDAY AFTERNOON WITH HIS DISCIPLES HE RETURNED TO JERUSALEM TO THE HOUSE OF A FRIEND THERE, WHERE IN AN UPSTAIRS ROOM HE ATE THE JEWISH CEREMONIAL PASSOVER, INSTITUTED THE LORD'S SUPPER, AND THEN SPOKE HIS FINAL, INTIMATE FAREWELL TO HIS TWELVE---NOW ELEVEN---DISCIPLES. LATE THAT NIGHT HE WENT TO THE GREAT OLIVE GROVE OF GETHSEMANE, WHERE HE FREQUENTLY RETIRED FOR PRAYER, AND WHERE JUDAS AND THE SOLDIERS HAD HID TO ARREST HIM. THAT MUST HAVE BEEN ABOUT MIDNIGHT.

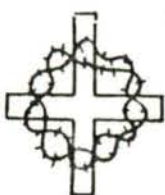
EARLY FRIDAY MORNING HE WAS BROUGHT BEFORE THE JEWISH RELIGIOUS SUPREME COURT AND CONDEMNED TO DEATH, THEN BEFORE THE ROMAN GOVERNOR, PILATE, FOR PRONOUNCEMENT OF SENTENCE---FIRST OF SCOURGING, THEN OF CRUCIFIXION. NOTES FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

Abuse is becoming, or perhaps I should say has become a part of our day-to-day existence in these United States of America. I want to share some things about WIFE ABUSE that should concern us all.

WIFE ABUSE

One third of all police time is reportedly spent responding to domestic violence calls.

Seventy percent of police officers interviewed said they completed written reports in fewer than 20 percent of domestic violence cases;

An estimated six million women are physically abused by their husbands each year in the United States, and one million in Canada.

Between 2,000 and 4,000 women are beaten to death in the United States each year by their husbands.

According to FBI, 31 percent of female murder victims are killed by their husbands or boyfriends.

Nearly half the women who need emergency surgery have been battered. Two of every three pregnant patients seen in emergency rooms have been victims of abuse.

It is estimated that violence against women will occur at least once in two-thirds of all marriages. Twenty-five percent of married women are severely beaten during the course of their marriage.

Crimes committed by relatives are more likely to involve attacks and injuries and are more likely to require medical attention than crimes committed by strangers.

What can you do? What can I do? What can we do, together?

First, help you children understand that nobody deserves physical violence. One can never justify taking it as one's just desert, or giving it as one's right.

Encourage victims to flee violence and to stay away from violent people when they do flee.

SAFE HARBOR, INC. is a non-profit organization serving 10 Eastern Kentucky Counties, of which Rowan County is one.

For emergency help, one may call any hour of the day, 1-800-926-2150. Persons who answer such a call will know how to help, and how to get one out of the home and into a safe place.

As Christians, we need to be concerned to put an end to Domestic Violence immediately.

THE PASTOR'S PEN.....

In the July issue of "Lexington Theological Quarterly", Jane McAvoy had a provocative article entitled, "The Changing Image of Pastoral Ministry". Her insights have made me to do some reflecting and I share those reflections with you now.

At the turn of the century, the predominant image of ministry in American Protestant churches was clearly that of the minister as "preacher". Preaching was the most important aspect of parish ministry. The Preacher was "the Evangelist" whose main concern was "saving souls".

In the 30's, we began to hear about "Pastoral Care". The minister became a counselor, a therapist, a psychologist for a hurting people. At this point, some of the preaching preparation time had to give way to "pastoral care". Then after World War I as churches began to grow rapidly, there was a need for the preacher to become an administrator of Sunday Schools, and ever expanding programs that reached into the church and out of the church into the community. Large sums of money were needed to pay for buildings and to hire support staff. Committees were formed to cover innumerable aspects of ministry. The Minister had to become an administrator.

In the 60's and on into today, the church has been in search of a recognized definition of ministry. I think such a definition should be sought in that great protestant principle of, "The Priesthood of the Believer", which acknowledges the right of the layperson to perform all, or some of the ministries of the church. In the very early days of the church, it is written in The Acts of the Apostles, chapter 6, verses 1-7....

"Now in those days when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists murmured against the Hebrews because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution. And the twelve summoned the body of the disciples and said, 'It is not right that we should give up preaching the word of God to serve tables. Therefore, brethren, pick out from among you seven men of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint to this duty. But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word.' And what they said pleased the whole multitude and they chose..." These they set before the apostles, and they prayed and laid their hands upon them. And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly...."

Today, the success of the church is dependent upon both an adequate minister and a willing congregation who will serve tables and multiply the ministry of the Church. As we look to a new church year, will YOU be attentitive to God's Call, and do your part to make the Church adequate in these days?

I look forward to seeing you this Sunday, and throughout the church year as we labor together, in fields that are "white with harvest."

### '80s Successes Create Strong Base for '90s Church Establishment

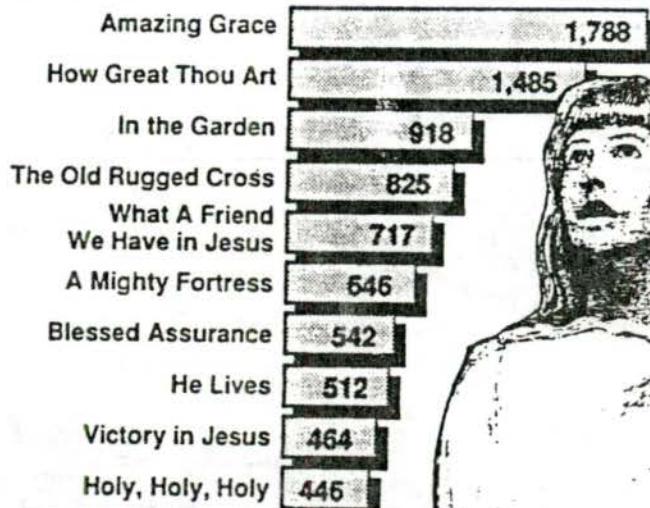
The establishment of 132 new congregations over the past ten years is hailed as one of the most significant accomplishments by the Christian Church (Disciple of Christ) this past decade.

Today, 57 of the 132 new congregations established are fully organized and housed in buildings. Forty have closed their charters and are working toward planning, funding and constructing buildings while the remaining 36 are still in early stages of development.

James L. Powell, Director of the denomination's Church Advance Now (CAN 11) Program, says a 1990s goal of 200 new church starts will be a formidable task but lessons learned in the 80's indicate it is achievable.

## THE PASTOR'S PEN.....

As the leaves change color and fall from the trees and as the days grow shorter and a chill is in the air, we are reminded that our year is coming quickly to an end that a new year will soon begin. Between our celebration of THANKSGIVING and our celebration of CHRISTMAS, we must set new goals for our church and commit ourselves to a Stewardship that will enable these goals to be reached. Very little happens in the church or in the secular world without goals being set and stewardship commitments being made towards the fulfillment of such goals. Even now, a budget is being prepared for the 1991 Church Year. Immediately, each one of us will need to determine the extent of our stewardship obligation to God and to His Church. That means that we will need to make an "Estimate of our Giving" for 1991. Jack and Scharline Whidden are heading our Stewardship Committee this year and will need the help of the total membership, and some friends, if we are to continue to be Christ's Church, alive in this day.

To inspire us as we contemplate our stewardship for 1991 let us share a story that Raymond E. Balcomb tells in a book about Stewardship. He says that during World War II when sugar was rationed, a coffee shop served both black coffee and coffee that was sweetened. Instead of putting sugar on the counter, a spoon of sugar was added to the coffee before it was served, if the customer wanted sweetened coffee. One man who often drank coffee in this coffee shop was always complaining that his coffee didn't have enough sugar to his taste. One day when that customer was complaining, the agitated waitress handed him a spoon and said, "Stir what you've got and it will be enough!"

That's a good message for each of us today. All of us are blessed. We have the where-with-all to do what we want.
