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...In a Nutshell

- Headcount enrollment in Fall 2008 was 8,981, down 85 (<1%) from Fall 2007 (9,066).
- First-time freshman average composite ACT score is up from 20.9 in 2007 to 21.5 in 2008, continuing a 5-year trend.
- Retention of first-time freshmen is up 1.2%, from 64.8% in 2007 to 66.0% in 2008, an upward trend that began in 2005.
- First-time freshman headcount was 1,338, an approximate 5% decrease from Fall 2007 freshman enrollment (1,409).
- Seventy-five percent of undergraduates (5,605 of 7,487) enrolled full-time compared to 21% of graduate students (314 of 1,494), the majority of which were enrolled part-time.
- Women outnumbered men at the University, accounting for 62% of undergraduates, 68% of graduate enrollment, or 63% of enrollment overall.
- The mean age of undergraduates was 24 years (minimum 15 years, maximum 85 years) compared to 33 years for graduate students (minimum 21 years, maximum 79 years).
- Eighty-six percent (7,694 of 8,981) of enrollees were Kentuckians; 64% (5,741) originated from MSU's 22-county Service Region.
- Minorities (including international students) represented 6% of University enrollment overall.
- MSU conferred 1,507 first degrees in 2007-2008; 149 Associate, 973 Bachelor, and 385 Master/Specialist. An additional 19 second degrees were conferred in 2007-2008, all Bachelor degrees.
- Residence halls housed 2,279 students in Fall 2008.
- Approximately 67% of MSU's alumni reside in Kentucky.
- MSU's 369 full-time and 104 part-time faculty taught 2,415 courses in Fall 2008.
- In addition to faculty, MSU employed 777 full-time and 257 part-time staff (including 115 graduate assistants).
- The University's opening budget for 2008-2009 was \$122,466,000.

University Overview for Fall 2008

Meeting the educational needs of East Kentucky while striving to constantly improve the quality of its public service, economic development, and applied research programs is the primary objective of Morehead State University.

Historically, the University traces its lineage to the Morehead Normal School, which opened its doors in 1887. The private school closed in the spring of 1922 when the Kentucky General Assembly established Morehead State Normal School. The state institution accepted its first students in the fall of 1923 and graduated its first class in 1927. Name changes occurred in 1926 when "and Teachers College" was added, again in 1930 when it was shortened to Morehead State Teachers College, again in 1948 when "Teachers" was dropped and, finally, to university status in 1966. Thirteen men, starting with Frank C. Button, have served as president. Dr. Wayne D. Andrews assumed office as the 13th president on Jan. 1, 2005.

Academically, the University offers 149 undergraduate degree programs, including 17 associate level degrees and 132 baccalaureate level degrees, as well as 20 pre-professional programs in four colleges (Business, Education, Humanities, and Science and Technology), 20 academic departments and the Institute for Regional Analysis and Public Policy. There are 57 graduate degree programs and 37 graduate non-degree programs designed especially for professional educators. The education specialist in five specialty areas is also offered. A master's degree for physician assistants, social workers and a cooperative doctoral program, all with the University of Kentucky, are available on the MSU campus.

Classes are conducted in Ashland, Jackson, Maysville, Mt. Sterling, Pikeville, Prestonsburg, West Liberty and other locations. Regional campuses--located in Ashland, Jackson, Mt. Sterling, Prestonsburg and West Liberty--are staffed with full-time directors. The University offers a number of distance learning courses throughout the region via KET telecasts and interactive compressed video. Additionally, the University provides a large number of online based courses via the Internet. Sixty-five percent of MSU's 369 full-time faculty members hold doctoral degrees.

Physically, the University is located in the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest in Rowan County. The nearly 500-acre main campus within the city limits of Morehead includes more than 50 major structures with a total replacement value of more than \$144 million. Beyond the city, the University's real estate holdings include the 320-acre Derrickson Agricultural complex and Eagle Trace, a par 72, 6,902-yard public golf course. The instructional plant includes 120 classrooms and 112 laboratories. Housing facilities include space for over 2,700 students in a variety of housing styles including traditional residence halls, suites and apartments.

Fiscally, the University operated on an annual budget of \$122.5 million in 2008-09 with about \$46.6 million provided by the state and \$52.8 million coming from tuition and fees. Additionally, grants and contracts from external sources for research, service and academic/student support projects generate more than \$15 million each year. Annual private donations to the University, through the MSU Foundation, Inc., average \$3 million annually.

Statistically, the University has awarded more than 50,000 degrees and currently has more than 1,100 full-time employees. Enrollment for fall 2008 was nearly 9,000 with the student body representing 107 Kentucky counties, 43 states and 33 foreign countries. The University attracts more than 50,000 visitors annually and its economic impact, directly and indirectly, on the Morehead area is estimated at more than \$80 million yearly.

Administratively, an 11-member Board of Regents governs the University with eight citizens appointed by the governor and three seats held by elected faculty, staff and student representatives. Management of the institution is vested primarily in five divisions--Academic Affairs, Administration and Fiscal Services, Planning and Technology, Student Life, and University Advancement--with each headed by a vice president.

Athletically, the University sponsors 16 intercollegiate sports for men and women in accordance with the regulations of the Ohio Valley Conference, the Pioneer Football League and Division I of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. MSU also supports an intramural program involving more than 25 team and individual sports.

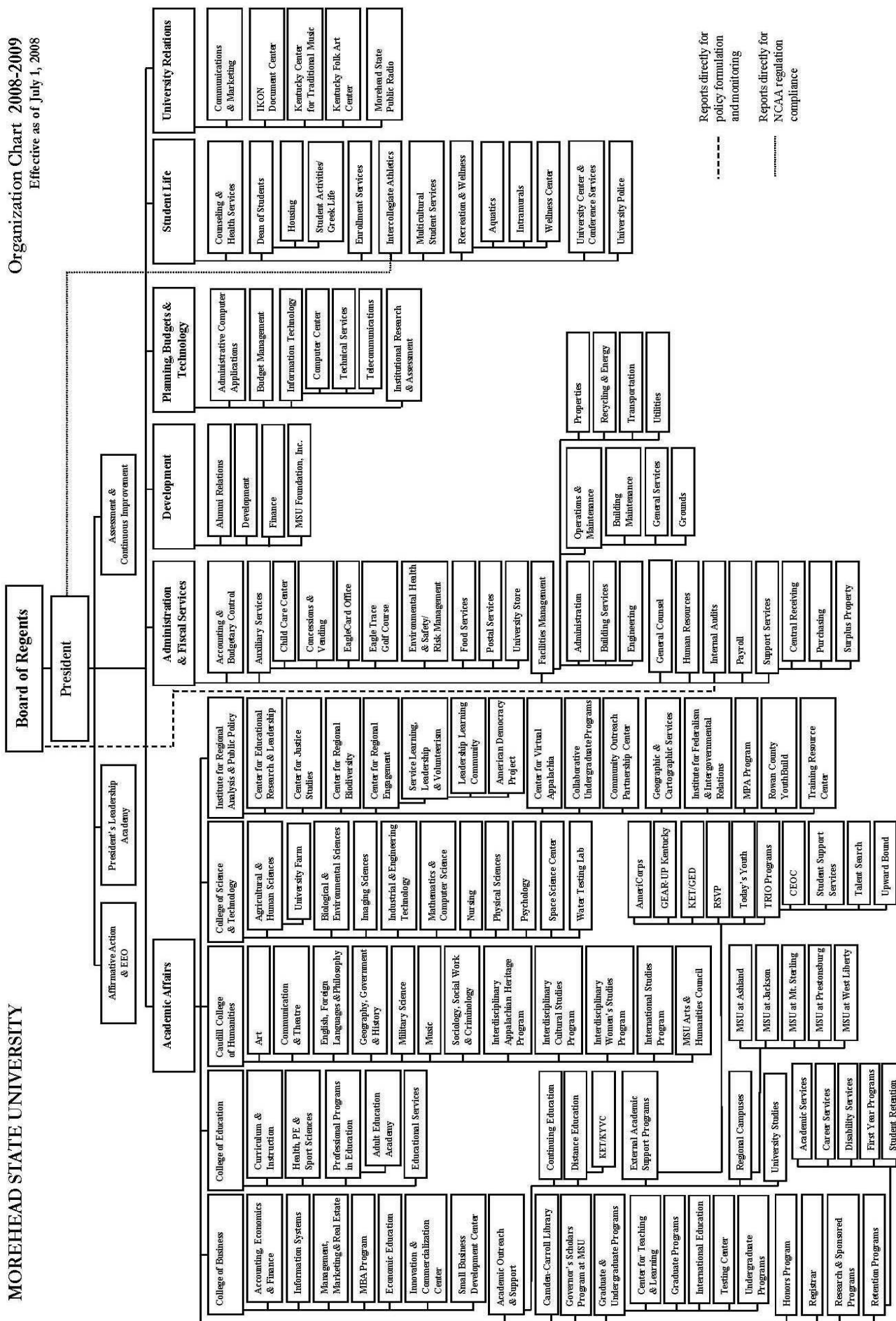

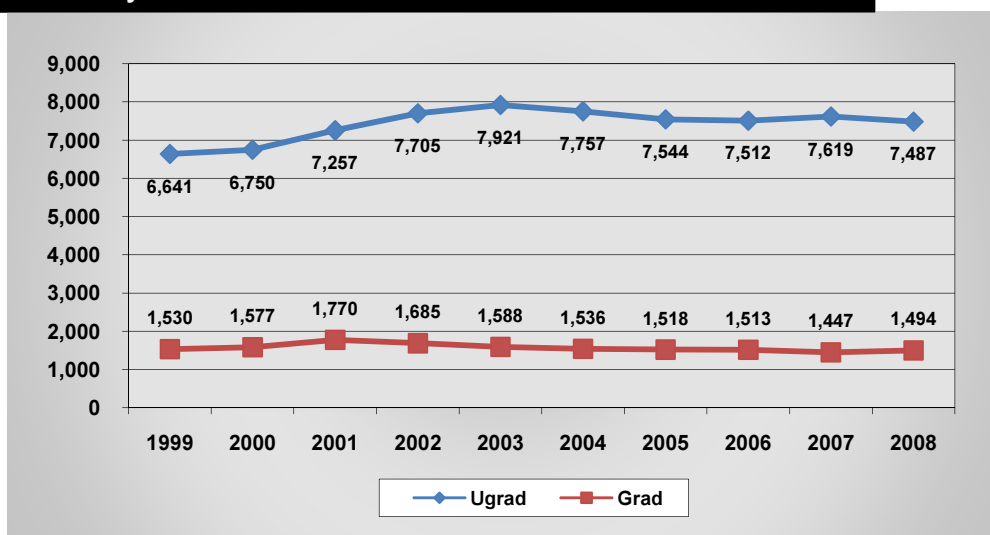

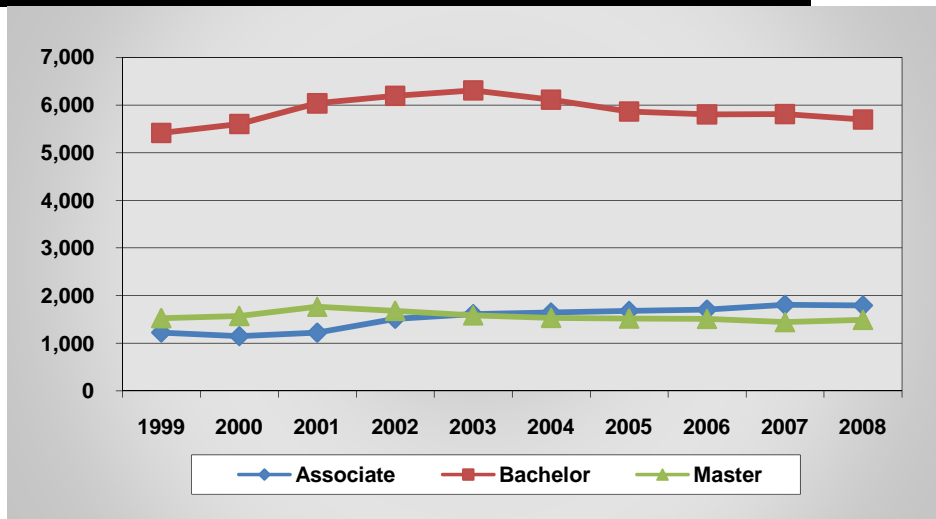

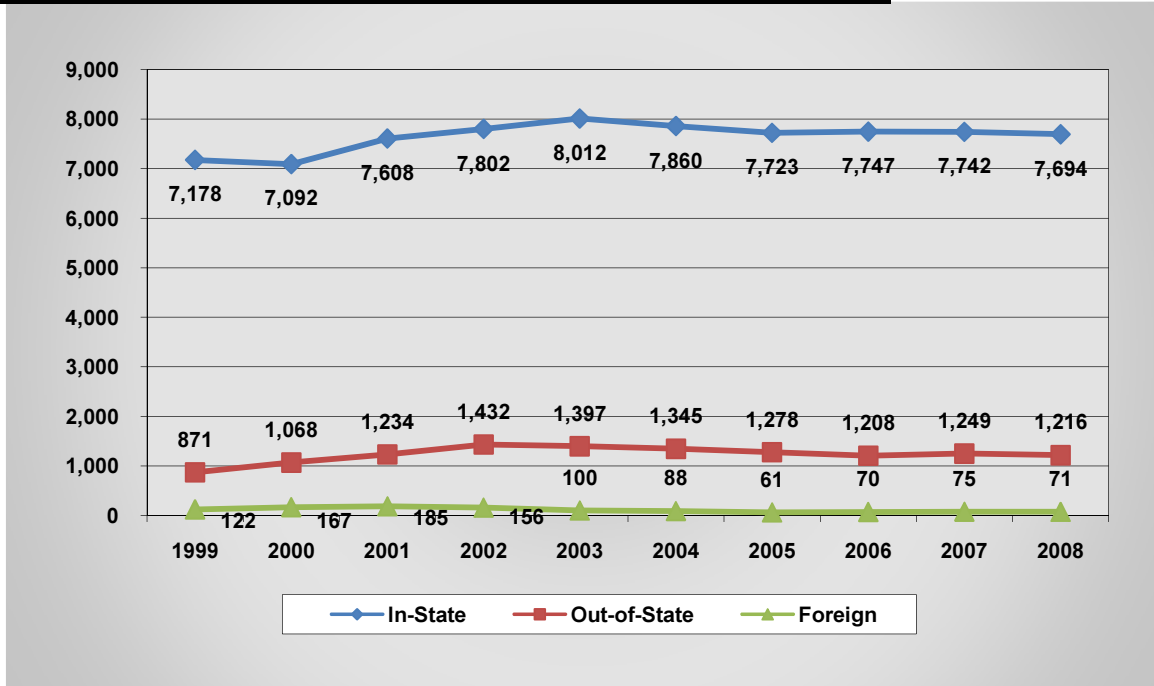

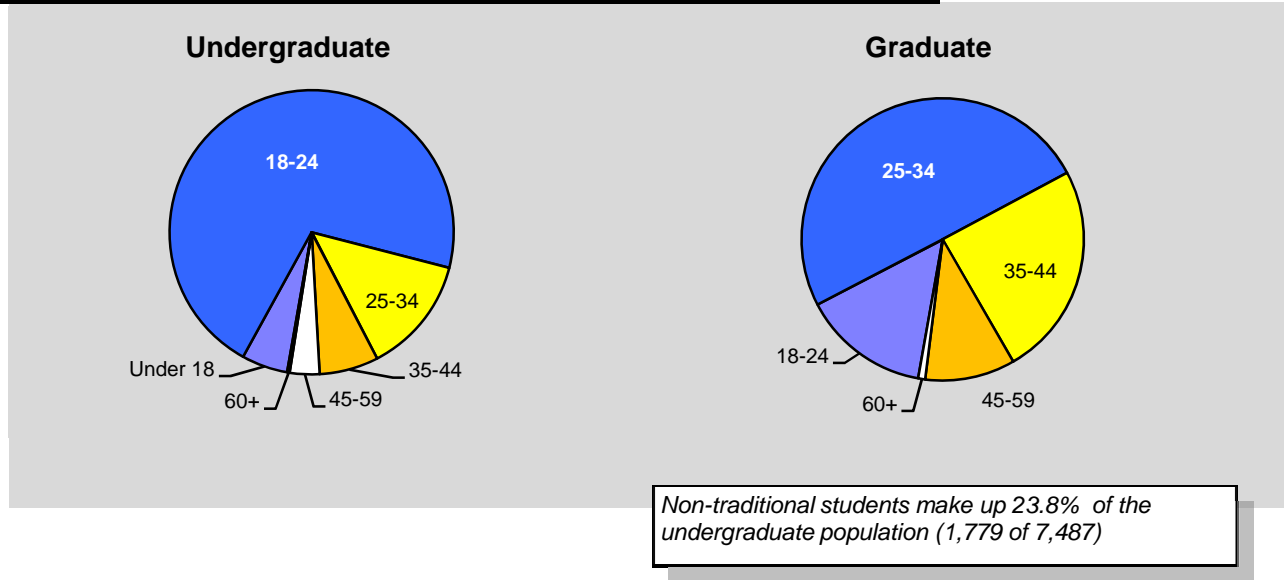

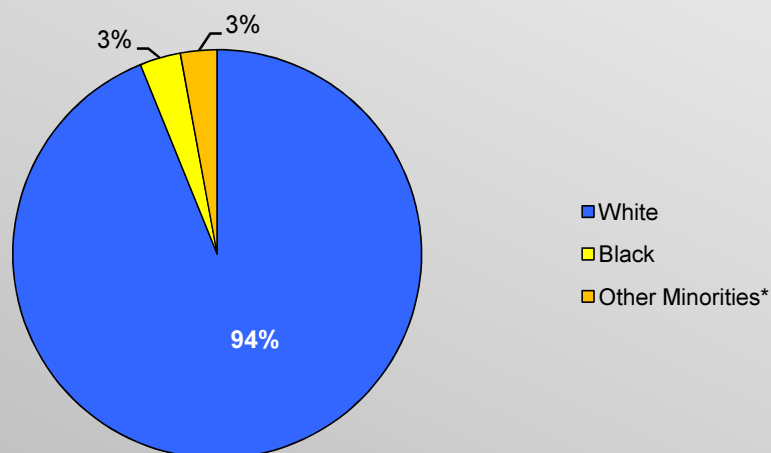

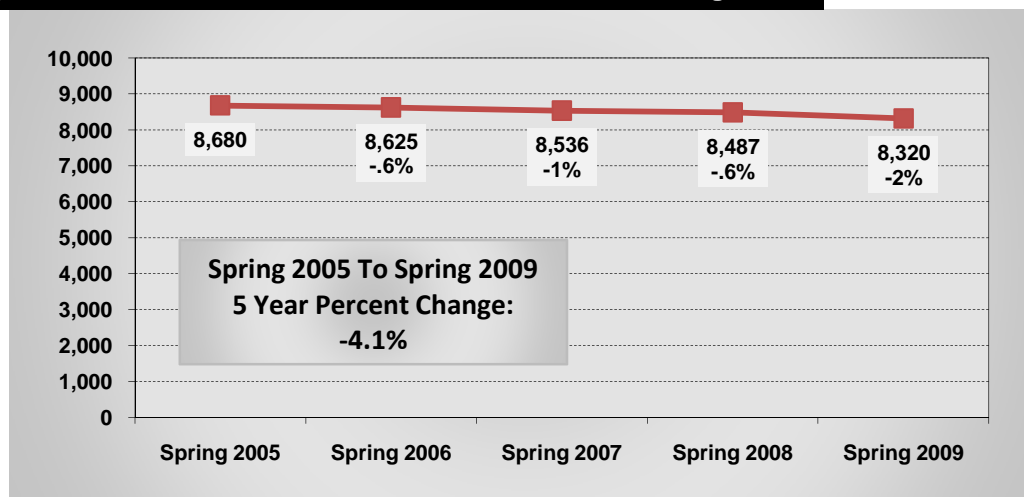

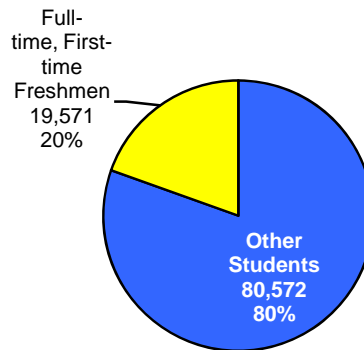
Highlights: First-Time Freshmen Fall 2008

Ninety-seven percent (1,300 of 1,338) of Fall 2008 first-time freshmen were full-time students. This group accounted for about 20% (19,571) of the University's total credit hour production (100,143). Headcount

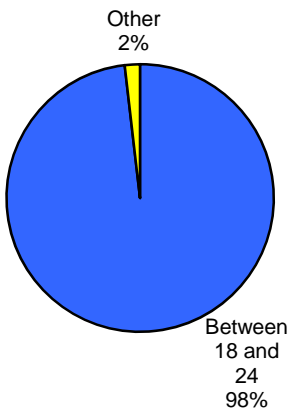

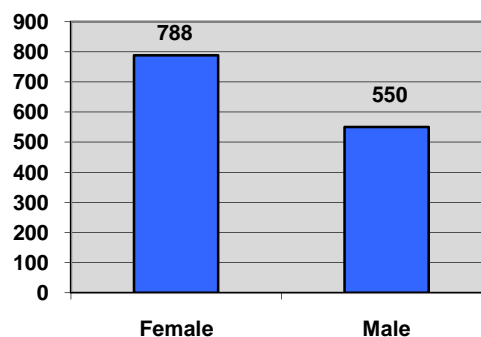


The majority (1,313 or 98%) of MSU Fall 2008 first-time freshmen were of "traditional" age, that is, between 18 and 24 years of age, and more than half (59%) were female. About 92% (1,235) were white, whereas blacks accounted for 56% (58 of 103) of non-whites and about 4% of Fall 2008 first-time freshmen enrollment overall.

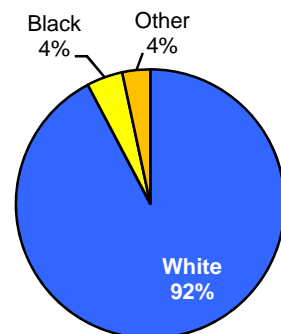

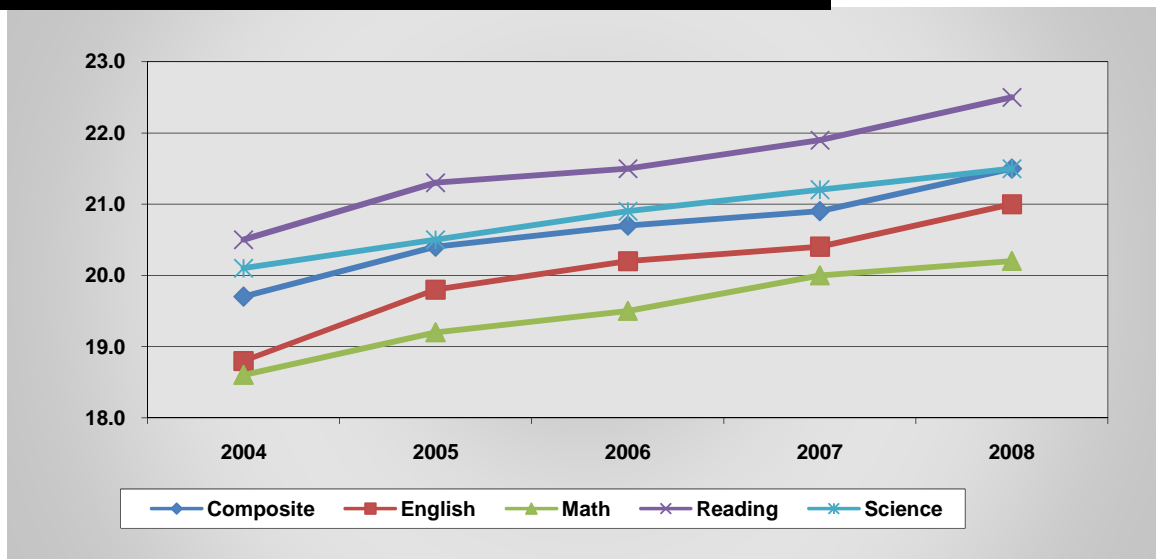

In Fall 2008, 74% (989) of first-time freshmen were seeking a bachelor's degree and 26% (349) were enrolled in associate level programs. 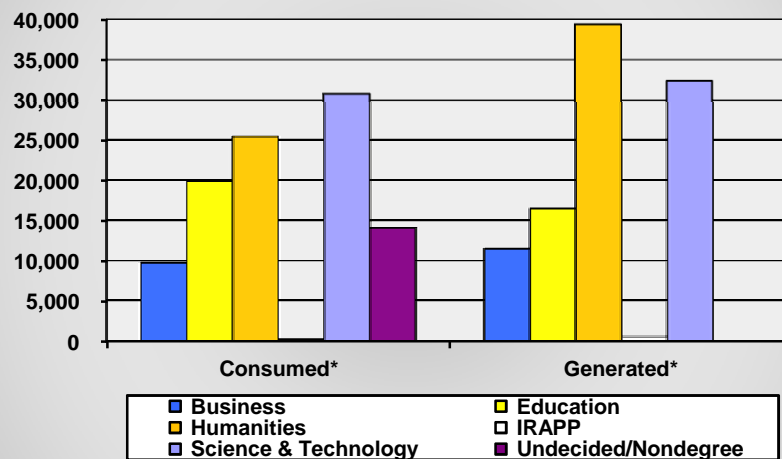

The difference between credit hours "consumed" by majors within a given college and credit hours "generated" by faculty teaching within a given college characterize that college's general academic service profile. For example, Education majors consumed 19,890 credit hours in Fall 2008 whereas Education faculty taught classes which generated 16,464 credit hours during the same semester. The number of credit hours consumed by Education majors in excess of credit hours generated by Education faculty characterizes the College of Education as an academic service "consumer" in Fall 2008.

In order to obtain a general program area overview of enrollments, the Council on Postsecondary Education prepares trend tables displaying comparative fall enrollments by CIP (Classification of Instructional Programs) Area. That is, the 6-digit CIP codes for specific program majors are collapsed to 2-digit codes and enrollments in all majors beginning with the 2-digits are summed. For example, under CIP code 13 (Education), enrollments in 16 specific program major codes have been summed showing MSU's Fall 2008 enrollment in Education programs to be 1,747. The technique allows for quick overview of predominate areas of enrollment at MSU (as in this table) and for other institutions across the Commonwealth and Nation.

Distance Learning Courses Fall 2008

The Council on Postsecondary Education classifies distance learning courses by Provider Category (Institutional, KYVU) and by Primary Learning Mode of Delivery ("B" Internet/World Wide Web, "C" Interactive Video, "F" KET Telecast.)

In Fall 2008, Morehead State University reported 455 distance learning courses. The following table shows that for those 455 courses, the predominant modes of delivery were Internet (255 courses) and Interactive Video (198 courses). The two remaining courses were KET originated. Other sections of the table display total course enrollments and student credit hours generated by all distance learning courses in Fall 2008. In summary, distance learning courses accounted for about 16% of course enrollments (5,989 of 37,857) and 18% of student credit hours generated (17,839 of 100,143) overall.

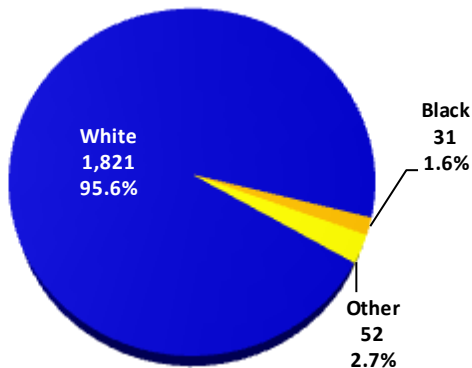

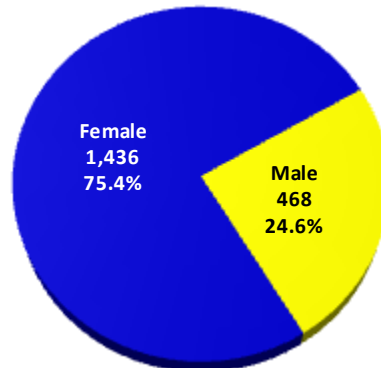

MSU Regional and Off-Campus Sites Profile, Fall 2008

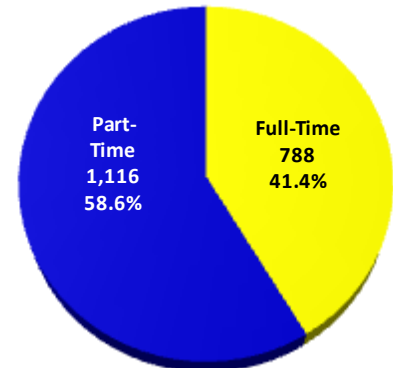

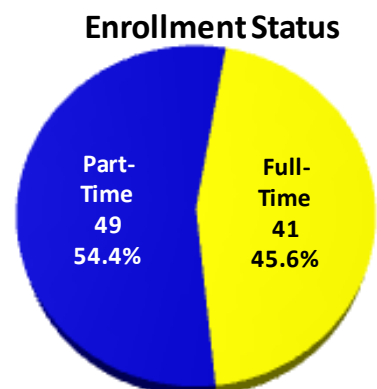
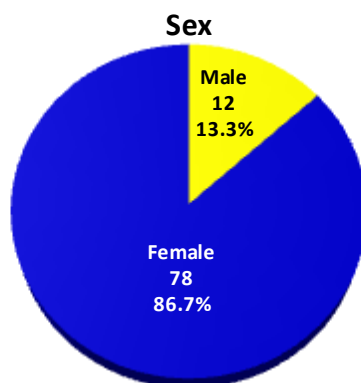
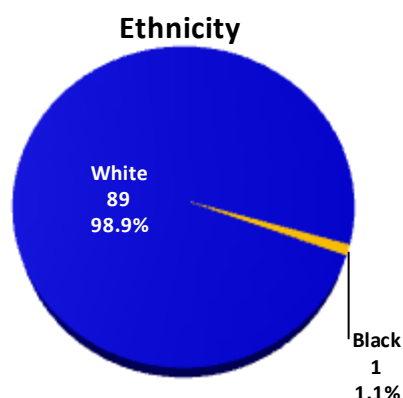
Total Courses, Enrollment and Credit Hours

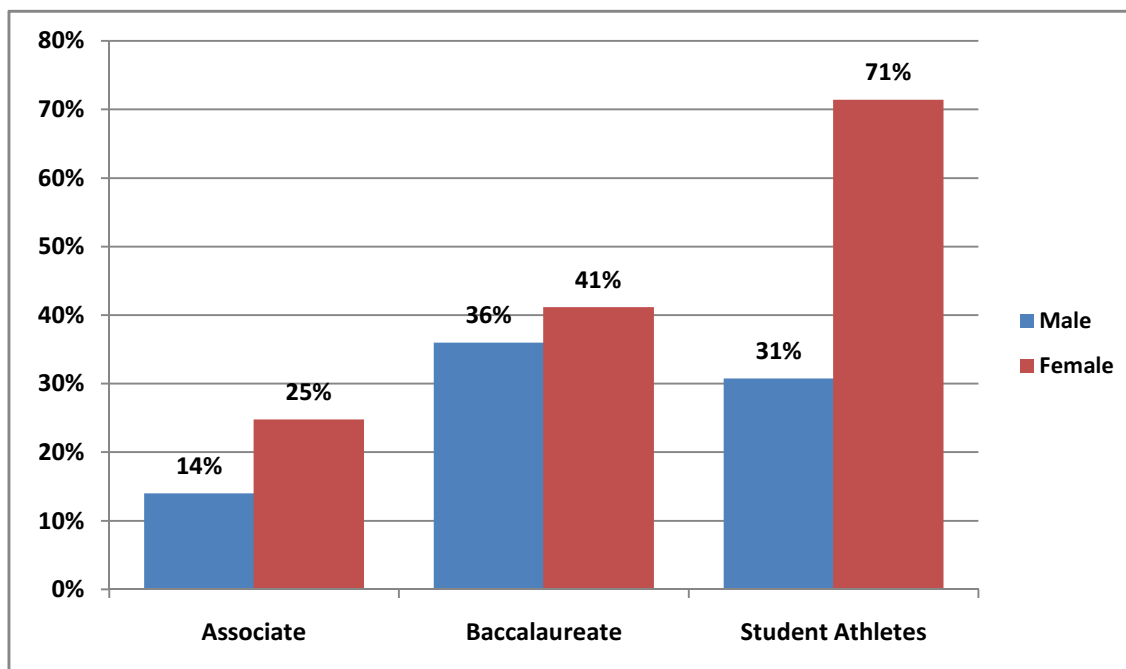

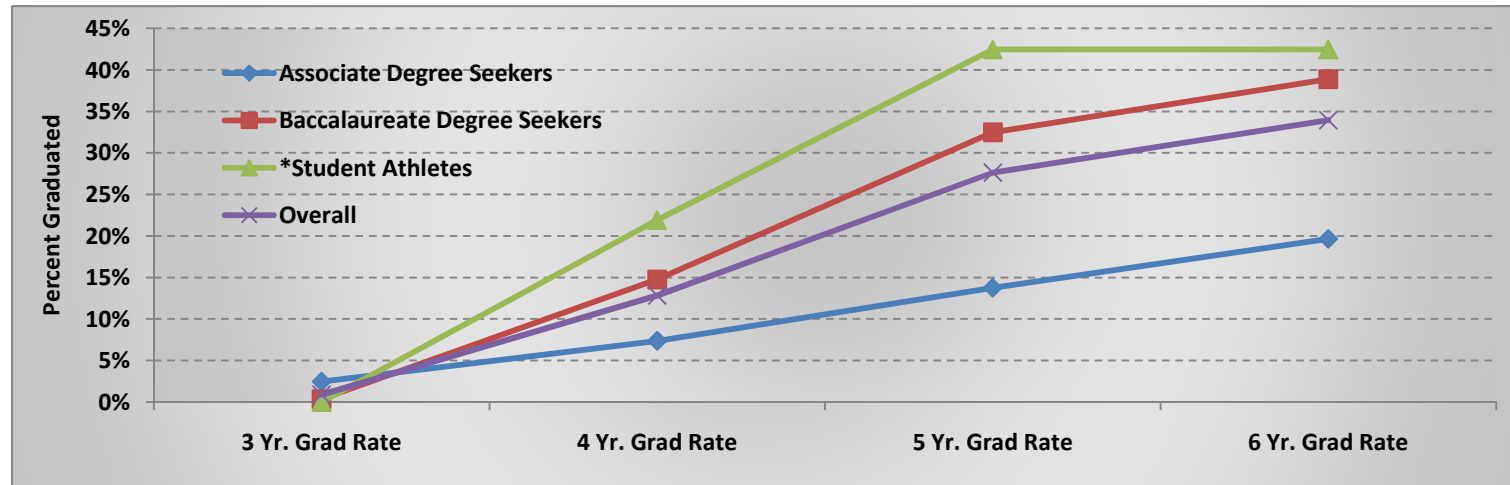

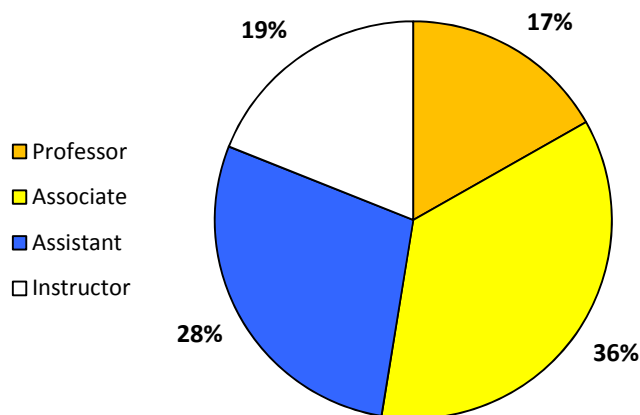

Five-Year Trends Instructional Faculty by Status, College, and Department 2004-2008

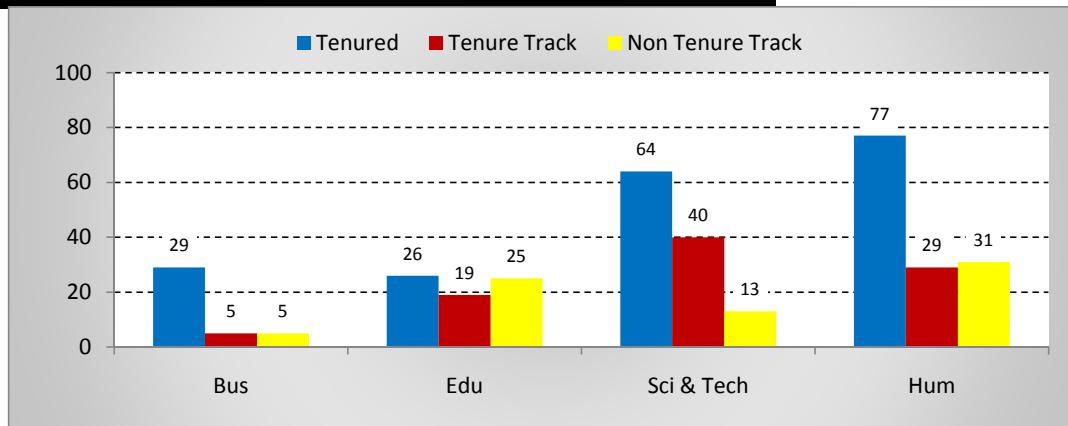

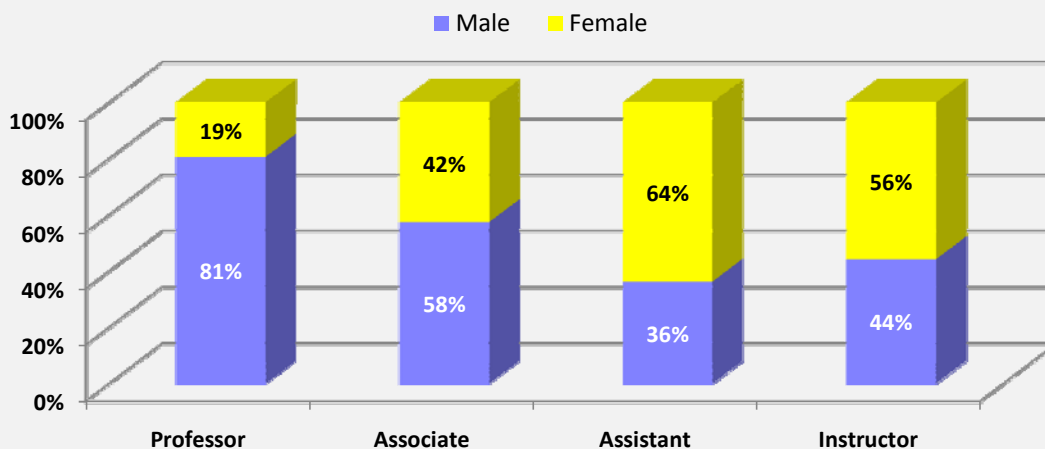

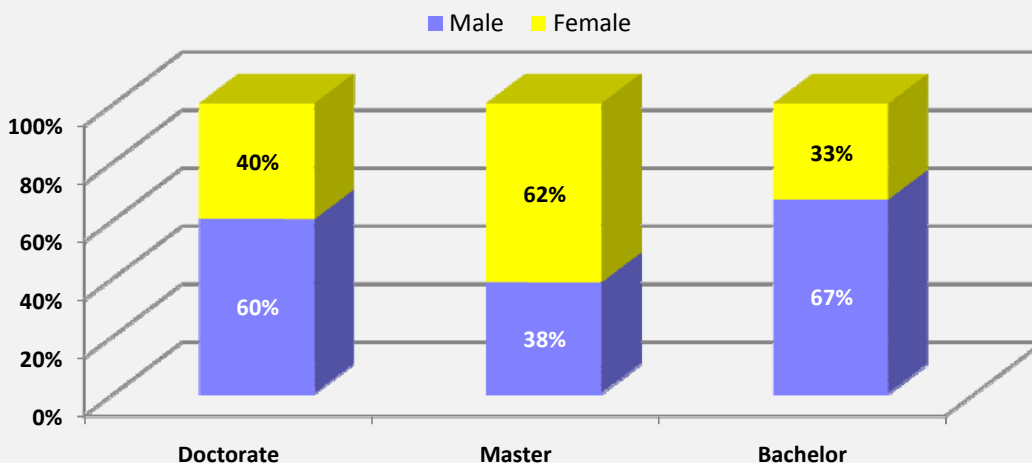

Full-time Faculty Degrees By Sex



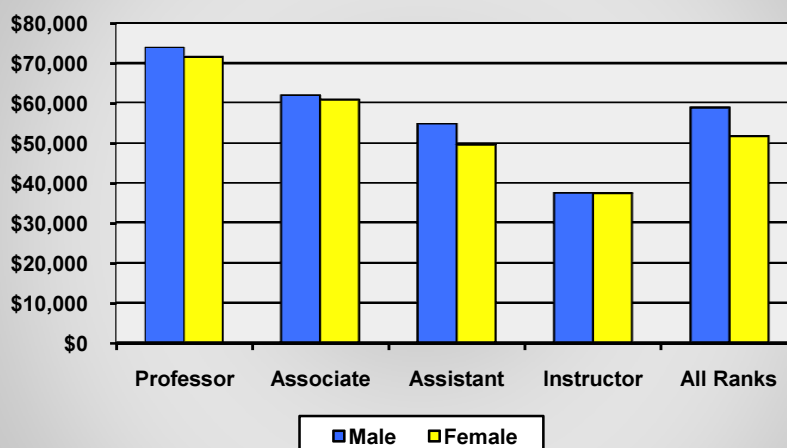

AAUP/IPEDS and Faculty Salary Comparisons

IPEDS (Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System) full-time faculty is identified by the National Center for Education Statistics definition:

Those members of the instruction/research staff who are employed full-time (as defined by the institution) and whose major (more than 50%) regular assignment is instruction, including those with release time for research. Also included in this category are:

- * Full-time instructional faculty on sabbatical leave
- * Full-time replacements for instructional faculty on leave without pay
- * Chairs of departments (if they have no other administrative title and hold a full-time faculty rank)

Both AAUP (American Association of University Professors) and IPEDS collect and report average faculty salaries and compensation (salaries plus other benefits) annually. As an option, institutions may forward their mandatory IPEDS faculty surveys to AAUP rather than prepare a separate AAUP-sponsored survey. AAUP publishes an "Annual Report on the Economic Status of the Profession" in the March-April issue of its bulletin, *Academe*. The next page shows a table displaying average faculty salaries by rank for MSU's Fall 2008 benchmark institutions. Faculty salary averages and respective numbers at each rank have been taken from the AAUP data reported in *Academe*, March/April 2009, when available.

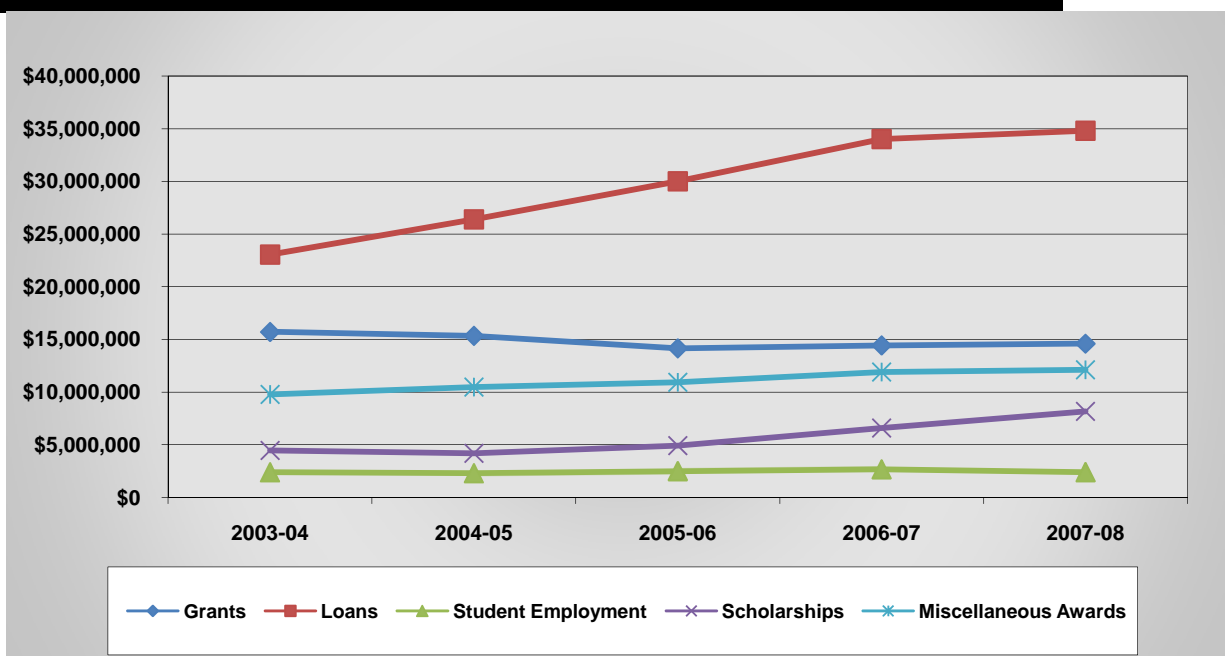

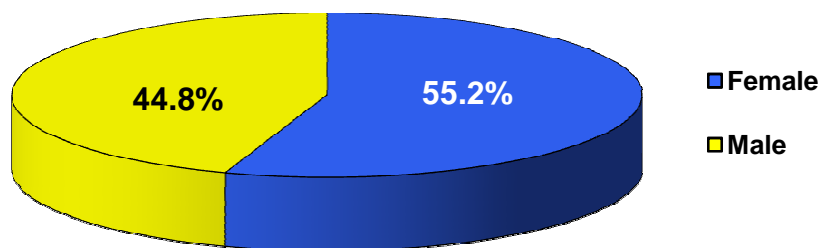

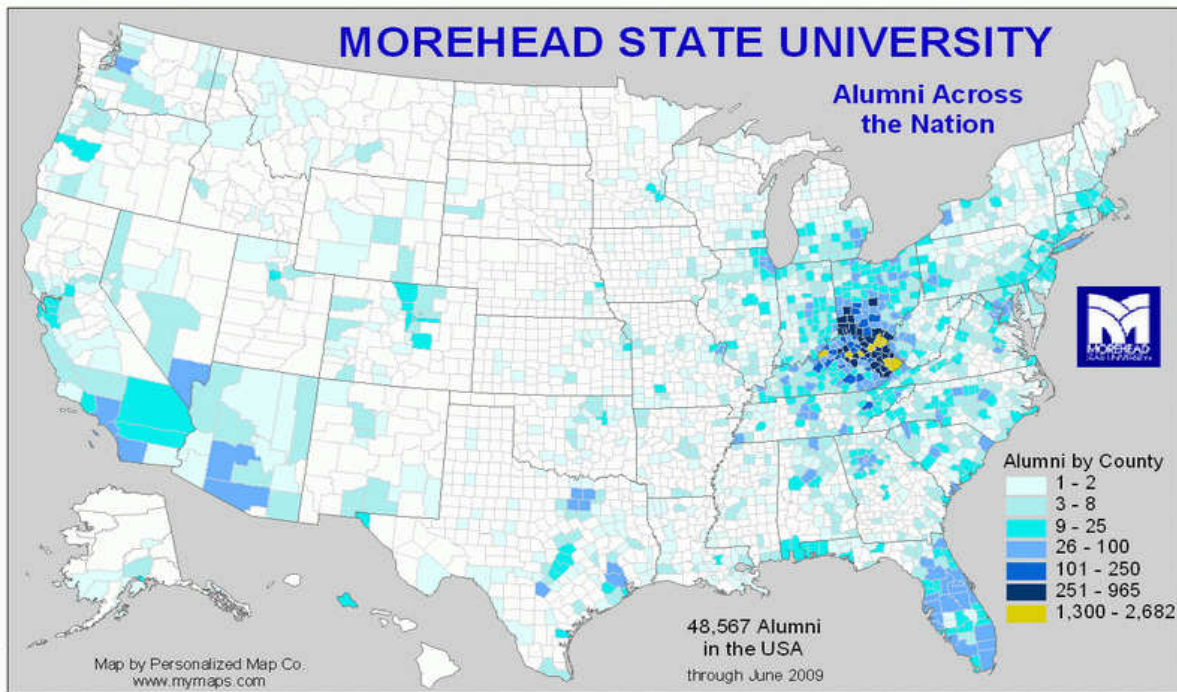

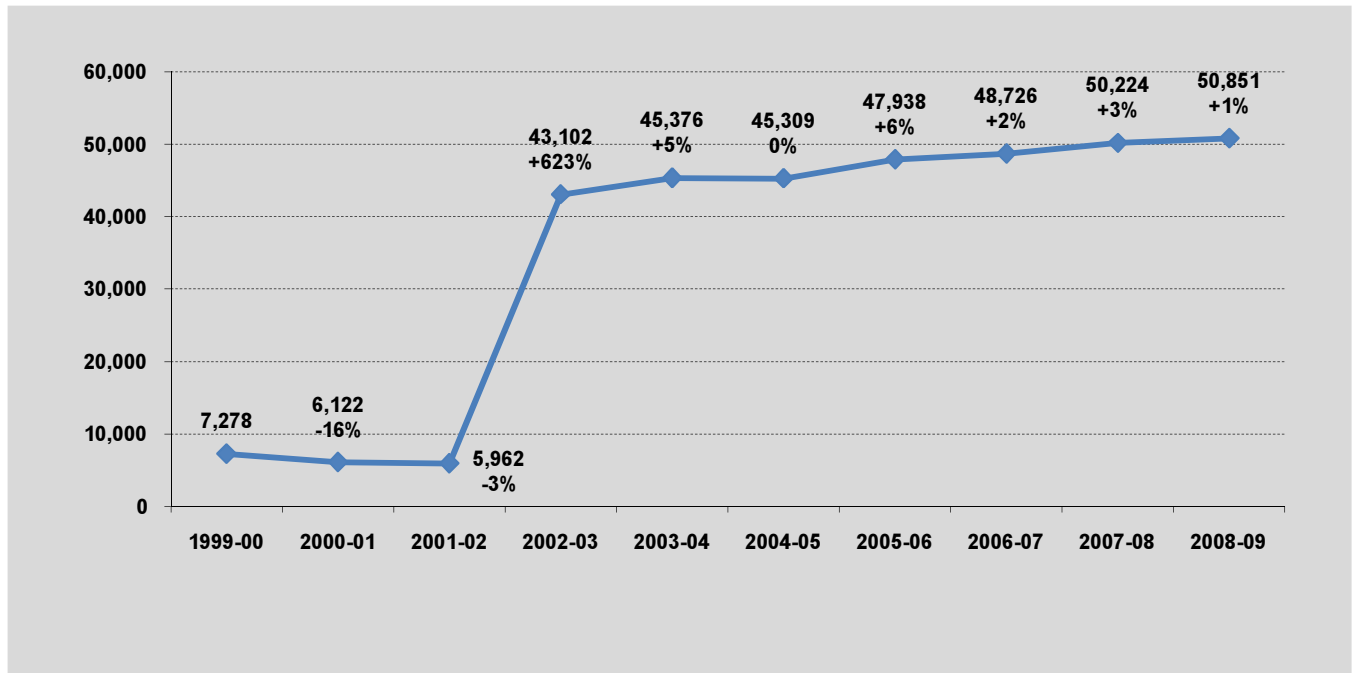

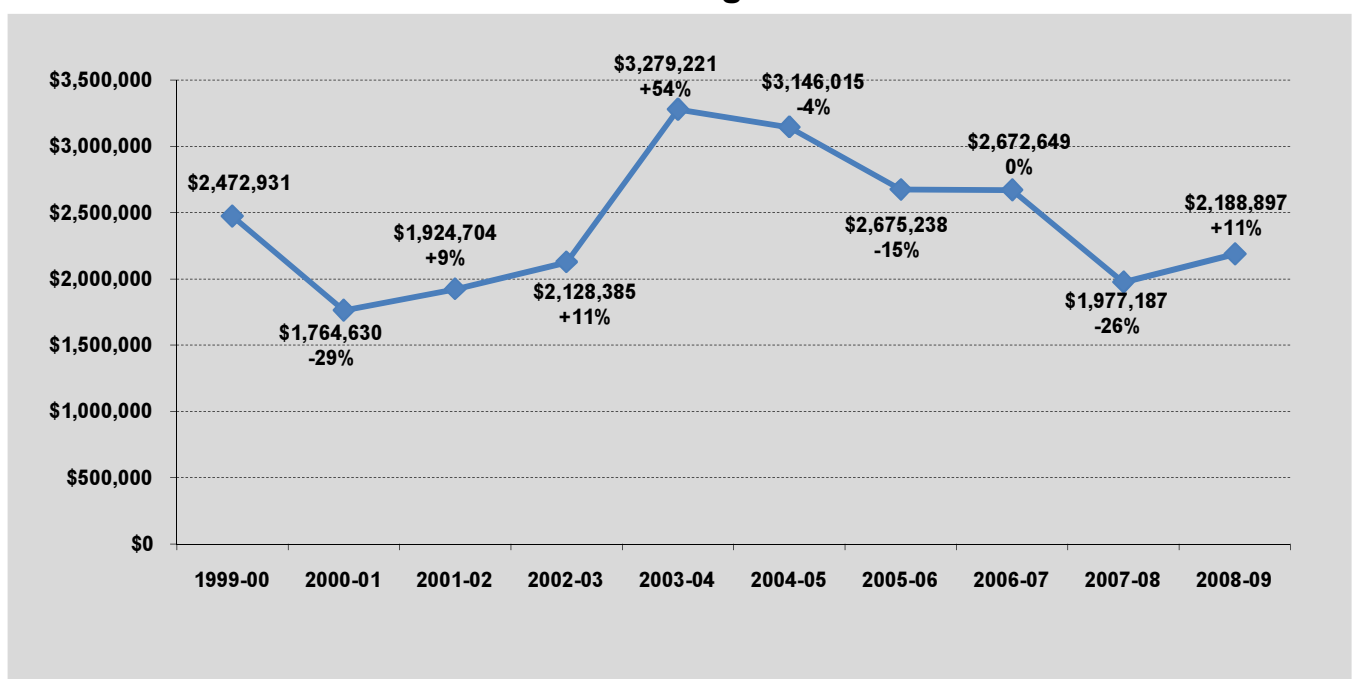

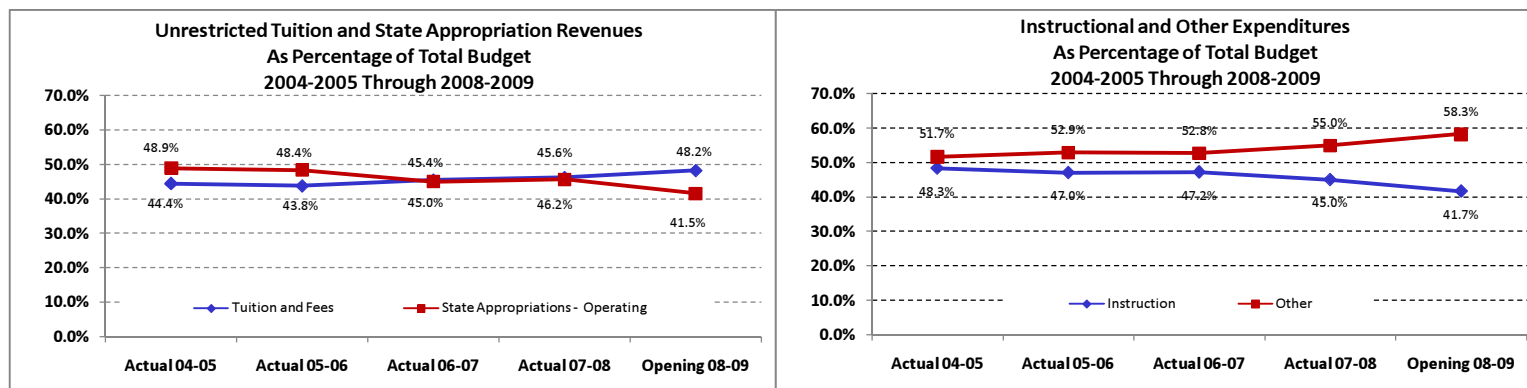

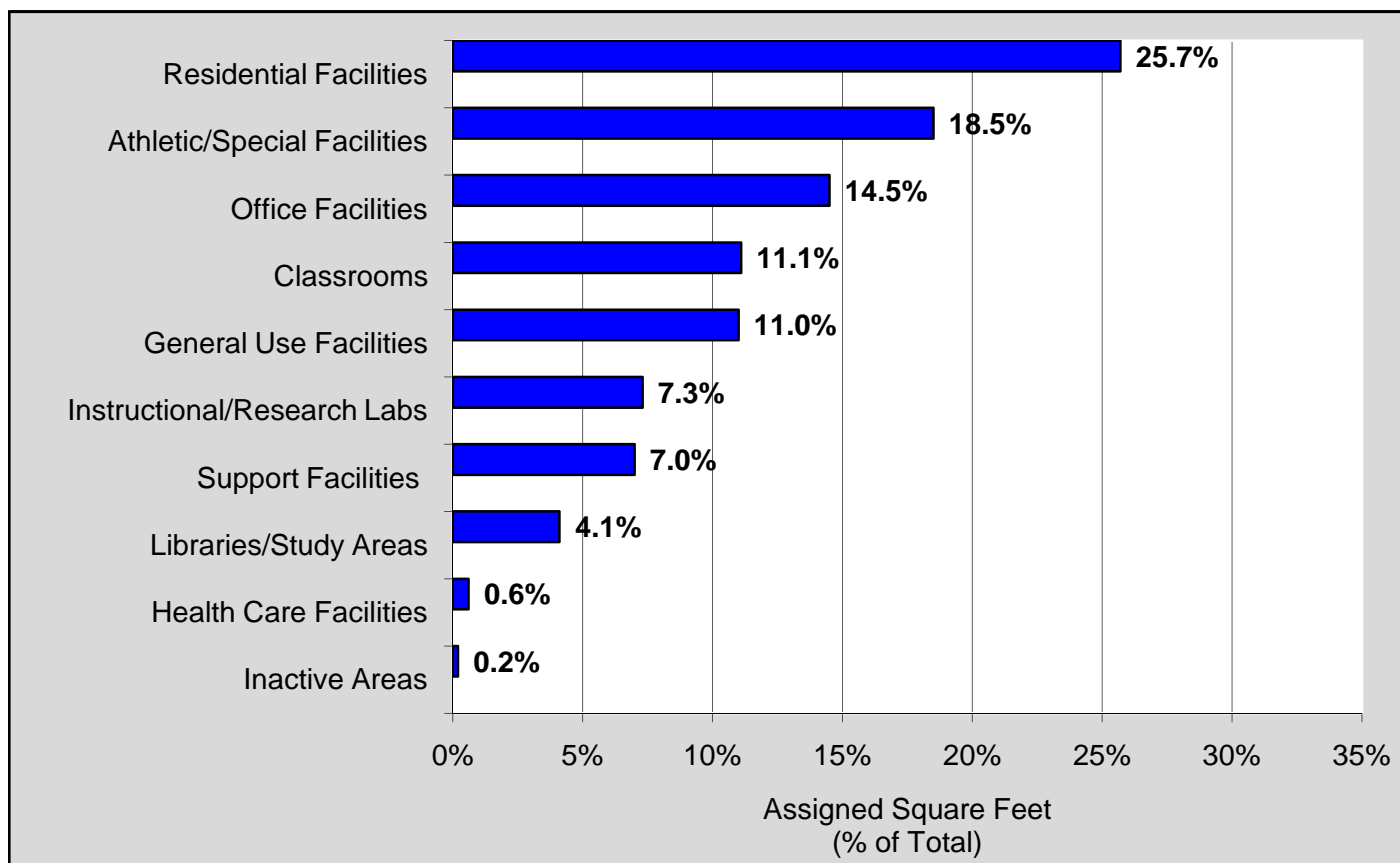

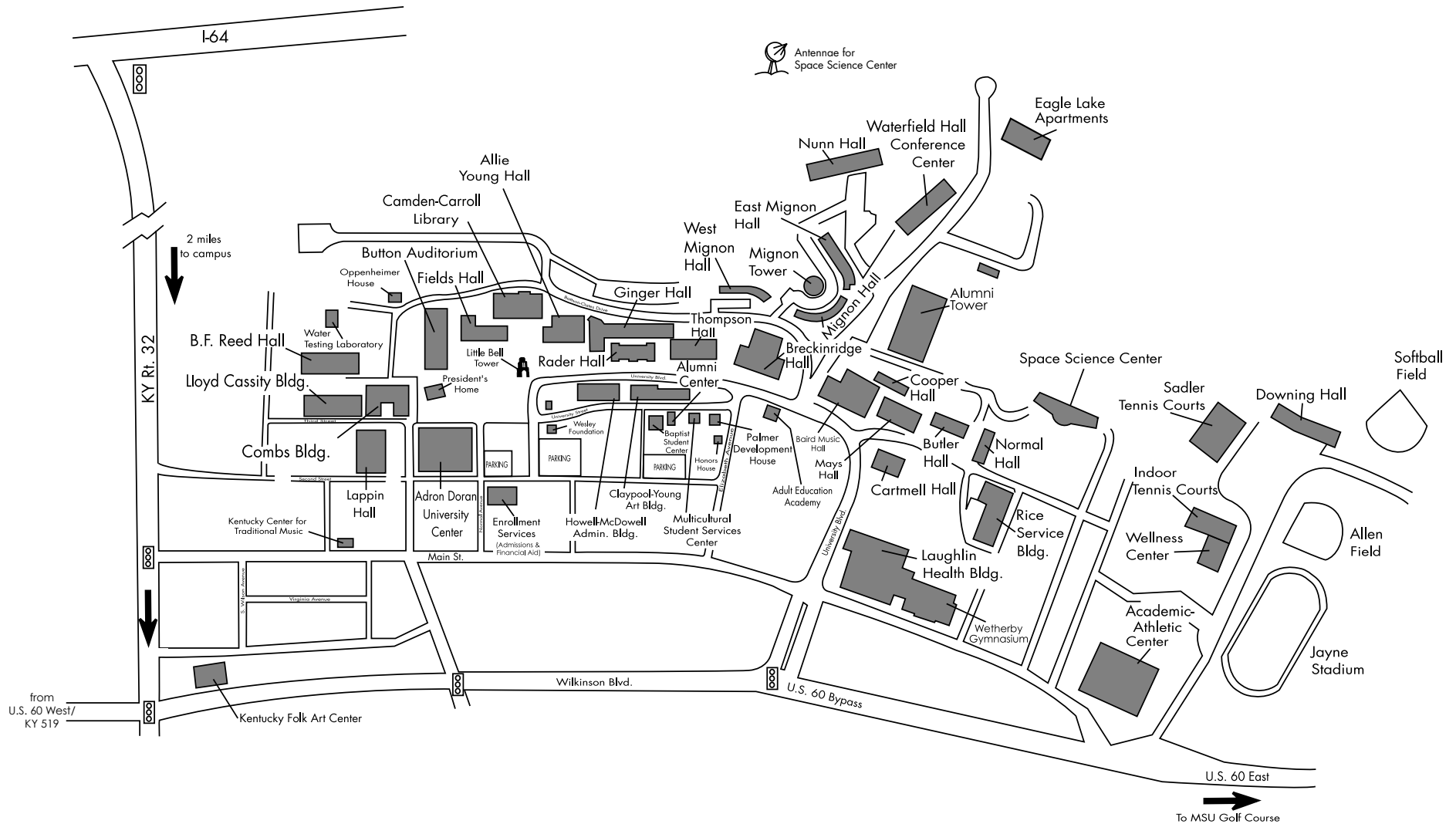
