- 4) Any modifications made at a later date to any reports used to provide these data might reflect different numbers.

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...In a Nutshell

- Headcount enrollment in Fall 2009 was 9,046, up 65 (1%) from Fall 2008 (8,981).
- First-time freshman average composite ACT score is down from 21.5 in 2008 to 21.4 in 2009.
- Retention of first-time freshmen is up 5.0%, from 66.0% in 2008 to 71.0% in 2009, an upward trend that began in 2005.
- First-time freshman headcount was 1,260, an approximate 6% decrease from Fall 2008 freshman enrollment (1,338).
- Seventy-four percent of undergraduates (5,586 of 7,550) enrolled full-time compared to 19% of graduate students (289 of 1,496), the majority of which were enrolled part-time.
- Women outnumbered men at the University, accounting for 61% of undergraduates, 67% of graduate enrollment, or 62% of enrollment overall.
- The mean age of undergraduates was 24 years (minimum 14 years, maximum 75 years) compared to 33 years for graduate students (minimum 21 years, maximum 67 years).
- Eighty-six percent (7,786 of 9,046) of enrollees were Kentuckians; 62% (5,628) originated from MSU's 22-county Service Region.
- Minorities (including international students) represented 7% of University enrollment overall.
- MSU conferred 1,490 first degrees in 2008-2009; 150 Associate, 930 Bachelor, and 410 Master/Specialist. An additional 21 second degrees were conferred in 2008-2009, all Bachelor degrees.
- Residence halls housed 2,275 students in Fall 2009.
- Approximately 67% of MSU's alumni reside in Kentucky.
- MSU's 370 full-time and 99 part-time faculty taught 2,354 courses in Fall 2009.
- In addition to faculty, MSU employed 778 full-time and 291 part-time staff (including 118 graduate assistants).
- The University's opening budget for 2009-2010 was \$124,100,000.



Morehead State University aspires to be the best public university in the south! The primary objective of the University is to meet the educational needs of Eastern Kentucky while striving to constantly improve the quality of its public service, economic development, and applied research programs. Located in the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest, the nearly 500 acre main campus lies within the city limits of Morehead, Kentucky. Beyond the city, the University's real estate holdings include the Derrickson Agricultural complex and the Eagle Trace public golf course. In addition to the main campus, classes are conducted at 5 regional campuses, located in Ashland, Jackson, Mt. Sterling, Prestonsburg, and West Liberty, as well as a variety of other off-campus locations. In addition to traditional face-to-face instruction, the University offers a number of distance learning courses via the internet and throughout the region via interactive compressed video.

The University is governed by the 11 member Board of Regents including eight citizens appointed by the governor and three seats held by elected faculty, staff, and student representatives. Management of the institution is vested primarily in five divisions: Academic Affairs which includes 4 colleges (Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences; Business and Public Affairs; Education; and Science and Technology) and 22 departments; Administration and Fiscal Services; Planning, Budgets, and Technology; Student Life; and University Advancement.

Morehead State University is committed to achieving academic excellence through the development, delivery, and maintenance of superior academic programs. MSU is accredited as a comprehensive university offering a wide variety of undergraduate, graduate, and pre-professional programs in a collegial and open environment. During the 2009-2010 academic year, MSU offered 152 undergraduate degree programs, including 19 associate level degrees and 133 baccalaureate level degrees, as well as 22 pre-professional programs. There were 63 graduate degree programs and an education specialist program in 5 specialty areas as well as 35 graduate non-degree programs designed especially for professional educators. Additionally, a master's degree for social work and several cooperative doctoral programs, all with the University of Kentucky, were available on the MSU campus. MSU offers students a 17:1 student/faculty ratio, allowing for a more personalized educational experience, and has been recognized for the fifth consecutive year as one of the top public universities in the South in the 2010 edition of "America's Best Colleges" by U.S. News & World Report.

MSU and the surrounding area offer students an engaging educational experience both in and out of the classroom! Constantly seeking improvement and new opportunities for student learning, MSU recently built the Equine Health Education Center and the Space Science Center, through partnership with NASA. In 2009, construction began on the Center for Health Education and Research, through partnership with St. Claire Regional Medical Center and the University of Kentucky, and on a new \$30 million Student Recreation Center. Housing facilities include space for over 2,700 students in traditional residence halls, suites, and apartments. In addition to academics, students have the opportunity to join more than 100 clubs and organizations or participate in a variety of student activities. Athletically, the University sponsors 11 intercollegiate sports for men and women in accordance with the regulations of the Ohio Valley Conference, the Pioneer Football League, and Division I of the NCAA. MSU also supports an intramural program involving both team and individual sports.






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Ten-Year Trends











Highlights: First-Time Freshmen Fall 2009

Ninety-eight percent (1,239 of 1,260) of Fall 2009 first-time freshmen were full-time students. This group accounted for about 19% (18,980) of the University's total credit hour production (99,917). In order of degree intent, 1,157 (92%) were baccalaureate seekers followed by 103 (8%) associate seekers.



The majority (1,215 or 96%) of MSU Fall 2009 first-time freshmen were of "traditional" age, that is, between 18 and 24 years of age, and more than half (57%) were female. About 92% (1,157) were white, whereas blacks accounted for 47% (48 of 103) of non-whites and about 4% of Fall 2009 first-time freshmen enrollment overall.



More than half (734 of 1,260) of first-time freshmen originated in MSU's 22-county service region and an additional 26% (331) came from the remaining counties throughout the Commonwealth. Overall, 85% of first-time freshmen were Kentucky residents compared to 85% Kentucky residency in the total Fall 2008 student population.



By Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE) definition, first-time freshmen are degree-seekers. In Fall 2009, 92% (1,157) of first-time freshmen were seeking a bachelor's degree and 8% (103) were enrolled in associate level programs. In order to gain a broad overview of freshman program area interests, Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) major codes were collapsed to two digits and enrollments were tallied by level and program area as shown below.



The difference between credit hours "consumed" by majors within a given college and credit hours "generated" by faculty teaching within a given college characterize that college's general academic service profile. For example, Education majors consumed 14,316 credit hours in Fall 2009 whereas Education faculty taught classes which generated 12,208 credit hours during the same semester. The number of credit hours consumed by Education majors in excess of credit hours generated by Education faculty characterizes the College of Education as an academic service "consumer" in Fall 2009.

In order to obtain a general program area overview of enrollments, the Council on Postsecondary Education prepares trend tables displaying comparative fall enrollments by CIP (Classification of Instructional Programs) Area. That is, the 6-digit CIP codes for specific program first majors are collapsed to 2-digit codes and enrollments in all majors beginning with the 2-digits are summed. For example, under CIP code 13 (Education), enrollments in 16 specific program major codes have been summed showing MSU's Fall 2009 enrollment in Education programs to be 1,584. The technique allows for quick overview of predominate areas of enrollment at MSU (as in this table) and for other institutions across the Commonwealth and Nation.

Distance Learning Courses Fall 2009

The Council on Postsecondary Education classifies distance learning courses by Provider Category (Institutional, KYVU) and by Primary Learning Mode of Delivery ("B" Internet/World Wide Web, "C" Interactive Video, "F" KET Telecast.)

In Fall 2009, Morehead State University reported 480 distance learning courses. The following table shows that for those 480 courses 60% were Internet courses and 40% were interactive video courses. Other sections of the table display total course enrollments and student credit hours generated by all distance learning courses in Fall 2009. In summary, distance learning courses accounted for about 19% of course enrollments (6,973 of 37,730) and 21% of student credit hours generated (20,753 of 99,917) overall.





MSU Regional and Off-Campus Sites Profile, Fall 2009













Full-time Faculty Degrees By Sex





AAUP/IPEDS and Faculty Salary Comparisons

IPEDS (Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System) full-time faculty is identified by the National Center for Education Statistics definition:

Those members of the instruction/research staff who are employed full-time (as defined by the institution) and whose major (more than 50%) regular assignment is instruction, including those with release time for research. Also included in this category are:

- * Full-time instructional faculty on sabbatical leave
- * Full-time replacements for instructional faculty on leave without pay
- * Chairs of departments (if they have no other administrative title and hold a full-time faculty rank)

Both AAUP (American Association of University Professors) and IPEDS collect and report average faculty salaries and compensation (salaries plus other benefits) annually. As an option, institutions may forward their mandatory IPEDS faculty surveys to AAUP rather than prepare a separate AAUP-sponsored survey. AAUP publishes an "Annual Report on the Economic Status of the Profession" in the March-April issue of its bulletin, *Academe*. The next page shows a table displaying average faculty salaries by rank for MSU's Fall 2009 benchmark institutions. Faculty salary averages and respective numbers at each rank have been taken from the AAUP data reported in *Academe*, March/April 2010, when available.
















