he Master of Science in Nursing (MSN), Family Nurse Practitioner Program (FNPP), with a primary focus has completed two years of course work and admitted four cohorts of students. Three courses will be taught for the MSN program this summer.

We would like to congratulate Susan Woodard with the MSN Honor's Award for having the highest GPA. The MSN Program was awarded accreditation by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) at their annual meeting in May. There are currently 47 active students enrolled in the MSN program. The first cohort of students is scheduled to graduate Fall 2019.

The Online Nursing Programs would like to provide public notification of a curricular change as follows:

Post-Licensure Baccalaureate of Nursing Program

One new courses were approved by the university curriculum committee and will be offered this fall. This course will serve as NURS "Elective Courses" which students can take to meet Post-Licensure Baccalaureate of Nursing Program requirements. This courses will also serve as free/general electives for other MSU majors.

NURS 401: Disaster and Emergency Management. (3-0-3) Fall and Spring. Open to any interested student. A study of the cause, impact and mitigation of disasters and emergency management.

COURSE STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon completion this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Critically explore disaster preparedness at the local and national level.
- 2. Critique ethical and legal issues through a disaster perspective.
- 3. Analyze the impact of disaster on high-vulnerability populations.
- 4. Explore the impact of natural disasters and methods of mitigating harm.
- 5. Analyze chemical, biological and radiological threats to humanity
- 6. Adapt triage and health management to the disaster setting.
- 7. Outline available resources for disaster planning and mitigation.

The Online RN-BSN Program ranked #2 in Kentucky according to a study by RegisteredNursing.org, a nursing advocacy organization. This ranking is up from #5 last year.

In mid-July Morehead State University's nursing program was notified that their fully Online RN to BSN program was ranked #2 in the Commonwealth of Kentucky! The announcement came from Registered Nursing.org. Methadologies used to determine school rankings included: accreditation status, number of online programs at the institution, program completion rates, tuition and

fee structure adjusted for each counties cost of living factor, ratio of teaching faculty that are tenured, nursing program completion rates compared to the University completion rates, ratio of instructional faculty who are tenured, acceptance rate for the University and graduation rate at 150% of the normal time.

The Online RN to BSN program at Morehead State University is nationally accredited by the Commission for Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) through 2025! Courses are mainly taught in 8-week semester and some 4-week semesters in the summer and winter terms. The majority of full-time faculty teaching in the program are tenured or are on a tenure-track earning line. The curriculum was recently revised to reflect the most current evidenced-based practices that are geared toward the practicing RN student.

Course reviews, completed by online students are overwhelming positive with comments that center around the flexibility of the program, online courses and the willingness of the faculty to go the extra mile and help the students receive a practical and quality nursing education.
