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Highlights

- In Fall 2011 MSU enrolled 10,971 students.
- First-time students' average composite ACT score was 21.8, up from 21.6 in Fall 2010.
- MSU retained 72.7% of its first-time freshmen from Fall 2010 to Fall 2011. MSU's adjusted Fall to Fall Retention Rate for all undergraduates (Retained plus graduated/divided by original number enrolled) was 78.4%.
- Fall 2011 first-time freshmen headcount was 1,372, a 16.3% increase from Fall 2010 first-time freshman enrollment (1,180).
- Fifty-nine percent of undergraduates (5,553 of 9,420) enrolled full-time compared to 20.4% of graduate students (316 of 1,551), the majority of which were enrolled part-time.
- Women outnumbered men at the University, accounting for 61.2% of undergraduates (5,762 of 9,420), 62.7% of graduate enrollment (973 of 1,551), or 61.4% of enrollment overall (6,735 of 10,971).
- Fifty-nine percent of undergraduates are age 18-24 (5,528); 21.5% are below 18 (2,022) and 19.9% (1,870) are 25 and older.
- The mean age of undergraduates was 22.3 years (minimum 15 years, maximum 77 years) compared to 33.3 years for graduate students (minimum 20 years, maximum 69 years).
- Eighty-seven percent of enrollees originated from Kentucky (9,582); 62.7% (6,882) originated from MSU's 22-county Service Region.
- Under-represented Minorities (American Indian, Black, Hispanic/Latino, and Native Hawaiian) represented 4.6% of University enrollment overall (492 of 10,654); up from 4.5% in Fall 2010 (392 of 8,616). Students of unknown race/ethnicity and non-resident aliens are excluded from the denominator.

Highlights, continued

- As an outreach effort, MSU is offering more classes to high school students. There were 1,788 more high school students in fall 2012 (2,343) when compared to fall 2011 (555). This equates to an enrollment increase of 322.2% of students in this classification.
- First-time freshmen underrepresented minorities (African-American, Hispanic, American-Indian, Native Alaskan, Pacific-Islander) grew by 3 students, from 83 in Fall 2010 to 86 in Fall 2011.
- MSU conferred 1,681 first degrees in 2010-2011; 165 Associate, 1,079 Bachelor, and 437 graduate degrees (Master and Specialist). An additional 39 second degrees were conferred in 2010-2011, all Bachelor degrees.
- Residence halls housed 2,439 students in Fall 2011 (an 89.9% occupancy rate).
- The majority of MSU's alumni (67.4%) live in Kentucky.
- MSU's 381 full-time and 98 part-time faculty taught 2,584 courses in Fall 2011.
- In addition to faculty, MSU employed 791 full-time and 266 part-time staff (including 116 graduate assistants).
- The University's opening budget for 2011-2012 was \$135,500,000.

Campus and Locations

The University is located in the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest in Rowan County. The nearly 500-acre main campus within the city limits of Morehead includes more than 50 major structures. Outside the city, the University's real estate holdings include the 320-acre Derrickson Agricultural Complex and Eagle Trace, a par-72, 6,902-yard public golf course. Housing facilities include space for approximately 3,000 students in a variety of housing styles, including traditional residence halls, suites and apartments.

Classes are offered at regional campuses in Ashland, Jackson, Mt. Sterling, Prestonsburg, West Liberty and at other sites, including Maysville and Pikeville. Additionally, the University offers a number of distance learning courses throughout the region via the Internet and interactive compressed video.

Academics

The University offers 141 undergraduate degree programs, including eight associate level degrees and 133 baccalaureate degrees in four colleges

There are 71 graduate degree programs plus five education specialist program in five specialty areas. A master's degree for physician assistants, social workers and a cooperative doctoral program, all with the University of Kentucky, are available on the MSU campus. A doctoral degree in education began in fall 2010.

Alumni

Over 50,000 alumni reside in all fifty U.S. states, plus Washington D.C. and U.S. territories.

The University is comprised of four colleges:

- Caudill College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences
- College of Business and Public Affairs
- College of Education
- College of Science and Technology

Budget

The University currently operates on an annual budget of \$135.5 million with about \$41 million provided by the state and \$67.4 million coming from tuition and fees. Additionally, grants and contracts from external sources for research, service and academic/student support projects generate more than \$16 million each year. Annual private gifts to the University, through the MSU Foundation Inc., average \$2.8 million annually.

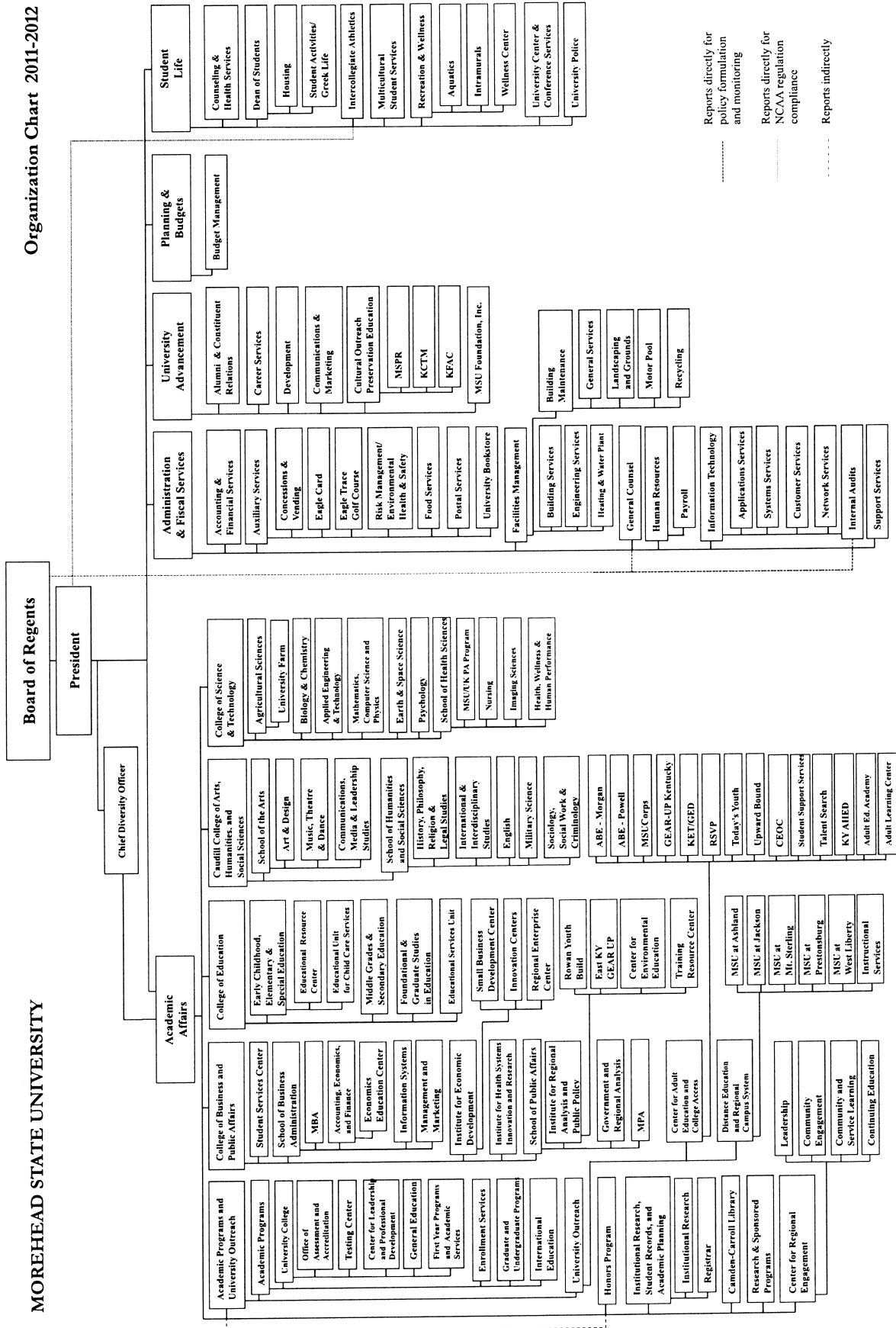

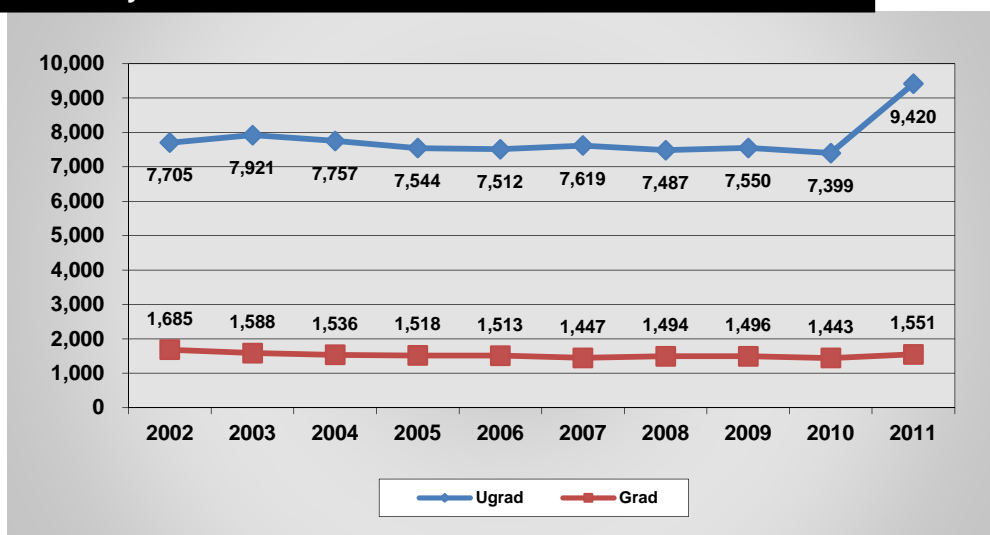

Fall Headcount by Level



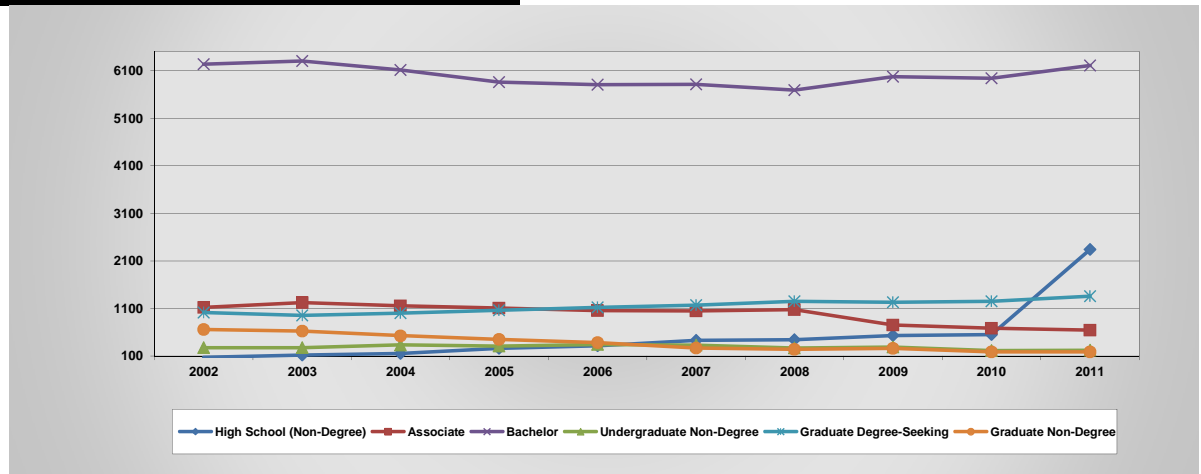

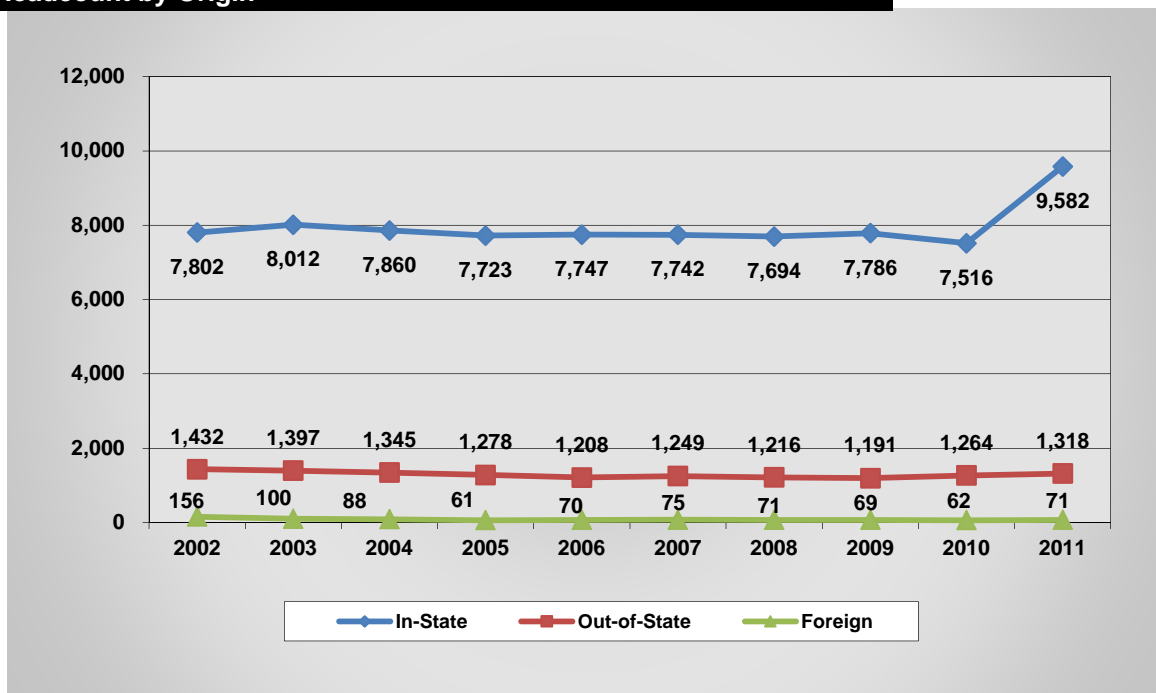

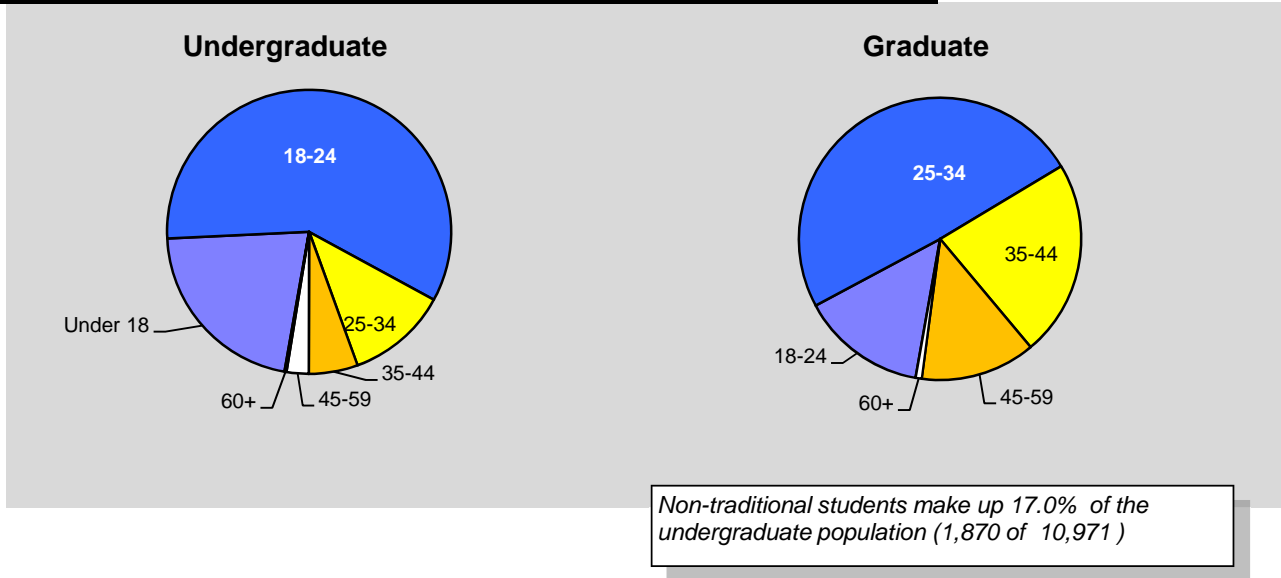

Enrollment by Age and Level



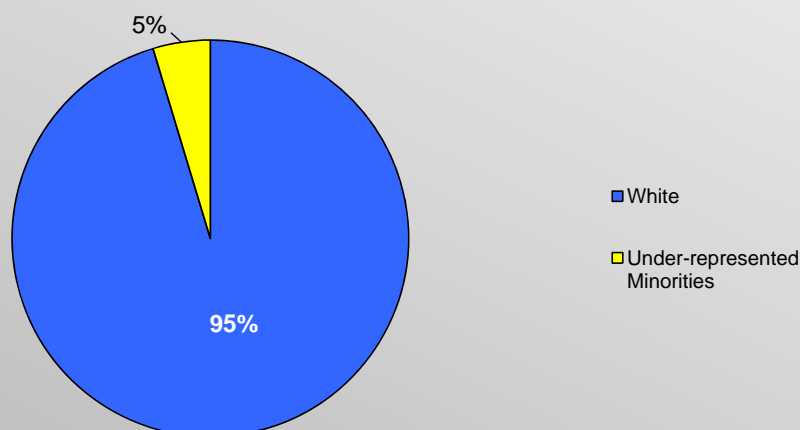

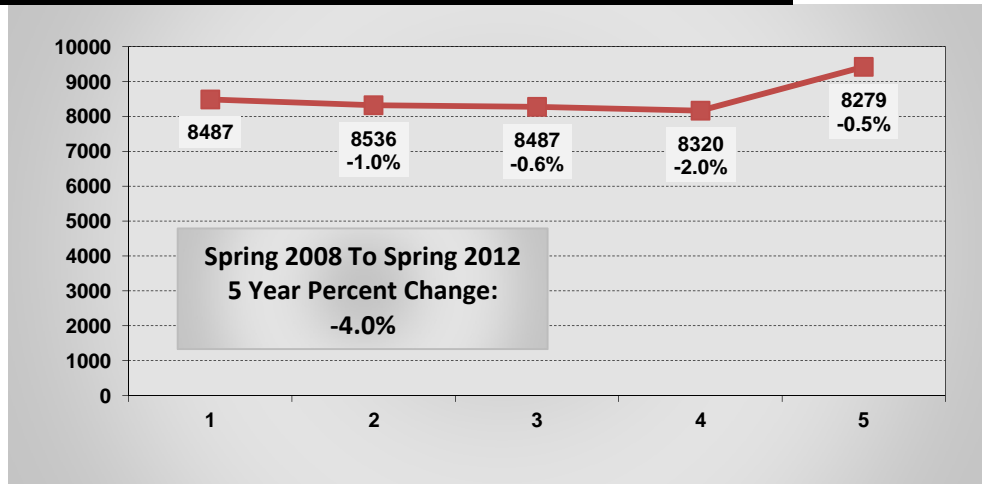

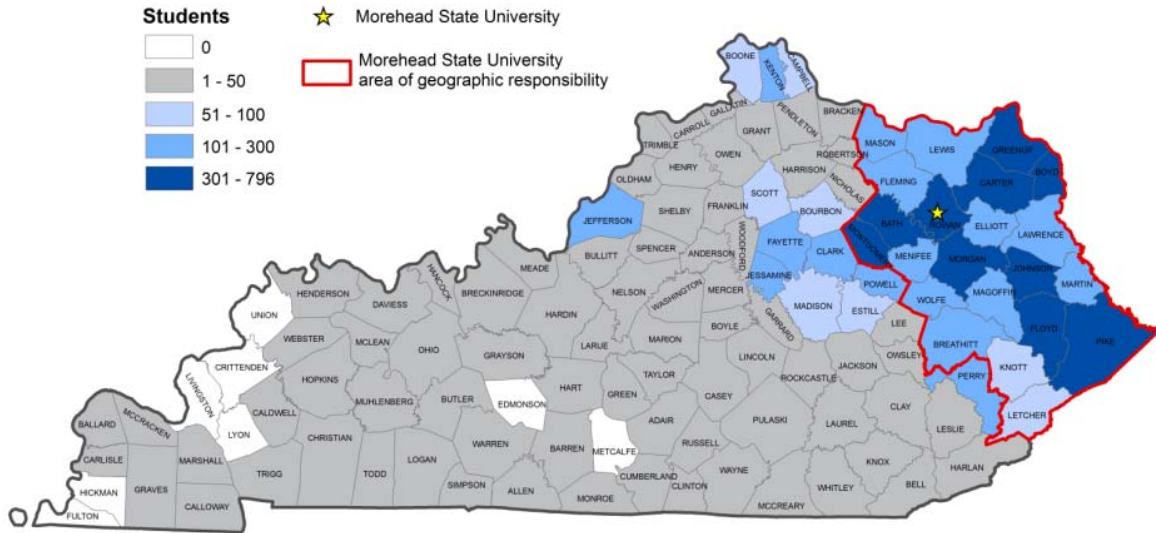

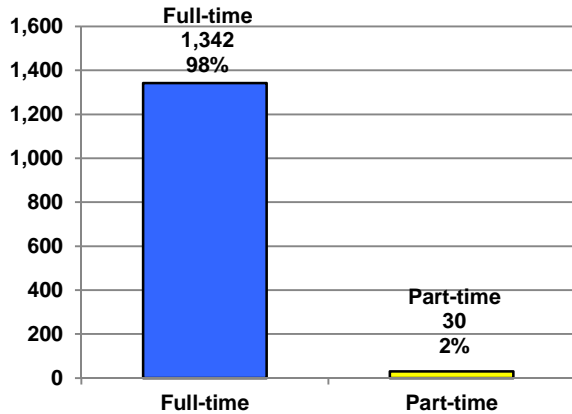

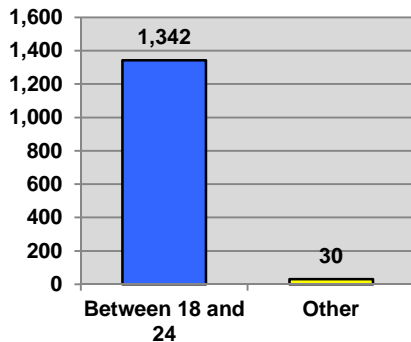
Headcount



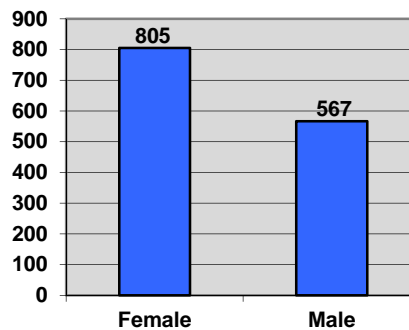
Credit Hours



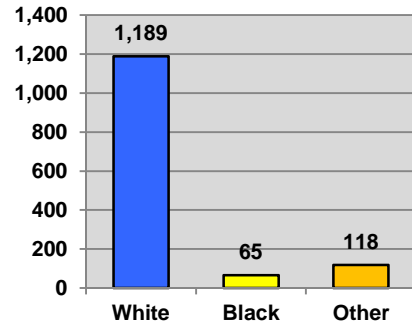

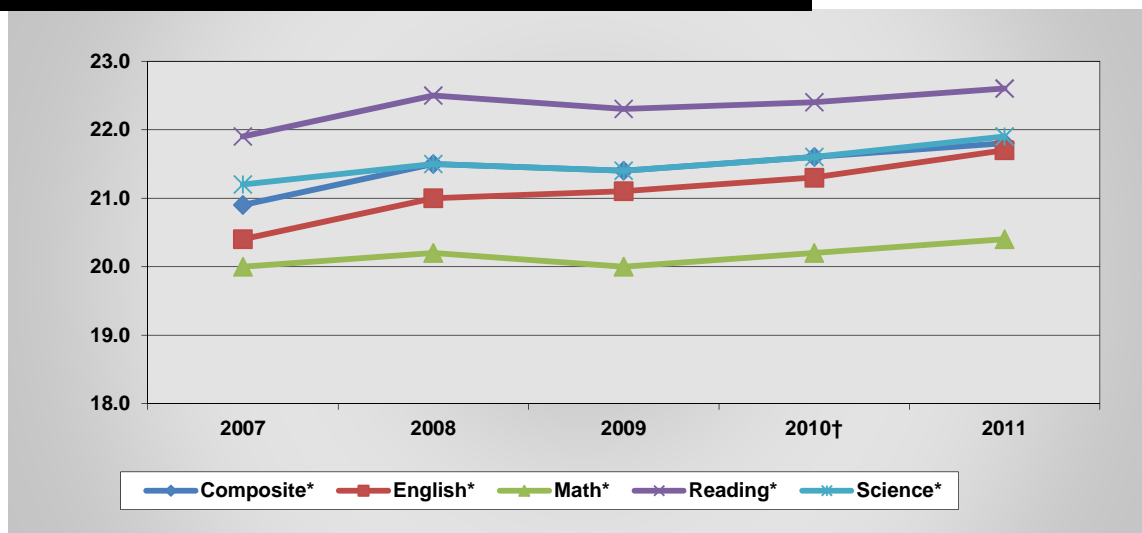
Highlights: First-Time Freshmen Fall 2011

By Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE) definition, first-time freshmen are degree-seekers. In Fall 2011, 93% (1,273) of first-time freshmen were seeking a bachelor's degree and 7% (99) were enrolled in associate level programs. In order to gain a broad overview of freshman program area interests, Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) major codes were collapsed to two digits and enrollments were tallied by level and program area as shown below.

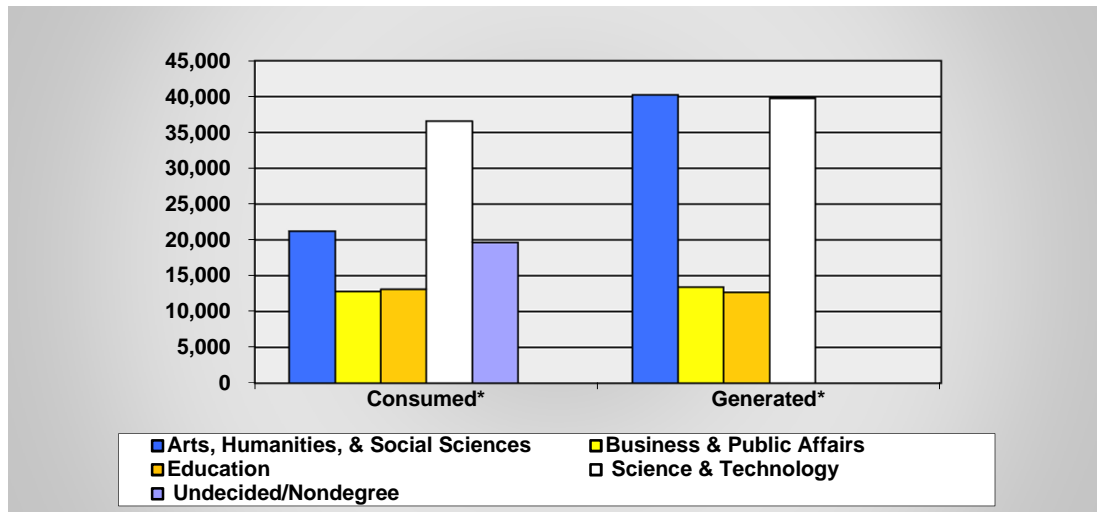

The difference between credit hours "consumed" by majors within a given college and credit hours "generated" by faculty teaching within a given college characterize that college's general academic service profile. For example, Education majors consumed 13,092 credit hours in Fall 2011 whereas Education faculty taught classes which generated 12,671 credit hours during the same semester. The number of credit hours consumed by Education majors in excess of credit hours generated by Education faculty characterizes the College of Education as an academic service "consumer" in Fall 2011.

Fall Distance Learning Courses by Delivery Mode

In Fall 2011, Morehead State University reported 533 distance learning courses. The following table shows that for those 533 courses 60% were Internet courses and 40% were interactive video courses. In summary, distance learning courses accounted for about 21% of course enrollments (8,306 of 39,795) and 24% of student credit hours generated (24,978 of 106,312) overall.

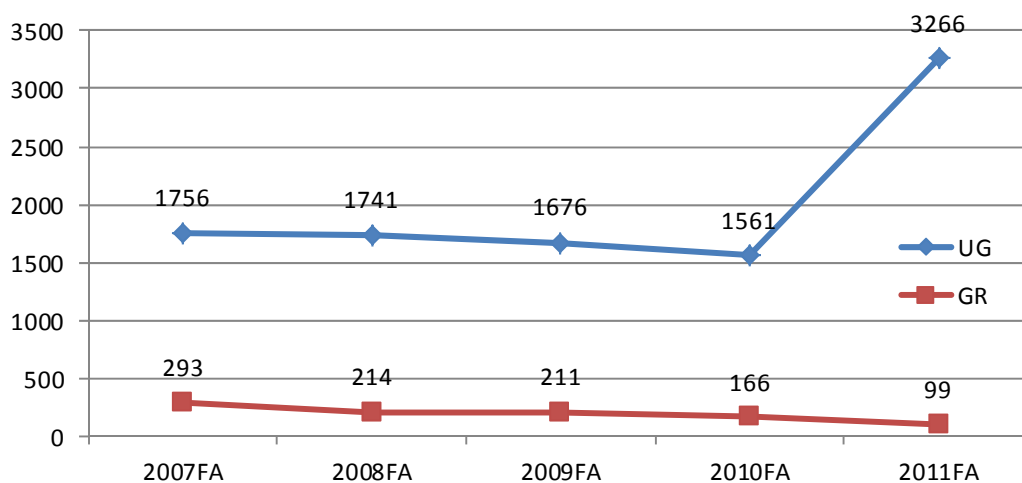

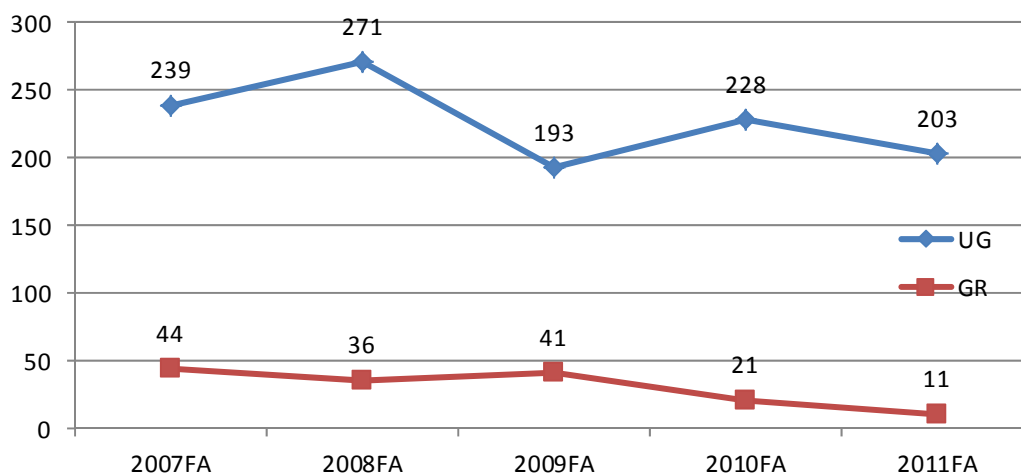

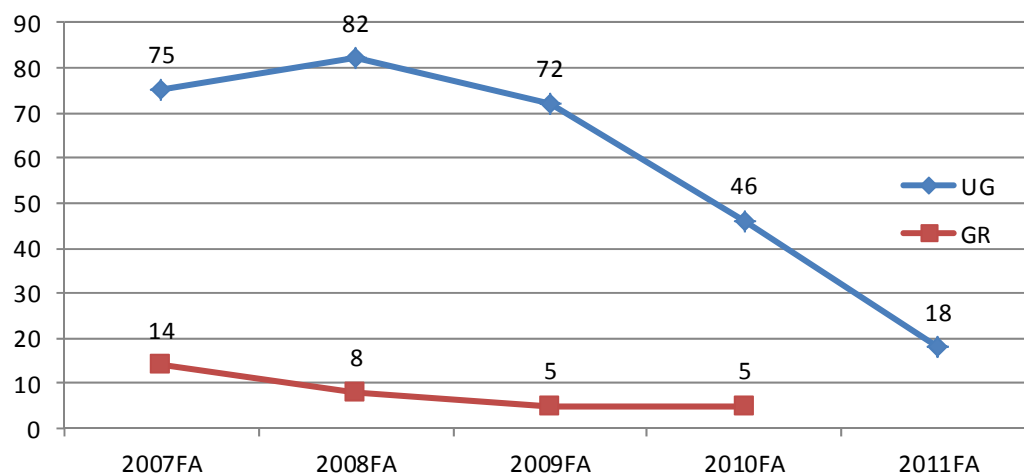

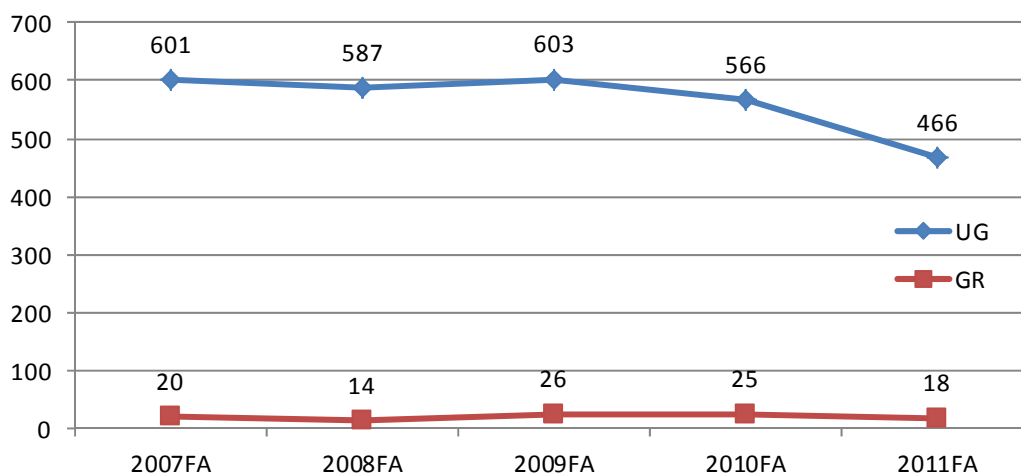

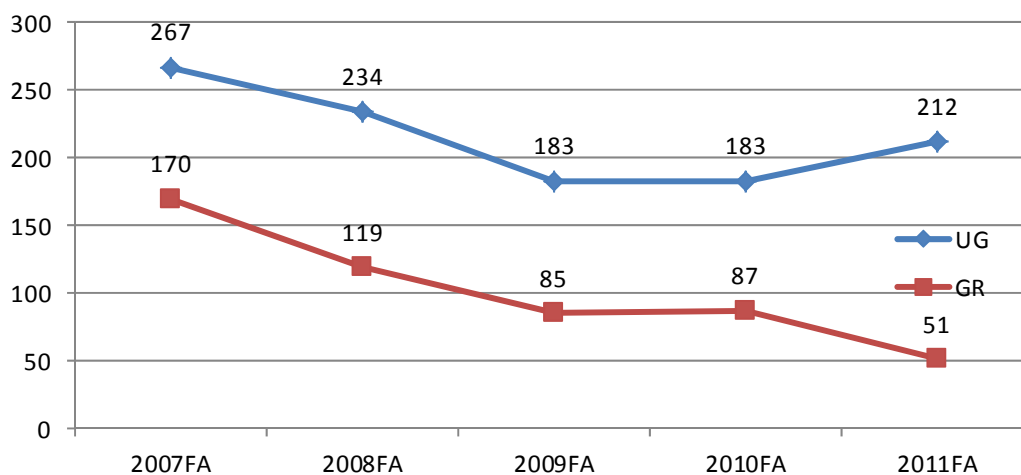

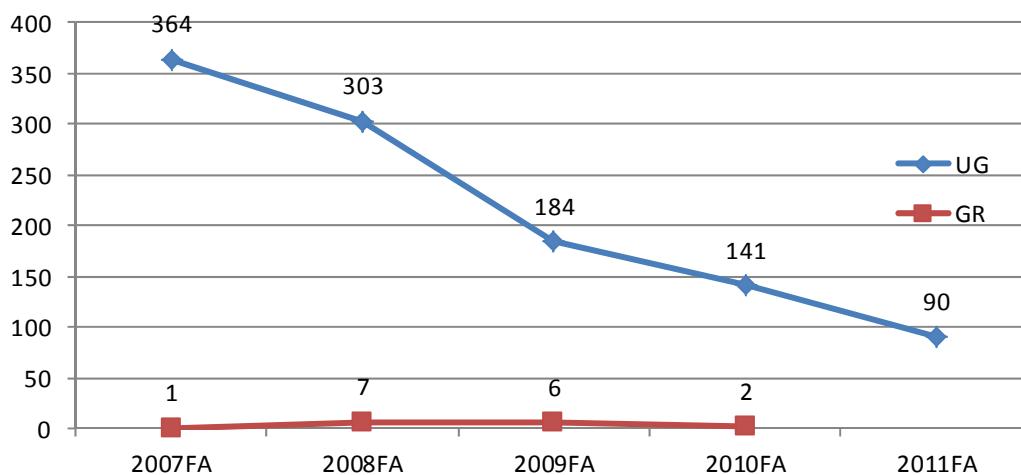

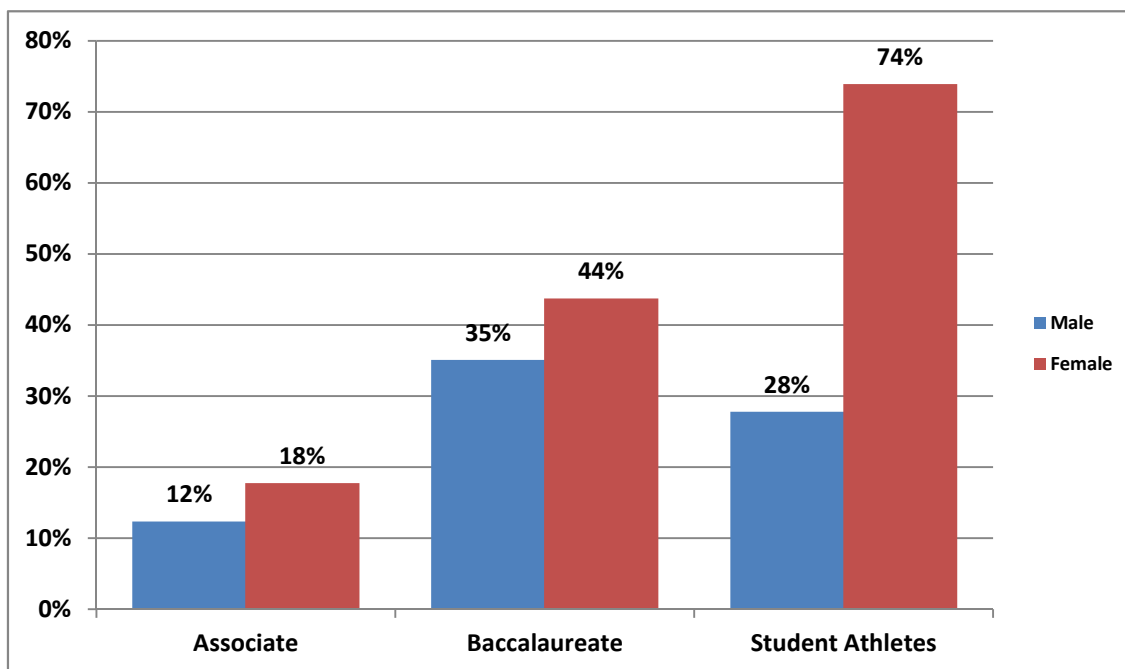

Cohort Entering Fall 2005



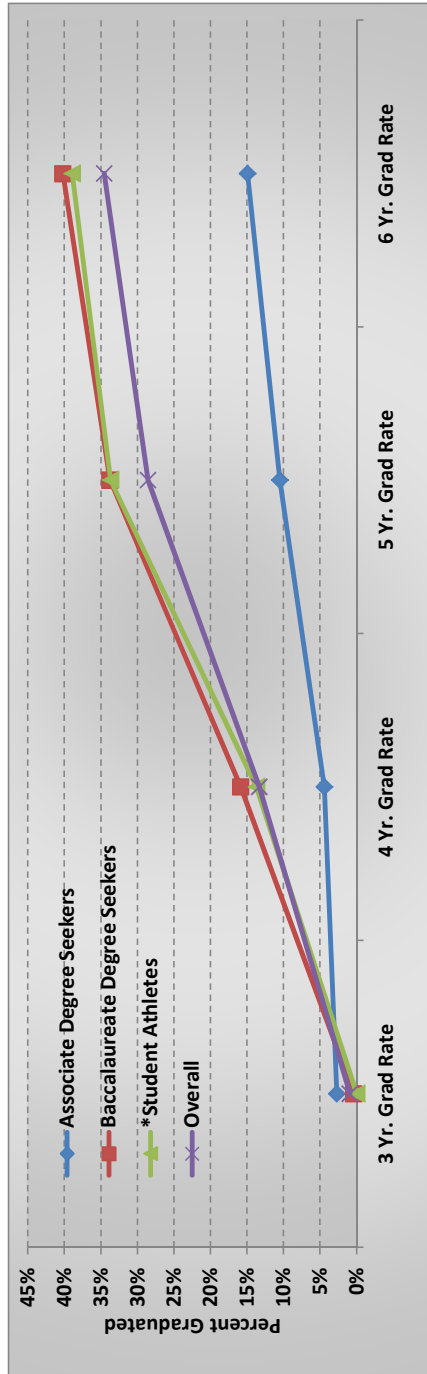

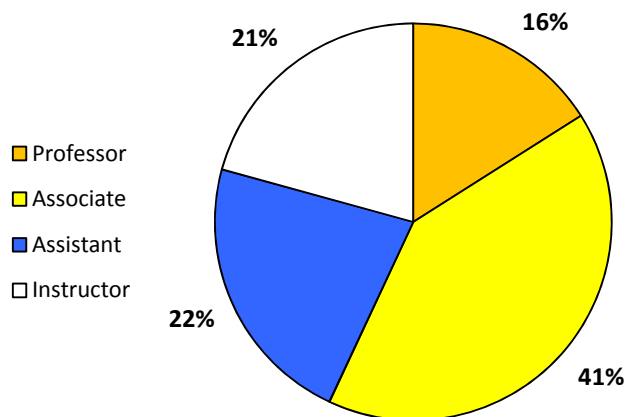

Three-Year Trends Instructional Faculty by Status, College, and Department 2009-2011

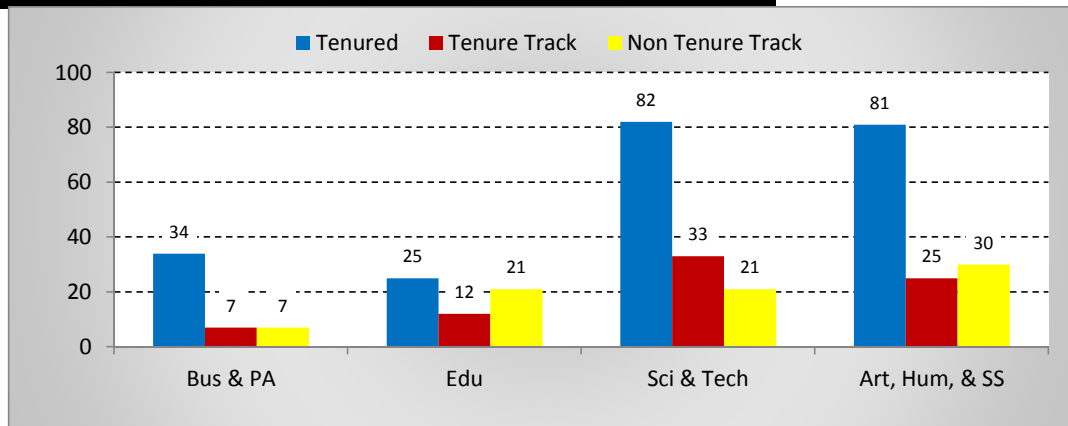

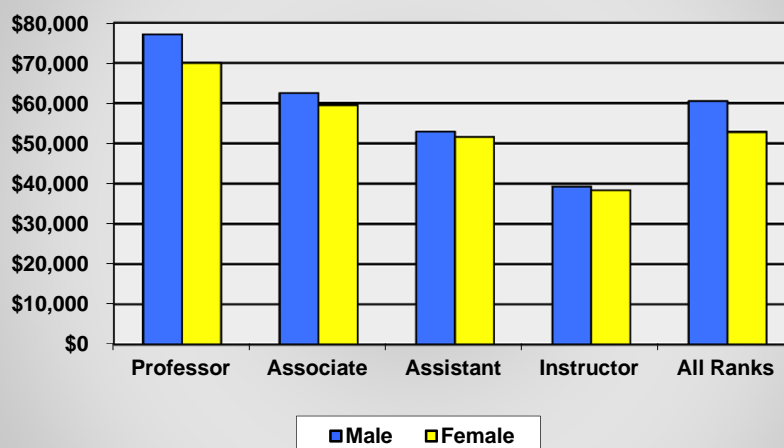

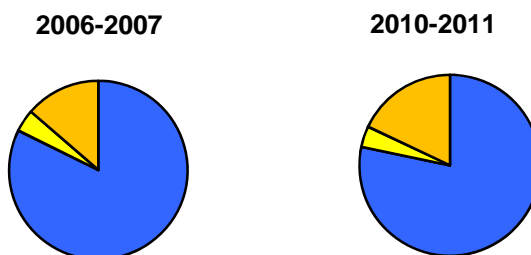

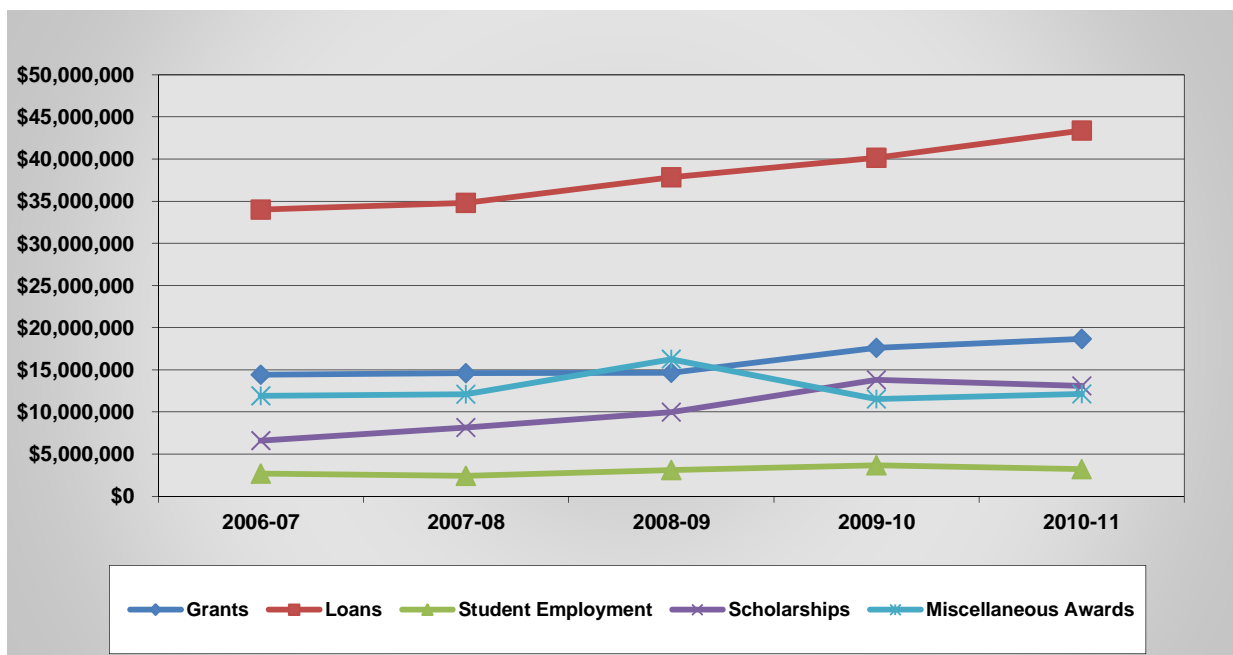

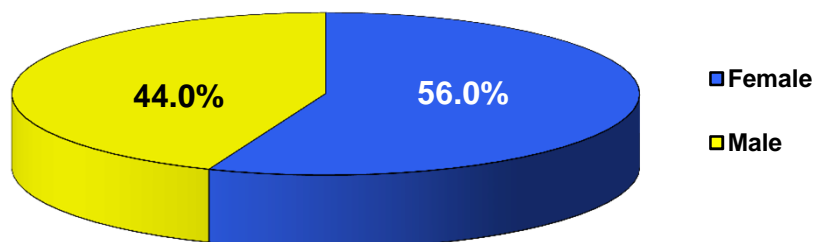

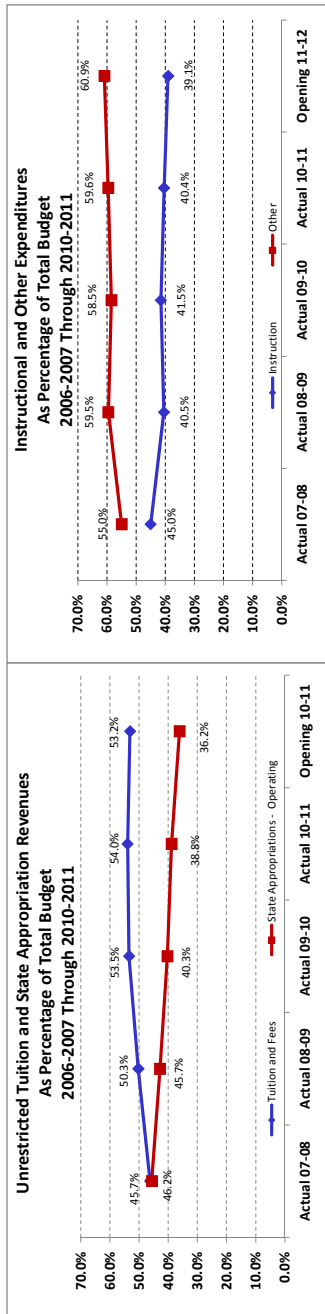

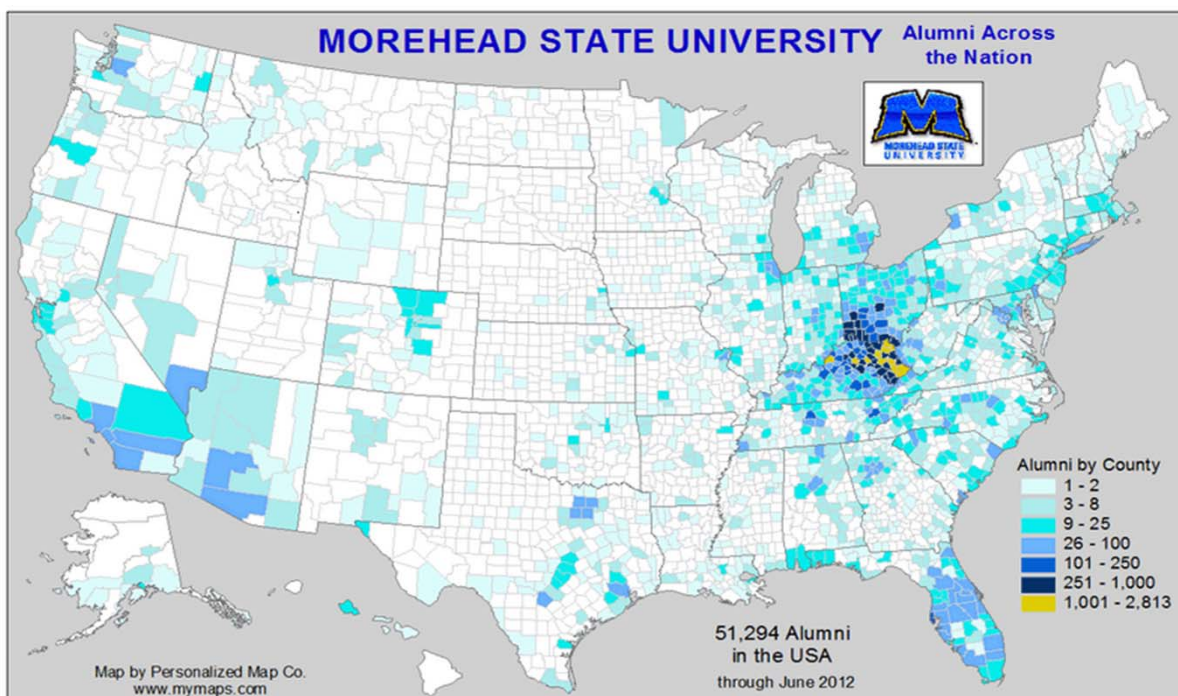

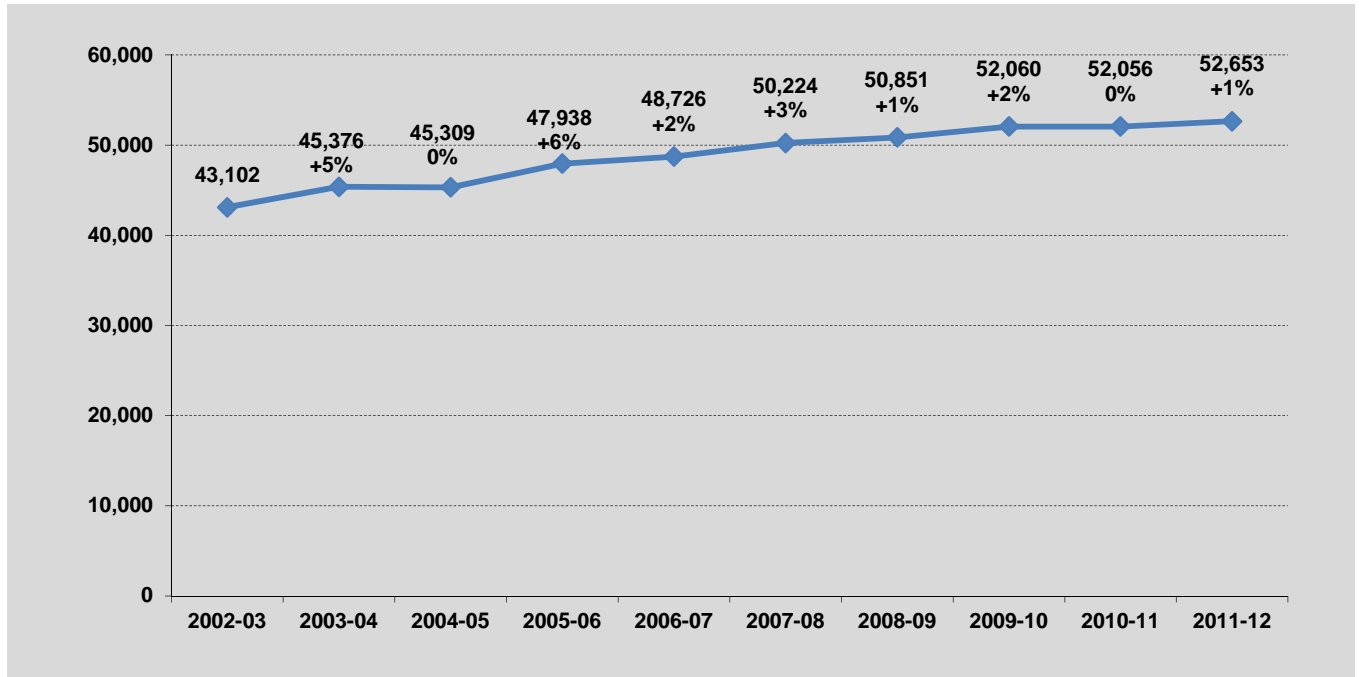

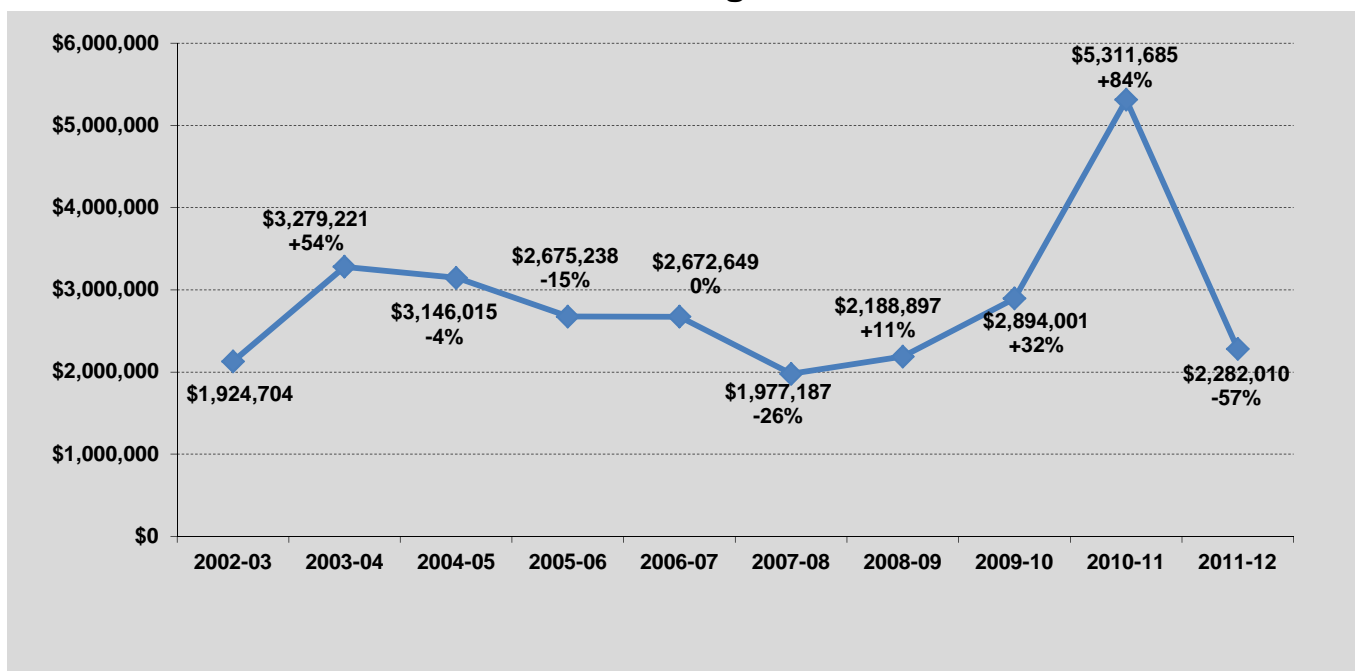

Note: Beginning in 2002-2003, the definition of "active membership" was changed to those alumni that are contactable with a viable address, phone number, or email address.

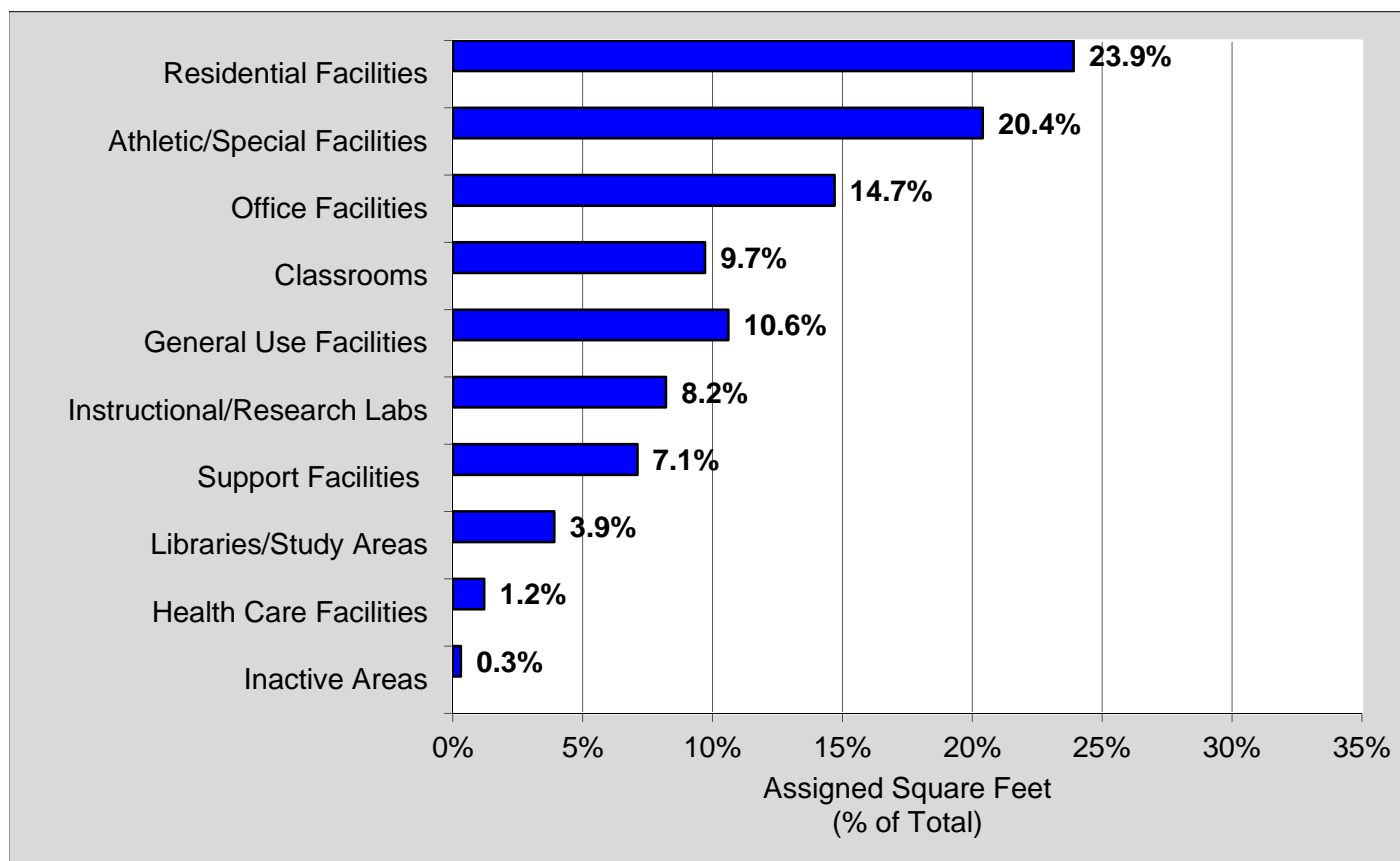
Comparison of Giving with Year to Year Percent Change 2002-2003 through 2011-2012
