In trying to adjust church finance Bro. Kiddell proposed to preach for \$1500.00 and parsonage for the year 1931. On motion of F. C. Button, seconded by H. L. Wilson it was voted to accept his proposition and to give him one

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month's vacation in which to hold protracted meetings.

It was agreed <sup>by</sup> the house should be kept by members and that the furnace should be fired by H.C. Lewis and the Kiddell boys, alternately.

On motion of F.C. Button seconded by W.C. Loppin it was voted to discontinue the services of a paid janitor.

The Committee composed of F.P. Fla and J.E. Calvert <sup>and</sup> appointed to have the leaks in the roof stopped report that preliminary arrangements had been made for the work to be done.

The report of the committee composed of C.O. Perrott, M.L. Wilson and W.L. Loppin <sup>and</sup> appointed to recommend a financial statement to the Board to be considered by them for adoption by the church was made and filed.

This meeting was called to hear a  
and parson report on insurance for the church.  
C.O. Peratt reported that the state agent of  
the Petra Insurance Company had  
inspected the church and had recommended  
that all stoves and stove pipes should be so  
adjusted as to give 18 inches space between  
them and combustible walls, that the stoves  
in the ladies aid room be put on metal  
legs, that metal under all stoves should  
extend 18 inches in front, that in lieu  
of 14 inches above stove pipe in prayer  
meeting, board asbestos and felt that  
metal might be used fastened with  
nails & knobs, that basement doors be  
thickened to 7/8 in and supplied with  
automatic spring or air closers, that  
ventilator in rear attic be screened with  
1/4 inch galvanized wire mesh, that the  
opening into the attic be closed with  
a closely fitting top door, and that the  
plastering that had fallen off be replaced  
in order to secure the lowest rate of  
insurance possible. It was voted to  
turn these repairs over to a committee
