

Greetings from the Associate of Science in Nursing Program (ADN)!

The Associate Degree Nursing Program offered a new pre-nursing course (NURA 112: Introduction to Nursing Concepts) in fall 2015. The first cohort of students who completed this course and met all admission requirements were admitted into the spring 2016 class. We are also pleased to announce that preliminary NCLEX-RN passage rates for 2015 are above the passing standard at both the Morehead and Mt. Sterling campuses.

The ADNP faculty engage in scholarship through presentations and publications. Dr. Teresa Ferguson, Associate Professor of Nursing, and Dr. Teresa How-

ell, Professor of Nursing, published a manuscript in the Nursing Clinics of North America, Bedside Reporting: Protocols for Improving Patient Care, DOI:

cation among Faculty and Students" at the Organization for Associate Degree Nursing (OADN) 2015 Annual Convention in Jacksonville, Florida in November 2015.

The Associate Degree Nursing Program continues to partner with the community to provide service learning opportunities for students. Service learning endeavors in fall 2015 included health fairs at local schools which provided education on topics such as nutrition, exercise, dental hygiene, bullying, ATV safety, drugs and alcohol. The ADNP also donated over 100 items to the MSU Food Bank for students in need this semester. This effort was coordinated by Amy Brown, MSN, RN, Associate Professor of Nursing.

In December 2015, there were 29 graduates of the Associate Degree Nursing Program at the Morehead Campus and 8 graduates at the Mt. Sterling Campus.

program. The recent MSU Self Study recommended that the BSN pre-licensure program explore planning for a two cohort per year admission cycle due to the increased number of qualified applicants over the last few years. A two cohort system would facilitate placement of qualified applicants and increase the number of baccalaureate degrees awarded by MSU. Additionally, going to a two cohort per year admission cycle will assist the profession of nursing in meeting the IOM recommended 80% of nurses in the United States hold at least a baccalaureate in nursing (BSN) by the year 2020.

Curriculum Revision

The BSN program faculty engage in a continuous evaluation process in order to ensure our program meets the needs of our students, adherence to the standards of practice in nursing and nursing education, as well as equipping our students to meet the needs of an ever changing health care environment. The BSN program is anticipating a few curriculum changes during the next academic year. In order to be more in line with other BSN programs, we will be decreasing the total number of hours required from 121 credit hours to 120 credit hours. Additionally, there will be a change with the NURS elective requirement, an additional credit hour of NURB 326 Advanced Health Assessment, and the incorporation of a required pharmacology course. All changes are pending the curriculum committee approval process.

Successful Reaccreditation

The BSN program completed a successful site visit/self -study in April 2015 and received official notification from CCNE this fall that the BSN program at MSU was reaccredited for an additional 10 years! The next review cycle will be in 2025. I would like to thank the faculty and staff for all their hard work on making the reaccreditation process a success!

2015 NCLEX Passage Rate

The BSN program has an unofficial NCLEX passage rate of 100% for 2015! The BSN program is very proud to offer quality programming for students from the service region and beyond. Our graduates are employed by area health care facilities and throughout the nation.

Online Nursing Programs Coordinator's Report

Greetings from the Post-Licensure RN-BSN Online Nursing Program!

A lot of changes are happening with the program. Curriculum revision is one aspect of the changes. A new

curriculum has been developed that is competitive with other programs and is updated to address the changing health care environment. The purpose of the revised program is to effectively expand the nursing workforce to promote health and well-being of the populace at the local and global level. The curriculum proposals have been submitted and are now under review at Morehead State University (MSU). The planned implementation date for the new curriculum is Fall 2016. The Post-Licensure Baccalaureate Nursing Program is also moving toward eight week modular courses rather than full semester courses. Eight week modular courses facilitate the educational needs of students who have full time employment. Half of the courses will be in eight week modules for the Spring 2016 term and all will be converted to eight week modular courses for Fall 2016. Two online nursing courses were offered for the new Winter 2015 term from December 15, 2015 to January 15, 2016 to further accommodate student learning needs.

The Department of Nursing at MSU has partnered with St. Claire Regional Medical Center (SCRMC) to provide an educational experience specific to the learning needs of SCRMC Associate Degree prepared nurses. Funding for the nurses in this project was provided for by SCRMC, TENCO and EKCEP to promote workforce development within the coordinating service regions. A cohort of students from SCRMC was admitted Fall 2015, and participated in a courses that contained the option of attending class/lab face to face, completing course requirements online, or completing course requirements by both attending class/lab face to face and online. One emphasis in the class was to assist students in developing skills needed in the online learning environment. While some students already possessed these informatics skills and chose to complete course requirements online, others had not attended class in 20 plus years and attended face to face class/lab until they mastered the skills needed to be successful in the online learning environment. Student feedback from this course was very positive. We look forward to admitting a second cohort from SCRMC for the Spring 2016 term.

There were 17 graduates from the Post-Licensure Baccalaureate Nursing Program for Fall 2015. Two students tied for the award for their capstone project. Kourtney Black was a winner with her project *Resuscitation Efforts with Family Presence* and Perdita Prater was also a winner with her project *Appropriate Management of Blood Cultures in the Clinical Setting*. Academic Award winners were Pamala Roberts (first place), Mindy Greene (second place) and Tara Ensor (third place). We are very proud of our graduates and look forward to seeing the contributions they make to the health care environment.

The Department of Nursing is also exploring the addition of a Master of Science in Nursing Program (Family Nurse Practitioner). Market surveys have been very positive for the program. Preliminary plans include a possible implementation date of Fall 2017.

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Fall 2015 in the Department!

Dr. Kim Clevenger is Program Coordinator for the traditional (land-based) BSN program. We anticipate going to a 2-cohort admission process (admit fall and spring semester) in 2017. Dr. Lucy Mays moved from the Program Coordinator role for the AASN program at the MSU campus to the newly created Online Nursing Programs Coordinator. Dr. Mays is working closely with the administrative team at St. Claire Regional Medical Center (SCRMC) to admit their associate-degree prepared registered nurses into the Online RN-BSN completion program. The SCRMC Chief Nurse Officer, cites improved patient care outcomes and the Magnet hospital recognition criteria of 80% of RNs prepared at the BSN level as a major impetus for this initiative.

The Arnold P/ Gold Foundation and the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) awarded a grant to the MSU Department of Nursing to hold a *White Coat Ceremony* for the entering BSN class. Morehead State University was one of two schools in the Commonwealth of Kentucky to be selected for this program. Only 60 nursing schools across the nation were selected for this recognition in 2015. White Coat Ceremony



The Morehead State University (MSU) Bachelor of Science in Nursing program was selected through a competitive grant application process to hold a *White Coat Ceremony*. Morehead State University was one of 60 programs selected from across the nation for this distinction by the Arnold P. Gold Foundation and the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN).



The Gold Foundation works with health professionals across the country and with students enrolled in health programs. The Foundation desires to instill a culture of respect, dignity, and compassion for patients and health professionals. The aim of the Gold Foundation is delivery of compassionate care. Health professionals enjoy a staggering ascendance of science and technology along with the greatest economic healthcare challenges. This is why it is more critical than ever to maintain the "care" in healthcare. This is why the Gold Foundation logo features a heart-shaped stethoscope in the center of their lapel pin that each student participating in the ceremony received.

The *White Coat Ceremony* was held on Friday, December 4, 2015 in the Demoss Conference Center in the Center for Health, Education and Research (CHER) building. Over 120 guests were in attendance to help 58 students celebrate at this event.

President Wayne Andrews greeted guests in attendance and spoke of the University's support for quality health care in the University's service region and across the Commonwealth.

Dr. Colleen Swartz, Chief Nurse Executive at UK Chandler Medical Center in Lexington Kentucky gave the Keynote Address and shared statistics on how nurses impact patient care outcomes. Dr. Lerae Wilson delivered the Plenary talk and shared the impact that nurses have at the bedside, especially for terminally ill patients.

Each student recited the *White Coat* ceremony oath. They received the Arnold P. Gold Foundation pin, a scroll of the *White Coat Ceremony* oath and blue and gold honor cords which are the colors of Morehead State University as they crossed the stage.

Nursing is a rigorous curriculum and students attend clinical courses throughout their program of study. It is anticipated that participation in this ceremony will encourage students new to nursing programs to *stay the course*.

Lisa McDavid ADN Associate Professor Michelle McClave, MSN, RN, attended the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing 43rd Biennial Convention in Las Vegas from November 6 through November 11. She presented in the Creative Arts in Nursing Peer-Reviewed Poster category, *Re-flecting on Reflections to Discover Myself as a Leader*. This presentation discussed the mechanism she used to focus on her perspective of leadership by looking through the lens of a creative expression. She reflected on clinical reflections required in a variety of nursing education domains as a means to reflect on her own growth and development as a leader in both nursing and education. There were also connections made to other creative expressions of growth and development of leadership capabilities. The overriding purpose of this presentation was to provide attendees to view clinical reflection from a different perspective. This presentation offered not only the view of the nursing student, but also the view of the nurse educator. She also described her own growth as a result of reflecting on clinical reflections.

The ADNP graduating class of fall 2015 were involved in a different learning strategy this semester. Using evidenced based practice at the bedside is crucial to promoting positive patient outcomes. ADNP faculty Amy Brown and Lisa McDavid wanted to provide a learning activity that engaged the learner, the class, and gave an opportunity for group work with a speaking component. The QI presentation project did just that. The students were given topics that needed to be researched to provide the latest evidence based practice. They composed a power point presentation and handouts. This project not only in-

corporated research activities, but also prepared our students for advancement in their future employer's clinical ladder system. Our community partner, St. Claire Nursing Administration/Education department were on hand to evaluate the presentations.
