Paul Reynolds stated \$24.00 in money and many items of clothing and furniture had been donated to the Howard family and had been delivered by our men.

Minister's Report; Mr. Allen stated he would be gone through the next two Sundays and that the Youth Group would take care of the church services the first Sunday and Dr. Zell Walters the following one. He solicited the help of the board members in this program. Mr. Battson to assist Dr. Walters.

Wilford Waltz suggested improvement of the order of serving the Deacons and Elders, which was accepted.

The Official Board of the Morehead Christian Church met in regular session, with A. B. Bowne, Vice-Chairman, presiding. Meeting opened with prayer by Rev. Allen.

The Official Board of the Morehead Christian Church met in regular session, meeting presided over by the Chairman, Mr. Bayless. Opened with prayer by Paul Reynolds. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved. Treasurer's report presented and discussed, approved.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE: Mr. Crosley called attention to a leak in the baptistry. Kennard and Crosley to make repair. The matter of rental fee for the use of the church was discussed. Mr. Allen read set of regulations and policies, which mentioned the fee of \$7.50 for the use of the basement and 10.00 for the Sanctuary. This was left in the hands of the committee, already named.

This week being Public Relations week, Mr. Bayless called attention to his contact with people visiting from Pakistan. He suggested our choir made some recordings to be broadcast, in this interest. Stating Mr. Carter would be willing to work with the choir during the summer months in this interest. Mr. Carr asked the minister to check into the cost of such a program and report. It was suggested that Mr. Powers be asked to write an outline of the history of this church. ~~Mr. Battsen asked to cooperate with him.~~ Mr. Bayless asked for the cooperation of all members in this undertaking. To keep the Christian church before the public a Publicity Committee was appointed. Mr. Bayless, Ward Williams, <sup>A. B. Bowne</sup> Mr. Allen named to this committee.

A letter of commendation addressed to Mrs. E. D. Blair was read, expressing gratitude for the work of the carpet and redecorating committee. Motion made by Mr. Kennard, 2nd by Adrian Razor that letter be mailed to Mrs. Blair, Motion carried.

Mr. Allen stated that Hobart Lacy had requested that Gideon be given audience in our church on May 16th. This was discussed at large. The Board advised Mr. Allen to extend this invitation.

The Policy of the Morehead Christian Church in regard to outside groups shall be as follows:

1. The purpose of our church is to win people to faith in Jesus Christ and to commit them actively to the church, and to help them grow in grace and knowledge of Christ. Therefore, we welcome co-operation from all Christian and character-building groups outside the church which have similiar aims and purposes.
2. Groups outside the church which desire to use our church facilities are welcome to do so, provided the following rules are observed:
  - a. Application must be made to the Board and permission granted.
  - b. The time and rooms desired must be cleared with the minister so as not to conflict with the program of the church.
  - c. The rules concerning use of electricity, water, heat, kitchen facilities which are posted in the basement must be observed.
  - d. Outside groups are expected to help defray the cost involved by paying a fee of \$10.00 per day for the use of our sanctuary and \$7.50 per day for use of the basement or other rooms.  
Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts are considered a part of the church program and are excepted from payment of fees. Other exceptions may be made by the Board.
3. Outside groups which desire to present their program to the people of the church and/or make an appeal for funds or members are welcome to do so provided the following steps are taken:
  - a. Request is made to the Board and permission granted. The name of the speaker for the occasion should be included in the request.
  - b. The time and date is cleared with the minister so as not to conflict with the program of the church.
  - c. Groups desiring to make an appeal for money are welcome to use the Sunday School assembly period on Sunday, a period of time after the Worship Service, the Sunday night service, the monthly Fellowship Dinner, or any special called meeting. Since the Sunday morning Worship Service is devoted to worship, the presentation of the gospel, and furthering the program of our own church, no outside group may make an appeal for money at that time.
4. Outside groups desiring a gift of money from the church shall make a written request to the Board. Such gifts will be granted on the basis of human need, of their promotion of the gospel, and their value in relation to other worthy causes and the funds available.

Some Facts about our Church:

Our budget this year is \$13,625.00. This is a 20% greater budget than last year. Our budget is the minimum allowance for the large program of our church. Many members who have already made pledges have given over and above for redecorating the sanctuary.

The total cost of the Parsonage was \$16,044.25, including sale of the old parsonage and repairs and improvements to the new one.

This excludes, of course, the balance of \$679.67 which was turned over to the Church Treasury when debt was paid.

The Total Receipts on the parsonage were \$16,723.92. Subtract \$7400.00 (old parsonage) and \$400.00 (church loan) = \$7800.00. Total giving = \$8,923.92.

The Policy of the Morehead Christian Church in regard to outside groups shall be as follows:

1. The purpose of our church is to win people to faith in Jesus Christ and to commit them actively to the church, and to help them grow in grace and knowledge of Christ. Therefore, we welcome co-operation from all Christian and character-building groups outside the church which have similiar aims and purposes.
2. Groups outside the church which desire to use our church facilities are welcome to do so, provided the following rules are observed. *Minister & Pastor*
  - a. Application must be made to the Board and permission granted.
  - b. The time and rooms desired must be cleared with the minister so as not to conflict with the program of the church.
  - c. The rules concerning use of electricity, water, heat, kitchen facilities which are posted in the basement must be observed.
  - d. Outside groups are expected to help defray the cost involved by paying a fee of \$10.00 per day for the use of our sanctuary and \$7.50 per day for use of the basement or other rooms.  
Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts are considered a part of the church program and are excepted from payment of fees. Other exceptions may be made by the Board.
3. Outside groups which desire to present their program to the people of the church and/or make an appeal for funds or members are welcome to do so provided the following steps are taken:
  - a. Request is made to the Board and permission granted. The name of the speaker for the occasion should be included in the request.
  - b. The time and date is cleared with the minister so as not to conflict with the program of the church.
  - c. Groups desiring to make an appeal for money are welcome to use the Sunday School assembly period on Sunday, a period of time after the Worship Service, the Sunday night service, the monthly Fellowship Dinner, or any special called meeting. Since the Sunday morning Worship Service is devoted to worship, the presentation of the gospel, and furthering the program of our own church, no outside group may make an appeal for money at that time.
4. Outside groups desiring a gift of money from the church shall make a written request to the Board. Such gifts will be granted on the basis of human need, of their promotion of the gospel, and their value in relation to other worthy causes and the funds available.



May 26, 1958

Dr. Blair was asked by our chairman to accept Chairmanship of the Budget Committee for next year.

Plans were discussed for paying off the debt on the carpet. Arthur Blair made a motion, 2nd by Adrian Razor that the month of June be set aside to make a special drive to clear this debt. Motion carried.

Mr. Allen presented the church program for the remainder of the year, which will be mailed to each member. It was suggested that Lester Palmer be invited to conduct a revival for us starting October 26th through the 31st. Arthur Blair made a motion, 2nd by Razor that this invitation be extended to Mr. Palmer. Motion carried. Wednesday night services for the summer were discussed.

Mr. Allen asked the group for assistance in sending two girls to Midway for the summer, the school to furnish everything except clothing and spending money, the amount of spending money for each to be \$2.00 per week. McClain and Johnson are the names. Mrs. Clayton made a motion 2nd by Mrs. Oppenheimer that our church accept this responsibility. Motion carried. ## PROBLEM AREAS IN THE FIELD OF STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE

### Solution:

1. Our membership is poorly informed and poorly motivated to give of their support of the church.
2. People do not see the special needs of the Church to carry on an effective local and world-wide program.
3. There are only a few books related to stewardship in the church library.
4. There are less than a dozen tithers in our Church.
5. The budget has never been underwritten by pledges. Our approach in enlisting pledgers has been less than effective.
6. The budget should be prepared earlier and promoted longer by more people.
7. The quarterly report and yearly report have been done by the minister. This should be done by a layman.
8. There is confusion about which bills should be paid first.
9. The treasurer is not bonded.
10. There is no effort to promote gifts to the Church through wills and annuities.
11. There has never been an audit of books.
12. Special Days (Thanksgiving, Easter, Children's Day, Widow's and Orphan's Home Day) have not been promoted effectively.

## PROBLEM AREAS IN THE FIELD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

### Solution:

1. There has been some confusion about what materials should be ordered.
2. There is the constant problem of trained leaders and Sunday School teachers.
3. The Sunday School attendance has dropped from an average of 112 in 1956 to about 92 this year.
4. The Sunday School is suffering from low morale.
5. There is the feeling that the Sunday School is separate and apart from the Church.
6. There is some difficulty procuring necessary equipment for classes.
7. There is no one responsible for submitting an educational budget to the congregation.
8. Youth activities have been poorly planned and supervised, except those with sponsors.
9. No one is responsible for establishing educational aims and determining ways to reach them.
10. The adult classes have not felt that they are a part of the Sunday School or of the Church.
11. Planning for Vacation Bible School has been poor.
12. Planning for the Christmas Program has been poor.
13. The library is poorly arranged, there are too few shelves, there need to be additional books, and a way to stimulate reading by members.



## PROBLEM AREAS IN THE FIELD OF PROPERTY

### Solution:

1. Adequate care of the Church building and constant improvement to make it a thing of beauty and a tool for worship and education.
2. The proper care and improvement of the parsonage.
3. Responsibility is not assigned for supervision of the janitor.
4. There has been no planning for the future.

## PROBLEM AREAS IN THE FIELD OF WORSHIP

### Solution:

1. There are no greeters or ushers.
2. There are times when Communion is not removed from the table until Wednesday.
3. There are no baptismal robes.
4. The Board needs more than an opening prayer. Our deacons need instruction and practice in worship and prayer.
5. No one is responsible for developing a program of personal and family worship.
6. There is no layman to maintain and supervise the musical program of the Church.
7. There is no one to promote the gift of aids to worship. (The Pulpit Bible needs repair.)

## PROBLEM AREAS IN THE FIELD OF MEMBERSHIP

### Solution:

1. Less than one third of the resident membership usually attends worship service.
2. Inadequate promotion of the spirit of fellowship.
3. There are members with talent who are not active in the life of the Church.
4. There are leadership positions unfilled.
5. There is no program to induct new members into the fellowship and membership of the Church.
6. There is no program to restore inactive members.
7. Public relations procedures are not used.

## PROBLEM AREAS IN THE FIELD OF EVANGELISM

### Solution:

1. We have not had an evangelism campaign since Easter of 1957.
2. There is no continuing, year-round program of Evangelism.
3. Our church is not evangelism-minded.
4. No way has been used to welcome new people to our community, to find out who they are, or to invite them to Church.



PROBLEM AREAS IN THE FIELD OF OUR WORLD MISSION

Solution:

1. Some of our members are half-hearted in their support of missions and a few are opposed.
2. Some of our members are poorly informed concerning benevolence, our brotherhood program of missions, Christian higher education and our plea for unity among the churches.
3. We have never held a school of missions.
4. Little effort has been made to reach the Sunday School classes and Men's Fellowship with the story of missions.
5. Additional books are needed to uphold missions.
6. Better communication with our Link Missionary is needed.
7. The Missions Committee has never recommended the budget amount for missions.

December 22, 1958

The Official Board of The Morehead Christian Church met in regular session, meeting presided over by Dr. Zell Walters, Chairman and opened with prayer by Paul Reynolds. Treasurer's report was given and discussed. There is still a deficit of \$348.62 in the Unified program fund, of which \_\_\_\_\_ has come in, leaving a balance of \_\_\_\_\_ at this time. \$350.00 has been appropriated to meet the parsonage utility bills including telephone rental, but not personal long distance calls.

Ward Williams, the newly elected Church Librarian, stated the Laymen had consented to give the use of their class room for the library, also to furnish the money to redecorate it. Geo. Cline made a motion, 2nd by Noah Kennard, that the men be authorized to take this action. Motion carried. The matter of the removal and disposition of the organ and old pews from this room was discussed. Geo. Cline made a motion, 2nd by A. D. Bowne, that the Chair appoint a committee to dispose of this matter. Motion carried. Committee named - Paul Reynolds, Arthur Blair and Noah Kennard.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE: Paul Reynolds stated his committee had met twice and were making plans for Worldwide week of Prayer which is November 4 to 11th, also a week of Revival preceeding the Easter period. And that his committee go on record as favoring the promotion of the Church Library. Paul asked for the approval by the Board of these plans, which was given unanimously.

Mr. Allen suggested Mr. Jack Shuly <sup>orby</sup> as <sup>Evangelist</sup> leader of the Revival Program, open date being in September. Mr. Allen presented a program to be used in the news paper., this being a publicity program. He stated he had already consulted Mr. Crutcher about the cost of such a program and was told by him that Mrs. Crutcher would donate the first six issues. Mr. Allen recommended this program and asked to be authorized by the Board put it into effect. Cline made a motion, 2nd by Kennard to approve this program. Motion carried.
