Foreword

I am pleased to present this annual report of sponsored programs at Morehead State University for the 2009– 2010 fiscal year. Compiled by Ms. Janet Cline in the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs, this report provides both an overview as well as detailed information of the external funding received by MSU in support of our instructional, research, and public service programs.

As I complete my fourth and final year as Associate Vice President for Research, I am happy to report significant increases in a number of important benchmarks including: proposals submitted (4% vs 2008-09; 21% vs 2005-06); the dollar amount requested (48% vs 2008-09; 99% vs 2004-05); the dollar amount funded (22% vs 2008-09; 72% vs 2005-06); and the amount of Facilities and Administrative (F&A) costs funded (5% vs 2008-09; 105% vs 2005-06).

Overall, MSU faculty and staff were awarded over \$21 million in funding during the 2009-2010 fiscal year with an expected F&A return of \$933,637. Based upon the approved formula, roughly 50% of the earned F&A will be distributed to departments and colleges to enrich programs and to encourage further research and development. The remainder will be returned to the University's general fund to support priority programs across the campus. The funding provided through faculty- and staff-initiated grants and contracts supports enhanced teaching, research, and service programs both on- and off-campus that would not be possible through our tuition revenues and regular state appropriations.

Consistent with previous years, the majority of our funding (90%) was obtained either directly or indirectly from federal funding sources, representing an increase of 7% over the previous year. In contrast, state funding for programs dropped 4% from 12% in 2008-09 to 8% in 2009-10. Funding from foundations and other private sources also decreased from 2008-09 (5%) to approximately 3% in 2009-10. As expected, most of the funding received will directly or indirectly benefit students. Indeed, funding for instruction, academic services, student services, and student financial aid accounted for about 45% of total funding. Awards for public service projects and research (applied and basic) accounted for roughly 37%. Most of the competitive federal research funding was received through the National Institutes of Health for biomedical research programs.

Although the growth in funding for the year was exceptional (22%), it will be difficult to maintain this level of funding over the next few years given the economic conditions of the state and the nation. Indeed, the current year funding included over \$3 million in federal stimulus funding and approximately \$2 million in federal earmarks, both of which will likely come to an end after the next fiscal year. In addition, given the likely future emphasis on federal deficit reduction, budgets for federal funding agencies for education and research will probably not keep up with inflation, and may experience a significant decrease. These economic factors will make it more important than ever for faculty and staff to be encouraged to compete for all available funding opportunities. Given the significant demands already placed on faculty/staff time, it will be important to provide additional incentives (e.g., reduced teaching load, bonuses, etc.) for those faculty and staff who are willing to go the extra mile for the institution in seeking extramural funding to support our instructional, research, and service programs.

As always, it is important to recognize that these awards are solely due to the efforts of the dedicated faculty and staff listed in this report. We applaud their efforts and congratulate them for their success in securing the external resources necessary for MSU to provide the highest quality programs for our constituents. As equal partners in this enterprise, I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the contributions of the outstanding staff in the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs. Our grants and contract administrators, Mr. Scott Niles and Ms. Janet Cline, led by the Director of Pre-Award Administration, Ms. Darlene Allen, are highly trained, knowledgeable, and extremely dedicated professionals. Similarly, our Research Integrity and Compliance division, led by Dr. Shannon Harr, does an exceptional job in maintaining the highest level of compliance with all federal laws and regulations including human and animal research safety and welfare while providing a streamlined program that facilitates the instructional and research activities of the institution. Finally, the departmental administrative assistants, Ms. Brenda Dehart (Faculty and Undergraduate Research programs), Ms. Janet Skidmore (IRB, IACUC, Research Compliance), and Ms. Stephanie Evans (Pre-Award Administration) are consummate professionals that provide the backbone and structure that keeps the unit running at the highest efficiency. It has been my pleasure and honor to work with such a highly qualified and dedicated staff during my tenure in this position. Any progress we have made during this time is ultimately due to their energy, enthusiasm, and dedication to achieving the short- and long-term goals of the University.

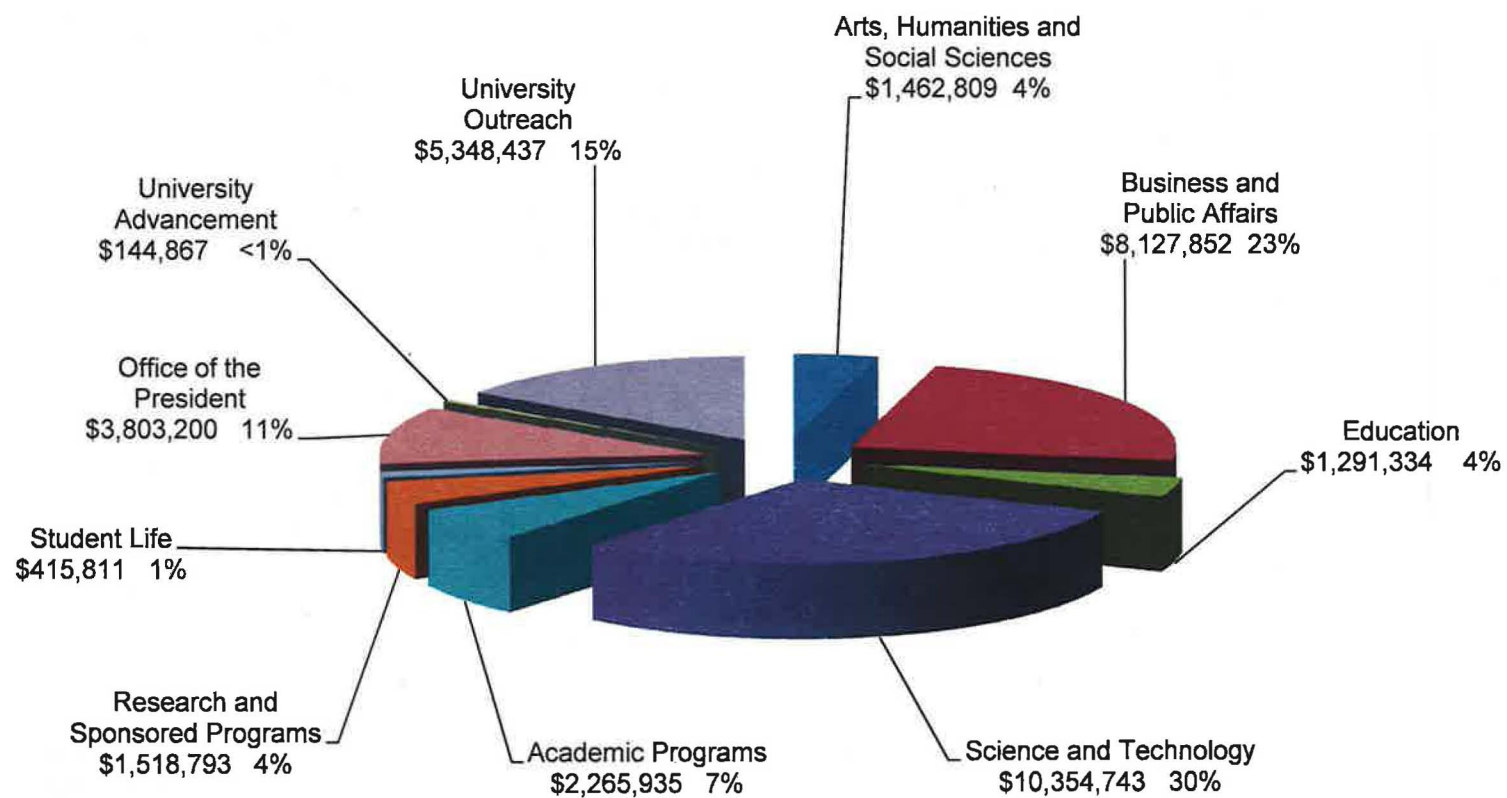

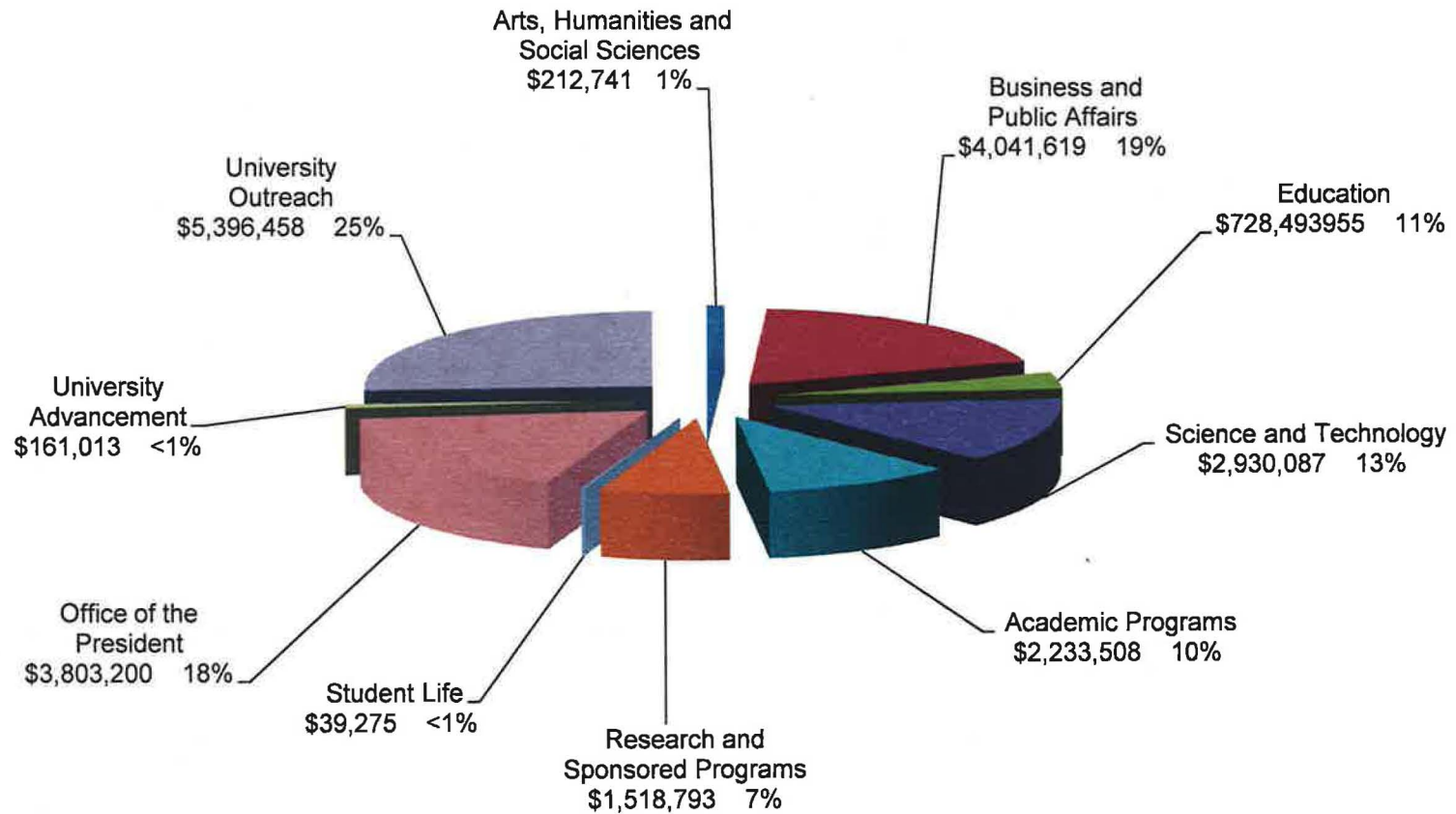

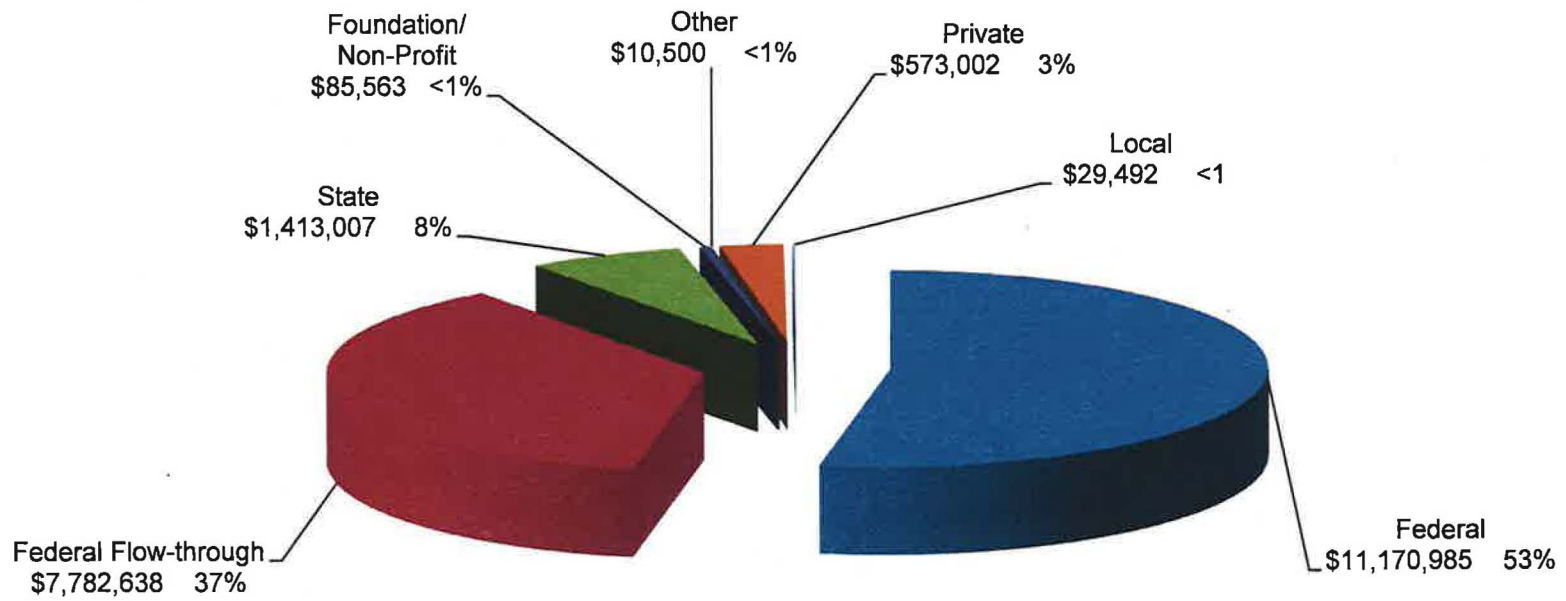
**SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS SUBMITTED

July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010**



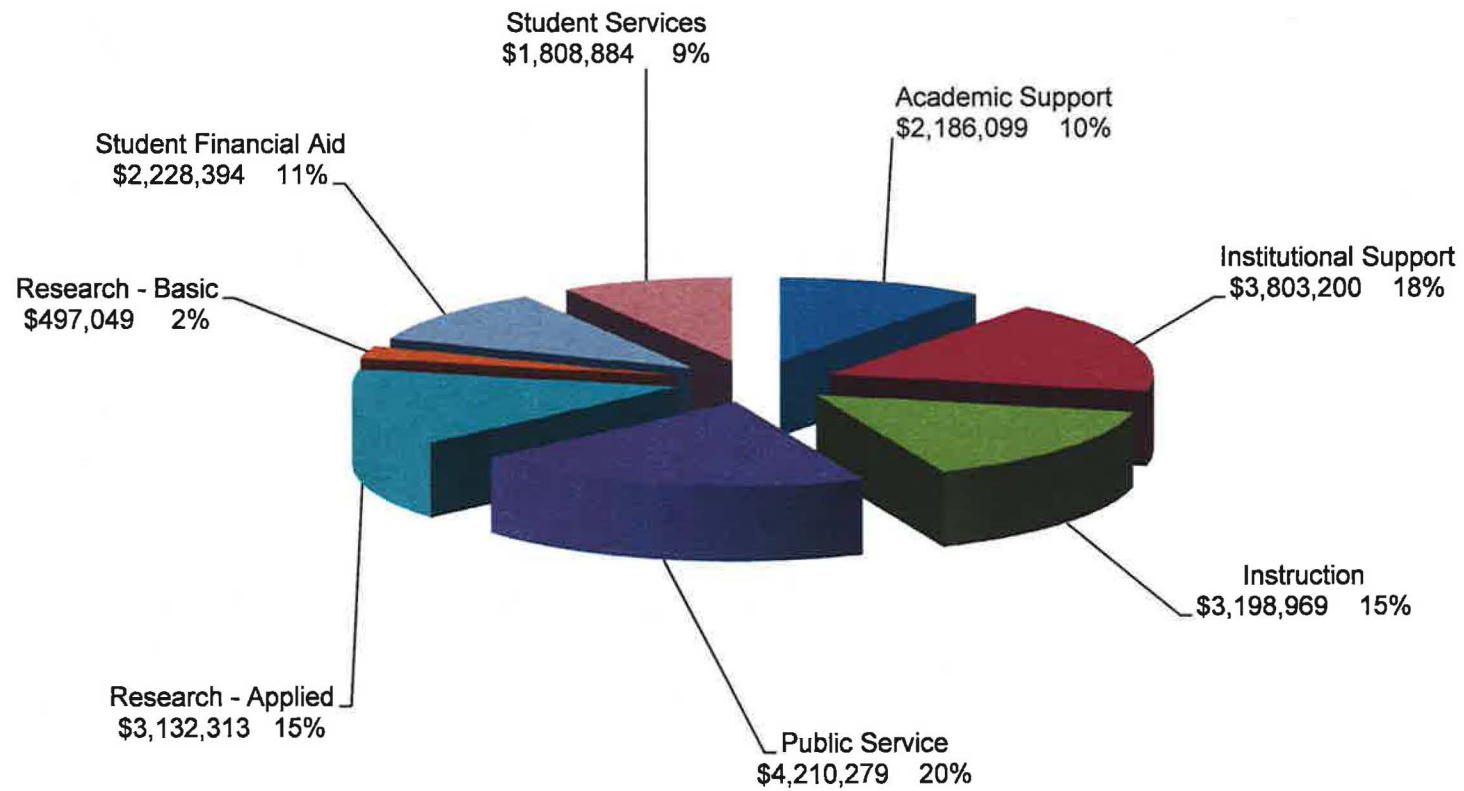
**SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS FUNDED
