GLORIOUS NEWS FROM THE ARMY!!! GREAT BATTLE!!!

GEN. TAYLOR VICTORIOUS! THE MEXICAN ARMY, LED BY SANTA ANNA, DEFEATED WITH GREAT SLAUGHTER, AT BUENA VISTA.

THE THIRTIETH MEXICAN KILLED. (We are indebted to the obliging Clerk of the steamer DASH, BOONE for an Extra of the Cincinnati Atlas, the contents of which we publish to-day before our readers.)

The anxiety of the public for the safety of Gen. Taylor, and his army is at an end. Another great battle has been fought, the genius of Taylor is again triumphant. Stripped of all his regular force, and so reduced in numbers that even those who wish his safety was met by an army outnumbering his own four to one, with Santa Anna himself at their head, and his agents everywhere. The glorious news that we have received is well merited by his brilliant achievement.

The official dispatch of Gen. Taylor has been cut off. Col. Moore's regiment Ohio volunteers have been reinforced by a command from Monterey, had reached that place in safety.

Col. Curtis of Ohio, with one company (Capt. Hunter's) of the 2d U. S. Dragoons, his own regiment, one Indiana volunteer, the Virginia regiment, and I think some Texas Rangers, in about 2,000 men, was about to leave Maysville to attack Gen. Ureca, who is said to be about thirty miles south of that place with an army of from 5,000 men, principally regulars.

It is believed that about 15,000 regular troops. A great many if not all of these regulars, as soon as they hear of the success of Santa Anna's army, will disperse, and the gallant "Colonel will not doubt obtain the victory." This news from above proves that the various reports which had before been received of Gen. Taylor's retreat upon Monterey, and the advance of a large force to attack our depot at Brazos and at the mouth of the Rio Grande to be untrue.

Of the defenses of the mouth of the river I know nothing, but have a long list that are sufficient to make a strong resistance. The fortifications at the Brazos, with the force of artillery and persons in the quarters, we did not find more than a 1000 man garrison, is sufficient to drive back a command of about 2,500 to 3,000 Mexicans.

The work which we will technically term a continuation of the operations of our master's and commissary's stores in depot. wants so large a force as Santa Anna had taken under his command, and as we have drawn this much from the probabilities attending this bloody encounter, we will draw on Monterey, and suppose it probable that had arriving here the Mexican army, which had been fully prepared for the straits by starvation and thirst, called all their energies into requisition, and hence the slaughter reported to have taken place on both sides, it would be a struggle for food and drink; on the other, a natural display of courage and military enthusiasm.

The enemy, outnumbering in every count four to one, and standing as it were on his own ground possessing superior advantage in every respect, as well as in the nature of the country, together with expert knowledge of its geographical and geological character, and many other facts calculated to favor him, is reduced to the necessity of inventing stratagems to account for his double want of success, amounting in a word to defeat.

This is humiliating indeed. Twenty or twenty thousand men perished on one side, five thousand, with all the attending favorable circumstances, and yet that the larger force should acknowledge the necessity of falling back after less than a day's fighting, is almost incredible. We would be inclined to think the despatches of Santa Anna a forgery, as far as this acknowledgement goes, and we will find the names of the journals under the patronage of his agents.
