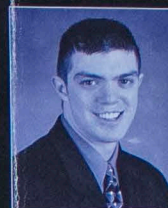

SGA ELECTION RULES AND PROCEDURES

Executive Branch / Congressional Elections

The following are rules by which the campaigning will be governed. Should there be any violations of the rules, then action may be taken against the individual concerned.

A. Voting / Election

1. In order for a student to vote in the election, he/she must be a full-time student at Morehead State University.
2. Voting may not be used as bribery or as a way to gain admittance or admission into any function, anyone found committing such acts would face the student court.
3. The on-line election will be open during the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. on a date specified within the election packet. Unofficial results will be revealed as soon after 10:00 PM on the day of the election in the Student Activities Office.
4. Official results will be announced at 4:30 PM in the Student Activities Office the day after the election.
5. If the server becomes unavailable for more than five consecutive hours, the results of the election will be void and there will be a new election held within 48 hours.
6. Should the University be closed for any unforeseen reason on the day of an election, the election will be held the following business day on any business day except Friday.
7. The election ballot will list candidate's name as it is registered with the university

B. Candidate Requirements and Responsibilities

1. Student Government Association officer and congressional candidates must meet all the qualifications set forth in the SGA Constitution; candidates will find these requirements attached to this document.
2. Each candidate, their campaign manager, or a designated representative must attend the first candidate's meeting on a day specified within the candidate packet.

C. Campaign Regulations

1. Candidates running for office may campaign after, and only after, the election rules meeting.
2. There will be no campaigning on the day of the election by persons attempting to persuade voters by any form of communication within ADUC, other student center areas, classroom buildings, residence halls, or any other university building with public computer access. This includes patio and entrance areas to these buildings.
3. Door to door campaigning may occur daily from 12 noon – 11:00 p.m. until the day before the election. No door to door campaigning may take place on the day of the elections. Residence Hall Visitation policies must be followed.
4. Any campaign activity should not interfere with the academic mission of the university.
5. Political activities such as meetings, rallies, parades, conferences, speeches, and the information booths necessitating physical arrangements should be scheduled through the Student Activities Office pending their approval.
6. Any candidate's speech or formal discussion to be held in a Residence Hall must

The Judicial Branch serves as the Student Court. Its members are appointed by the President and approved by the Student Congress.





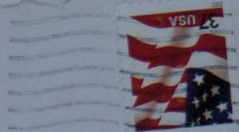

On behalf of Morehead State University, the Student Government Association would respectfully request the donation of Automated External Defibrillators. Our request comes from the students' concerns about the limited location of defibrillators on campus. With the help of administrators on campus, such as Brenda Wilburn of Counseling and Health Services, we have learned that current AEDs on campus are located in the Academic-Athletic Center, Jayne Stadium, Adron Doran University Center, Office of Public Safety, and the Wellness Center. In addition, we also learned that Allie Young Hall will soon be receiving an AED for their building.

In recognizing the needs and concerns of the Morehead State University students, we would like to request Automated External Defibrillators for Camden-Carroll Library and Alumni Tower. These buildings are determined in need of AEDs because they are heavily used by students, are available to all students, and are located on campus in areas not quite close to other AEDs that exist. 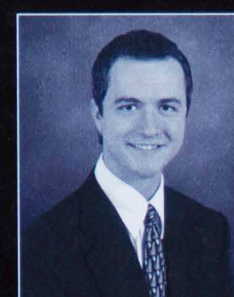

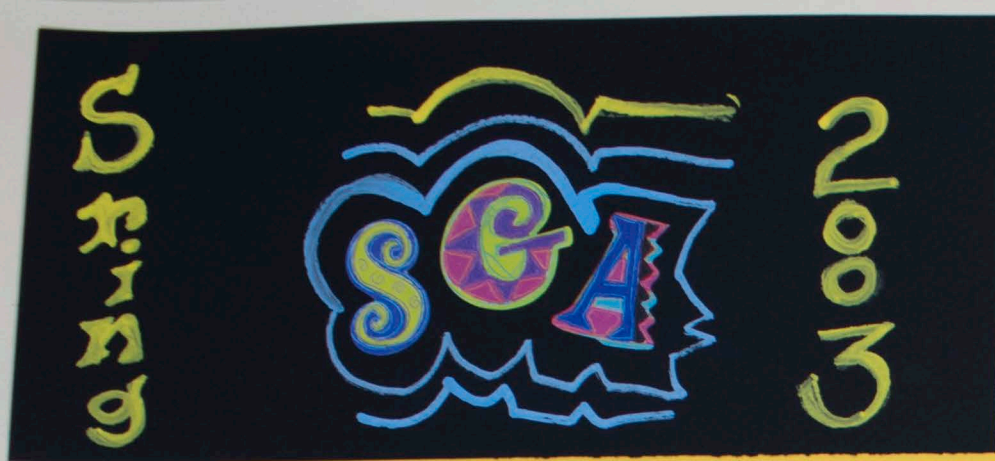

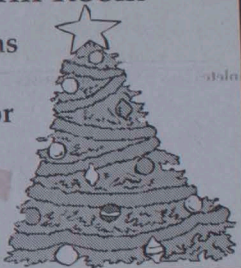

College students rally for

Student government representatives from across Kentucky plan to address legislators about cuts in funding of higher education.

Some Morehead State University students are doing their parts to combat the drastic reductions in state funding for higher education that are leading to higher tuition prices for all Kentucky public colleges and universities.

Members of the MSU Student Government Association and student body, along with students from other state univer-

Last week at a joint session of the General Assembly, Gov. Ernie Fletcher said this fiscal year's deficit is about \$300 million and he estimated next fiscal year's deficit, beginning July 1, will reach about \$710 million.

In an effort to overcome this year's state budget deficit and to create a \$100 million cushion for next year's budget, nearly \$65 million will be cut from postsecondary education allocations.

The 2.5 percent — about \$24 million — reduction in state funding from each university is recurring, while the other \$41 million is not, Fletcher said.

For MSU, this means a more than \$2.6 million cut in the university's budget, President Ronald G. Eaglin said.

Josh Gruenke, SGA president, said the rally today is a win-win situation for students.

"I don't know if anything will come out of this but either students go and affect change or they go and they are engaged," he said.

legislators to suggest they could find other ways of bringing in state revenue.

"Letters are more effective than changes and the rally is good for students," Gruenke said.

About 40 students from MSU are scheduled to attend today's rally in Frankfort. Gruenke said they plan to arrive in order to visit the offices of legislators to them face-to-face.

Representatives from the University of Kentucky's SGA and student body are also attending the rally. Rachel Watts, SGA president, said she plans to join other students in visiting Kentucky's legislators. "We don't want to be confrontational, we want to establish a stronger relationship between us and the legislators. I want to sit down with them and discuss the budget and working out how to help students," she said.

Watts said she looked for a few students to attend the rally.

Speaker sparks interest of many

signs that featured phrases like *Face It Abortion Kills*, *Stop All Abortion* and *Lord Forgive Us and Our Nation*.

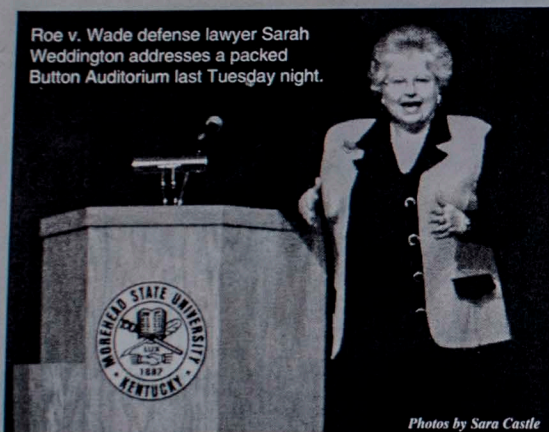
Jan Lewis, a volunteer at Hope Pregnancy Center in Rowan County, handed out pamphlets and fliers that contained information about the effects of abortion.

Steve Lewis, a local citizen and picketer in front of Button, said, "If we stay silent, they'll think we're all in agreement."

Richard Finfrick, a member of Lighthouse Baptist Church in Olive Hill, Ky., said, "We're all here rallying around to support something we believe in."

Jim Duval, associate pastor at Smokey Valley Baptist Church in Olive Hill, and Lowell Knipp, representative from Life Ministries, were also among those bearing signs.

Weddington described to the audience what it was like to be a young woman lawyer in a time when there were few women in the field and her joy at being asked by President Carter and his wife to come to Washington D.C.

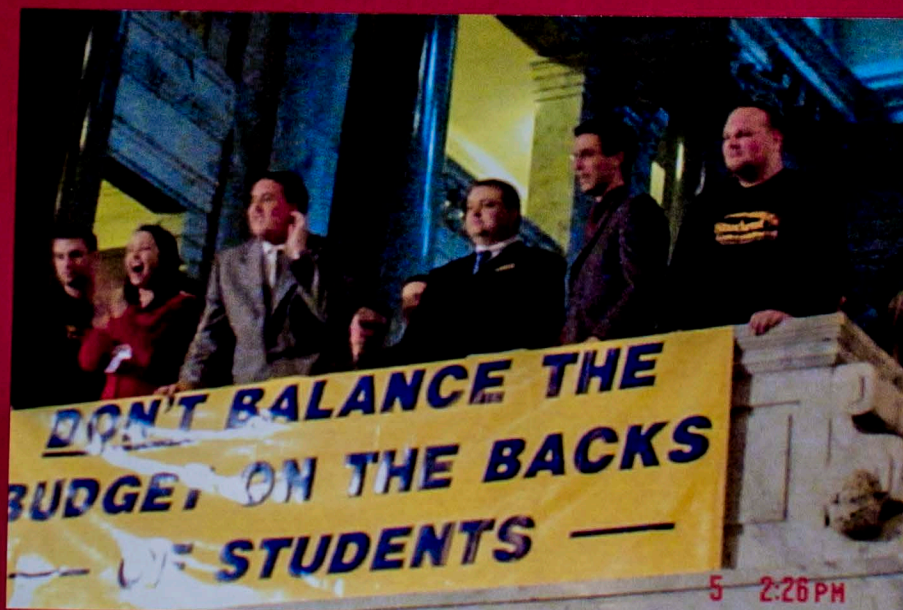
