Laws and Usages.

The extent to which the spirit of lawlessness is carried in some sections of the State is calculated to excite the most serious apprehensions of alarm. While we are happy to know that in our immediate locality peace and order prevail, and a strict observance of the law is generally recognized by our actions yet it is a matter of serious regret, without the extent to which the spirit of anarchy is carried in other localities. To enumerate the instances of outrage committed daily by lawless bands of marauders would be unnecessary. It is sufficient to know that they actually do commit and daily become more bold and frequent. The means and measures necessary for their suppression must wholly depend upon the character and magnitude of the combination; and in this case also lie more or less of the blame that should attach to the local authorities and the Legislative or Executive departments of the State. While the local authorities may be effective in the arrest of criminals by rule of law, yet it does not have the power to bring to justice a large and powerful combination of lawless marauders. The Legislature has only the power to invest the Executive and local authorities with such a system of punishment and reformation upon the part of the people of the State, who desire peace and law abiding citizens, should exercise boldly and firmly, and not shrink from the power which they are then invested with, should prove insufficient, then each man's conscience must dictate his course of action, and the State is prohibited its intercession.

This is certainly the only mode by which we can hope to secure to ourselves the benefit of good government, good society and good order.

San Domingo.

For the most gigantic exhibitions of executive energy and ability, we are disposed to the proceedings of the San Domingo commission. What is the effect of it? What substantial nation's benefit can be realized from it? That portion protest can justify the visitations of the people's honor, as the immediate result of such an encroachment? Is it a predatory stop acquisition by purchase? If so, what do we want with her? We have already territory enough to answer all our wants. We have already a population in our country, let loose open society, to curse, to curse, and breed in who need civilization, with adding an additional curse to the land in the shape of a foreign population of a similar character. If her acquisition is to be attended with a purchase, by what financial scheme is it proposed to procure the necessary means? A nation growing under a debt of three hundred millions of dollars, with a population of six millions feeding upon us, and still maintaining the subsistence of other people, is not an opportunity to try experiments at a fanciful cost. But there is no accounting for the political schemes of radical abolition. Settlers come and purpose, are made paramount to the public good. The Chinese and Japan expeditions are prominent examples of national folly. The former has introduced into our midst an element of social and political discord, and the latter is barren of good results.

Admission of Utah.

Is there not probable that Congress will make haste to authorize a Constitution to be held over for a State Constitution for Utah. Such will be the case in the vicinity of the time when the first settlers of the country upon the subject of religious toleration will be put to the test.

The Constitution of the United States provides that "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof." The Territory of Utah has a population of more than one hundred thousand. In the event that it is decided to hold over the holding of a Constitutional Convention preparatory to her admission into the Union upon an equal footing with the States, will it be required before such authority shall be granted, that she shall submit to certain conditions upon the subject of religion? Will Congress dictate the terms of admission, as it has done in the past? In its reception policy? Unless the speedy admission of Utah will advance the interests of radicalism, we fear that such a course will be pursued.

What then? As first comes up the question of right. Upon the problem, a correct view of the subject presents the same confusion, that it has, heretofore, presented, that if Utah, having the right to self-government, will apply for admission, and present itself to Congress as a State, it will be admitted.

Utah, having the right to self-government, is in itself, and is every other particular in conformity with the necessary requirements of the constitution of the United States, but, ignoring the subject of religion, as is evidently her right to do, it is the main duty of Congress to receive her without any further conditions.
