WORSHIP COMMITTEE: Mrs. Andre Bowne, Chairman, stated the palms would be changed. The use of teen-age boys as ushers was discussed in her committee meeting and they hoped Bill Mack would assume the leadership for them. Her committee also is visiting new members and aksed that the cards be filled in that are in the pews so they would know who the new members were and where they lived.

He also brought up the empty communion cup problem for the Deacons. He said two racks have been placed inside of the arms of the front pews. He will explain to all Deacons the new method of taking communion, in a letter. Dr. Holbrook asked that it also be explained there should be no crisscrossing in serving the communion.

Rev. Brooks stated that Paul J. Reynolds and Russell McClure are Elders for this month and the service will be a little more elaborate because of World Communion Day.

Noah Kennard asked about the new front doors. Andre was to meet with a fellow concerning them. A check had been made with Cincinnati Sash & Door Company and they would furnish the doors made up in fur or oak.

Rev. Brooks checked with Rev. Jim Lollis at Lexington as to where they had obtained their doors and Andre called the company and a representative is coming.

NEW BUSINESS: Rev. Brooks stated that a year ago a concern offering was taken for the Committee on Moral and Civic Rights. He suggested \$20.00 be taken out of the budget instead of special offering taken from the congregation. Dr. Grotte moved and Dr. Holbrook seconded the motion that the Treasurer be authorized to send a check for \$20.00 to this committee. It will be added to next year's budget.

Rev. Brooks asked about music scholarship. He was assured they were increased from last year. Mrs. Venetozzi had inquired.

Rev. Brooks said he would have to let Lynn Draper know how many will be attending the meeting at Flemingsburg, October 31 for Line of Credit Meeting.

Rev. Brooks also stated that in October a roll call would be made each Sunday.

Rev. Brooks dismissed the meeting with a prayer.
