# VOCATIONAL SCHOOL OPENS

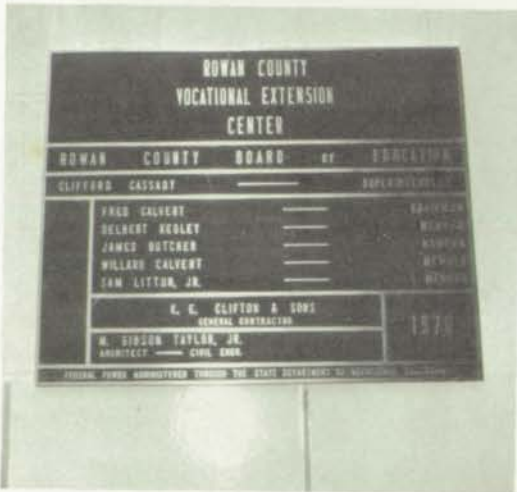
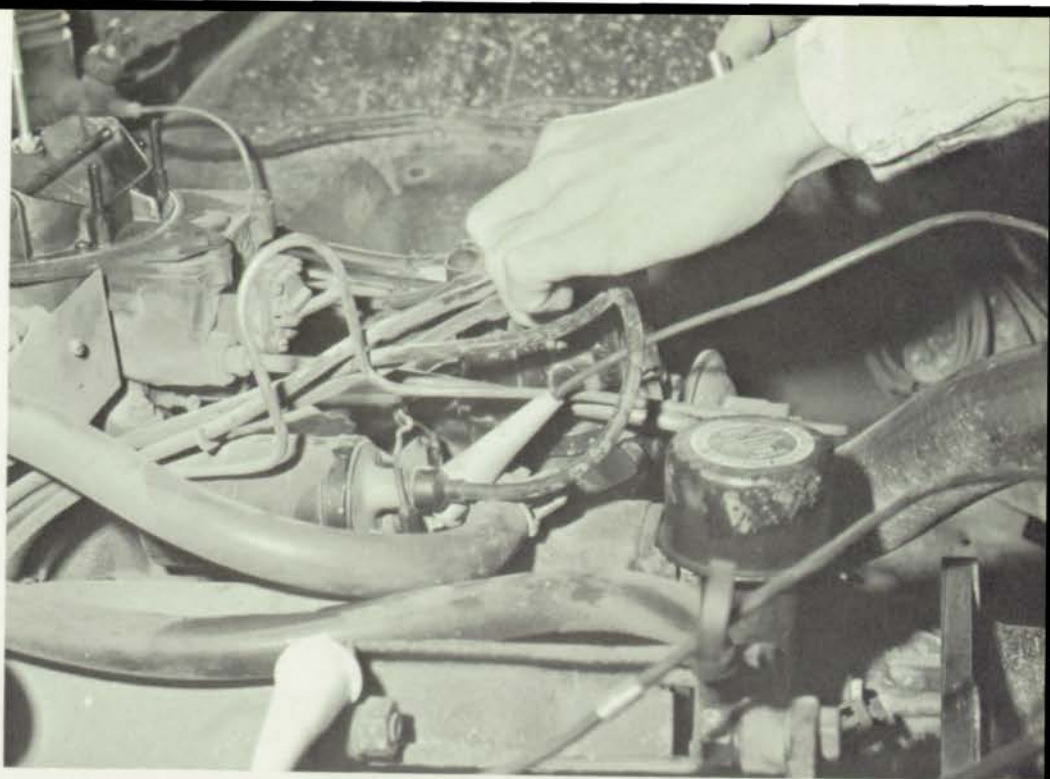
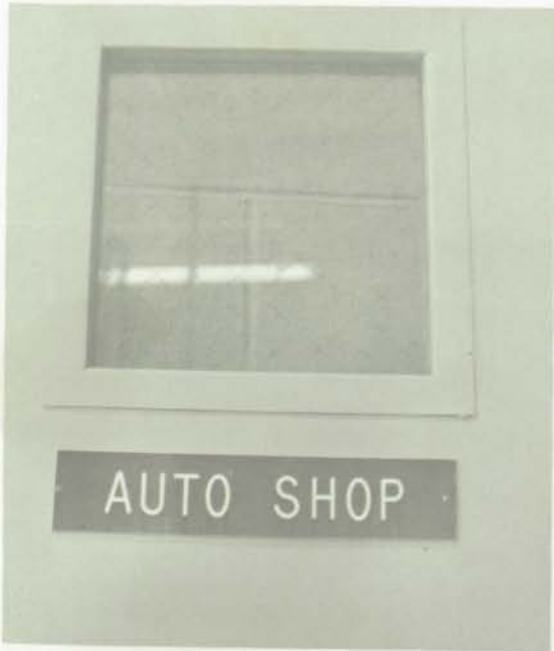

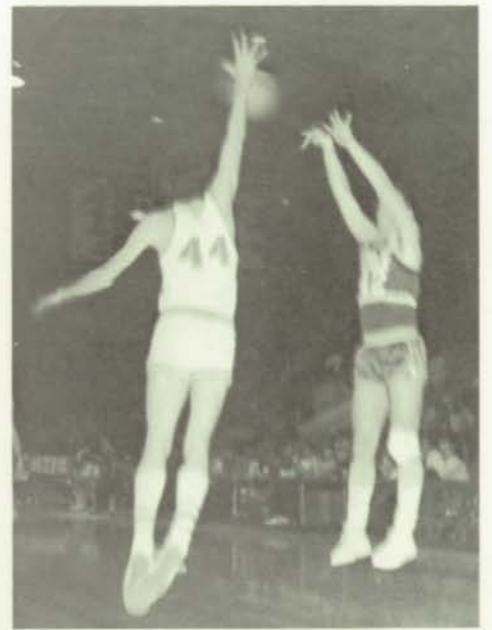

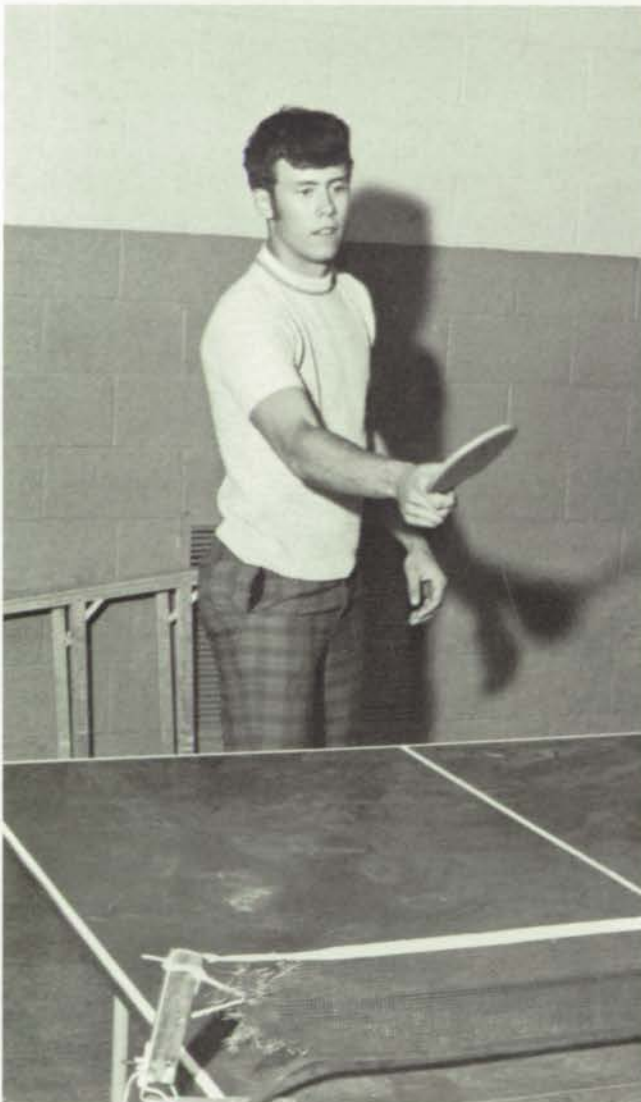

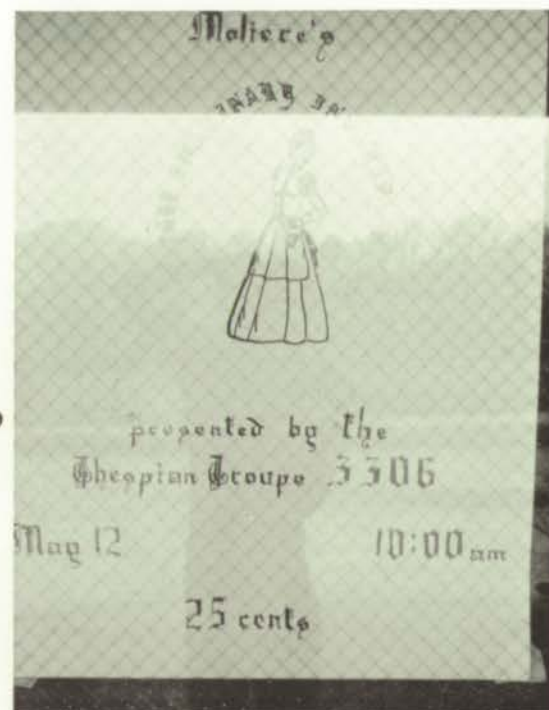
