Mrs. Nell Prather acts both as director and secretary to the Rowan County Vocational School.
















LEFT: Mr. James serves as Rowan County's visiting teacher. The visiting teacher assists students who have financial problems which may interfere with their attendance.


RISNER RELATES WITH STUDENTS






