

Closing of Ford's Theatre—The Trial of Miss Harris.
 WASHINGTON, July 10.
 Ford's Theatre was closed to-night, before the performance commenced, by order of the War Department, and the building taken possession of by a military guard. A crowd assembled in front an hour before the performance was to commence, but soon dispersed quietly. Ford protested against the proceeding through counsel, Thomas Ewing, late counsel for Mudd and Sprangler.
