VIRGINIA ELECTIONS. WHIG TRIUMPHS.

The following which we clip from the Pittsburg Commercial Journal, of the 24th, is the first from the front of the Whigs in the Richmond District, whose election is announced. It is the same individual who undertook to "head Jones Tyler." He is a thorough Whig and his election would seem to indicate that Virginia too was about to forsake the Administration notwithstanding the impassioned appeals to her "Ancient Democracy" which have greeted the columns of the Washington Union for the past few weeks.

We have a few returns from the Virginia elections. The Whigs have elected Pendleton, in the 9th; Bots in the 6th, and Frederick Beale in the 8th Congressional District, showing a gain thus far to members in the last Congress, there being but one Whig member, Mr. Pendleton, from the State.

In the election for the members of the House of Delegates, there appeared to have been no political changes. The Democrats have gained one Senator in the Fredericksburgh District.
