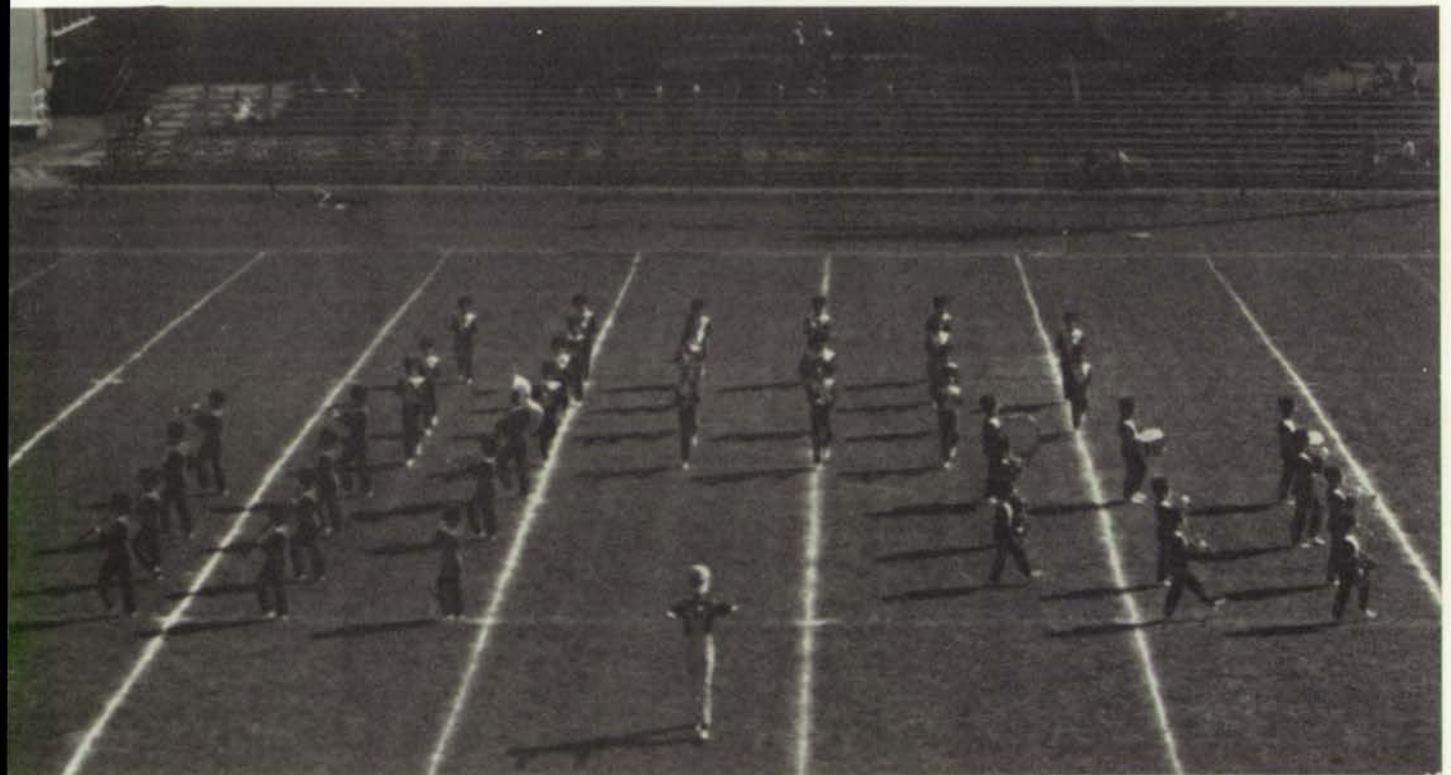

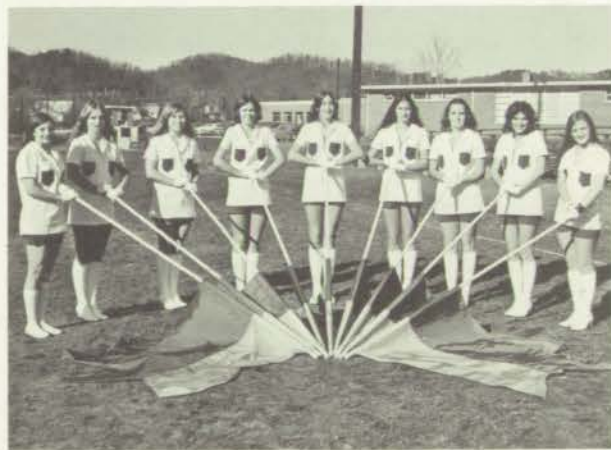

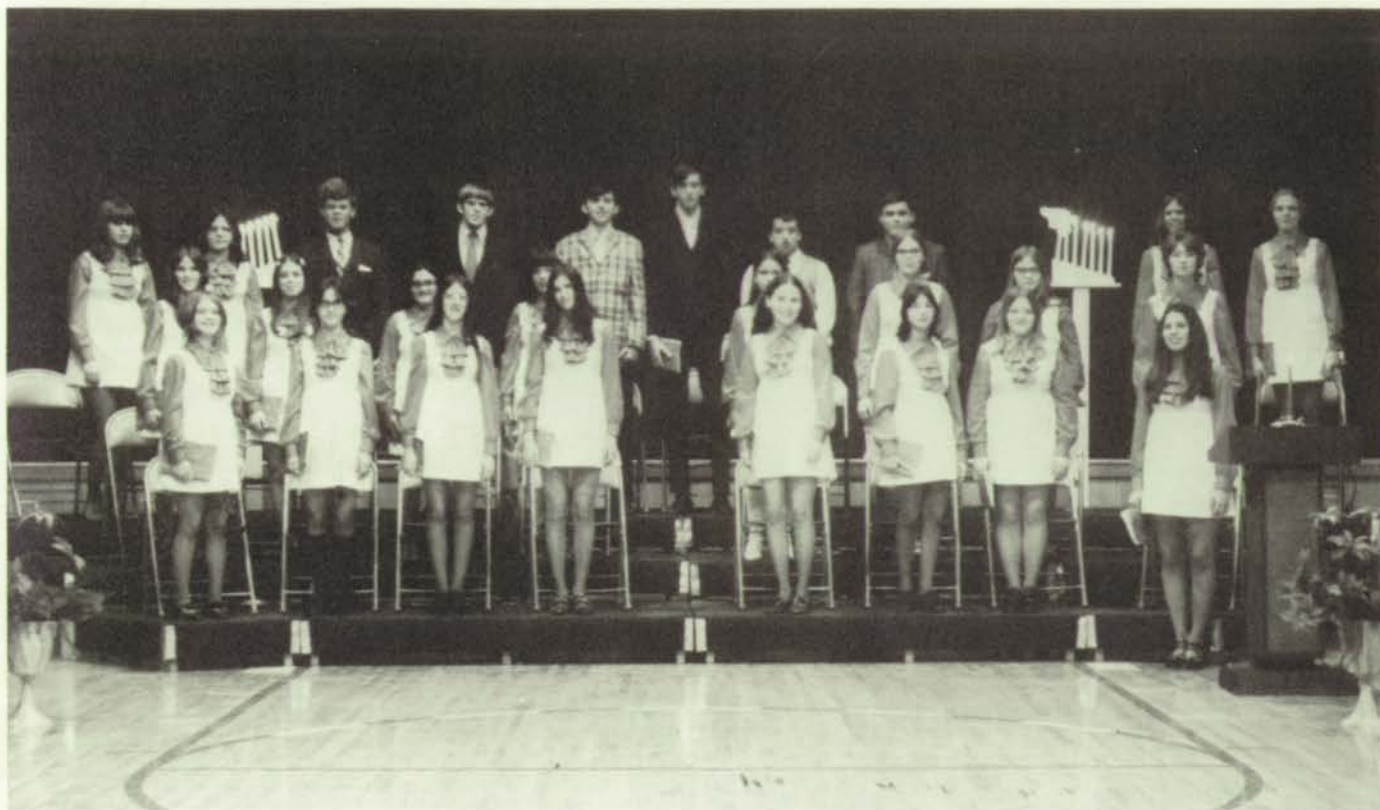


Band Adds Innovation: R.C.H.S. Acquires New Drill Corp

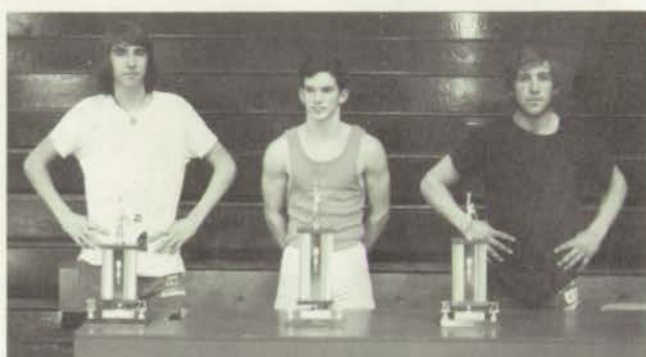

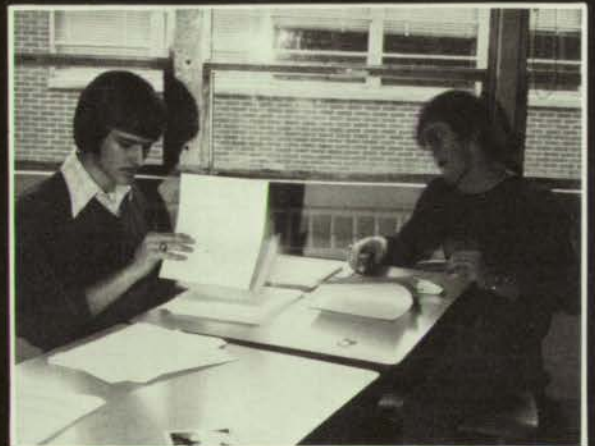

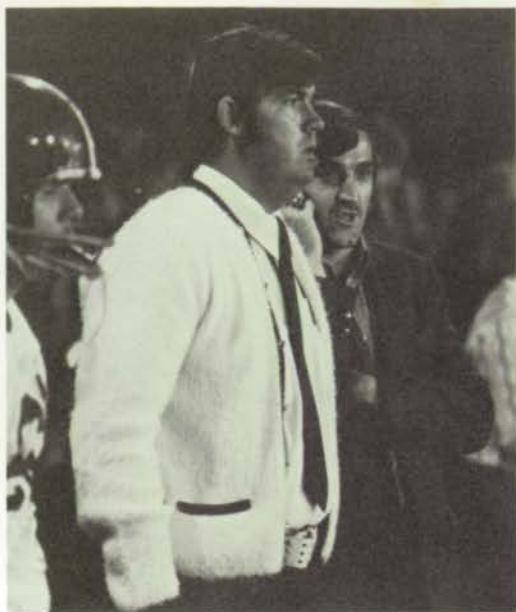
Season Record 5-5
