the board devised a plan to off-set the deficit.

At this witing, the deficit has been reduced by about \$3351.85 until it stands presently at \$1,148.15. It was pointed out at the board meeting Monday evening, however, that this figure is low because already during this year our church has lost \$1,500.00 of pledged money from deaths and folk moving from the community. So in actual numbers to break even in operating costs by June 1983 we will need to raise approximately \$3000.00 extra. Lets work together to make it happen.
