

- 3. Be responsible for providing for all:
 - A. Ice
 - B. Bread/ Butter
 - C. Coffee (coffeemaker uses exactly one pound of drip coffee)
 - D. Cream/Sugar
 - E. Lemonade (large can of Country Time brand)
 - F. Tea (use instant, but the plain kind not kind with lemon and/or sugar)
 - G. Napkins
 - H. Meat -(this can be handled one of several ways each team can decide how they want to do it leaders will advise)
- 4. Team members should bring their meat plus one vegetable, and either a salad or dessert for the dinner. (total of three).
- 5. Clean-up do dishes, take down tables and chairs, stack linens neatly and assign a team member to take them to the laundry early in the week. Please leave kitchen clean and neat.
- 6. Team leaders will collect the money from table bowls and turn into CWF treasure: The money placed in the bowls will always go into the CWF kitchen fund. This is used to buy dishwashing supplies, replenish glassware, linens, and other supplies and articles necessary for the upkeep and use of the Kitchen.


