

Craig Tolliver's Trial.

In the Tolliver case yesterday the defense moved the court to instruct the jury to bring in a verdict of not guilty, because the testimony offered by the State was not sufficient to convict. This was overruled and several witnesses then testified that David Martin had said at his preliminary examination that he knew nothing of the robbery. This, too, when he had testified for the State that Tolliver and the others wanted him to engage in it. Martin had also said that a woman named Lizzie Hall was present when the matter was talked over. This she denied yesterday. The judge took under consideration some special charges asked and the case will go the jury this morning.—[Cincinnati Enquirer, 20th instant.
