The measure may be revived any time within the next two legislative days by any Senator who voted to table the bill and amendments.

Cincinnati, O., Jan. 29.—A romance that had its inception in the Breathitt county, Ky., feud, culminated in the marriage in Cincinnati yesterday morning of Mrs. Abriella Harat Marcum, forty-six years old, to Capt. Thomas Jefferson Turner, fifty years old. "Squire Edward H. Hausenheld officiated. The couple are from Jackson, Ky.

Mrs. Marcum and Capt. Turner arrived in Cincinnati Thursday evening and registered at the Grand Hotel. Yesterday morning, accompanied by C. P. Poe, chief clerk, they procured a marriage license and went to Square Hausenheld's office, where the ceremony was performed. Capt. and Mrs. Turner then returned to the Grand Hotel, and in an effort to keep the marriage a secret, registered as "Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Jefferson Harat, Paintsville, Ky."

Mrs. Turner was the widow of Attorney James B. Marcum, who was killed by Carl Jess and Tom White May 4, 1903. This shooting was the culmination of a series of murders. The slayers of Mr. Marcum were among the few brought to justice.

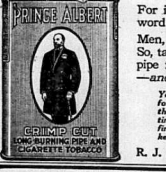
