CHURCH FISCAL YEAR

First Christian Church has just completed its 1970-71 fiscal year, and on July 1st it started the new one. The new budget was recently presented to the congregation at a congregational meeting held after church. Those present passed the new budget.

The budget this year includes such departments as Church Administration, Property, World Outreach, Worship and Services and Education. These items total \$31,298.00. Over and above this is the Debt retirement on a five year note, amounting as payment for this year of \$5,163.92 which includes payment on both principle and interest. This will average about \$700.00 per week income which the church needs to pay its regular expenses and on the note.

Last year, with the help of several of those who had sent checks to pay the balance of their pledges, we met all the items of the budget, including the World Outreach. Thank you for your help and your contributions.

Marsh, Russell McClure, Tom Queen, Robert Walshe, Agnes Williams, Faith Fannin, and Ward Williams. Mrs. Grace Apel, Church Socretary and bookkeeper, Mr. John Williams were also present.

The minutes of the June 28, 1971 meeting were approved as read.

Mrs. Brucene McClure, chairman of the nominating committee, recommended Mr. Alex Conyers, chairman, Mr. Elmer Anderson, vice chairman, Dr. Jack Bizzel, treasurer, and Miss Alice Cox, secretary, for the year 1971-1972. Mr. Reynolds moved that nominations cease, motion seconded by Mrs. McClure, passed. Dr. Bizzel asked Mrs. Apel to explain the treasurer's report which showed a balance on the church's world outreach had been paid, leaving in the general treasury a blance of \$95.28 as of July 26, 1971.

Committee Reports

Youth groups will be split. Chi Rho will include 7th and 8th grades with Kim Behling, leader; C.Y.F. will include 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grades with Dick Patrick, leader. College group will include those graduated from high school last year. Increased responsibility and participation will be stressed.

Evangelism Committee: New members should be sought.

Property Committee: Ceiling at the parsonage has not been fixed since plasterer was not available. Other means of fixing ceiling might be considered. Part which had been ordered for the church rest room has not been received.

Reverend Roberson reported ---

Concern for those who are sick and for many families in which there recently have been deaths.

Pressing need for individual spirituality. Urged each Board member to make calls.

Happy events include many weddings.

Church picnic is being planned for latter part of August on the Warren Cooper farm.

He expressed appreciation for Mrs. Apel's work and all that the Board has done for him. The summer experience has been rewarding.

A revival will be held November 7 through 10.

We need help next Sunday when group comes from Kentucky Village.

He has spoken to Creston Mayhall about paying him for each service call instead of on a regular salary basis. He recommended that the Board use part of the sum formerly paid to Creston to get someone to do the cleaning.

Mr. John Williams reported --

He is thankful to the church. He said he had no place to go when he first came to Morehead. He wanted to get more involved in the ministry. He suggested that the church paper could be better, but he appreciated the effort that Mrs. Apel has made. The church could relate to the community better-- it could make better use of the radio and he can help since radio is one of his major studies. The bell choir needs a new director and he would be glad to take over that responsionity.
