 7. We hope you can work with the Board of Student Body Presidents as they are our representatives to forward students' concerns about higher education.

 - Please stamp the enveloped letter, and address it to your Legislators (find by hand out sheets) and give to your greek president.
 - Letters can be arranged to be picked up from the presidents or dropped off at SGA.
 - Tell family, friends, or anyone you know to write or call their legislators.
 - Other universities will be writing letters as well as the residence halls.

We closed Mainstreet at night due to the extremely low customer count, down to 30 people per night.

The ice cream machine in Alumni has been repaired. Unfortunately, Taylor was extremely slow in responding.

Meal Plans-All meal plans offer unlimited seconds this year. They are priced based upon an expected number of missed meals. Without a missed meal factor, the price of the meal plan would have to be raised. Note: The price of the 20 meal plan was lowered this Fall.

Alumni Hours of Service-the hours, as well as the unlimited seconds program is directly tied into pricing the meal plans and the casual meal rate. Additions to service hours would require a change in price or program. A change in the program would require a price change.

Plaza Grill-removed canned soda because of pricing from Pepsi. Our volume on canned soda was not sufficient to qualify for discount pricing from Pepsi.

All prices should already be posted. We will post any that were overlooked.

Athletes, as well as all students, had an opportunity to switch from the 20 Meal Plan to the 10 Meal Plan in the Fall.

We will look at a brunch on Saturday for next fall.

All our chicken is cleaned prior to cooking.

Alumni Lunch-our contract calls for the following menu selection at lunch: hot entree, hot sandwich, veg. casserole. Solid meats are more expensive and will be available in the evening.

We will look into vegetarian subs to go in the Grills. Is there a market?

Vegetarian casserole is available everyday in Mainstreet. Macaroni & cheese is run most days. Other vegetarian casseroles are substituted periodically other than macaroni & cheese. Note: low demand for vegetarian entrees in both buildings.

The students are not paying for the renovations!

Skim milk is available in Grab-N-Go. Extremely low usage in the Alumni Cafeteria, spoiling before consumed.

Silverware is available in Mainstreet and the Alumni Cafeteria.

ADUC Grill-we shut down chicken production at 5:00pm. Low level of sales is not sufficient to support the program.

ADUC Music Box & P.A. is not the food services responsibility.

The hot vegetables in Alumni are receiving our immediate attention.

Mainstreet Tuesday Night-although the house is packed, sales are low. We cannot afford to open the whole program-we would lose food and labor dollars.

WHAT IS THE STUDENT ATHLETIC BOARD?

Being formed for the first time, the Student Athletic Board functions as the student branch of the MSU Athletic Department. Basically, the Student Athletic Board concerns itself with supporting all varsity athletic programs of Morehead State University along with building up the school spirit among the student body.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

First of all, the Student Athletic Board is an officially registered Morehead State University student organization, by which control of the group is manifested directly through student membership.

In terms of management, the organizational hierarchy consists of the following:

1. Board of Directors - comprised of students elected once a year. Each oversees a specific area of responsibility within the group.
2. Committee Chairmen - positions filled by student members who are appointed once a year.
3. Associate Members - portion of the general membership that's qualified to vote. To be associate member, students must be involved with the Student Athletic Board for at least one semester.
4. Member - portion of the general membership that have joined but have yet to complete one semester of involvement. To become a member of the Student Athletic Board, students need to be enrolled in the University and fill out an application.

HOW DOES ONE GET INVOLVED IN THE STUDENT ATHLETIC BOARD?

Simple. Just fill out the attached application and return it to the Student Association Office, located in ADUC. After your application has been received, you will be notified of your membership with the Student Athletic Board. 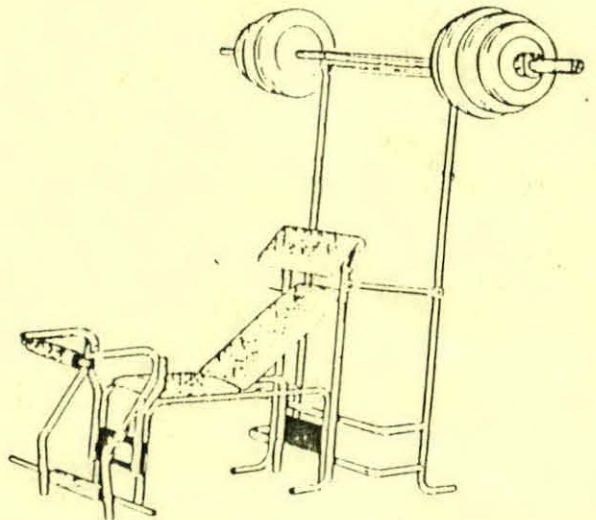
