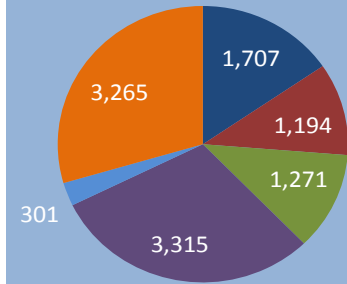

## Enrollment Quick Facts

- 489 new transfer students (including 14 Black, Non-Hispanics). 333 transferred from KCTCS.
- 6,456 enrolled from the 22-county service region.
- 3,351 enrolled from other Kentucky counties.
- 1,101 enrolled from 42 other states.
- 145 enrolled from 32 foreign countries.
- 76 Black, Non-Hispanics were among the 1,516 first-time freshmen.
- 69% First-Time Freshman retention rate from Fall 2013 to Fall 2014 (70% for under-represented minorities).
- 2,943 students in MSU residence halls and apartments.
