



IS THIS LOYALTY ?

Frankly, now is this LOYALTY? Thus far in our October Loyalty Attendance emphasis we have some doubts about the loyalty of our congregation. The roll call taken each Sunday at the Worship hour indicates that less than one-half of our membership have been in attendance on any one of the three Sundays. We seem so very slow in getting off the ground in this Fall and Winter Program launching.

Well now, you still have a chance to "get going" in the next two Sundays of this month. Again they are both special observance days in our Religious Calendar.

Sunday, October 24, is WORLD ORDER SUNDAY. So observed to place emphasis on World Peace. If there is anything in the world about which we should be stirred up it is PEACE. Do we as Christians have any contribution to make in a world where FORCE seems to be the only answer to our International problems? Surely it can be a time to come to the church and renew our faith in what the Bible has to say about its central message of "PEACE ON EARTH, AMONG MEN OF GOOD WILL."

SERMON SUBJECT: "THE END OR THE GOAL."

Sunday, October 31, is REFORMATION SUNDAY. This is a world wide Religious Calendar date. The Protestant forces of the world rethink the religious heritage which is ours from the declaration of our 16th century Reformers. Our emphasis is upon the mutual priesthood of all believers in a mutual ministry in a common life. Again we say that on such a day, every person who cherishes his religious liberty and enjoys the fruits of the efforts of the Reformers, should be in his place in the Church.

Come next Sunday and begin the habit of regular worship. Answer the Silent Roll Call. Stand up for the things you believe and love. God and His Church need YOU --but most of all YOU need the church. See you on Sunday, yes, but at church.

ANOTHER LIVING MEMORIAL.

During the recent past our church has been blessed because of the desire to have a Living Memorial to persons who have passed from our visible fellowship. Some have said: "How much better than giving flowers that fade and die."

This time the suggestion comes for a Living Memorial from our youth in memory of one of their own group. These youth want to help in providing a memorial for Jeff Calvert whose untimely passing was a shock to both old and young alike. This is not merely to revive the memory of the shock which came but rather to remember a blithe young soul who was once a part of all the church had to offer.

This memorial is to take the form of Schulmeric Handbells. And what are they, you ask? They are a set of handbells which comprise two octaves of the musical staff and are played in the same manner that the Swiss handbells are played. The mastery of them is not difficult. Most anyone who can read music or play the piano or organ can learn to play the bells. Several people use them at one time, each assigned to a certain number of notes which give the bells their tone. They will have many uses in our music programs within the church. They can be used for worship services to accompany the Calls to Worship, to play hymns and religious selections. They can be used to give Religious Musical Concerts, all with dignity and beauty.

There will be no financial drive to finance these bells which will cost in round figures about \$800.00. A Living Memorial is provided by those who feel moved to give something in memory of one who was beloved by the church and a part of its followship. This does not break faith with our established budget, for it is not a part of it. Anyone who wishes can share, and already many have; to the extent of more than \$450.00. And, by the way, this article is not an appeal but a reporting of the desire of many of our people to have such a memorial both for its intrinsic value and for its practical value as it will enhance the music in our church.




USHERS
