LEST YE FORGET!

The following article is reprinted from last week's paper, that it may be more thoroughly impressed on your mind.

FELLOW PROGRESSIVES:

Have you been misled by any candidate or worker for the remnants of the emancipated and weak Republican organization? You will remember that about six months ago, (on January 31, to be exact) the Republican State Central Committee met at the Galt House, in Louisville, Kentucky, and held a painstaking clinic over the emaciated form of the Jefferson County Elephant. The brow-wrinkling diagnosis disclosed the sad fact that the patient was a very sick brute, and that potent medicines were needed to stay the course of its illness. Wherefore, the committee, after much reflection, prepared a voluminous resolution, replete with whereases, setting forth the condition of the party and the course of treatment deemed necessary to restore its health. The most important feature of the proposed treatment consisted of the abolishment of the City and County Committees in Kentucky, all of which were thereupon abolished, including the Carter County Committee.

They then proceeded to bring back

into the Republican organization the persons who voted for Col. Roosevelt and the Progressive ticket last year by urging them somewhat in this way: "I believe you voted for Roosevelt last year?" 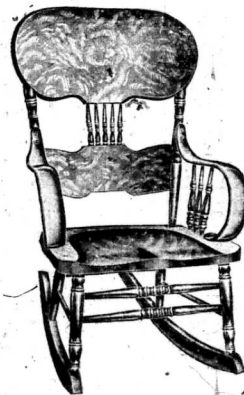
