

## Materials

22 yards 36" wide white percale  
 2 spools quilting thread  
 Quilting Needles  
 Leftover Cotton scraps

Before you start: Cut your white percale into 9" squares. This makes 352 9" squares. The best way to divide your 22 yards in to one-yard pieces. Then divide each yard in half, and then half again, ~~and then~~ giving you four 9" by 36" strips. Divide each strip in half again, and then in half again, giving your 4 nine inch squares out of one strip. You must get 16 of the 9" squares out of one-yard of material.

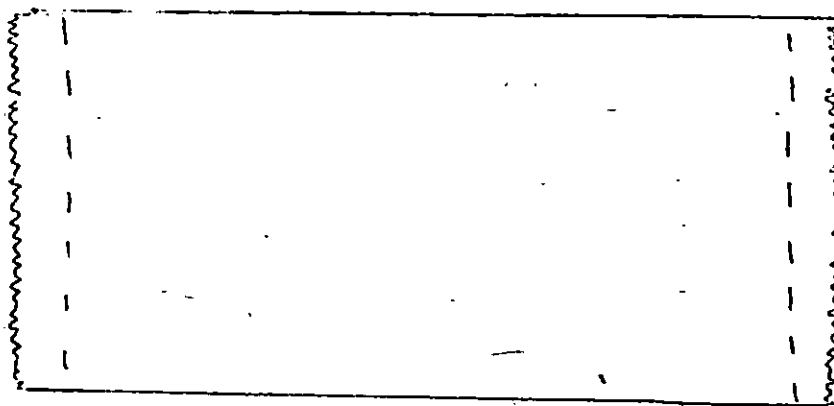
Your patterned or colored patches are any leftover cotton material cut into  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. The patches can be hit or miss design, or sets of four alike. Now that you have your materials all assembled and prepared, your all set to make the quilt. Just follow the seven steps listed below.

Step 1: (Working with white squares) Fold one 9" square in half & stitch each end of square as shown.

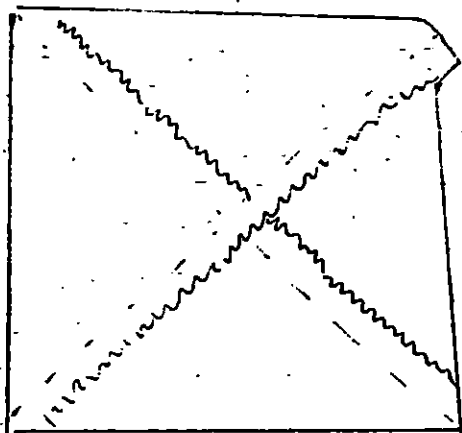
Step 2: Open and fold two edges together (having seams meet) and stitch across, leaving enough open so that you will be able to turn the square inside out after you have done stitching.

Step 3: After turning the square inside out, push out the corners. This gives you a  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square with no stitches showing. Slip-stitch opening.

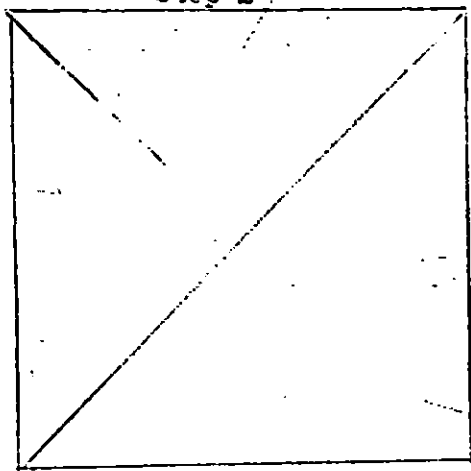
Step 4: Tack each corner into center of square, reducing size of square to approximately  $4\frac{1}{8}$  to  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



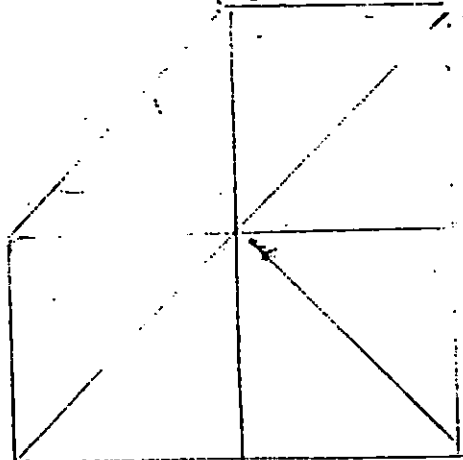

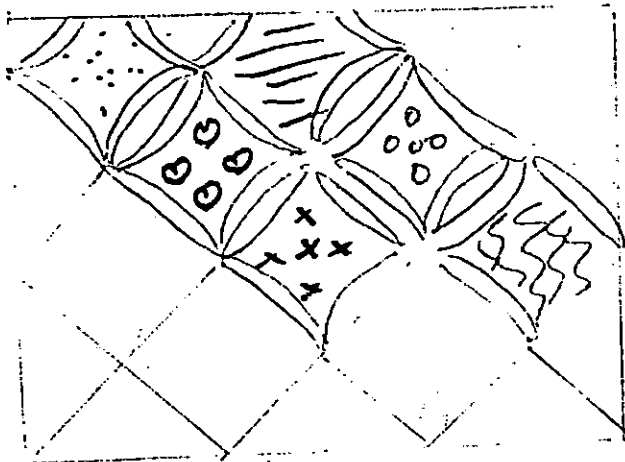
Step 5: When you have a number of these squares finished, start overcasting them together. All of the sewing is done on the top side of the quilt with very small stitches. Use 16 white squares to make up each row of the quilt.

Step 6: It is best to stitch these squares together in strips adding your patches as you go. The patches are set into and over the overcasting row of two squares. Pin patch in place, folding edge of the square over it. Use very fine stitches & make sure stitches go through to the underside forming quilting design.

Step 7: You will have only half squares at the edge of quilt, so in finishing the edge leave them blank. Just turn over edges of the squares to complete the design all around outside edge of the quilt.
