Personal Log, 6-30-94, Thursday:

I woke around 2:30am Saturday morning and got down to ADUC at 3:30am, as Roger Varney, the VP, said to be there. He didn't get there until 4:00am, with Robin Hays, the Treasurer. Brian Hutchinson, the Programing director, who has ulcers, was ill. He was puking quite a lot. We had to make a few pit-stops for him along the way. Roger, finding out that Holly Slone, the Publicity director, had dropped Brian off at a Super America station did a U-turn in the middle of main street to turn around and get him.

We took the AA highway to Cincinnati, and after one or two back tracks, we managed to get there with about half an hour to spare. Trish McHolland, the secretary, and her brother Shawn were waiting for us at the American Air gate. We get checked in and our plane was this little propeller looking thing which looked like it was straight from Fantasy Island. I couldn't believe it. The inside was tiny, and I thought if I sneezed I'd cause it to crash.

Believe it or not, we made it to Nashville with no problems. After fiddling around for an hour, (and paying \$2.10 for a Goddamn cookie at an airport restaurant) we got on a real plane and were off to New York. The flight was uneventful.

We arrive and go to the baggage claim and got our stuff as this guy from the University we were to stay at (C.W. Post) introduced himself. He was the A-typical New Yorker, Goat-tee mustache, thick accent, baseball cap, the works. Come to find out he was the Clyde James of C.W. Post--he ran the student center. We waited for another group to arrive for about an hour.

During that time we saw this little leashed Chihuahua dog, no more than a foot long (if that), prancing in front of this lady. It, with in a second, doubled up and crapped right in the walkway of the airport. In the next second the lady behind it, looking around at everything but the dog, kicked the little sucker at least three feet while in mid-squat, leaving presents behind it. The janitor, who had just walked past that section cleaning a wall, came back around frowned, got a broom and a dust pan and cleaned it up.

On the way to the university traffic was hell. I slept through the better part of it in the front seat. Arriving at the "new dorm," I could not help but get the feeling that this University was not that old--which was true, I found. It had only been founded in the 1960's. We check in, and I sign everything "Mark Anderson" because it all has his name on it. I, at least, got a name tag with my name on it.

Upon finding my room, I found I wasn't roomed with Roger or Brian, but in there with no one I knew, and did not meet until that night. The rooms were odd. You had a central "living room" and four bed rooms and a bath connected on to it. So really I had about 8 roommates.

The first session was one where we had the T-shirt swap. Every group sent a person onto the stage to show what they had, and I got drafted for MSU. I introduced myself, where I was from, and how many shirts we had. I told them we have some "KEG" weekend T-shirts and left it at that--two guys in the back hopped up and whooped "Yeahhh!" upon hearing the

word "keg." It looked like the stock exchange, or a horse trading convention as everyone traded shirts back and forth. I had brought 2 of my own, and ended up with two decent ones in trade, and a pair of shorts.

We broke out into our "color groups," where we introduced ourselves, described our universities, &c. I got the feeling these things were not going to be that useful--confirmed later in the week. It had the feel of "group therapy" for some reason. Of all the universities represented in my group, MSU was the 3rd largest. There was one from Virginia with 20,000 students, another with 10,000 and us with 9,000. There were some universities that had less people than my high school! One thing I did get from these group meetings was a better appreciation of MSU. Hearing some of the problems some of these other SGA's deal with, plus the miniscule budgets they have, I really began appreciating MSU. Other general meetings and instructions were given, and afterwards they had a showing of the movie "Ace Ventura, Pet Detective," but I went to bed, instead.

I met my roommate then, Andy Aweida, an SAE from Puget Sound in Washington state. He was a really nice guy, and I think of all the people I met up there, he and I got along the best--which is surprising because I usually can't stand SAE's.

The next day was chucked full of activities and workshops. The first general session was on diversity appreciation or some such hoey. It proclaimed how America was no longer a melting pot, but rather a salad bowl. I'm not going to go into how that is bull, but I will say that those who advocate cultural diversity aren't talking about a salad bowl, but rather a salad bar, where everything is kept in specific containers and isn't mixed together. There was a guy behind me who voiced many objections I agreed with and I said as much to him. Afterwards he and I talked he made the comment that he was going to see Rush Limbaugh. Then it hit me, I had just agreed with a Republican! OhhhhhhNoooo!

In the color group meeting after it, the "group therapy" I'd felt in the first came out again. There was so much whining about oppression and all that I couldn't stand it. The seminars that day I attended included one on Ethics, one on Strategic Planing, and one on Politics in SGA's. This one was hosted by Bob Bowdecker (sp?) who knew Susette Redwine.

In the seminar on Ethics, we had to go around and state an ethical dilemma facing us or our SGA's. I had a perfect one. The exec's from here had been telling me how they wanted to put the down payment on a bass-boat with the administrative fund (as Robin put it, "We have it [the administrative fund], we should enjoy it. Last year's [exec's] didn't.") I told the group about the boat, and they laughed for a solid five minutes. The facilitator of the seminar said that was, with out a doubt, the most unusual story he'd ever heard. For the rest of the entire conference everyone I met kept saying "Buy the boat, Mike!" (Come to find out one of the guys I talked the most with during that seminar, John, was from Andy's school, and was a Sigma Nu, the only other there).

Lunch followed, and I got another lesson on how I should appreciate MSU--the food sucked! I thought Alumni was bad,

but it is nothing compared to what we had. Needless to say the \$60 given me by SGA got used those 4 days.

We met in a legislative session and were given nine problems that we, as a mock SGA, must solve. The situation was too unstructured to do much good, or to learn much. There were so many different universities, with so many different constitutional set ups, that for the most part it was chaos. I, in a meeting with some of my roommates, went through each mock bill with them, explaining, briefly what I would do with each--and in the end 90% of what I had suggested was done.

Roger wanted to nominate me for something, and ended up doing it for treasurer. I immediately declined. When the office of Parliamentarian came up, I told him to nominate me for that. Trish did, and Roger seconded. I didn't win only because one of the other guys had two copies of Robert's rules with him and held them up during his 45 second speech. I didn't really care one way or the other.

I attended the seminar on strategic planing and I think I got the most out of that than any other. I took plenty of notes, and will be briefing Mark on what I learned and maybe he can use some strategies for the fall.

The schedule, packed as tight a sardine can, was non-stop all day. We had a seminar, then a general meeting, then a meal, then this, then that--and I chugged through every bit of it, having a ball. I don't know why, but I always have fun on these kinds of trips. Toward the evening on Sunday, there was a comedian (the name escapes me) who was great. We all talked to him and are going to see if we can get him up here.

I was taking pictures and he made an odd face just as I clicked one. I, being in the front row with the rest of the MSU team, left myself wide open to his attack. "You have to take a picture when it looks like I'm taking a shit?" He then says he'll give me a matching photo. He goes over to the wall and looks like he is trying to take a piss, with his back to me. I got a picture of that too.

That night there was a keg party--a real keg party--put on by some of the students who had cars. Pay \$3 and it is all you can drink. I paid (not with SGA money), and had 3 drinks or so. The comedian was there and I told him, as he said, the worst joke he'd ever heard. Also there were these two girls, cousin's I think, who looked a lot alike, dancing around with everyone, and I danced with one, making Roger and Brian laugh like hell. The cops showed up. The comedian told us all to sing religious songs and act like it was religious pow-wow. They just broke it up, and we went back to the dorms. However, my roommate Andy was taken in for questioning. Nothing became of it.

Monday I was the only MSU student at the conference. The rest of the crew went to Manhattan early that morning. They told me they were going to, seeing how none of them had been to New York. I can't quite blame them, you'd think that if a conference were going to be held NY, the planners would allot at least a little time for sight seeing. I'd been to New York 3 or 4 times, so I didn't care to see it again.

The general morning seminar was on motivation. They passed out noise makers and various other things to induce

school spirit. We then were taught about the "Snickers" program (S.n.i.c.k.e.r.s stands for a long series of steps and ways to motivate). We had to cheer and do "touchy feely" exercises, which included getting into rows and literally passing a person over everyone's head down the row. Thankfully they picked light people.

The seminar that day I attended was on expressing yourself firmly, but politely. Now most people don't think I have a problem with that, and usually I don't, but I found last year in RHA that I did indeed have hesitation in stating what I wanted firmly. The facilitator gave several scenarios and asked us to evaluate, them based on certain criterion, and to say if they were in one of four categories (all of it is in my notes, so I'm not going through it here).

There were more color group meetings, and a long session where the presidents of the four mock SGA's got up and told how each of their respective groups handled the situations. At this I lost my umbrella and I was not pleased seeing how it looked like Noah's flood was going to start again. At the Keg party I had sort of felt rain in the air ("smelled it" I told them). Sure enough, my old instincts were dead on, as major thunderstorms moved in. The Beach party was canceled, and the lobster bake, which cost an extra \$20, was moved to a big cafeteria.

I kind of wish I hadn't spent that \$20.00. I had always heard how good lobster was and I figured that it was a deal to try it at that price. Wrong. I felt like I was in biology class again. I don't like lobster. I ate chicken instead.

After the lobster were the "SGA" games--sort of like the Greek games. All color groups were organized into 5 teams. These teams had to make up their own university, mascot, cheer, and banner. Well, I, having artistic ability, got picked to do the banner (I brought it home with me). We decided to call ourselves Slam U. Our mascot was a "slamerhead" shark. The others came up with a cheer, and we went to the games. We came in, over all, in second place. It was long, hot, exhausting, and I believe I had the best time that night of all. I didn't play, rather, having the job of photographer, and makeshift cheerleader/score watcher.

Afterwards there was kariokie (sp?) and it was a real good party--that is until people tried to sing. These two girls got up and screeched a Madonna song out at the top of their lungs that nearly sent me under my seat. Other than that, I enjoyed it. After it I wondered back to the dorms and found Roger and Brian sitting out with some others, beers in hand.

Tuesday was the last day, of course, and there was just some wrap up sessions to attend. Like the day before, I think I was the only one to attend them from MSU. At the first one we had "warm fuzzies" given out by Michael, the guy in charge of the whole thing. These things were white, fuzzy, flat and had two eyes pasted on them. They looked like tape worms. We had the final color group session then, and there were considerably less people at it. We wrote letters to ourselves, which the facilitator will mail in late January to us. This is to show us how many of our goals we will have accomplished in how ever many months when we read these



things. We then had an "affirmation session" where everyone said something to affirm another. I said some things about various people and got a surprise when the facilitator said she was very impressed with how I took charge of the banner last night, and really kept the team going by relaying, after each event, that we were only so many points behind. She said that was real team motivation. I never thought of it like that. I packed, and said good-bye to the gang, and the MSU team loaded up and went to the air-port.

The flight to Chicago was uneventful, except I bought one of those mini-wine things because I had a splitting headache and no aspirin. It helped (even though it tasted like vinegar). We arrived in Chicago around 3:30pm or so. The flight to Cincinnati was scheduled to leave at 4:14pm. It didn't.

This plane was another propeller plane, which seemed larger than the other, but older. We get on, after some initial delay, and we sit there for a while. Then they tell us that we are going to have to exit the plane because one engine has an oil leak. This is fun, I think, as we prance back up the tarmac. They then go about fixing the leak, and testing the plane, saying it will be about 5:45 before we take off. So I, having had nothing since the wine on the last plane, go back up to the TCBY yogurt place and get a cone.

When I get back I see Holly, who had been sick the whole day, standing with my book bag saying that the plane has been loaded and is about to take off. I freak. I tear down the tarmac, finishing the cone in two bites, with Holly walking slowly behind, to the plane. We make it on board--me feeling like the biggest shmuck in the world. So we taxi down the run way, the pilot says were number 14 for take off and it will be a while. So we sit and sit and sit. Then he gets back on the air and says that because of the rough weather, and the long ground stay, we're going to have to go back and get more fuel. I was not the only one to cuss.

We arrive back and they shut everything off on the plane as they refueled it. There is nothing more quite than a plane with everything shut off. The stewardess, bless her heart, is propping open the two doors to get a cross breeze going. She tells everyone free drinks for all. By this time my nerves are shot to hell. Having thought myself a fool for almost missing the plane, then the plane not taking off, made me slightly edgy. I ordered a mini-bottle of wine. We stayed longer on the plane, and the stewardess had gotten everyone a drink by this time, and I ordered another wine, and told her jokingly to keep them coming every five minutes. Part of it went down the wrong pipe and I hacked real loud, seeding the MSU team in to laughing convulsions and making this little British man in front of me sit up straight.

After about 30 minutes we hear the pilot announce that the flight had been canceled. More cussing. We stomp across the tarmac to the terminal and head to the desk. They book us on a Delta flight which should leave at 10:15pm or so. It is currently 8:30pm. Robin really lays into the desk worker saying we have no money, and what are we suppose to do for food? The lady calls the boss down, and she gives us all meal tickets worth up to \$10.00 a piece.



We walked across the whole frigging airport to Delta. This plane was a jet, a real plane, and when we get there they tell us it is having fuel injection problems, and it will be a while. OH SHIT! There goes my nerves again. We go back across the airport to this bar and grill, with poor sick Holly straggling behind (I decided to stay with her, and not follow the rest of the speed demons). Just before we got in the bar I caught up to Roger and said angrily, "Did it ever occur to you she couldn't walk as fast as we could?" It had not.

We ate, and I had a marguerite. I had to have something. Being so pissed, tired, and generally miserable gave me a good excuse. After the meal, we go back to Delta. Every 15 minutes they tell us it will be another 15 minutes. We joke and laugh with others who were on the last plane with us. Finally, after hours of BS, and just as we seriously were talking about giving up and finding a hotel, they start boarding. We took off and I must say I have never seen a more beautiful city at night, than Chicago. It was almost worth the wait.

We arrive in Cincinnati, and I try to call Mom but she isn't home from work yet (this is about 12:30am our time). Trisha's Mom and brother are there, and they all start telling her a story they had not told me. I listen (it wasn't like they were being secretive). The gist if consist of the gang in down town New York, and Trisha some how starts playing what I call a 3-card Monte. In reality it was a pan handler who had a shell game set up on the sidewalk.

Trish tells how she lost, by some means, \$100 to this guy. Roger comes in at this point and says he knows what the guy was doing, and how he was cheating her, so he bets \$100 so he can catch the guy in the act of cheating--which he does. The guy takes off running with the money, and Roger and company start to chase him, but they guy's partner delays them long enough for them him to get away. They call the police, and the police took it all down and said, "That'll teach you."

What the sam-hell where they thinking?! You go to down-town New York, cesspool of the world, and you gamble with a pan-handler on the side of the street. Not only do you do that but you bet \$100.00. Then you loose it and your friend bets \$100. Then you want to chase the S.O.B. who stole your money so he may possibly shoot, stab, or in some way kill you. Real smart. You don't ever let anyone in New York know you have any money! I just thank God I wasn't there or I'd have had a heart attack.

As we got our bags, Trish's Mom, in varying stages of disbelief, says, "I can't believe you lost \$100!"

Then Trish said something that at the time I didn't pay much attention to, but more and more I began to think about and not like. "Mom, it was SGA money, they gave it to us to spend." I don't think that is quite what Susette had in mind.

That is something else I noticed on this trip--how frivolous they all were to spend SGA money--like the administrative fund was their own personal slush fund from which to dip. That worries me--really worries me.

Well, we got to the van, paid \$12 for long term parking and headed back down AA highway to MSU. I've never been so

happy to see the Rowan Co. sign in my life. I got to  
Cartmell around 3:30am, called Mom, and went straight to bed.
